BYU VS. TEXAS A&M IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

BYU men's basketball has received an at-large invitation to the 2009 NCAA Tournament and will face Texas A&M on Thursday, March 19, at 12:30 p.m. EST in the West Region at the Wachovia Center in Philadelphia. Thursday's game is a rematch of last season's first round game when the Aggies of the Big 12 defeated the Cougars 67-62 in Anaheim, Calif. BYU is the No. 8 seed for the third-straight season and will be looking for its first NCAA Tournament victory since 1993. The Cougars advanced to the semifinals of the MWC tournament before falling to San Diego State while Texas A&M fell to Texas Tech in the first round of the Big 12 tournament. Thursday's game will be televised live on CBS while the radio broadcast can be heard live on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City beginning with the pregame show at 11:30 a.m. EST (9:30 a.m. MST).

UP NEXT

The winner of the No. 8 BYU - No. 9 Texas A&M game will advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament and face the winner of the No. 1 Connecticut - No. 16 Chattanooga game on Saturday, March 21, in Philadelphia.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

— With a 12-4 record in MWC, play BYU earned a share of the 2009 conference championship, becoming the first team in the history of the league to win three-straight conference titles.

— BYU won its league-high fifth MWC regular season title with its 54-49 home win over Air Force on March 7. The Cougars share the 2009 title with New Mexico and Utah. BYU also shared the title in 2001 and 2003 and took the title outright in 2007 and 2008.

— With a 9-1 finish to the 2008-09 regular season BYU has now finished at least 9-1 in four years under Dave Rose.

— At 25-7 overall and 12-4 in MWC play BYU is 51-13 (.797) in conference play under Coach Dave Rose. His .797 winning percentage is best all-time in the MWC. Rose is now 97-33 (.746) overall in four seasons, giving him the best winning percentage for a BYU coach through four seasons. Rose has led BYU to four-straight 20-win seasons including 20-9 and a trip to the NIT in his first season. In his second campaign he guided the Cougars to the outright MWC title, a top-25 ranking, a trip to the NCAA Tournament and a 25-9 overall record. Last season he led BYU to a 27-8 overall record, a second-straight outright league title and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Rose was named MWC coach of the year in 2006 and 2007.

— Lee Cummard and Jimmer Fredette were named first-team All-MWC while Jonathan Tavernari received third-team recognition. Jackson Emery was named to the All-Defensive Team. Cummard is a repeat first-team honoree and Tavernari is a repeat third-team honoree. Cummard and Fredette have also earned all-district honors. Last season Cummard was the MWC Co-Player of the Year and an honorable mention All-American.

MEDIA INTERVIEWS

All interviews with BYU players or coaches must be scheduled through a BYU Athletic Communications contact. Postgame interviews will take place as noted below. Other interview requests, such as live television shots after a game, should be arranged in advance through a BYU Athletic Communications contact. News conferences will be conducted on the day before each game (see the schedule of events at left) and also immediately after each game. The host media coordinator will have the authority to designate and require any student-athlete to attend any news conference, but should work with the participating institutions' head coach and SID, as well as a designated member of the United States Basketball Writers Association, to select postgame press conference participants. Each participating institution shall make student-athletes available at all scheduled news conferences. All interviews at the facility shall occur in the media interview room or the locker room area.

CAMERAS, RECORDERS

All electronic media desiring to record the proceedings in the interview room will be required to use the connecting devices supplied by the NCAA designee, Hammond Communications. No individual filming of the interviews will be permitted.

TELEPHONE INTERVIEWS

Neither coaches nor student-athletes may conduct interviews via telephone until 30 minutes after the cooling-off period ends, or until after their postgame obligations to all media have been met, whichever comes later.

LOCKER ROOMS

The locker rooms will be open to the media for a minimum of 30 minutes after the cooling-off period ends, provided media representatives are present the entire time. Student-athletes who do not play in the game may depart earlier. At the institution's discretion, the locker room can remain open for individual interviews with players who were held in the holding area prior to going on the dais and thus were unavailable while other players were interviewed in the locker room.

MEDIA INTERVIEWS, DAY BEFORE GAMES

Each coach and a minimum of two first-team student-athletes will participate in each news conference. Each team's top seven student-athletes who are not in the media interview room and any others requested by the media shall be available to the media in the locker room during the time the coach and selected student-athletes are participating in the news conference. A representative of each institution's sports information staff shall be in the area and will coordinate these interview requests.

NEWS CONFERENCE, POST-GAME

Cooling-Off Period: A "cooling-off period" has been set aside for a coach to be with the student-athletes in the locker room after each game. The period begins when the coach enters the locker room immediately after the game or after his interview with CBS or the radio network. The period will be 10 minutes for the winning team, 15 minutes for the losing team. A coach may shorten the cooling-off period, but may not extend it. The coach and student-athletes must report to the interview room after the cooling-off period ends. No interviews may take place during the cooling-off period, nor may representatives of the institution shoot video or conduct radio interviews on behalf of a media agency.

Two minutes (maximum) – Overview by head coach
 Eight minutes (maximum) – Questions to student-athletes (dismiss student-athletes at conclusion)
 Ten minutes – Questions to head coach

BLOGGING

Each credential holder (including television, Internet, new media, and print publications) has the privilege to blog (e.g., real-time or time delayed journal entries) during competition if approved for a credential. Any blog representing an NCAA Championship must submit the appropriate link to NCAA.com Blog Central. To submit your link, please send an e-mail to blogs@ncaa.com with the subject of Blog Central Submission. In return, all media entities entering a blog must post the NCAA.com logo/link on the page hosting their blog as a reciprocal link. All blogs must be free of charge to readers and must adhere to the conditions and limitations of this NCAA Blogging Policy. A blog description includes in-competition updates on score and time remaining in competition as well as a description of the championship and competition taking place during the given time that the competition is in progress. The NCAA and its designated championship personnel shall be the final authority over whether a credential holder or credential entity is following the NCAA Blogging Policy. The following is the NCAA's policy for the number of blog posts allowed during a men's and women's basketball championship competition or session (i.e., where more than one contest takes place under the same admission ticket): Five times per half, once at halftime and two times per overtime period.

COUGARS IN THE NCAA

— This is BYU's 24th NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season as a No. 8 seed, losing 67-62 in the first round to Texas A&M at the Honda Center in Anaheim, Calif. BYU is in the tournament for the third-straight season. In 2007 BYU, the No. 8 seed, lost 79-77 to Xavier in Lexington, Ky.

— The Cougars have an 11-26 record in the NCAA Tournament.

— This will be BYU's first NCAA Tournament appearance in Philadelphia.

— BYU has gone to the NCAA Tournament six out of the last nine seasons (2001, 2003, 2004, 2007, 2008 and 2009). BYU has earned a postseason tournament invite in nine of the last 10 years (NIT in 2000, 2002, 2006).

— Since seedings were started, BYU has been seeded as high as a No. 3 seed in 1980. BYU was a No. 4 seed in 1988. Other single-digit seeds included being a No. 5 seed in 1979, a No. 6 seed in 1981 (the year it advanced to the Elite Eight), a No. 7 seed in 1993 (the last year BYU was ranked during the season prior to this year), and No. 8 seeds in 1984, 1995, 2007, 2008 and 2009. BYU has been a No. 12 seed in 2001, 2003 and 2004.

— BYU has lost in the first round in its last six NCAA appearances. BYU's last NCAA win was in 1993 as a No. 7 seed in Chicago when the Cougars defeated SMU, 80-71. BYU lost to No. 2-seed Kansas, 90-76, in the second round that year.

— BYU is 7-16 in its opening round games in NCAA Tournament play.

— The last time BYU advanced out of the second round was in 1981 when the Cougars (as a No. 6 seed), defeated Princeton, 60-51 before upsetting No. 3-seed UCLA 78-55. BYU went on to defeat No. 2-seed Notre Dame on Danny Ainge's last-second, length-of-the-court dash, 51-50, to advance to the Regional Finals before losing to Ralph Sampson and No. 1-seed Virginia, 74-60.

— Current Cougar head coach Dave Rose is 0-2 all-time in NCAA Tournament play with last year's 67-62 loss to Texas A&M and a 79-77 loss to Xavier in 2007. Legendary BYU coach Stan Watts has the most NCAA Tournament with a 4-10 record in seven appearances followed by Frank Arnold (3-3 in three appearances), Ladell Andersen (2-3 in three appearances), Roger Reid (2-5 in five appearances) and Steve Cleveland (0-3 in three appearances).

— BYU head coach Dave Rose played in the NCAA Championship game for Houston's "Phi Slamma Jamma" team that lost to North Carolina State at the final buzzer in 1983. BYU assistant coach Dave Rice was a member of UNLV's 1990 National Championship and 1991 Final Four teams that won a school record 45 consecutive games.

LAST YEAR IN NCAA FIRST ROUND — COUGARS FALL TO TEXAS A&M IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

ANAHEIM, Calif. (March 20, 2008) – The BYU men's basketball team's season came to an end Thursday as the Cougars fell, 67-62, to Texas A&M in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Despite the loss, BYU still posted the second-best record in program history with a 27-8 finish, advancing to the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in the past eight years. Sophomore Jonathan Tavernari led four Cougars in double figures in the game with 15 points followed by Lee Cummard with 14, Trent Plaisted with 13 and Jimmer Fredette with 10. Cummard finally got BYU on the scoreboard with a put-back dunk at the 13:55 mark, prompting a huge reaction from the Cougar crowd. Moments later, a Burgess steal allowed the senior co-captain to get loose, resulting in a fastbreak layin to make the score 11-4. Plaisted later made his first bucket of the night, but Josh Carter came through from distance once again for Texas A&M, draining his fourth three-pointer in the first 13 minutes of the game to re-establish a double-digit lead at 20-10. The two teams traded buckets from there with the Aggies holding onto a 26-18 lead until Cummard breathed life into the Cougars with a three-point bucket, BYU's first of the game. After freshman Chris Collinsworth picked off a pass on the next Texas A&M possession, he went the length of the court before being fouled on the shot attempt. He missed both free throws, but fellow freshman Jimmer Fredette grabbed the rebound and took it to the hoop to cut the Aggie lead to just three points at 26-23 with two minutes to play in the half. Moments later, after an offensive foul on the Aggies, Tavernari completed the Cougar comeback bid with a trey followed immediately by a Texas A&M turnover and a three-pointer from Fredette. The back-to-back scores capped an 11-0 BYU run that gave the Cougars a 29-26 lead. The Aggies added a three-point make of their own with seven seconds left to knot the score at 29-29 heading into the locker room. Plaisted scored the first five points of the second half for BYU, keeping pace with the Aggies to a 33-33 tie. Carter and Tavernari traded treys, and a battle ensued as the lead seesawed back and forth between the two squads. The Aggies' rebounding ability kept possessions alive for Texas A&M, but the Cougars continued to pressure, forcing turnovers and steadily improving their shooting efficiency while recording a 45-43 lead midway through the half. The game pegged as the most even matchup of the first round lived up its billing as the Aggies knotted the score for the sixth time in the contest at 45-45. After Texas A&M went up 47-46, Plaisted powered to the hoop and slammed the ball home to once again tip the scales in the Cougars' favor. However, the Aggies continued to crash the boards, taking a 52-48 lead as second-chance points began to pile up. But just when it looked like Texas A&M would be able to pull away, Tavernari hit a timely three-pointer to cut the advantage to just one point at 52-51 with 4:32 left to play, forcing an Aggie timeout. A&M got what it wanted out of the break, pushing the lead back to four points at 57-53 as the clock ticked under three minutes. The Aggies extended their lead to 63-57 after two free-throw makes, and, despite a late trey from Fredette, pulled out the 67-62 win to improve to 25-10 on the year. Texas A&M advanced to face No. 1-seed UCLA in the second round.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "It was a very competitive game. Both teams played really hard and they got off to a really good start, hit some big shots. But we were able to fight back and get in to the game, get a lead, and then it came down to the last couple minutes of the game."
- "They made some big shots and got some big rebounds. We competed really hard but they made a few more plays than we did. They are big and physical players and at critical times they made critical plays."
- "I thought Jimmer played with a lot of confidence. Ben has had that ankle issue for the last couple weeks that has slowed him down just a bit. When Jimmer came in we hadn't scored in a while and we were looking for a little bit of a lift. I thought he did a good job of providing that for us."
- "I talked with our team after the game about the great things this team has done this year. It's not going to make anybody feel much better right now, but I wanted those guys to leave the locker room just knowing how proud our staff is of what they've accomplished. We won a lot of games, won back-to-back Mountain West Conference regular season championships. We beat a team ranked in the top 10 for the first time in a long while. We've got a nice homecourt winning streak going. There's a lot of good things that are going on with BYU basketball. Those are some of the things we tried to reflect on in the locker room."

BYU NOTES VS. TEXAS A&M

- Jonathan Tavernari made his 29th start of the year, joining Ben Murdock, Sam Burgess, Lee Cummard and Trent Plaisted in the starting five. The latter four have started every game this season. Cummard and Plaisted also started last year's NCAA First Round game against Xavier.
- Individual Career Highs: Jimmer Fredette 5 rebounds; Chris Collinsworth - 3 assists (tied).
- NCAA Tournament History - With the loss, BYU is now 11-26 all-time in 23 NCAA Tournament appearances. The Cougars have lost in the first round in their last six NCAA Tournament appearances. BYU is 7-16 in first-round play.
- BYU's 27-8 record this season is the second-best 35-game record in program history (1950-51 team went 28-7 before posting final record of 28-9). This year's Cougars set the program record for regular-season victories with 25.
- In addition to their 16-0 home record this year and 47 straight Marriott Center victories, the Cougars finished the year 11-8 away from the Marriott Center this season, including an 8-5 road record and a 3-3 mark on neutral floors. BYU won eight of its last 11 games away from home.
- The Cougars added to their school-record season three-point total with seven treys against the Aggies, bringing their season mark to 285. BYU has hit at least five treys in 33 of 35 games this year.
- The 29-29 halftime score marked just the second time this season BYU has been tied at the break (29-29 at San Diego State). The Cougars have held their opponents under 30 first-half points in 23 games.
- Jonathan Tavernari added to his school and MWC sophomore record for threes in a season with three against the Aggies, bringing his total to 88. Tavernari has hit at least three treys in 14 games this season. Tavernari and Cummard have each made at least one three-pointer in 32 of 35 games.
- With a putback dunk at the 13:55 mark, Cummard surpassed 1,000 career points, becoming the 38th member of BYU's 1,000 Point Club and just the 11th Cougar of four-year players to reach the milestone as a junior. Fellow junior Trent Plaisted reached 1,000 career points earlier this season.
- Cummard has now scored in double figures in 32 of 35 games this season.
- After missing their first eight shots and 12 of their first 14 from the field, the Cougars made 10 of their last 13 shots in the first half while climbing back from an 11-point deficit to take a three-point lead. BYU made six straight shots at one point during the comeback capped by a three-pointer from Tavernari to knot the score at 26-26.

LOOKING AT TEXAS A&M

Texas A&M enters the NCAA Tournament as the No. 9 seed in the West Region. The Aggies are 23-9 on the season and finished 9-7 in the Big 12, for a four-way tie for fourth with Oklahoma State, Texas and Kansas State. The Aggies were upset in the first round of the Big 12 tournament by Texas Tech. They are one of six Big 12 teams to qualify for the NCAA Tournament. Texas A&M starts four juniors and one senior. Three starters return from last season's squad that defeated BYU in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Bryan Davis, Josh Carter and Donald Sloan. Carter leads the team in scoring at 14.1 points per game while adding 4.5 boards per game while hitting 40.9 percent from downtown. He leads the team with 74 threes. Sloan (11.7), Davis (10.4) and Chinemelu (10.1) also average double figures for the Aggies. Eminu leads the team in rebounding at 7.4 rpg while Davis is second at 6.4 per game. Eminu is also the team's leading shot blocker with 50 while Davis has 40. Sloan leads the squad in assists per game at 3.0 per game. B.J. Holmes comes off the bench to average 8.8 points per game. He shoots a team-best .425 from long range. As a team Texas A&M averages 71.7 points per game while shooting .446 from the field. The Aggies yield 66.3 points per game while allowing their opponents to shoot .431 from the field. Texas A&M averages 25.6 free throw attempts per game, nine more per game than their opponents. The Aggies also dominate the glass, out-rebounding their opponents by 5.3 per game. Texas A&M is coached by Mark Turgeon (48-20 in his second season; 201-139 in 11 years overall), who has led the Aggies to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances.

TEXAS A&M'S LAST OUTING — AGGIES CAN'T HOLD OFF RED RAIDER RALLY, FALL 88-83

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP)—Mike Singletary single-handedly led the biggest comeback in Big 12 tournament history, scoring all 29 of Texas Tech's points during a second-half surge that pushed the Red Raiders to a 88-83 win against Texas A&M on Wednesday night. Singletary finished with 43 points to break the tournament scoring record of 38 set by Iowa State's Marcus Fizer in 2000 against Baylor. The last basket in Singletary's amazing stretch was a driving layup past Bryan Davis that put the Red Raiders (17-15) up 79-78 with 39.4 seconds left and erased the last part of a 21-point deficit. Alan Voskuil and John Roberson followed that with a pair of free throws apiece to push the lead to five. Donald Sloan led the Aggies (23-9) with 22 points and Josh Carter added 15. Davis opened the second half with a pair of free throws to put A&M ahead 50-29. Darko Cohadarevic hit back-to-back baskets to get Tech's offense off to a better start than the first half, when the Red Raiders missed their first 10 shots to fall into a 15-2 hole. But the rally really got started once Singletary—who didn't even start the game—got rolling. He converted Michael Prince's steal into a right-handed jam that cut the deficit to 56-44 with 13:02 remaining and soon after added a driving layup that got Tech back within single digits for the first time since the opening drought. He had a personal 7-0 run that got the lead down to 65-59 on a 3-pointer from the right wing with 6:08 left, and he had a chance to tie it at 67 before missing a free throw on the back end of a bonus situation. The Red Raiders kept going back to him, though, and he finally tied the score at 75 on a 3-pointer from right in front of the bench with 1:36. That brought his teammates to their feet immediately, and it wasn't long before they had the lead to celebrate, too.

SERIES NOTES

Thursday's NCAA Tournament matchup will be the third meeting between BYU and Texas A&M and the second in two years. Last season Texas A&M defeated BYU in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Cougars were the eight seed and the Aggies were the nine seed. Texas A&M won 67-62 in Anaheim. BYU won the first meeting, 83-81, in 1972.

BYU IN THE MWC TOURNAMENT

The Cougars have a 12-9 Mountain West Conference Tournament record. BYU advanced to the finals in the first two years of the MWC Tournament, winning the title over New Mexico in 2001 after losing to host UNLV in 2000. BYU then went five years without a finals appearance until losing to host UNLV in the 2007 Championship game. The Cougars fell again to UNLV in the title game in 2008. BYU has won its quarterfinal game in seven of the 10 MWC Tournaments. BYU has a 4-3 semifinals record and 1-3 finals record in MWC Tournament play. During the six years the MWC Tournament has been played in Las Vegas (2000-03, 2007-present), BYU has posted an 11-6 tournament record, with four finals appearances and one title (2001). BYU had a 1-3 tournament record during the three years the championship was conducted in Denver (2004-06). Overall, BYU has a 24-22 record in conference tournament games, which includes a 12-13 record in WAC Tournament games. BYU has played every MWC team in the MWC Tournament.

MWC TITLE GOES THROUGH BYU

In eight of the 10 years of the Mountain West Tournament, BYU or the team that has knocked the Cougars out of the tournament won the title, including a championship-game loss last season to host UNLV. The 2006 tournament was the first time that trend did not continue as San Diego State won the title after BYU was knocked out by Utah in the quarterfinals. After losing in the title game to host UNLV at the inaugural MWC Tournament in 2000, BYU won the title in 2001. The next four years the Cougars were knocked out by the eventual champion. BYU was defeated by San Diego State in the 2002 quarterfinals before back-to-back semifinal losses to 2003-champion Colorado State and 2004-champion Utah. In 2005, New Mexico went on to win the title after defeating BYU in the quarterfinals.

10 MWC TOURNAMENTS, SIX DIFFERENT CHAMPIONS

San Diego State became the first team in the MWC to win the Tournament title twice with its victories in 2002 and 2006. UNLV became the second with victories in 2000 and 2007, both over BYU. The Rebels won a third in 2008. New Mexico's win in 2005 marked the sixth Tournament winner in the first six years of the event. The only teams not to win an MWC title are Wyoming, Air Force and TCU, who made its MWC debut in 2005.

BYU SEEDS AT MWC TOURNAMENT

BYU has been the No. 1 seed at the MWC Tournament in each of the past three seasons after winning back-to-back outright MWC titles and a share of the title in 2009. The Cougars are 4-3 as the top seed (finals appearance in 2007 and 2008 and semifinals in 2009). BYU has been the second seed three times (5-2 combined record in 2001, 2003 and 2004, including 2001 title). The 2006 Tournament was the first time that the Cougars have been the No. 3 seed in the MWC Tournament (first-round loss to Utah). The Cougars have also been the fourth seed once (suffering a first-round exit with loss to eventual-champion San Diego State in 2002), the sixth seed once (advanced to the finals in 2000) and the No. 7 seed once (2005 first-round loss to eventual-champion New Mexico).

FRUITS OF THE SEEDS

In the first 10 years of the MWC Tournament, the teams with the No. 2 seed boasts the best mark at 19-5 while the No. 1 seed has gone 15-8. The No. 6 seeds have a combined 10-9 record while their first-round opponent No. 3 seeds have a 6-9 record. No. 4 teams have gone 11-10. Fifth-seeded teams are 4-8. The No. 7 team won for the first time in 2006 and now has a 2-10 record. The No. 8 seed has a 2-2 record in first round games and a 3-9 record overall. The No. 9 seed is 2-2 in the first round game and 2-4 overall. The 2006 tournament marked the first time the No. 7 seed advanced past the quarterfinals and the first time neither the No. 2 nor No. 3 seed advanced to the semifinals. The tournament title has been won by the second seed five times (BYU in 2001, New Mexico in 2005, UNLV in 2007 and 2008 and Utah in 2009); the top seed twice (UNLV in 2000 and San Diego State in 2006); the third seed once (Utah in 2004); the fifth seed once (San Diego State in 2002); and the sixth seed once (Colorado State in 2004).

BYU TOURNAMENT TITLES

BYU won the MWC Tournament title in 2001 over New Mexico. BYU won WAC Tournament titles in 1991 and 1992. The Cougars' Kevin Nixon hit a dramatic three-quarter-court shot at the buzzer to defeat UTEP, 73-71, in Fort Collins, Colo., for the 1992 title. BYU won its first WAC Tournament title in 1991 with an overtime win over Utah. The Cougars also won the postseason conference playoff series in the Rocky Mountain Conference in 1924 (defeated Colorado College, 2-1) and 1933 (defeated Wyoming, 2-1).

AT THE THOMAS & MACK CENTER ...

UNLV, BYU and Utah are the only teams with winning MWC Tournament records at the Thomas & Mack Center. UNLV has reached the championship game every year it has been eligible at the Thomas and Mack. Below are the win totals and records for the nine MWC teams in the five previous tournaments held at the Thomas and Mack Center (note: UNLV was ineligible for tournament play in 2001, and TCU has only played two tournament in Las Vegas) :

MWC TEAMS IN THE NCAA

In the previous nine years of the MWC, eight of the nine conference members have advanced to the NCAA Tournament at least once. TCU is the lone team not to advance, but the Horned Frogs have only been MWC members for four seasons. New Mexico became the last of the other MWC teams to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament by winning the 2005 MWC Tournament. 2008 MWC Tournament Champion UNLV received the league's automatic bid last season while BYU was selected as an at-large team. Utah qualified in 2009 with the automatic bid while BYU received an at-large bid.

BYU AND MWC IN POSTSEASON

BYU has now earned an invite to a postseason tournament in nine of the last 10 years, leading all MWC teams. BYU is tied with Utah in NCAA appearances since the formation of the MWC (BYU has made six NCAA and three NIT while Utah has made six NCAA, one NIT and one CBI). UNLV has received eight invites (three NCAA, five NIT). New Mexico has received six (one NCAA, five NIT) along with San Diego State (two NCAA, four NIT). Air Force has four (two NCAA and two NIT), Wyoming has three (one NCAA, two NIT) while Colorado State has been to one NCAA Tournament.



CUMMARD NAMED NABC ALL-DISTRICT

KANSAS CITY, Mo. [March 5, 2009] — The National Association of Basketball Coaches named BYU senior Lee Cummond to the NABC All-District 17 First Team on Thursday. The honor marks the second-straight season Cummond has earned NABC All-District First Team honors. In all, 240 student-athletes — from 24 districts which were realigned this season — were recognized as the nation's finest men's collegiate basketball players as selected and voted on by members of the NABC. An honorable mention All-American and Mountain West Conference co-Player of the Year in 2008, Cummond leads BYU in scoring (17.1 points per game), blocked shots (26), three-point percentage (.413) and free throw percentage (.845). He is second in rebounding (6.4) and assists (3.2). Cummond, a candidate to repeat as the MWC Player of the Year, has reached double figures in 25 of 29 games this season while scoring 20 or more points on 10 occasions. He has posted season highs of 36 points, 12 rebounds, six assists and four blocks. Cummond is ranked in the top-10 in nine statistical categories in the MWC. Currently ranked 11th all-time in scoring at BYU, Cummond is also sixth in career steals and fourth in made threes. Having played all 127 games in his career Cummond is one game from tying the BYU record for consecutive games played and two from tying the record for career games played. Joining Cummond on the District 17 First Team are Utah's Luke Nevill, UNLV's Wink Adams and Kyle Spain and Lorenzo Wade of San Diego State. The Second Team includes Brandon Ewing of Wyoming, Tony Dandridge and Daniel Faris of New Mexico, Kevin Langford of TCU and Rene Rougeau of UNLV. The all-district honorees are now eligible for the State Farm Coaches' Division I All-America teams to be announced on Saturday, April 4, as part of the 2009 NABC Convention in Detroit.

CUMMARD AND FREDETTE NAMED USBWA ALL-DISTRICT

ST. LOUIS [March 10, 2009] — With a third-straight Mountain West Conference regular season title in the books, BYU's Lee Cummond and Jimmer Fredette were named all-district on Tuesday by the United States Basketball Writers Association. BYU is a member of District VIII, which includes all NCAA Division I institutions from Wyoming, Utah, Idaho, New Mexico, Colorado, Nevada and Montana. Nine regions are represented from coast to coast and a player and coach of the year are selected in each. Cummond, a 6-foot-7 senior guard, is a repeat USBWA all-district honoree. This season the Mesa, Ariz., native has been named first-team all-MWC, first-team all-district by the National Association of Basketball Coaches and fourth-team all-America by FOXSports.com. In leading BYU to its third-straight MWC title, Cummond averages a team-high 17.1 points per game and is second on the team in rebounding (6.3 per game). He also leads the team in free throw shooting (.857) and blocks (27) and is second in assists (3.2). Cummond has posted double figures in 26 games, 20-plus points in 10 games and 30-plus twice. He has tallied season highs of 36 points, 12 rebounds and four blocks. Fredette, a 6-foot-2 sophomore, received first-team all-MWC recognition after averaging 16.0 points (third on the team) and a team-high 4.3 assists per game. The Glens Falls, N.Y., native is second on the team with 43 steals and a .850 free throw percentage. He shoots .488 from the field and .380 from downtown while averaging 3.0 rebounds per game. Fredette has scored in double figures 26 times and posted 20-plus points seven times. He has posted season highs of 28 points, 10 assists and five steals.

CUMMARD NAMED ALL-AMERICAN BY FOXSPORTS.COM

FOXSports.com senior writer Jeff Goodman named BYU senior guard Lee Cummond a four-team All-American. Cummond, who averages 17.1 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.2 assists, is one of only two out of 20 players recognized by Goodman who does not play in one of the six automatic qualifying BCS conferences. The other is Stephen Curry from Davidson, a first-team honoree.

FOUR COUGARS EARN ALL-MWC ACCOLADES

The Mountain West Conference announced its 2008-09 men's basketball awards today. The league's nine men's head coaches, along with a selected media panel, picked the all-conference teams, as well as the coach, player, newcomer, freshman, sixth man and defensive awards. New Mexico head coach Steve Alford captured MWC Coach of the Year honors for the first time, while Utah's Luke Nevill was named both the Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year. Additionally, TCU's Zvonko Buljan garnered Newcomer of the Year accolades, Wyoming's Afam Muojeke was chosen as the Freshman of the Year and Utah's Shaun Green received the Sixth Man of the Year award. BYU's Lee Cummond and Jimmer Fredette earned first-team honors, Jonathan Tavernari made the third team and Jackson Emery was named to the all-defensive team.

BYU'S LAST OUTING — COUGARS ELIMINATED BY SAN DIEGO STATE IN MWC SEMIFINALS

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (March 12, 2009) – In the semifinal match between BYU and San Diego State, the Cougars fell to the Aztecs 64-62 at the Conoco Mountain West Conference Championships on Friday. Jimmer Fredette led the team in scoring, posting 17 points on the night, going 6-for-7 from the free throw line. Lee Cummard had 11 points and four rebounds, playing 40 minutes for the Cougars. Noah Hartssock and James Anderson came off the bench to score seven and six points, respectively. Hartssock added five boards and each posted two blocks apiece. The team posted eight turnovers, six blocks and seven steals, along with 17 bench points and 28 points in the paint. With BYU trailing for much of the first half, Jonathan Tavernari sparked an 8-3 BYU run, with baskets also coming from bench players Hartssock and Charles Abouo. Cummard knotted the score at 25 shooting two from the charity stripe at the 4:54 mark. The Aztecs battled back with back-to-back baskets. Fredette scored the last points of the first half with a three-point play, going into the locker rooms at 28-31. Four minutes after coming out of the locker rooms, the Cougars posted a 9-2 run, knotting the score at 42 at the 12:54 mark on a layup by James Anderson. SDSU regained the lead with a two-point jumper at the 12:21 mark, followed by a three-point shot by Cummard nine seconds later to give the Cougars their first lead since 13-11. The Aztecs regained the lead at the 11:26 mark, only for the Cougars to tie up the score again and to eventually take a three-point on a Fredette trey at 52-49. The Aztecs then posted a 7-0 run and a four-point lead. It was silenced by Miles making 1-of-2 free throws at the 4:45 mark (53-56). With 39.2 seconds left in the game SDSU in-bounded the ball, getting it inside to make an easy layup to put the Aztecs up by three with 25 seconds left. BYU called a timeout with 22 seconds left to regroup, having Fredette throw up a three, getting fouled in the process. With 10.6 seconds left in the game, Fredette went to the foul line, putting both in the bottom of the net to put the Cougars behind by one point. The Aztecs brought the ball in, getting fouled and going to the line to shoot 1-and-1, making both of the foul shots to bring them to 60-62. BYU fouled again on the in-bounds play, with Lorenzo Wade of SDSU making both of his foul shots, putting them up by four points. Cummard drove the length of the court to come out with a two-point basket with 1.6 seconds left in the game. The Aztecs in-bounded the ball, which was stolen by Abouo. He put up a three-point shot, only to have it bounce off the backboard as the buzzer sounded.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...**BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

– “I think it was two really good teams battling to try to get to the Mountain West Conference championship game. Both teams played really hard. Defensively, I think it was a really great game to watch.”
– “Bottom line was we had a lot of chances to win, and San Diego State made a couple more plays and was able to pull out the win.”
– “I think you just have to give them credit. They played really well and were able to beat us at the end.”
– “We played zone most of the night. In the situation with 39 seconds to go, we’d actually talked about what we thought they would do and how we wanted to guard it.”

NOTES FROM BYU'S LAST OUTING**Player Notes**

– Noah Hartssock came off the bench to give BYU a big boost in the first half of the 2009 Conoco Mountain West Conference Championship semifinal against San Diego State, posting seven points, a career high for a first half. Hartssock added four rebounds and a block in the opening period. He added one rebound in the second half.

– Two Cougars scored in double figures against San Diego State with Jimmer Fredette scoring 17 points and Lee Cummard adding 11 points. BYU is 3-1 when two players score in double figures.

– BYU received solid contributions from its post players Chris Miles and James Anderson. Miles had seven points, seven rebounds, three assists and one block while Anderson added six points, two boards and two blocks off the bench.

Team Notes

– Trailing 28-31 at the break against the Aztecs in the MWC semifinals, the Cougars trailed at the half for the seventh-straight game. BYU is 5-2 in those games, losing the first 75-74 at UNLV before winning the next five to secure a third-straight regular season title and then losing to San Diego State.

– BYU is now 12-9 all-time in the MWC tournament, including 4-3 in the semifinals. The Cougars are also 5-3 as the No. 1 seed in the MWC tournament. BYU is 24-22 all-time in conference tournaments. Under Dave Rose BYU is 5-4 in conference tournament play, being eliminated in the quarterfinals in 2006, reaching the final in 2007 and 2008 and reaching the semifinals in 2009.

– Led by four from Chris Miles, the Cougars grabbed 13 offensive rebounds against San Diego State, the fifth time in six games and the 15th time this season BYU has reached double figures in offensive boards.

Record Watch

– Lee Cummard has now played in 130 consecutive games and 130 games for his career, both school records. He broke the all-time record for consecutive games played, previously held by Mark Durrant (128), against Air Force in the quarterfinals and set the record for total games against San Diego State in the semifinals.

– With 11 points against San Diego State on Friday, Lee Cummard now has 539 points this season and 1,552 career points. He needs 16 points to pass Kenneth Roberts (1,567) for ninth place in BYU history.

– With five points against San Diego State on Friday, Jonathan Tavernari has 508 points this season and 1,148 for his career. He is now 27th all-time and three points from passing Elwood Romney.

– With one three against the Aztecs, Jonathan Tavernari now has 82 threes for the season and 199 for his career. He is 15 from passing Mark Bigelow (213) for first all-time at BYU in career threes and seven from breaking his own record for threes in one season (88 in 2007-08).

Game Trends

– BYU vs. San Diego State featured eight ties and nine lead changes with six changes coming in the second half. The Cougars' largest lead came at the 18:03 mark in the first half at 6-2 while the Aztecs held their largest lead of eight at 16:53 remaining in the second half, 38-30. Lee Cummard's three with 12:15 remaining gave BYU it's first lead of the second half at 45-44. After San Diego State went ahead by four, the Cougars came back and tied the score at 49-all on a Chris Miles jumper and then led with a three by Jimmer Fredette at 52-49. The Aztecs responded with a 7-0 run to lead 56-52. BYU took its last three with 2:31 remaining on a Jackson Emery three. Twenty-five seconds later and Lorenzo Wade hit a three to give San Diego State the lead for good.

BYU Team Records

Regular-Season Victories — With a 24-6 regular season record, this year's Cougar team is tied for the second-most wins in regular season play. Last year's team went 25-6 in the regular season to establish the record.

Scoring Margin/Season — With a +12.7 scoring margin, the Cougars are on pace to set the school record for scoring margin in a single season. The 1965-66 team and the 1952-53 teams won their games by an average margin of 12.6.

Steals — Led by 47 steals from Jackson Emery and 46 apiece from Jonathan Tavernari and Jimmer Fredette the 2008-09 edition of the Cougars is on pace to set the school record for steals in a single season with 230 through 32 games. The 1999-2000 team finished with 236 steals, leaving the current team seven shy of tying the school record.

Field Goal Percentage — With a team field goal percentage of .487 through 32 games the Cougars are threatening to crack the top-nine, trailing the 2006-07 team which shot .491.

BYU IN THE RANKINGS

The BYU men's basketball team entered the top-25 rankings for the first time this season on March 9 when the Cougars were voted No. 25 in the AP Top 25. BYU is two spots out in the ESPN/USA Today Poll with 30 votes. No. 25 Illinois received 57 votes and St. Mary's received 43 votes. BYU was last ranked in the AP Top 25 on March 11, 2008 at No. 24. The ESPN/USA Today Poll last ranked BYU on March 10, 2008 at No. 23. This marks the third-straight year BYU has been ranked, the first time the Cougars have been ranked three-straight seasons since 1979-80, 1980-81 and 1981-82. Coach Dave Rose has had BYU ranked in the top-25 in three of his four seasons. In 2006-07 his team finished the season ranked No. 24 and was as high as No. 20 in 2007-08. The Cougar basketball program has now been ranked in the AP Poll during 17 seasons since its first national ranking in 1950-51 (see list below).

BYU AS A RANKED TEAM

BYU owns a 143-58 record as a ranked team. The Cougars are 81-12 at home, 38-29 on the road and 23-17 at neutral sites when nationally ranked. BYU's victory at Portland on Dec. 1, 2007 marked the Cougars' first road win as a ranked team since an 84-63 victory at UTEP on March 4, 1993 when BYU was ranked No. 21. BYU is 16-6 as a ranked team under Dave Rose (1-0 in 2008-09).

COUGARS FINISH SECOND IN TOURNAMENT ACCORDING TO INSIDE HIGHER ED

When it comes to the National Collegiate Athletic Association's Division I men's basketball tournament, everyone is an expert. Nearly every observer, from average fan to seasoned sports commentator, has his or her own tried-and-true method of filling out the 65-team bracket and predicting the national champion. Still, most televised predictions and entries to the average office pool are not even close. After all, it would not be March Madness without an upset or two. Back by popular demand, *Inside Higher Ed* proudly presents its 4th Annual Academic Performance Tournament. As in years past, we have broken down the entire men's tournament bracket and advanced those teams with the better performance in the classroom.

To select the winners, we used the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate – a nationally comparable score that gives points to teams whose athletes stay in good standing academically and stay enrolled from semester to semester. (Last year, the NCAA began using the scores to impose penalties on teams that underperform academically.) In instances where matched-up teams had the same Academic Progress Rate, we broke ties using the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate – which, unlike the federal graduation rate, considers transfers and subtracts athletes who leave college prior to graduation "as long as they would have been academically eligible to compete had they remained."

Often, this method selects some unlikely teams as national champions. For example, the first two years we played out such a tournament, the winners were both from the Patriot League – Bucknell University and the College of Holy Cross. In the actual tournament, Bucknell lost in the second round in 2006, and Holy Cross lost in the first round in 2007. Last year, Davidson College won our Academic Performance Tournament. Though the Wildcats did not win the actual tournament last year, they fared better than any of our past champions. Davidson lost in the Elite Eight, after an unlikely run.

This year, our Academic Performance Tournament has its fair share of upsets. No. 16 East Tennessee St. beats No. 1 Pittsburgh, and No. 15 Morgan St. beats No. 2 Oklahoma in the first round. Both of these Cinderella teams advance to our Sweet 16. At the end of the day, however, only one team can be champion. This year, our winner is actually quite plausible. North Carolina finished ahead of BYU in the title game.

20 WINS IN FIRST FOUR SEASONS

With BYU's home win over New Mexico the Cougars reached the 20-win plateau for the fourth time under head man Dave Rose. Rose is just the third BYU coach to reach 20 wins in each of his first four seasons as he joins G. Ott Romney and Roger Reid as the others. Romney achieved 20 wins in each of his first five seasons from 1928 to 1933. Reid won 20-plus games in each of his first six seasons from 1989 to 1995. Rose is on pace to have the best winning percentage of each of the three through four seasons. Romney had won 66.4 percent of his games (83-42) and Reid 70.8 percent (92-38) through four seasons. Rose has won 74.6 percent of his games (97-33) and has the NCAA Tournament to improve on that mark. This is the 32nd 20-win season in program history.

REGULAR-SEASON BENCHMARKS FOR NCAA INVITES

Winning 20 or more games in the regular season has proven to be a significant indicator for BYU receiving an invitation into the NCAA Tournament. Since the first NCAA Tournament in 1939, BYU has had 22 seasons with 20 regular-season wins, including this year's team. In those 22 years, BYU has earned a postseason invite each season, including 19 NCAA bids, three NIT berths (BYU played both NIT and NCAA in 1950-51) and one NAIB (1948-49) invite. In the modern era since the NCAA Tournament became the predominant championship over the NIT, BYU has had 17 seasons (including the current squad) when it earned 20 or more wins during regular-season games (prior to starting the conference tournament). The Cougars have received an invite to play in the NCAA Tournament in 16 of those seasons, with the lone exception being the 2005-06 team that finished the regular season 20-7 and fell to 20-8 with a loss at the MWC Tournament before receiving an NIT invitation. Including last year, BYU has reached 21 regular-season wins during 13 of those 17 seasons and has been invited to play in the NCAA Tournament in each of those 13 years.

MWC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Lee Cummond (Nov. 17)

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU senior Lee Cummond has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for the third time in his career. A 6-foot-7 guard from Mesa, Ariz., Cummond scored a career-high 36 points to go with 11 rebounds, four assists, two steals and a career-best tying four blocks in BYU's 75-65 victory over Long Beach State Friday in Provo. He shot 13-for-16 (81.3 percent) from the floor, including 3-of-4 from three-point range and 7-for-7 from the charity stripe. Cummond netted 22 of his team's 31 points in the first half on 9-of-11 shooting and kept BYU in the game by scoring 11 of 12 points during one stretch. With BYU trailing 40-33 early in the second half, he scored six straight points and assisted on another bucket to give the Cougars the lead, then went 6-for-6 from the free-throw line in the final six minutes of the contest to put the game away.

Jimmer Fredette (Dec. 15)

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU sophomore Jimmer Fredette and New Mexico junior Roman Martinez have been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Co-Players of the Week. Fredette is a first-time player of the week honoree and is the second Cougar this season to earn the award. Lee Cummond was named player of the week on Nov. 17. A 6-foot-2 guard from Glens Falls, N.Y., Fredette averaged 20.0 points per game while shooting 72.7 percent from the field (16-for-22) in helping BYU to wins against Boise State (94-56) and Portland (91-76). He started the week scoring a career-high 23 points on 10-of-15 shooting, while tying a career-best with four steals vs. Boise State. Against Portland, Fredette scored 17 points (6-for-7 from the field), while also collecting three rebounds, three assists and two steals.

Jimmer Fredette (March 2)

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU sophomore Jimmer Fredette has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for the second time this season. A 6-2 guard from Glens Falls, N.Y., Fredette led the Cougars to wins at San Diego State (69-59) and over Utah (63-50) at home last week. Against SDSU, he scored a game-high 28 points on 10-of-19 shooting, while recording a career-best five steals. Fredette scored 20 of his 28 points in the second half, including a personal 9-0 run to give BYU a 61-55 lead. He then dished out one of his four assists to complete a 15-0 BYU run to put the game away. Fredette also pulled down five rebounds, while hitting all six of his free-throw attempts. Against first-place Utah, Fredette scored a game-best 25 points on 8-of-16 shooting, while dishing out three assists and collecting two steals. On the week, Fredette averaged 26.5 points, 3.5 steals, 3.5 assists and 2.5 rebounds.

HOME WINNING STREAK

BYU's school record and what was previously the nation's longest active home winning streak (53 games) ended on Saturday, Jan. 3, 2009 with a 94-87 loss to No. 6 Wake Forest. The Cougars set the school record with their 67-59 win over Utah in the Marriott Center on Feb. 20, 2008, their 45th straight home win. The Cougars were 16-0 at home last year and won 17 home games the prior season after going 14-1 at home in 2005-06. BYU's last home loss before the streak was in the 2005-06 season opener against Loyola Marymount. BYU won 29-straight over nonconference opponents and 24-consecutive over MWC foes during the streak. BYU is 432-118 (.785) all-time in the Marriott Center, and Cougar head coach Dave Rose is 58-3 (.952).

5-0 STARTS

For the 22nd time in school history BYU men's basketball started the season 5-0. In the 21 previous season during which BYU started at least 5-0 the Cougars won 20-plus games 11 times and finished first or tied for first in conference play eight times. In fact, the last five times BYU has started at least 5-0 the Cougars have won or shared the regular season conference title, including last season's squad that was 27-8 overall and won the conference outright at 14-2. The Cougars were not members of a conference the first five seasons BYU started 5-0. Three of BYU's previous season-opening win streaks of five-plus games have ended with losses to ranked opponents, including No. 1 North Carolina last season, No. 11 Michigan in 1991-92 and No. 2 NC State in 1955-56. BYU's most obscure loss to end a perfect start to a season was to Denver Piggly Wiggly in 1932-33.

The Cougars defeated Utah State at Energy Solutions Arena. The Aggies are the No. 11 seed in the West Region and they play No. 6 seed Marquette. Finally, BYU fell to Arizona State in at the University of Phoenix Stadium. The Sun Devils are the No. 6 seed in the South Region and they play Temple.

HITTING THE OFFENSIVE GLASS

Freshman Noah Hartssock has emerged as a force on the offensive glass in the last several games. In BYU's home win against New Mexico he had three rebounds with two on the offensive end. Then at San Diego State he had a career-best seven boards with four on the offensive glass. In the home win against Utah he went for six boards with three on the offensive glass. In the last eight games he has 13 offensive boards. Chris Miles has also been on a tear on the offensive boards lately. In the last 10 games Miles has pulled down 22 offensive rebounds, including five at Wyoming, three against Utah and four against San Diego State in the MWC tournament.

RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE

BYU fans came out in full force to support the Cougars against Wake Forest. The official attendance was 23,096, just 10 from tying the Marriott Center record for attendance (23,106) set March 7, 1981, against Utah. BYU defeated the Utes 95-76 in that game. The Wake Forest game unseated the previous No. 2 crowd of 23,084 set on Jan. 12, 1980, also against Utah. BYU won that game 89-72. The crowd does mark the largest crowd for a nonconference game. The previous record of 23,042 was set on Nov. 30, 1979, against Illinois, a game the Cougars lost 86-76. BYU sold out the Marriott Center for the Air Force game and had a capacity crowd of 22,700.

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

— Including incoming freshman Charles Abouo, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
 — The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 37 of the past 57 years.
 — In the last five years, BYU has rostered eight international players, including three on this season's team — Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire), Archie Rose (Bahamas) and Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil).
 — Foreign players at BYU have received nine all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen — 1985, Rafael Araujo — 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari — 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic — 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo — 2004).
 — According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
 — BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
 — During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

SIGNING DAY

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2008) — BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose today announced that four players have committed to play for the Cougars by signing national letters of intent. Joining BYU for the 2009-10 season will be 6-foot-4 guard Tyler Haws out of Lone Peak High School and 6-foot-9 forward Brandon Davies out of Provo High School. Big men Nate Austin from Lone Peak and Ian Harward from Orem High School, both 6-foot-10, plan to complete their missionary service before enrolling at BYU. Haws has led Lone Peak to back-to-back 5A state titles under coach Quincy Lewis. Haws averaged 20.9 points, 4.6 rebounds and 3.1 assists per game as a junior while helping Lone Peak to a 23-2 overall record. He was named the 2008 Utah Mr. Basketball and the 2008 Gatorade Utah boys basketball player of the year. An athletic big man and excellent low post scorer, Davies has helped lead Provo High School to back-to-back 4A state titles under Craig Drury. Davies was recently named to the Long Beach Press-Telegram Best in the West Second Team along with Haws. A traditional low post player, Harward will bring size to the Cougar roster following his mission. Harward plays well with his back to the basket and has range out to 15 feet. This summer Harward registered 35 points, 13 rebounds and 10 blocks in a Tri-City Tournament game near Seattle. Austin is a teammate of Haws at Lone Peak High. At the Las Vegas Spring Showcase Austin scored 24 points and grabbed 22 rebounds in a gold bracket quarterfinal game. Austin is known for his work ethic and can step out and shoot the three as well as play on the post.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU Men's Basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a three-year resume that is nearly unmatched. In fact, only eight other coaches have ever won more games in their first three seasons at the Division I level. Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with back-to-back appearances in the top-25 polls

and back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships. Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past two seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as Associate Head Coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in eight of the past nine seasons, including five NCAA bids, while claiming four MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 11 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 25 years of coaching experience, including 13 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels, Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave

and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.
