COUGARS RETURN HOME TO PLAY SOUTHERN ON TUESDAY

At 3-0 after defeating Hawai'i on the road, BYU men's basketball returns to Provo to take on Southern on Tuesday at 7 p.m. Southern is 0-3 on the year and coming off a loss at Utah. The game is the first-ever meeting between the Cougars and Jaguars. Tuesday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. MT on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com.

UP NEXT

The day after Thanksgiving, Friday, Nov. 27, BYU will take on in-state foe Weber State in the Marriott Center at 7:30 p.m. Follow the game on www.byucougars.com and listen live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. MT on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be broadcast live on The Mtn.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

— Jimmer Fredette has opened the 2009-10 season with three-straight 20-point games, including 25 vs. Bradley, 22 vs. Idaho State and 20 at Hawai'i.

— Since Rose took over as head coach of BYU basketball, the Cougars are 63-3 (.955) in the Marriott Center, including a 53-game winning streak from 2005 to 2008 — the longest in school history. With the win over Idaho State, the Cougars have an eight-game home winning streak.

— Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has four-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight postseason appearances. At 100-34 (.746) overall, he reached 100 wins faster than any other coach in BYU history. Roger Reid held the previous record, reaching 100 wins in 143 games.

— BYU has been picked to finish first (23 of 24 first-place votes) in the MWC preseason poll by the league's media. — Senior forward Jonathan Tavemari is on the verge of becoming BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers (208 — six from passing Mark Bigelow) and is climbing the list in points (23rd with 1,191) and steals (8th with 119).

LOOKING AT SOUTHERN

Southern is 0-3 to open the 2009-10 season and coming off an 88-48 loss at Utah on Nov. 21. The Jaguars lost at Baylor (61-45) and Oklahoma State (93-61) to open the season. Jazz Williams leads the team in scoring at 12.7 points per game and scored a season-high 21 points against the Utes. Earnest Jones is second on the team in scoring at 8.0 ppg and first in rebounding at 5.0 rpg. Tony McGilveary is third in scoring at 7.3 ppg and leads in three-point shooting at 41.7 percent from downtown. Nick Walls adds 7.0 ppg and leads with 3.3 assists per game. Southern averages 51.3 points per game as a team and shoots 30.3 percent from the field as a team. Rob Spivery is Southern's head coach and is 48-79 in his fifth season.

SOUTHERN'S LAST OUTING — UTAH UTES ROUT JAGS, 88-48

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) - Utah's Marshall Henderson scored 13 and Jordan Cyphers added 12 as Utah got off to a quick start and cruised to an 88-48 win over Southern University Saturday night. By halftime, Jordan Cyphers scored three 3-pointers in matching his career-high with 12 points and Utah led 52-17. Most of Utah starters played sparingly in the second half. Jazz Williams scored 21 points and Earnest Jones had 15 for Southern (0-3), which was out-rebounded by the taller Utes 53-27. Henderson's two free throws gave Utah a 27-6 lead midway through the first half. The lead grew to 50 points at 81-31 when Shawn Glover made a shot in the lane with 8:49 to play in the game. Southern missed their first 12 attempts from the field. Jameel Grace finally made a layup with 11:14 left in the first half, the Jaguars' only 2-point basket of the half.

BYU'S LAST OUTING — ROSE FASTEST TO 100 WINS

HONOLULU, Hawaii (Nov. 20, 2009) - BYU head coach Dave Rose became the fastest coach in program history to 100 wins, leading the Cougars to an 83-65 win over the Hawai'i Rainbow Warriors on Friday. Rose is now 100-34 (.746) overall in four-plus seasons as BYU's head coach. Roger Reid previously held the record as the fastest Cougar coach to 100 wins, achieving the mark in 143 games. "We wanted to play this game early in the season because we knew it would be a good test to see how we would respond on the road," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "The way you win championships is by winning on the road." Jimmer Fredette scored at least 20 points for the third-straight game, finishing with 20 points (9-of-14), a season-high eight assists, two steals and a block. Jonathan Tavernari rebounded from a slow start to the season, adding 17 points, five rebounds and two steals. "It was a struggle to find my rhythm," Tavernari said. "I had a better rhythm and was wide open. I give all the credit in the world to my teammates. Their penetration created shots for me." BYU (3-0) blew the game open with a hot start coming out of halftime, turning a ten-point lead into 18 points in less than five minutes. The Cougars quickly went on a 13-0 run, jumping out to a lead from which the Rainbow Warriors could never recover. The Cougar bench provided a spark, scoring 23 points as a unit including 19 in the first half. Freshman Brandon Davies scored six while Michael Loyd, Jr., hit a pair of treys. Noah Hartssock again capitalized on the minutes given to him, grabbing seven rebounds to go with five points, a steal and a blocked shot. "You play 26 minutes and get seven rebounds, you're doing a really good job for your team," Rose said of his sophomore forward. The Cougars shot 56 percent from the field as a team while keeping control of the ball with a season-low ten turnovers. On the defensive end, BYU forced Hawai'i (2-2) into 20 giveaways, turning the turnovers into 32 points. Dwain Williams, Hawai'i's leading scorer averaging 17.7 ppg, was held scoreless by the Cougars, shooting 0-of-5 from the field.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...**BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

— "We wanted to play this game early in the season because we knew it would be a good test to see how we would respond on the road. The way you win championships is by winning on the road."
— "I thought we did a really good job tonight defending the first shot. We did a great job of making them take tough shots. When you hold a team to 39.6 percent from the floor at their place, you have a chance to win."
— "The thing that will be the real test is for guys to keep coming with their best efforts off the bench. Everyone wants to play and as a coach you want to play everyone, but sometimes it doesn't work out. If guys continue to step up and respond, this team will be really good. I like the makeup of this group."

BYU NOTES FROM LAST OUTING**Player Notes**

— Tyler Haws earned the first start of his career, replacing Charles Abouo who started the first two games of the season.
— Davies, fouled on the Cougars' third basket of the game, was hit in the face while converting the field goal. Noah Hartssock, came off the bench to convert the three-point play.
— Jimmer Fredette assisted on 4 of BYU's first 5 baskets. He had six assists and no turnovers at halftime and finished with a season-best 8 dimes.
— Four Cougars scored in double figures: Jimmer Fredette (20), Jonathan Tavernari (17), Tyler Haws (12) and Jackson Emery (11).
— Jimmer Fredette has now scored 20+ points every game this season: 25 vs. Bradley, 23 vs. Idaho State, and 20 vs. Hawaii.
— Jonathan Tavernari had his best shooting game of the season, scoring 17 points on 7-of-14 shooting, including 3-of-7 from downtown.
— Brock Zylstra scored the first points of his collegiate career, hitting one field goal in just one minute of play. Every Cougar on the roster has now scored at least two points this season.

Team Notes

— BYU held Hawai'i's leading scorer, Dwain Williams, was held to zero points. Williams previously averaged 17.7 ppg coming into the game.
— BYU's bench scored 7 of the Cougars' first 12 points of the game. Out of the Cougars' first 32 points, 19 came from players off the bench while 13 were off of turnovers.
— BYU's 19 first-half bench came from Davies (6), Loyd, Jr. (6), Hartssock (3), Abouo (2) and Morgan, Jr. (2).
— BYU went on streaks of perfection multiple times in the first half, hitting four straight field goals at one point, then nailing five straight field goals later in the half.
— The Cougars shot 54.5 percent from the field in the 1st half, the best mark in a half for BYU this season best.
— BYU forced Hawai'i into a season-high 20 turnovers. The Cougars had 10 turnovers.
— With the win, BYU has now started the last three seasons with 3-0 records.
— The Cougars totaled 11 steals, a new season-high. Seven players had at least one, led by Jackson Emery with 3 thefts.

Record Watch

— Jonathan Tavernari's 17 points pushed the senior forward past Joe Richey into 23rd place on BYU's all-time scoring leaders with 1,191 points. Tavernari needs just five points to jump another spot and supplant Eldon Brinley for 22nd on the list.
— Tavernari also had two steals, giving him 119 for his career and sending him past Randy Reid's 118 for 8th on the Cougar career list. Tavernari is now five steals away from tying Matt Montague's career mark of 124.
— With seven more 3-point attempts, Tavernari is now three attempts behind all-time leader Mark Bigelow, 559-556.
— Tavernari's three successful three-pointers put him at 208 for his career, six away from passing Mark Bigelow for the school record.
— Dave Rose earned the 100th victory of his career as BYU's head coach, improving to 100-34 (.746) overall. He reached the 100-win plateau faster than any coach in BYU history. Roger Reid previously held the record, achieving the mark in 143 games.

Game Trends

— BYU's first three baskets were by freshmen. Haws scored the first while Davies converted the next two.
— Coach Rose went deep to his bench quickly, as 10 players saw playing time for BYU in the first 8 minutes of the game. A total of 11 players entered the game in the first half.
— BYU blew open the game in the first five minutes of the game, forcing turnovers to help spur a 13-0 run.

COUGARS HONORED FOR ACADEMIC SUCCESS

In April 2009, BYU men's basketball was among the teams the NCAA honored for earning multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports. The NCAA's APR calculation includes eligibility, retention and graduation to provide a clear picture of the academic culture of each sport. This marks the third-straight year the men's basketball team has received public recognition from the NCAA while women's volleyball is receiving recognition for a second-consecutive year. BYU is the only school in the state to have teams receive APR recognition in 2008-09. In NCAA Division I men's basketball 36 teams qualified for public recognition out of 342 programs. BYU is one of only 10 teams in the country that received high academic achievement honors and also qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Other NCAA Tournament teams that received APR recognition include Dayton, Duke, Illinois, Kansas, Michigan State, North Carolina, Texas, Villanova and VCU. San Diego State was the only other men's basketball team in the Mountain West Conference to earn recognition in 2009.

HOME OPENERS

BYU is 84-24 (.778) all-time in home openers, including a 28-11 (.718) mark in the Marriott Center. The Cougars won their home opener in 2008-09, 75-65 over Long Beach State, and this season BYU defeated Bradley 70-60 in their home opener behind 25 points from Jimmer Fredette.

ROAD SUCCESS

In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU is 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU's 83-65 win at Hawai'i got the Cougars off to a 1-0 start in road games this season.

"Tonight, BYU was the team that their fans are used to seeing. They made difficult shots. They went 11-for-22 from 3-point range, made their free throws and they run like crazy."

"When they had to make a free throw, they made it. When they had to make a play, they made it. When you deliver like that, you win. They did, and they did ... They were opportunistic. Every time we had a ball that looked like we were going to get that we didn't get, they made us pay for it. That's what good teams do. All that being said, we fought back."

He also owns the single-season record for consecutive games with a made three (22) set in 2008-09.

7 BYU's block total in its 87-53 win over Idaho State. It is two off last season's high of nine against Boise State and matches the second highest total from 2008-09 which came against Air Force in the MWC Tournament. Freshman Tyler Haws and sophomore Noah Hartssock came off the bench to register two apiece and Charles Abouo, Chris Miles and Brandon Davies joined the block party as each tallied one.

12 The number of consecutive free throws made by Jimmer Fredette against Bradley in the season opener. After missing his first two attempts, Fredette drained 12 straight as part of his game-high 25 points. He extended the streak to 13 against Idaho State before missing. Fredette hit his last five attempts against the Bengals. His best streak came in 2008-09 when he made 19-straight. He hit 6-of-6 at Wyoming, 4-of-4 in the season finale against Air Force, 7-of-7 vs. the Falcons in the MWC quarterfinals and then hit two vs. San Diego State in the MWC semis before finally missing. Fredette is shooting 87.0 percent from the charity stripe this season.

TEAM/PLAYER NOTEBOOK

— At 12-4 in the MWC in 2008-09, BYU shared the regular season title with Utah and New Mexico and became the first team to win three-straight league titles after winning the championship outright in 2007 and 2008. The titles mark the first stretch of three-straight titles for the Cougars since 1932-34. BYU is tied for seventh among all NCAA Division I programs for most regular-season titles won or shared with 28. BYU's 99 MWC wins in the nine-year history of the league leads all MWC teams.

— BYU won its first six home games in 2008-09 to extend its program record home winning streak to 53 games. The streak ended on Jan. 3, 2009 with a 94-87 loss to then-No. 6 Wake Forest. BYU finished 14-2 at home and is 434-118 (.786) all-time in the Marriott Center. Cougar head coach Dave Rose is 63-3 (.955) all-time in the Marriott Center. BYU is on an eight-game home win streak.

— Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari is BYU's 23rd all-time leading scorer with 1,191 points. He joined the 1,000-point club on Feb. 3, 2009 when he scored 17 points at Air Force. He climbed to 25th by the end of the 2008-09 season and has a chance to crack the top-10 with another strong season. With 208 threes Tavernari is six from passing Mark Bigelow for first in school history.

— Junior guard Jimmer Fredette earned first-team All-MWC honors in 2008-09 and was the only sophomore to receive first, second or third-team honors. He also became BYU's first point guard to earn all-conference honors since Marty Haws in 1990. Fredette has 847 career points and will become BYU's 40th member of the 1,000-point club if he maintains his scoring pace from 2008-09. He is also the owner of a .851 career free throw shooting percentage, currently second all-time on BYU's career list.

Jimmer Fredette scored 20 points at Hawai'i on Nov. 20, his third-straight 20-plus point effort to start the season — he had 25 in the opener against Bradley and 23 at home against Idaho State — and the 11th 20-point game of his career. BYU is 9-2 when Fredette scores 20 or more and has won the last eight games in which he has reached the 20-point mark. With three-straight 20-point games to start 2009-10, he has matched his longest streak for consecutive games with 20 or more points. The first streak came last season when he had 21 at Utah (Jan. 27, 2009), 28 at home against Wyoming (Jan. 31) and 20 at Air Force (Feb. 3).

COUGARS VOLUNTEER FOR CHILDREN WITH CANCER CHRISTMAS FOUNDATION

In what has become an annual tradition, the BYU men's basketball team has joined the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation in an effort to raise money for families who have children with cancer and participate in the Foundation's annual Christmas party for those families. This marks the 11th year the team has participated with the organization. BYU head coach Dave Rose is in his fifth year as the honorary chairman and his wife Cheryl, serves as the vice chair for the Foundation. The cause became even more personal for the family as Dave Rose was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in June 2009. He is now cancer free, excited to coach the Cougars and dedicated to helping those families that have children with cancer. "We were so blessed by the support we received when Dave was diagnosed with cancer," Cheryl Rose said. "It gave us a new perspective on life and on what this foundation means to us. It's an incredible opportunity to serve and to learn from these amazing families. I am touched by every donation and show of support. There is a wonderful spirit of service in this community." FIRST CAREER START

Through three games he is averaging 8.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists while shooting .444 from the field and .818 from the free throw line. Haws has increased his scoring total in each game with four vs. Bradley, nine vs. Idaho State and 12 at Hawai'i.

FREDETTE NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (NOV. 16)

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (Nov. 16, 2009) – BYU junior Jimmer Fredette has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for games through November 15. This is the third weekly accolade of his career. A 6-2 guard from Glen Falls, N.Y., Fredette led the Cougars to a season-opening win over Bradley (70-60) last Friday, Nov. 13. He scored a game-high 25 points on 6-of-14 shooting, while also recording five rebounds and four assists in 37 minutes. Fredette scored 16 of his 25 points in the second half, while also dishing out three assists. He also went 12-of-14 from the charity stripe in the second half, including hitting his last 12 attempts, six of which came in the final five minutes of the contest. Fredette has 805 career points and earned first-team all-MWC honors in 2008-09. He averaged 16.2 points and 4.1 assists while shooting .382 from downtown and .847 from the free throw line. Fredette was voted the MWC Preseason Player of the Year by the media for the 2009-10 season.

ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) – BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons. In his four seasons at the helm, Rose has helped BYU establish one of the best home court advantages in the nation. After dropping his first home game as a head coach, Rose led the Cougars to a school record 53-game winning streak in the Marriott Center. His overall home record stands at 61-3 (.953) and includes two undefeated seasons – 16-0 in 2007-08 and 17-0 in 2006-07.

ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6-foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the three-time defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. As a sophomore Collinsworth averaged 14.7 points, 3.0 assists and 4.8 rebounds and earned first-team all-state honors from the Deseret News and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points. A 6-foot-9 forward with the skills to play at both the small and power forward positions, Chris Collinsworth helped lead BYU to 27-8 record and an outright regular season MWC title while averaging 3.2 points and 4.8 rebounds and chipping in 14 blocks, 19 assists and nine steals. He led the Cougars in rebounding seven times while posting double-digit boards on three occasions. Martineau, a 5-11 point guard out of Fruit Heights, Utah, played in 20 games as a true freshman. He averaged 5.8 minutes per game and totaled 13 points, 14 assists and eight rebounds. Martineau posted career highs of six points and four assists against Loyola Marymount.

EMERY AND MORGAN NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 20, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced Tuesday that senior Lamont Morgan, Jr., and junior Jackson Emery have been named captains for this year's team. "Jackson and Lamont are team players," Rose said. "They are proven leaders and have the respect of their teammates. They are willing to do whatever it takes to make this team better. Their teammates voted them as captains and I couldn't ask for better leaders." Morgan enters his third year in the program after redshirting in 2007-08 and playing a key role off the bench last season. The 5-foot-10 senior guard averaged 3.6 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists while shooting .461 from the field and .412 from downtown. In his first season back from a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Mexico, Emery started 32 of 33 games while posting averages of 7.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists. He was third on the team with 47 steals and shot .480 from the field, .377 from downtown and .738 from the free throw line. Known for his hustle and defensive play, Emery earned a spot on the 2009 MWC All-Defensive Team.

HOME OPENER ATTENDANCE MARKS

The 16,276 on hand to witness BYU's 70-60 season-opening win over Bradley in the Marriott Center was the largest crowd for a home opener since 1994-95 when there were 17,654 in the stands for BYU's 96-80 win over Nevada. The attendance for home openers has increased each year since 2006-07, when 8,854 were on hand to see BYU outlast Idaho State 84-78 in overtime. In 2007-08 the Cougars got the best of Idaho State again, winning 90-69 with 12,153 in the Marriott Center. Last season 15,753 seats were full as BYU defeated Long Beach State 75-65 in the season/home opener.

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire) gained valuable experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA Afrobasket Tournament.

FIRST HALF DEFENSE

BYU is averaging a 12.0 point lead at the half thanks to its defense. Cougar opponents are shooting just 34.2 percent from the field in the first half of games, including 27.3 percent by Bradley and 26.7 percent by Idaho State. Last season BYU held just two opponents to sub-30.0 percent shooting in the first half — at home against North Florida (20.0 percent) on Nov. 20, 2008 and at home against UNLV (29.6 percent) on Feb. 21, 2009.

SECOND HALF SHOOTING

BYU hit 57.1 percent from the field in the second half at Hawai'i, its best half of shooting this season. It was also the second-straight game with 50-plus percent shooting in the second half. The Cougars have hit 50.6 percent of their shots in the second halves of games this season.

NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

PROVO, Utah (July 16, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2009-10 nonconference schedule Thursday, which features matchups with Arizona, Arizona State and Utah State as well as a trip to the Las Vegas Classic. The 16-game nonconference slate includes teams from nine different conferences and nine teams that qualified for postseason play in 2009. The Mountain West Conference schedule will be announced at a later date. On Nov. 17 BYU will host Idaho State, a team the Cougars have defeated in five-straight contests including 85-65 in 2008. Three days later BYU will head to the Aloha State to play Western Athletic Conference member Hawai'i. The two teams last played in 1999, the Cougars' final season as members of the WAC. After the Hawai'i game the blue and white will host Southern University (Nov. 24) and Weber State (Nov. 27). BYU will look to protect its unbeaten home record (17-0) against the Wildcats. The Cougars will open the month of December with in-state rival Utah State. BYU owns a 135-90 record against the Aggies but has lost four-straight in Logan. The game is scheduled for Dec. 2. On Dec. 5 the Cougars will play at Energy Solutions Arena for the fifth time since 2003 when they host San Francisco. BYU defeated Utah State 68-63 in 2008 at Energy Solutions where the Cougars are 2-2 all-time. BYU will remain in Utah and host Arizona State on Dec. 8 at the Marriott Center. The Cougars will be looking to avenge last season's one-point loss at the Stadium Shootout at the University of Phoenix Stadium. BYU will head to southern California to take on Fresno State at the Galen Center in Los Angeles on Dec. 12. Former Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland is at the helm of the Bulldog program. BYU returns to the Marriott Center following the neutral tilt at the Galen Center to host Wagner (Dec. 17) and Eastern Washington (Dec. 19) for its first two games of the Las Vegas Classic. The final two games of the Classic will be at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on Dec. 22 and 23. Nebraska, Nevada and Tulsa will also compete in the Classic. Matchups will be announced at a later date. BYU's last game of the 2009 calendar year will be at Arizona on Dec. 28. The Cougars and Wildcats were conference rivals in the 1960s and 70s when both teams were members of the WAC. The final home nonconference game will be against Eastern New Mexico on Jan. 2 and the nonconference schedule will conclude at UTEP on Jan. 9.

DEFENSE LEADS TO OFFENSE

BYU has taken advantage of its opponents miscues through three games by converting them into points. The Cougars have converted their opponents' 51 turnovers into 72 points, including 32 points off 20 turnovers at Hawai'i. BYU is averaging 1.4 points per opponent turnover this season.

IMPROVED DEPTH

BYU's bench has scored at least 21 points in all three games this season with 21 against Bradley, 30 vs. Idaho State and 23 at Hawai'i. Last season the BYU bench scored 20-plus points just eight times all season.

KEEPING IT CLOSE

BYU has trailed a total of 9:47 out of a possible 120 minutes of action so far this season. The Cougars trailed Bradley 2-0 for 2:01 before taking a 3-2 lead on a Jackson Emery three and never trailed the rest of the way. Idaho State led for a total of 6:12 but never led by more than three points. BYU trailed Hawai'i for a total of 1:34. The Cougars' largest deficit was three against Idaho State.

IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (214).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (99).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

PRESEASON MWC POLL

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavernari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the pre-season squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring (16.2 ppg) and assists (135) for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavernari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder (7.2 rpg) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring (6th/15.7 ppg) and 3-point percentage (8th/.381) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining first-place vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU (82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force (25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior Tre'Von Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the

national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 12 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 26 years of coaching experience—including 14 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college and high school levels—Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

Dave Rice joined the BYU coaching staff as an assistant in May 2005 and was promoted to Associate Head Coach in April 2008. Rice has 18 years of coaching experience, including 16 seasons at the Division I level at BYU, UNLV and Utah State. As a player, Rice was a member of UNLV's 1989-90 National Championship and 1990-91 Final Four teams that won a school-record 45 consecutive games. During his time as both a player and a coach, he has played with or helped guide 13 players who went on to play in the National Basketball Association, eight of whom were drafted in the first round, including six lottery picks.

An excellent recruiter and on-the-floor coach, Rice coordinates the teams offense and recruiting efforts. In his four seasons coordinating the Cougar offense, BYU has generated the Mountain West Conferences top attack three years and ranked second once. This past season the Cougars ranked among the top 20 nationally in numerous offensive categories, including scoring margin (9th, 11.9), field goal percentage (8th, 48.4), assists per game (16th, 16.3) and assist to turnover ratio (7th, 1.43). In 2007-08 BYU ranked 21st in assists per game (16.8) and 22nd in scoring margin (+10.5) while also setting a school record for assist-to-field goal ratio at 64.8 percent. In 2006-07, the Cougars ranked among the top 30 in the nation in three-point field-goal percentage (5th, .415), scoring (24th, 78.1 ppg) and scoring margin (25th, +9.0). In his first season at BYU, Rice helped the Cougars become the nations second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record.

Rice has helped BYU earn four straight 20-win seasons and a 97-34 overall record while recording back-to-back outright Mountain West Conference Championships in 2007 and 2008 and sharing the title in 2009 the programs first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. The Cougars have also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time BYU was ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982.

Rice came to BYU from Utah State University where he helped Coach Stew Morrill and the Aggies earn a 24-8 record, Big West Conference Tournament title and an NCAA Tournament bid in 2004-05. In his one season at Utah State, Rices coaching duties included working with the offense and coaching the guards. In 2004-05, the Aggies led the nation in field-goal percentage (school-record .525) and ranked fourth nationally in scoring margin (+14.6), 10th in assists (17.2) and 20th in three-point field goal percentage (.391).

Rice spent 11 seasons as an assistant coach at UNLV, which is the second-longest tenure ever for an assistant in that program. While in Las Vegas, Rice worked under four head coaches including Jerry Tarkanian, Tim Grgurich, Bill Bayno and Charlie Spoonhour. In his last eight seasons at UNLV, the Runnin Rebels received seven postseason invitations and averaged 20 wins per year.

In addition to his Division I experience, Rice served as an assistant coach for one season at Chaffey (Calif.) College in 1994, helping the Panthers to a 32-6 record and an appearance in the California State Final Four. He also spent one season at Claremont (Calif.) High School, where he was an assistant coach under his father Lowell, a long-time high school coach. That team went 21-7, winning the Baseline League Championship and reaching the CIF quarterfinals. Rice earned his bachelors degree in political science from UNLV in 1991 and his MBA in 1993. He was also a two-time UNLV Scholar-Athlete of the Year and a Rhodes Scholar candidate.

Prior to playing at UNLV, Rice began his college career at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, Calif., where he earned All-South Coast Conference honors as a sophomore and was chosen from among more than 13,000 student-athletes as the 1989 California Junior College Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He graduated from Claremont High School. A native of Claremont, Calif., Rice and his wife Mindy have two sons, Travis and Dylan.

Boasting a 20-year, championship-filled coaching resume, John Wardenburg has been a key part of BYUs success since first coming to Provo in 2001.

Wardenburg joined the Cougar coaching staff as an assistant coach in May 2001 under former BYU coach Steve Cleveland before serving the past four seasons with current Cougar head coach Dave Rose. Wardenburg and Rose have a long coaching history together. Wardenburg served as an assistant to Rose at Dixie State College and before joining Rose as an assistant on Cleavelands staff at BYU.

On Roses staff the past four seasons, Wardenburg has helped the Cougars earn four-straight 20 wins seasons and a 97-34 overall record while recording back-to-back outright Mountain West Conference Championships in 2007 and 2008 and sharing the title in 2009 the programs first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. BYU has also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time the Cougars were ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982 and the previous Cougar team to be ranked was in 1993. During their first season with Rose at the helm in 2005-06, BYU became the nations second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record.

Wardenburg's primary responsibilities on the staff have included defensive skill development, game film preparation, defensive game plan preparation, summer basketball camp director and recruiting. His efforts on the defensive end helped the Cougars finish the 2008-09 season ranked first in the MWC and 11th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage defense. BYU was also second in the league in steals and rebounding margin. In 2007-08 the Cougars were the 11th-ranked team in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, holding opponents to a combined 38.9 percent on the year. In addition to field-goal percentage defense in 2007-08, the Cougars were also the MWC's top team in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.300) and had the largest margin on the boards, grabbing 4.3 more rebounds per game than their opponents.

Prior to coming to BYU, Wardenburg had 13 years of coaching experience at the high school and junior college levels. He compiled a 105-62 record in seven years as a head coach at Payson High School (1988-93) and Pine View High School (1999-01) while guiding his teams to five league titles and seven state tournament berths. In those seven years, his teams earned three fifth-place state tournament finishes, one third-place finish and a 3A Utah State Championship with his 2001 Pine View team.

After Wardenburg's Payson teams claimed three league titles and posted a 76-43 overall record, he served as an assistant coach from 1993-97 at Dixie State College under current BYU head coach Dave Rose and helped the Rebels to a 95-31 record and a national ranking as high as No. 2. Wardenburg left coaching for two years to serve as Dixies Director of Athletics. He returned to coaching as the head coach at Pine View High School in St. George where he recorded two highly successful seasons before joining BYUs staff in 2001.

Wardenburg's Pine View teams won the league title both seasons he was the coach while achieving a 29-19 record. Wardenburg earned 3A Coach of the Year honors in 2000 after coaching his team to a third-place state finish and was named Championship Coach of the Year in 2001 after guiding his team to the state title.

Born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Wardenburg was a multi-sport athlete at Kiel High School in Kiel, Wis. He served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to The Netherlands from 1977-79 and earned a BA in political science from BYU in 1986 and an MA in health, physical education and recreation from Utah State in 1992.

Wardenburg and his wife, Pam, have four sons, Scott (Laura), Jonathan (Natalie), Adam and Barrett, and two granddaughters.

A former BYU point guard, Terry Nashif was hired as an assistant coach in June 2007 after serving two seasons on Dave Rose's staff as the Cougars' Director of Basketball Operations from 2005-07.

In his first season as an assistant coach, Nashif helped the Cougars achieve the second most wins in school history with a 27-8 record and become the only team in Mountain West Conference history to win two outright league titles. The 2007-08 Cougars won their second-straight outright regular-season MWC Championship with a 14-2. In Nashif's second season as an assistant BYU went 25-8 and earned a third-straight league title at 12-4 — the program's first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. BYU has also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time the Cougars were ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982 and the previous Cougar team to be ranked was in 1993.

In his four years overall on Rose's staff, Nashif has been a part of four straight 20-win seasons and a 97-34 overall record. Nashif's efforts in 2008-09 assisting with game film and defensive game plan preparation helped the Cougars finish ranked first in the MWC and 11th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage defense. BYU was also second in the league in steals and rebounding margin. In 2007-08 the Cougars were 11th in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, holding opponents to a combined 38.9 percent on the year. In addition to field-goal percentage defense in 2007-08, the Cougars were also the MWC's top team in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.300) and had the largest margin on the boards, grabbing 4.3 more rebounds per game than their opponents.

A native of Vancouver, Wash., Nashif first came to BYU in 2001 as a walk-on point guard and eventually earned a scholarship. A smart floor leader, Nashif appeared in 103 games for the Cougars, including 14 starts, as a member of two NCAA Tournament teams. As a sophomore in 2002-03, Nashif helped the Cougars claim a share of the Mountain West Conference regular-season title by ranking first among MWC players in assist/turnover ratio during league games. That season he played in every game, including six starts, and led BYU in assists (3.0) while averaging 2.2 points, his highest scoring average of his four-year career. He posted a career-high 11 points on 3-for-3 three-point shooting in 30 minutes at San Diego State and had one of the best games of his career against UNLV, tallying seven assists, four rebounds and two blocks while matching up against future NBA first-round draft pick Marcus Banks.
