COUGARS VS. SAN DIEGO STATE IN MATCHUP OF TOP 10 TEAMS

No. 9/9 BYU basketball will host No. 4/4 San Diego State on Wednesday, Jan. 26, at 8 p.m. MT in the Marriott Center. Tipoff is scheduled for 8:15 p.m. The winner will gain an early edge in the race for the Mountain West Conference regular season title as both teams are 5-0 in league play while the Cougars are 19-1 overall and the Aztecs are 20-0 overall. The game will feature a top 10 BYU team taking on a top 10 opponent in the Marriott Center for the first time in the facility's history. The Cougars are coming off a 94-85 win at Colorado State, their ninth-straight victory overall. Jimmer Fredette scored 42 points to lead BYU in the victory. San Diego State did not play on Saturday and its most recent win came at home on Jan. 19 against Air Force, a 68-55 triumph. Wednesday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 7 p.m. MT on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on CBS College Sports.

No. 9/9 BYU will travel to Albuquerque, N.M., to play New Mexico on Saturday, Jan. 29, at 2 p.m. MT in The Pit. Live stats and audio links will be available on www.byucougars.com and fans can listen live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 1 p.m. MT on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City. The game will be televised live on VERSUS.

COUGAR OUICK HITS

- No. 9/9 BYU head coach Dave Rose is 146-41 in his six seasons at BYU and is the program's all-time leader in winning percentage at .781. He is third in wins and six from tying Roger Reid for second.
- The Cougars were ranked in the AP Preseason Poll for the first time since the 1980-81 season and are currently ranked No. 9 in the AP Poll and in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, BYU's highest rankings since 1987-88.
- Jimmer Fredette was named to eight preseason All-America teams and is a Wooden Award and Cousy Award midseason candidate and a preseason candidate for the Naismith Trophy. Fredette leads the nation in scoring at 26.7 points per game and adds 4.4 assists and 1.3 steals per game.
- Senior guard Jackson Emery is second on the team in scoring at 13.0 points per game and adds 3.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists and a team-best 2.6 steals per game. He has posted four-plus steals seven times this season and is the program's all-time leader in career steals. Brandon Davies is third on the team in scoring at 11.3 points per game on .533 shooting. He has scored in double figures 14 times this season, including 11 of the last 12 games.
- At 19-1, BYU has tied the best 20-game record in program history with last season's squad and the 1987-88 team.

Highlights:

- No. 4/4 San Diego State is one of two undefeated teams in the nation (No. 1 Ohio State is the other) at 20-0 overall and 5-0 in the MWC. The Aztecs own MWC road wins at TCU, Utah and New Mexico and have defeated UNLV and Air Force at home. Some of San Diego State's top nonconference wins came at Gonzaga and California and at home against Saint Mary's.

- Kawhi Leonard averages a double-double to lead San Diego State with team-best averages of 15.7 points and 10.3 rebounds per game. He also leads the team with 29 steals. D.J. Gay adds 12.8 points and a team-high 3.2 assists. He leads the team with 49 threes on .415 shooting from downtown. Malcolm Thomas adds 11.9 points and 8.1 rebounds per game.

- San Diego State averages 73.5 points and shoots .492 from the field. Aztec opponents average 58.8 points and shoot .400 from the field against San Diego State.

SAN DIEGO STATE'S LAST OUTING - NO. 6 AZTECS DOWN AIR FORCE, 68-55

SAN DIEGO (AP) - Although it wasn't as smooth as they would have liked, the No. 6 San Diego State Aztecs reached yet another milestone in the best season in school history.

SDSU extended the country's longest active winning streak to a school-record 20 games by beating Air Force 68-55 on Wednesday night. D.J. Gay scored 20 points and Billy White had 10 of his 12 during a decisive 13-3 run late in the game. Like they've done several times this season, the Aztecs had a slow first half before taking control in the second.

Nor are they going to play much bigger games than they will next Wednesday night, when the Aztecs (20-0, 5-0 Mountain West) visit conference rival and ninth-ranked BYU.

Sophomore forward Kawhi Leonard had 10 points and 10 rebounds for SDSU, his 13th double-double this season and 30th of his career. Tom Fow scored 21 points for Air Force (10-7, 1-3).

Air Force stuck around long enough to make the Aztecs earn it, which they did over the final $7\,1/2$ minutes. The Falcons got consecutive 3-pointers from Fow and Derek Brooks to pull to 48-44 before suddenly going cold.

White got hot for the Aztecs, keying the game-deciding run with two 3-pointers, a three-point play and a free throw. Chase Tapley added two free throws while Malcolm Thomas had one.

SDSU used an 8-0 run midway through the half to take a 48-38 lead. Leonard made a bank shot, James Rahon a 3-pointer and Brian Carlwell a slam dunk after a pass from Leonard.

SDSU made 11 of 26 3-pointers and outrebounded Air Force 34-20. The Aztecs made 13 of 25 3-pointers in an 87-77 win at New Mexico on Saturday, including seven by Gay.

Air Force not only stayed with the Aztecs in the first half, but jumped to a 28-22 lead with 3:15 left in the first half. Fow, who made three 3-pointers in the first 10 minutes and had 16 points at halftime, hit a jumper and Brooks made two shots from underneath to quiet the sellout crowd of 12,414 at Viejas Arena.

Gay had eight points as the Aztecs went on a 12-2 run over the final 2:51, including scoring the final nine points to take a 34-30 halftime lead. Gay, coming off a career-high 30 points at New Mexico, hit consecutive 3-pointers, Leonard had a steal and a layup, Gay followed with a layup and White made a turnaround jumper. Air Force's only points in the run came on Zach Bohannon's inside shot on a pretty feed from Evan Washington.

SERIES NOTES

BYU leads the all-time series against San Diego State 46-22, including a 71-69 win at San Diego and an 82-68 win in Provo last season. The Cougars are 8-4 against the Aztecs under Dave Rose.

BYU RALLIES ON THE ROAD TO DEFEAT SDSU

SAN DIEGO (Jan. 23, 2010) - Jimmer Fredette scored 33 points at San Diego State and Charles Abouo had a block on a pivotal possession late in the game as BYU defeated the Aztecs 71-69 on Saturday. The win is the 15th-consecutive for the Cougars, the second-longest streak in program history

BYU is now 20-1, tied for the best record ever for a Cougar team, set previously in 1987-88. BYU is also a perfect 5-0 in the Mountain West Conference, the only team in the MWC with fewer than two conference losses.

Fredette tied his mark for second-most points in a game this season, finishing with 33 on 11-of-19 from the field, including 5-of-8 from three and 6-of-6 from the free throw line.

Up by a single point with under a minute left, BYU wore down the shot clock to under ten seconds when Fredette took the ball from the top of the key and slipped in for a left-handed layup to push the lead to 69-66.

On the ensuing possession for San Diego State, Kelvin Davis drove underneath looking for a layup, but BYU's Charles Abouo blocked the shot away, preserving the win after two more Fredette free throws

"Even though we got ourselves in a tough situation where they had the momentum, the crowd, and a lot of energy, we were able to stay calm and put enough in the basket to win," said BYU head coach Dave Rose.

BYU started the second half stagnant, eventually giving up the lead to the Aztecs, 48-44. That's when Abouo came in for his first minutes of the game, quickly scoring on a tip-in and a jumper from the wing. About finished with five rebounds, four points, one steal and one block

That jumper would begin a 15-0 run by the Cougars over the next 5:38 of the game. Tyler Haws, Fredette and Jonathan Tavernari each hit a three-pointer as BYU came back to take a double-digit lead, 61-50 with six minutes left.

Fredette went on to score seven of BYU's last nine points to seal the win.

"He was really good off ball screens tonight," Rose said. "That's what he does and he's good at it. Our post guys have been good at getting a good angle for him. He's just good at settling things down in games like this.

BYU again came out hot to start the game, led by freshman Tyler Haws who scored the team's first five points and had 10 at halftime. Haws shot 6-of-10, 3-of-4 from beyond the arc for 17 points.

Chris Miles grabbed seven rebounds, one shy of his career high, adding six points, two blocks and an assist.

BIG SECOND HALF PROPELS COUGARS TO 26TH WIN

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 24, 2010) - A strong second half sealed the win for No. 13/11 BYU as it defeated San Diego State 82-68 on Wednesday night in the Marriott Center. With the win the Cougars set the program's best record through 29 games by improving to 26-3 on the season and 11-2 in Mountain West Conference play

Junior Jimmer Fredette led all scorers with 26 points and added five boards and five assists. Also scoring in double-figures for BYU was Jackson Emery with 17 points. Jonathan Tayernari with 11 and Tyler Haws adding 10. Emery also recorded a game-high five steals and seven rebounds.

As a team, the Cougars made 21-of-28 free throw attempts, while the Aztecs were 7-of-12 from the line.

Fredette drove to the basket late in the shot clock on BYU's first play of the game, scoring the first two points for BYU, He connected on a three-pointer on the following possession, but SDSU took a 7-5 lead after making a trey of its own with 16:32 to play in the first half. A 2-for-2 trip to the free throw line for Haws sparked a 6-0 Cougar

The Aztecs regained the lead at 12-11 but it didn't last long as the teams traded baskets for the next few minutes. Another perfect trip to the free throw line for Haws tied the score 18-18, while Fredette's layup put the Cougars

Though SDSU held BYU scoreless for over three minutes, it was Fredette who ended the drought with a threepoint make with 5:22 remaining in the first half. It was another Fredette trey that sparked an 11-0 Cougar run. He and Emery were responsible for every point scored during that run, making several trips to the charity stripe.

SDSU's Chase Tapley hit a three-pointer with two seconds remaining in the half, bringing BYU's halftime lead to

The whistles blew often and early as both teams picked up two fouls while running just over one minute off the clock to start the second half. The Aztecs clawed at BYU's lead and managed to tie the score 44-44.

Charles Abouo's running layup pushed the Cougars' advantage back up to 10 points with 11:52 remaining in the game. SDSU continued to produce points, but BYU always had an answer for them. Tavernari hit his second three-pointer of the night to extend the Cougar lead to 12. Emery soon followed that by making a layup with 5:50

BYU continued to push the tempo as it stretched the lead to a game-high 18 points, with back-to-back fast-break layups by Fredette and Haws. Both Fredette and Emery went 1-for-2 at the free throw line as time ran off the

LAST TIME OUT - FREDETTE AND COUGARS STOP RAMS ON THE ROAD

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (Jan. 22, 2011) - The No. 9/9 BYU Cougars outlasted the Colorado State Rams on the road, 94-85, on Saturday night in Fort Collins. The Cougars only trailed during the first three minutes of the game but the Rams made BYU work for the win, fighting to the very end. The Cougars' 19-1 record through 20 games is tied for the best in program history.

The nation's leading scorer, Jimmer Fredette, led the Cougars with 42 points followed by Jackson Emery and Kyle Collinsworth who each posted 16 points in the victory. Collinsworth tallied 13 of his 16 in the first half which gave the freshman a new career-high in points while six assists gave the Provo native a career-high in assists as well. Brandon Davies nearly tallied a double-double with 12 points and nine rebounds.

While both teams came out shooting lights out from the field early on, BYU was able to take an early 14-7 lead in the first four minutes of the game forcing a CSU timeout. Coming out of the huddle the Cougars demonstrated their ability to shoot from downtown with Fredette, Noah Hartsock and Collinsworth each hitting a trey to take a 23-11 lead. Still, the home team showed their fans they would not be defeated easily by going on an 8-0 run to cut the BYU lead to four, 23-19.

The Rams continued to battle even after an Emery trey stopped the run, but the Cougar guard play was too much as Fredette, Collinsworth and Emery combined for 43 of BYU's 55 first half points. The Cougars went into the break with a 15-point advantage as BYU shot 62.5 percent from the field.

With success early in the second half, the Cougars led by as many as 19 points. However, with 10:35 remaining a three-pointer by Wes Eikmeier cut the BYU lead to 13. Less than one minute later Cougar center Brandon Davies and Noah Hartsock were saddled with four fouls each. A three-point play by CSU brought the Rams within 10 points of BYU with the Moby Arena crowd on their feet. A missed opportunity by the Cougars followed by another Eikmeier trey continued to cut away at the BYU lead, 71-63. CSU would cut the lead to six but the Rams hopes of a comeback were temporarily silenced by a Fredette trey on the following play.

A breakaway dunk by Dorian Green reignited the CSU faithful as BYU sought to hang onto a 78-71 lead. As the Rams continued to give the Cougars their best, BYU was able to execute offensively and were able to hang on for the victory. The Cougars sealed the deal with less than a minute remaining when Fredette dished the ball to Abouo for an open two-handed dunk, adding an exclamation point to the 94-85 victory.

FREDETTE NAMED TO WOODEN AWARD MIDSEASON TOP 30

Los Angeles (January 6, 2011)— BYU senior guard Jimmer Fredette has been named to the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 that was announced today by The Los Angeles Athletic Club. Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the list is made up of 30 student-athletes who, based on their performances in November and December, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor.

Returning players from past Wooden Award ballots include a pair of seniors: Duke's Kyle Singler (2009, 2010) and BYU's Jimmer Fredette (2010). Singler was the MVP of the 2010 Final Four and is averaging 17.5 points and 5.8 rebounds in 2010-11 for the undefeated Blue Devils; Fredette was an All-Mountain West Conference player as a junior and so far this year posts a 25.1 ppg scoring average

Fredette is among the nation's scoring leaders and has led BYU to a 15-1 record and a No. 14 national ranking. The Glens Falls, N.Y., native has scored 20-plus points 12 times and has eclipsed 30 points four times.

Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are eligible for this midseason list but did not appear on the preseason Top 50. All players nationally who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament, making it unique among college postseason awards.

The Big 10 and Big 12 conferences boast the largest number of players chosen to the list, with six each. Other conferences with multiple players represented include the ACC (5), Big East (5), Pac-10 (3), and the Mountain West (2). The Horizon, SEC and Ohio Valley each had one player selected.

Purdue (JaJuan Johnson, E'Twaun Moore) and No. 1-ranked Duke (Singler, Nolan Smith) were the only schools with two players on the Midseason List. In a change from the past several years, half of the players chosen are seniors. Only two freshmen made the list: Ohio State's Jared Sullinger and Terrence Jones of Kentucky.

The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10,

Kyle Collinsworth was also named the Preseason Freshman of the Year and the Cougars were picked to finish second in the MWC by the

Fredette, a preseason first-team All-American and national player-of-the-year candidate, repeats as the league's preseason player of the year. Also named to the preseason all-conference team, Fredette is a two-time All-MWC First Team honoree and last season led the league in scoring at 22.1 points per game while adding 4.7 assists.

Collinsworth is a versatile guard out of Provo High School who was named Utah's Mr. Basketball and the state's Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior. At Provo he helped the Bulldogs win two state titles and was a three-time firstteam all-state honoree.

San Diego State was picked to finish first in the league and garnered 21 first-place votes compared to five for the Cougars. Last season, BYU was picked to finish first in the league and finished the season second in the regular season standings while setting a program record with 30 wins and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This marks the third time the Cougars were picked to finish second in the preseason media poll — the other years being the 2006-07 and 2008-09 seasons. BYU finished first in the MWC regular season in 2007 and tied for first in 2009.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

With a 146-41 record, Rose has produced a five-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His five-year resume ranks among the best in the history of NCAA Division I basketball. His 127 victories through five seasons place him fifth for best career starts (through five seasons) by wins in NCAA history, ahead of the likes of Jerry Tarkanian, Jim Boeheim and Thad Matta. He currently holds the school record for winning percentage (.781) and the MWC record for winning percentage in league games (.805).

Equally committed to excellence off the court, Rose was honored on April 6, 2008, by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. While Rose has never sought such attention, his actions and accomplishments — both on the court and in the community — have commanded the praises of faithful followers and casual observers alike. In April 2008 Rose became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award, given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA honored BYU with Public Recognition awards for three-straight seasons (2007 to 2010) for their high academic achievement. BYU is the only program in the last four seasons.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. A tireless worker, gifted motivator and talented strategist, Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with four-straight seasons appearing in the top-25 polls and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament — both firsts in program history. In his first season, Rose and his staff produced the nation's second-most improved team by turning a 9-21 squad that finished tied for last with three wins in the Mountain West Conference into a 20-9 NIT qualifier and 12-4 second-place MWC finisher. Under his tutelage from 2007 to 2009, the Cougars achieved the MWC's first two-time outright league championships (2007 and 2008) while adding to the streak with a share of the regular season title in 2009 to make it three-consecutive. In 2010, BYU set a program record with 30 victories and defeated Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the programs first tournament victory since 1993. In addition to the record-setting win total, the 2009-10 Cougar squad set program records for winning percentage, scoring margin, field goals, three-point field goals, turnover margin and steals. Nationally, BYU finished the season first in free throw percentage, second in scoring offense, scoring margin and three-point field goal percentage.

The only BYU men's basketball coach to ever win top conference coaching honors in back-to-back seasons, Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. In his second season, Rose coached the 2006-07 Cougars to a 25-9 overall record and NCAA berth after winning the MWC regular-season title with a 13-3 mark. In his first season, Rose received conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year accolades as well as honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program after a 1-25 season. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as Associate Head Coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job just two days after Cleveland announced his departure. Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, including defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. His efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 11 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 13 years Rose has been in Provo. Seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Jonathan Tavernari was named the 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year after fellow Cougar and second-team Freshman All-American Trent Plaisted received the same honor in 2006. In 2010 Tyler Haws was named third-team All-MWC as a freshman and set the BYU record with 48-consecutive free throws without a miss.

With 27 years of coaching experience including 15 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels, Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah) while guiding six of his seven teams to top-20 rankings, including a national ranking as high as No. 2. He earned three conference titles and was honored by his peers as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as long-time NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU, Rose has coached six players who have received All-America recognition—Mekeli Wesley (2001 AP honorable mention), Rafael Araujo (2004 Basketball Times Second Team, AP honorable mention), Trent Plaisted (2006 Scout.com Freshman Second Team), Keena Young (2007 AP honorable mention), Lee Cummard (2008 AP honorable mention, FOXSports.com Fourth Team) and Jimmer Fredette (2010 third-team Sporting News and NABC, AP Honorable Mention and Lute

Olson All-America team)--and two players who have been selected in the NBA Draft--Travis Hansen (2003) and Araujo (2004).

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose is the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before the Texas native returned to his hometown, transferring to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up after suffering a buzzer-beating defeat to North Carolina State in the NCAA Championship game. Rose spent three years at Houston, playing in 1980-81, redshirting in 1981-82 and concluding his career in 1982-83.

PERSONAL

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Rose followed Steve Cleveland as the second BYU head coach to have served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Rose served in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie State College.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. The National Association of Basketball Coaches honored Rose with its Game Pillar Award for Service in April 2008. While at Dixie State College, Rose became the first coach in the State of Utah to participate in the American Cancer Society's nationwide Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. He has also been a volunteer coach for youth groups. Dave and Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community, receiving the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005.

The fight against Cancer became more personal for the family when Dave was diagnosed with pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor cancer in June 2009. Since the emergency surgery to remove the tumor, no other cancer has been found. Scans since the surgery by doctors at the Huntsman Cancer Institute have all come back clear. The United States Basketball Writers Association recognized Rose for his efforts with its Most Courageous Award.

SUMMARY: An athletic big man and excellent low post scorer, Davies helped lead Provo High School to back-to-back 4A state titles as a sophomore and junior and a second-place finish as a senior. Known for his ability to run the floor and his soft hands, Davies earned first-team all-state honors his senior year. As a freshman in 2009-10, Davies helped BYU to a 30-6 record and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He averaged 5.4 points and 3.0 rebounds while shooting .539 from the field.

SUMMARY: A versatile player, Abouo was the Utah 3A Player of the Year in 2007 out of Logan High School before playing for Brewster Academy in 2007-08, where he helped his team earn a 31-4 record. Abouo played in all 33 games as a freshman in 2008-09 and helped the Cougars finish 25-8, win a share of the MWC regular season title and make a trip to the NCAA Tournament. He averaged 2.9 points and 1.9 rebounds while shooting 42.9 percent from downtown. Played with the Cote d'Ivoire (Ivory Coast) National Team during the summer of 2009 that finished second in the FIBA Africa Championships and qualified for the 2010 World Championships. Abouo is a good defender with a solid mid-range game and the ability to drive to the hoop or pull up and hit the three. He has excelent length and athleticism.
