COUGARS AT HOME TO FACE TCU

No. 9/9 BYU basketball will look to keeps its MWC record perfect when the Cougars host TCU on Tuesday, Jan. 18, in the Marriott Center at 8 p.m. MT. BYU is 17-1 overall and 3-0 in the MWC and has won seven-straight games, including last Tuesday's 104-79 win at Utah. Jimmer Fredette scored 32 points in the first half and finished with 47, a record for a BYU player in the rivalry and tied for the second-highest single-game total in program history. TCU is 10-9 overall and 1-3 in the MWC and has lost five of six, including a 79-69 setback at Colorado State on Jan. 15. The Frogs' conference victory was a 78-60 win over Wyoming at home. TCU is 1-5 on the road this season. Ronnie Moss leads the team in scoring at 15.3 points per game while Garlon Green adds 11.8 points per game and Hank Thorns averages 9.2 points and 5.8 assists per game, first in the MWC. Tuesday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 7 p.m. MT on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

No. 9/9 BYU will play at Colorado State on Saturday, Jan. 22, at 7 p.m. MT. Live stats and audio links will be available on www.byucougars.com and fans can listen live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. MT on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

COUGAR OUICK HITS

- No. 9/9 BYU head coach Dave Rose is 144-41 in his six seasons at BYU and is the program's all-time leader in winning percentage at .778 and third in wins.
- The Cougars were ranked in the AP Preseason Poll for the first time since the 1980-81 season and are currently ranked No. 9 in the AP Poll and in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, BYU's highest rankings since 1987-88.
- Jimmer Fredette was been named to eight preseason All-America teams and is a Wooden Award and Cousy award midseason candidate and a preseason candidate for the Naismith Trophy. Fredette leads the nation in scoring at 26.1 points per game and adds 4.4 assists and 1.3 steals per game.
- Senior guard Jackson Emery is second on the team in scoring at 12.6 points per game and adds 3.9 rebounds, 2.6 assists and a team-best 2.7 steals per game. He has posted four-plus steals seven times this season and is the programs all-time leader in career steals. Brandon Davies is third on the team in scoring at 11.2 points per game on .545 shooting. He has scored in double figures 12 times this season, including nine of the last 10 games
- At 17-1, BYU has tied the best 18-game record in program history with last season's squad and the 1987-88 team.

- TCU is 10-9 overall and 1-3 in MWC play. In conference play, the Frogs opened with a home loss to San Diego State and followed with a loss at UNLV, a home win against Wyoming and a road loss at Colorado State
- Ronnie Moss leads the team in scoring at 15.3 points per game and has made team highs of 33 threes and 55 free throws. He also adds 3.7 assists per game. Garlon Green adds 11.8 points per game while shooting .532 from the field and .509 from three. Sammy Yeager adds 9.3 points per game and Hank Thorns averages 9.2 points and a team-best 5.8 assists per game. J.R. Cadot leads the team in rebounding with 6.3 boards per game.
- TCU averages 71.5 points per game and shoots .455 from the field and .361 from three. Opponents average 69.4 points per game and shoot .453 from the field.

TCU'S LAST OUTING - TCU FALLS AT COLORADO STATE, 79-69

FORT COLLINS, Colo.—TCU's road woes continued Saturday, as the squad dropped a 79-69 decision to Colorado State at the Rams' Moby Arena. CSU shot over 60 percent from the field, including better than 70 percent in the first half.

The setback dropped the Horned Frogs to 10-9 overall and 1-3 in Mountain West Conference play. Colorado State improved to 12-5 overall and 2-1 in the MWC.

Freshman forward Amric Fields led TCU with a game-high 19 points on 8-of-13 shooting. He also totaled five rebounds and pair of steals. Joining Fields in double figures were junior guards Ronnie Moss and Hank Thorns, who scored 17 and 13 points respectively. Moss matched junior forward J.R. Cadot for the team lead with six rebounds, while Thorns dished out a game-high nine assists, his fifth game with as many helpers this season. Senior guard Greg Hill added nine points for the Frogs

Four players scored in double figures to lead a hot-shooting CSU squad, including forward Andy Ogide, who recorded a double-double featuring 17 points on 8-of-13 shooting and a game-high 11 rebounds. Fellow forward Travis Franklin scored 14 points, while guards Dorian Green and Jesse Carr totaled 10 points each. Each of Carr's points came in the second half to help turn back the Frogs.

CSU used an extremely efficient offensive performance to keep the Frogs at bay throughout the evening. In addition to shooting 60.4 percent (32-of-53) for the game, the squad was credited with 22 assists and more than half (40) of its points in the paint.

TCU had a tough time keeping up with CSU in the first half, as the Rams controlled the action throughout the opening period by shooting 72.4 percent (21-of-29) from the field. CSU attacked the paint early and often against the Frogs, scoring 26 of their 46 first-half points in the paint. TCU shot well itself (53.8 percent), but was unable to go shot-for-shot

CSU used seven consecutive points by Ogide to grab an early nine-point advantage, 17-8, just five and one-half minutes into the contest. A trey by Moss minutes later brought TCU back to within three points, but the Rams answered by rattling off a 14-3 run to jump on top by 14 points, 33-19. Franklin scored eight points during the spurt.

After trailing by 11 at intermission, 46-35, TCU was able to climb within five points just under six minutes into the half, but the Frogs would get no closer. The squad went without a basket for nearly five minutes during the middle of the period, and two consecutive layups by Carr, the last of which came with 6:02 remaining, put the Rams up by 14, 66-52.

BYU leads the all-time series against TCU 16-3, including a regular season sweep and a win in the MWC Tournament last season. Dave Rose is 12-0 all-time against the Frogs.

BYU WINS, GOES TO 7-1 AFTER FIRST HALF OF MWC PLAY

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 2, 2010) – The BYU men's basketball team hit the ground running against TCU, opening the game with a 10-0 lead over the Horned Frogs thanks to strong team play and never looking back, beating TCU 76-56.

BYU was lead by Jimmer Fredette with 26 points. Noah Hartsock also contributed 14 points for the Cougars while Jackson Emery chipped in 12 points. Senior Chris Miles led the BYU effort on the boards with a career-high 11 rebounds.

The offensive success that BYU found in Saturday's game against Utah continued into the opening minutes of the contest versus TCU. Emery led the offensive explosion with two threes in the first five minutes of the game while also leading BYU on the defensive end with two early steals. With seven minutes to play, BYU led 21-13 and had assisted on each of their first seven field goals with Emery leading the Cougars with three assists.

With a relatively comfortable lead, Rose began to showcase the depth of his bench which scored 13 points in the first half, including two treys by Lamont Morgan, Jr., and a three-pointer by Jonathan Tavernari. Morgan is currently 9-for-12 from long range on the year.

With 2:45 left to play in the first half Emery hit a three-point bucket of his own to give BYU their largest lead of the half at 33-19. The Cougars held onto their 14-point lead to go into the break ahead, 35-21.

TCU came out of the locker room revitalized, scoring five unanswered to open the half. BYU was unable to make a field goal for the first 3:36 of the half until turning to their post players. Hartsock made a jumper to end the drought and give the Cougars a 38-26 lead. During the subsequent play, Chris Miles made a turnaround jumper to extend the BYU lead.

The Cougars' 40-28 lead was too close for comfort for Fredette. The junior guard, who had scored six points in the first half, went to work, making a layup followed by a three-point basket.

The Horned Frogs cut the BYU lead to 10 with 8:14 remaining but Fredette responded, making a trey and extending the lead to 13. TCU answered with a three-pointer of their own with seven minutes left to play. The Horned Frogs would cut the lead to eight but once again Fredette answered hitting yet another three-point basket.

FORT WORTH, Texas (Mar. 6, 2010) – Forward Charles Abouo and No. 14/15 BYU exploded on offense at TCU, winning its 12th-straight against the Horned Frogs 107-77 in the Cougars' final game of the regular season.

The sophomore forward finished with 22 points, doubling his previous career high. Abouo shot 8-of-11, hitting two three-pointers, while collecting five rebounds and three assists in a career-high 26 minutes.

Abouo's output led a season-high 61 points from BYU's bench, also including a season-high 23 points from senior forward Jonathan Tavernari. Tavernari nailed 9-of-12 shots and 5-of-8 from beyond the arc, adding four rebounds, three assists and three steals.

"Our guys really got going," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "Our bench shot the ball extremely well, which helps our starters to shoot well. They're playing at a higher level. They can elevate the performance of the starters and

After falling behind early by a score of 18-4, the Cougars went on a 14-3 run at the 12:00 mark of the first half to take their first lead of the game. BYU went into halftime up 57-43, tying for the most points in a first period this season. Tavernari hit four trevs for 16 points in the first half to key the run.

The second half was even better for the Cougars, as the team shot 72.0% for the half. BYU started the second frame by going on a 12-2 run. Jackson Emery quickly hit a three off an assist from Brandon Davies, then Jimmer Fredette and Davies hit back-to-back layups. Emery would follow with another hoop and a free throw, extending the lead to 68-45.

Emery posted the best all-around game of the night with 22 points on 8-of-10 shooting from the field, 5-of-6 from three, including five steals, five assists, two blocks and two rebounds. Emery, already the BYU record holder for most steals in a season, moved into third place on the BYU career steals list with his fourth game this season of five steals or more.

"Tonight we had a lot of people involved that really helped us win this game and that helps with individual confidence," Rose said.

As a team the Cougars had 14 steals, their third of the last four games with at least 10 thefts.

FREDETTE TOPS 40 AGAIN AS BYU ADVANCES IN MWC TOURNEY

LAS VEGAS (Mar. 11, 2010) – In the quarterfinals of the Mountain West Conference Tournament, junior Jimmer Fredette scored 23 of his 45 points from the free throw line as BYU advanced with a 95-85 win over TCU on Thursday.

With the win, BYU improves to 29-4, the most wins in a season by any Cougar team, breaking the 1950-51 squad's record of 28 wins.

Fredette became the first Cougar ever to score more than 40 points twice in a career after setting the all-time school record with 49 points earlier this season at Arizona. The junior's 45 points against the Horned Frogs is the third-most on the BYU record books and an MWC Tournament record.

Fredette finished 23-of-24 from the charity stripe overall, also school and MWC Tournament records, while converting on his last 21 attempts, all in the second half.

The point guard also had six assists and four rebounds, playing 38 minutes.

"You give Jimmer a little more freedom because of his ability to create so much attention from the opposing team," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "Iff they're going to guard him one on one, we're spread out, it's hard. If they run another guy at him, then Jimmer needs to make the play and find the open guy."

The Cougars trailed TCU at halftime, 40-39, after Ronnie Moss scored on a floater right before the halftime buzzer.

But Fredette came alive, scoring 30 points in the half. With the Cougars up 67-60 with 10:38 left in the game, the junior scored eight-straight points on four free throws and then back-to-back baskets. Fredette nailed a jumper, then scored on a fast break layup after Jackson Emery stole the ball on an acrobatic leap.

Michael Loyd, Jr., converted on a reverse layup and Emery hit another jumpshot to give BYU its biggest lead of the game at 78-65 with 7:22 left.

Emery scored 15 points, shooting 4-of-5 from beyond the arc, and added seven rebounds, three assists and two steals.

LAST TIME OUT - COUGARS CAPTURE DESERT DUEL VICTORY

SALT LAKE CITY (Jan. 11, 2011) – Seniors Jimmer Fredette and Jackson Emery posted career performances as the No. 10 BYU men's basketball team defeated rival Utah 104-79 Tuesday at the Huntsman Center.

With 12:47 remaining in the first half, senior Jackson Emery recorded is 196th career steal and passed BYU legend Danny Ainge for the all-time BYU lead. Emery, who averages 2.7 steals per game this season, would add one more to bring his career total to 197. He also added 20 points, three rebounds and three assists.

Senior All-American Jimmer Fredette led the Cougars with a season-high 47 points on 16-of-28 shooting, including 6-of-9 from three-point range, while adding four rebounds, six assists and two steals. Fredette now leads the nation in scoring with 26.1 ppg.

Scoring was back and forth to start the contest. Fredette led the Cougars early with eight quick points despite the Cougars falling behind 21-17 at the 10:37 mark in the first half. However, the Cougars came back to take a 25-23 lead on the heels of an 8-2 run that was highlighted by back-to-back treys by Emery and Fredette. Emery finished the first half with six points on 2-of-3 shooting from three-point range and three assists, while freshman Kyle Collinsworth added nine points and three rebounds.

BYU's biggest lead of the half came after Fredette hit a half-court buzzer beater as time expired to put BYU up 53-42. Fredette would finish the half with 32 points on 10-of-15 shooting, including 5-of-6 from three-point range. It was his highest career first-half total, besting the 24 points he scored in the first half against Arizona last season. The Cougars, who shot 8-of-14 (.571) from long range in the first half, stayed hot in the second half, taking a 61-49 lead at the 15:10 mark and would not lead by less than 10 points for the rest of the game, running away with their third-consecutive conference win.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

"He's (Fredette) a special player. He's on a roll and playing with a lot of confidence."

"This is a great team win for a lot of reasons. This is a great basketball team when Jimmer's playing like that and the other guys are engaged like they were."

- Fredette's 47 points gave the senior guard his season-high in points and the second-most points in a game during his career and tied for second-most in a BYU game.

- Fredette's 47 points made the Cougar point guard the nation's leading scorer in NCAA Division 1 basketball. He hit the second of two free throws for his final point of the night and to give him 2,001 career points.

FREDETTE NAMED TO WOODEN AWARD MIDSEASON TOP 30

Los Angeles (January 6, 2011)— BYU senior guard Jimmer Fredette has been named to the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Top 30 that was announced today by The Los Angeles Athletic Club. Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the list is made up of 30 student-athletes who, based on their performances in November and December, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor.

Returning players from past Wooden Award ballots include a pair of seniors: Duke's Kyle Singler (2009, 2010) and BYU's Jimmer Fredette (2010). Singler was the MVP of the 2010 Final Four and is averaging 17.5 points and 5.8 rebounds in 2010-11 for the undefeated Blue Devils; Fredette was an All-Mountain West Conference player as a junior and so far this year posts a 25.1 ppg scoring average.

Fredette is among the nation's scoring leaders and has led BYU to a 15-1 record and a No. 14 national ranking. The Glens Falls, N.Y., native has scored 20-plus points 12 times and has eclipsed 30 points four times.

Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are eligible for this midseason list but did not appear on the preseason Top 50. All players nationally who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament, making it unique among college postseason awards.

The Big 10 and Big 12 conferences boast the largest number of players chosen to the list, with six each. Other conferences with multiple players represented include the ACC (5), Big East (5), Pac-10 (3), and the Mountain West (2). The Horizon, SEC and Ohio Valley each had one player selected.

Purdue (JaJuan Johnson, E'Twaun Moore) and No. 1-ranked Duke (Singler, Nolan Smith) were the only schools with two players on the Midseason List. In a change from the past several years, half of the players chosen are seniors. Only two freshmen made the list: Ohio State's Jared Sullinger and Terrence Jones of Kentucky.

The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011

DENVER (Oct. 12, 2010) – BYU guard Jimmer Fredette received Mountain West Conference Preseason Player of the Year honors at the league's media day being held today at The MountainWest Sports Network studios. Kyle Collinsworth was also named the Preseason Freshman of the Year and the Cougars were picked to finish second in the MWC by the league's media.

Fredette, a preseason first-team All-American and national player-of-the-year candidate, repeats as the league's preseason player of the year. Also named to the preseason all-conference team, Fredette is a two-time All-MWC First Team honoree and last season led the league in scoring at 22.1 points per game while adding 4.7 assists.

Collinsworth is a versatile guard out of Provo High School who was named Utah's Mr. Basketball and the state's Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior. At Provo he helped the Bulldogs win two state titles and was a three-time first-team all-state honoree.

San Diego State was picked to finish first in the league and garnered 21 first-place votes compared to five for the Cougars. Last season, BYU was picked to finish first in the league and finished the season second in the regular season standings while setting a program record with 30 wins and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This marks the third time the Cougars were picked to finish second in the preseason media poll — the other years being the 2006-07 and 2008-09 seasons. BYU finished first in the MWC regular season in 2007 and tied for first in 2009.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

With a 144-41 record, Rose has produced a five-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His five-year resume ranks among the best in the history of NCAA Division I basketball. His 127 victories through five seasons place him fifth for best career starts (through five seasons) by wins in NCAA history, ahead of the likes of Jerry Tarkanian, Jim Boeheim and Thad Matta. He currently holds the school record for winning percentage (.778) and the MWC record for winning percentage in league games (.805).

Equally committed to excellence off the court, Rose was honored on April 6, 2008, by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. While Rose has never sought such attention, his actions and accomplishments — both on the court and in the community — have commanded the praises of faithful followers and casual observers alike. In April 2008 Rose became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award, given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA honored BYU with Public Recognition awards for three-straight seasons (2007 to 2010) for their high academic achievement. BYU is the only program in the last four seasons.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. A tireless worker, gifted motivator and talented strategist, Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with four-straight seasons appearing in the top-25 polls and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament — both firsts in program history. In his first season, Rose and his staff produced the nation's second-most improved team by turning a 9-21 squad that finished tied for last with three wins in the Mountain West Conference into a 20-9 NIT qualifier and 12-4 second-place MWC finisher. Under his tutelage from 2007 to 2009, the Cougars achieved the MWC's first two-time outright league championships (2007 and 2008) while adding to the streak with a share of the regular season title in 2009 to make it three-consecutive. In 2010, BYU set a program record with 30 victories and defeated Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the programs first tournament victory since 1993. In addition to the record-setting win total, the 2009-10 Cougar squad set program records for winning percentage, scoring margin, field goals, three-point field goals, turnover margin and steals. Nationally, BYU finished the season first in free throw percentage, second in scoring offense, scoring margin and three-point field goal percentage.

The only BYU men's basketball coach to ever win top conference coaching honors in back-to-back seasons, Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. In his second season, Rose coached the 2006-07 Cougars to a 25-9 overall record and NCAA berth after winning the MWC regular-season title with a 13-3 mark. In his first season, Rose received conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year accolades as well as honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program after a 1-25 season. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as Associate Head Coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job just two days after Cleveland announced his departure. Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, including defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. His efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 11 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 13 years Rose has been in Provo. Seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Jonathan Tavernari was named the 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year after fellow Cougar and second-team Freshman All-American Trent Plaisted received the same honor in 2006. In 2010 Tyler Haws was named third-team All-MWC as a freshman and set the BYU record with 48-consecutive free throws without a miss.

With 27 years of coaching experience including 15 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels, Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah) while guiding six of his seven teams to top-20 rankings, including a national ranking as high as No. 2. He earned three conference titles and was honored by his peers as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as long-time NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU, Rose has coached six players who have received All-America recognition—Mekeli Wesley (2001 AP honorable mention), Rafael Araujo (2004 Basketball Times Second Team, AP honorable mention), Trent Plaisted (2006 Scout.com Freshman Second Team), Keena Young (2007 AP honorable mention), Lee Cummard (2008 AP honorable mention, FOXSports.com Fourth Team) and Jimmer Fredette (2010 third-team Sporting News and NABC, AP Honorable Mention and Lute

Olson All-America team)--and two players who have been selected in the NBA Draft--Travis Hansen (2003) and Araujo (2004).

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose is the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before the Texas native returned to his hometown, transferring to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up after suffering a buzzer-beating defeat to North Carolina State in the NCAA Championship game. Rose spent three years at Houston, playing in 1980-81, redshirting in 1981-82 and concluding his career in 1982-83.

PERSONAL

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Rose followed Steve Cleveland as the second BYU head coach to have served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Rose served in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie State College.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. The National Association of Basketball Coaches honored Rose with its Game Pillar Award for Service in April 2008. While at Dixie State College, Rose became the first coach in the State of Utah to participate in the American Cancer Society's nationwide Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. He has also been a volunteer coach for youth groups. Dave and Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community, receiving the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005.

The fight against Cancer became more personal for the family when Dave was diagnosed with pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor cancer in June 2009. Since the emergency surgery to remove the tumor, no other cancer has been found. Scans since the surgery by doctors at the Huntsman Cancer Institute have all come back clear. The United States Basketball Writers Association recognized Rose for his efforts with its Most Courageous Award.



SUMMARY: An athletic big man and excellent low post scorer, Davies helped lead Provo High School to back-to-back 4A state titles as a sophomore and junior and a second-place finish as a senior. Known for his ability to run the floor and his soft hands, Davies earned first-team all-state honors his senior year. As a freshman in 2009-10, Davies helped BYU to a 30-6 record and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He averaged 5.4 points and 3.0 rebounds while shooting .539 from the field.

LAST GAME: Surpassed Danny Ainge for first place on the BYU all-time steals list, recording his 196th career take away while going 5-for-7 from three-point range en route to scoring 20 points to reach 1,000 career points.
