### COUGARS TO HOST ARIZONA STATE

BYU men's basketball (6-1) will host Arizona State — the team that gave the Cougars their first loss in 2008-09 — Tuesday in the Marriott Center at 8 p.m. Playing at University of Phoenix Stadium last season, BYU hit a potential game winner at the buzzer that was called good on the court but later overturned after a review by the officials. Tuesday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 7 p.m. MT on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

### UP NEXT

The Cougars will head west to play former BYU head coach Steve Cleveland and Fresno State on Saturday, Dec. 12 at 7 p.m. Listen to the game live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 7 p.m. MT on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

### COUGAR QUICK HITS

— With 13 points vs. San Francisco, Jimmer Fredette has scored in double figures in 21-straight games, the longest such streak since Travis Hansen scored in double figures in 21-straight games during the 2002-03 season. He was also 4-of-4 from the line against the Dons, extending his streak of consecutive makes to 27.

— Since Rose took over as head coach of BYU basketball, the Cougars are 65-3 (.956) in the Marriott Center, including a 53-game winning streak from 2005 to 2008 — the longest in school history. With the win over Weber State, the Cougars have a 10-game home winning streak.

— Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has four-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight postseason appearances. At 103-35 (.746) overall, he reached 100 wins faster than any other coach in BYU history. Roger Reid held the previous record, reaching 100 wins in 143 games.

— BYU has been picked to finish first (23 of 24 first-place votes) in the MWC preseason poll by the league's media.

— Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers with two treys vs. San Francisco to give him 214, one ahead of Mark Bigelow. He is also climbing the lists for points (20th with 1,233) and steals (17th with 124).

**LOOKING AT ARIZONA STATE**

Arizona State is 6-2 on the season and is coming off a home loss to Baylor, 64-61. The Sun Devils started the season with four straight wins, all at home, before losing to Duke in the NIT Season Tip-Off in New York. They rebounded with a win over LSU in the NIT consolation game and then defeated Arkansas-Pine Bluff at home before the Baylor loss. Arizona State is 5-1 in home games and 1-1 in neutral games. The Sun Devils have yet to play a true road game this season. Rihards Kuksiks leads Arizona State in scoring at 12.3 points per game and is shooting .396 from downtown with 21 makes. Derek Glasser averages 11.5 points and leads the team with 5.3 assists per game. Eric Boateng is the third scorer in double figures, also at 11.5 per game, and leads the team in rebounding (6.6 per game) and shooting percentage (.700). Trent Lockett averages 9.5 points per game and 5.4 rebounds per contest. As a team Arizona State averages 73.2 points and shoots .510 from the field while their opponents average 56.0 points and shoot .385 from the field. Herb Sendek is in his fourth season as the head coach at Arizona State. He has a 60-47 record with the Sun Devils.

**ARIZONA STATE'S LAST OUTING — ARIZONA STATE FALLS LATE TO BAYLOR, 64-61**

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP)—Tweety Carter tied a season high with 27 points, including two free throws with 14.3 seconds remaining, and LaceDarius Dunn made an uncontested layup with five seconds left as Baylor beat Arizona State 64-61 to continue the Big 12's unbeaten run in the Big12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series. Carter made 7 of 9 3-pointers after hitting all six of his 3-point attempts while scoring 27 points in his last game, a 69-64 victory over Xavier on Nov. 29. Carter made 3-point field goals on four of five Baylor possessions to key a 13-0 run that gave the Bears (7-1) a 52-47 lead with 5:21 remaining. Rihards Kuksiks, who led Arizona State (6-2) with 16 points, scored 11 straight Sun Devil points, tying the game at 58 on a 3-pointer with 1:24 remaining. Kuksiks made one of his first 12 field goal attempts before hitting his last four.

**SERIES NOTES**

Tuesday's game will be the 49th meeting between BYU and Arizona State with the Cougars owning a 26-22 advantage in the series. Arizona State won last season at University of Phoenix Stadium 76-75. Charles Abouo hit a shot at the buzzer for BYU that was called good by the officials. The play was reviewed and the call overturned, giving the win to the Sun Devils. The Cougars had won the previous two meetings and four of five between the schools before last season's setback. BYU is 20-4 all-time vs. Arizona State in Provo, including 11-3 in the Marriott Center.

**LAST YEAR VS. ARIZONA STATE — COUGARS FALL TO ARIZONA STATE**

GLENDALE, Ariz. (Dec. 20, 2008) - The BYU men's basketball team (10-1) suffered its first loss of the season Saturday losing a nail-biter to No. 20/17 Arizona State (9-1) 76-75 Saturday. Charles Abouo's tip as time expired was initially counted and would have given the Cougars the win but after reviewing the play the officials waved it off. The Cougars led the Sun Devils the entire second half until Charles was called for a foul on Arizona State's James Harden with nine seconds remaining. Harden hit the second foul shot to give the Sun Devils a one-point lead at 76-75. Three Cougars scored in double figures including Jonathan Tavernari leading the Cougars with 24, Jimmer Fredette with 16 and Lee Cumcard with 13. Senior Lee Cumcard played in his hometown for the first time since his senior year of high school, posting 13 points, six rebounds and six assists on the afternoon. The Cougars came out strong with Cumcard and Emery leading BYU to a 9-2 lead. The Sun Devils stole away the Cougar lead at the 12:17 mark, just one point ahead of BYU. Arizona State led BYU for over 11 minutes in the first half. The Cougars took the lead back late in the first half with 53 seconds left on the clock. With a steal from Fredette and back-to-back three pointers from Tavernari, the Cougars led the Sun Devils going into the locker room 41-36. The Cougars kept the lead until the 2:07 mark in the second half when Arizona State tied the score 73-73, and at 75-75 at the 1:00 mark. With 33.7 seconds left in the game, a timeout was called, ASU keeping the ball for 24 seconds, stopping the clock with until a personal foul called on the Cougars. Harden of ASU made his second free throw, putting the Sun Devils up 76-75. Harden led Arizona State with 30 points on the afternoon, including the last point to win it for the Sun Devils.

**WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...**

**BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

- "It was very exciting when they called the shot good and we thought we had won. It was obviously disappointing when the call was reversed."
- "We played well for stretches against a very good team. We did make some mistakes down the stretch but they are things we can correct. We'll work hard in practice to get better and be ready for our next game."
- "I believe our players are good players and that we'll continue to get better."
- "We have a lot of different areas we can work on, but I think our execution is getting better. We just need to be a little more consistent over the course of 40 minutes."

**Arizona State Head Coach Herb Sendek**

- "My heart goes out to BYU because they played a heck of a basketball game."
- "They are the real deal. They are difficult to guard and they get it up the court and in the basket. I was mesmerized when I watched them on film, but now after seeing them in person I'm even more impressed."
- "BYU, to me, is as good as any team I've seen in college basketball on offense. They are the real deal on offense. They are hard to guard. I was mesmerized watching them on tape, and seeing them in person, my feelings are only confirmed."

**BYU NOTES FROM LAST SEASON VS. ARIZONA STATE**

**Player Notes**

- Archie Rose hit his first three of the season with 2:20 remaining in the first half and scored a career-high six points against Arizona State.
- Jonathan Tavernari ended the first half on a tear, hitting back-to-back threes to give the Cougars a 41-36 lead at the break. Tavernari totaled 12 points and four rebounds in the first half on 5-of-9 shooting. He finished the game with 24 points, one off his season high, and added four rebounds and four assists.
- Jimmer Fredette helped carry the Cougars in the first half, scoring 11 points on a variety of drives while dish-ing out four dimes. He finished the game with 16 points, four assists and two steals.

**Team Notes**

- For the 10th-straight game, BYU head coach Dave Rose started Jimmer Fredette, Jackson Emery, Lee Cumcard, Jonathan Tavernari and Chris Miles. The Cougars are 9-1 with that starting lineup.
- BYU continued its trend of hot first half shooting, knocking down 57.7 percent (15-26) against Arizona State. The Cougars have hit 50.0 percent or better in the first half in seven of their last eight games.
- Three Cougars scored in double figures with Jonathan Tavernari netting 24, Jimmer Fredette scoring 16 and Lee Cumcard adding 13 points.
- BYU hit 50.0 percent (26-52) from the field against Arizona State, the ninth time this season the Cougars have hit at least 50.0 percent from the field in a game.
- BYU has played at a neutral site twice this season, defeating Utah State 68-63 at Energy Solutions Arena and losing to Arizona State 76-75. The two games are BYU's only two games in which the Cougars have not won by double-digits.

**Record Watch**

- Jonathan Tavernari hit four three-pointers against Arizona State to bring his career total to 148. He is third in BYU history and is now 16 threes away from passing Mike Rose (163) for second. He has 31 threes this season.
- With 13 points against Arizona State, Lee Cumcard now has 1,208 career points. He passed Eldon Brinley (1,195) and Gary Trost (1,205) during the game and is now 20th all-time in school history. He is 11 points from passing Doug Roberts (1,218) for 19th.
- With one steal against Arizona State Lee Cumcard now has 110 career steals. He is seven picks from passing Mark Bigelow for eighth all-time.

- With 75 points against Arizona State the Cougars have scored 70-plus points in nine of 10 games. The 76-75 loss is BYU's first loss when scoring at least 70 points since losing at Boise State 73-70 on Dec. 29, 2007.
- With BYU trailing 28-33 in the first half Archie Rose hit his first three of the season with 2:20 remaining. It started a 13-3 run to end the half that included a shot by Jimmer Fredette, two free throws by Gavin MacGregor and back-to-back treys from Jonathan Tavernari to give the Cougars a 41-36 lead at the half.

**BYU'S LAST OUTING — COUGARS DEFEAT SAN FRANCISCO AT ENERGYSOLUTIONS ARENA**

SALT LAKE CITY (Dec. 5, 2009) — The BYU Cougars triumphed over the San Francisco Dons at EnergySolutions Arena in Salt Lake City, defeating USF 69-43 on Saturday. The Cougars were led by Jackson Emery who finished with 14 points, four steals, four rebounds and two assists. Emery was followed closely by Jimmer Fredette who scored 13 points and had six assists. Sophomore Noah Hartssock started for the first time in his career, setting a new career high with 28 minutes, while leading BYU with five rebounds and tying his career-highs in steals and assists with two in each category. Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in 3-point baskets, hitting a three off a pass from Fredette at the 8:56 mark in the second half. The trey was the senior's 214th, breaking the record previously held by Mark Bigelow with 213 threes made. Both the Cougars and the Dons seemed to favor their post match-ups early with the first five shots of the game being taken in the paint. However, after missed layups on each end, both teams began to utilize their outside play with Fredette and Haws hitting jumpers in the next five minutes of the game. USF also banked in a three-point basket. The crowd favorite plays of the first half both featured BYU freshman post Brandon Davies. Five minutes into the half, Davies pinned a USF shot against the backboard and four minutes later his one-handed throwdown brought Cougar fans to their feet. The dunk put BYU in front, 15-8. Senior Chris Miles scored the first points of both the first and second half, completing a three-point play for the Cougars. Guard play continued to be the driving force behind BYU's dominance as Emery hit his third three-pointer of the game, while Fredette hit two free throws and added an and-one play giving the Cougars their largest lead of the game, 46-26. BYU was able to maintain a lead of more than fifteen points for the remainder of the second half and eventually stretched the lead to thirty points with four minutes left to play. Strong play by the BYU bench allowed USF to only score three points for eight minutes of the last ten minutes of the second half. The BYU defense was consistent throughout the game, holding the Dons to only 43 total points, the lowest for a BYU opponent this year and the fewest total allowed by the Cougars since 2007 at Long Beach State.

**WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...****BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

— "It was a good win. We were pretty fortunate. I was really happy with the way our guys were sharing the ball offensively, and it's just nice to get a win and get things working in a positive direction again."  
— "I believe defensively this team is playing better than they are offensively. We are still trying to find the right combination on offense, but again I was really pleased with how we shared the ball and how well our defense played."  
— "I think we have a lot of weapons, but trying to get everyone in the flow of the offense is a challenge every year. The ball gets stagnant sometimes, so we just really need to find the right flow so we can play at the fast pace we are used to."  
— "I'm really proud of him (Jonathan Tavernari). Its quite an accomplishment, and he really worked hard to achieve it. It's a good record to have, but it's nice to get it behind us so we can move on and keep winning games."

**San Francisco Head Coach Rex Walters**

— "We missed at least ten layups and ten free throws. Combine that with 14 turnovers and that's a game of mistakes. Those will kill you. We just need better attention to detail."  
— "This is a young team, which is what a lot of people probably don't want to hear right now, but it is. We haven't built a culture yet."

**BYU NOTES FROM LAST OUTING****Player Notes**

— Dating back to last season, with 13 points against San Francisco, Jimmer Fredette has now scored in double figures in 21 consecutive games. The last Cougar to accomplish this feat as Travis Hansen, also with 21 games in a row during the 2002-03 season.  
— Making 4-of-4 from the free throw line, Fredette has now made 27 straight free throws. After missing his first two free throws of the season, Fredette is 40 for his last 41. His previous career high was 19 straight, accomplished last season.  
— Emery led the team in scoring for the second time this season with 14 points, including 5-of-7 from the field and 3-of-5 from three. Emery also totaled 4 steals, 4 rebounds, and 2 assists in a team-high 30 minutes.  
— In his first career start, sophomore Noah Hartssock set a new career high in minutes played (28), leading the team with 5 rebounds and tying career highs in steals (2) and assists (2), while adding 2 points and 2 blocks.

— The Cougars went with their third different starting lineup this season, as Hartssock started for the first time in his career. Other starters included Jimmer Fredette, Jackson Emery, Tyler Haws and Chris Miles.  
— The Dons 24 first half point total is tied for the second-lowest allowed by the Cougars this season (22 vs. Southern, 24 vs. Idaho St.)  
— BYU allowed just 5 second-chance points, the fewest of any opponent this year.  
— BYU scored 21 fast-break points to San Fran's two, both season-bests for the Cougars.  
— The Dons scored 19 points in the second half, the fewest for a BYU opponent since Western Oregon (17) in 2006.

— Jonathan Tavernari became the BYU career three-point leader, hitting 2-of-5 tonight, including the record-breaker at 8:56 in the second half. Tavernari now has 214 three-pointers, one more than Mark Bigelow's previous record of 213.

— BYU went on a 10-1 run in the first half, taking an 18-8 lead. Tavernari made a layup, Fredette scored on an old fashioned three-point play, Davies slammed home a fast break dunk and Morgan sunk a three-pointer.  
— BYU began the second half on an 11-2 run, increasing a 35-24 lead to 46-26. Miles started with a layup and a free throw, followed by a trey from Emery. Fredette then hit two free throws, then added another after getting fouled on a layup conversion.  
— The Cougars went on a 20-3 run in the second half, increasing their lead to 69-37. The Dons scored three field goals and 9 total points in the last 9:45 of the game.

**WHEN JIMMER SCORES 20...**

Jimmer Fredette had 23 points in BYU's 87-70 win over Weber State, his fourth 20-point game this season and 12th of his career. BYU is 10-2 when Fredette scores 20 or more and has won the last nine games in which he has reached the 20-point mark. With three-straight 20-point games to start 2009-10, he matched his longest streak for consecutive games with 20 or more points. The first streak came last season when he had 21 at Utah (Jan. 27, 2009), 28 at home against Wyoming (Jan. 31) and 20 at Air Force (Feb. 3).

**FIRST CAREER START**

Freshman Tyler Haws started for the first time in his young career at Hawai'i, helping the Cougars to an 83-65 win over the Rainbow Warriors. He chipped in a career-best 12 points, one assist and one steal in the victory while playing a career-high 25 minutes. He has now started five-straight games for the Cougars. Noah Hartsock made his first career start vs. San Francisco and turned in five points, two assists, two blocks, two steals and two points in 28 minutes of action.

**HOME OPENERS**

BYU is 84-24 (.778) all-time in home openers, including a 28-11 (.718) mark in the Marriott Center. The Cougars won their home opener in 2008-09, 75-65 over Long Beach State, and this season BYU defeated Bradley 70-60 in their home opener behind 25 points from Jimmer Fredette.

**ROAD SUCCESS**

In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU is 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU is 1-1 on the road this season with a win at Hawai'i and a loss at Utah State.

**TEAM/PLAYER NOTEBOOK**

— At 12-4 in the MWC in 2008-09, BYU shared the regular season title with Utah and New Mexico and became the first team to win three-straight league titles after winning the championship outright in 2007 and 2008. The titles mark the first stretch of three-straight titles for the Cougars since 1932-34. BYU is tied for seventh among all NCAA Division I programs for most regular-season titles won or shared with 28. BYU's 99 MWC wins in the 10-year history of the league leads all MWC teams.

— BYU won its first six home games in 2008-09 to extend its program record home winning streak to 53 games. The streak ended on Jan. 3, 2009 with a 94-87 loss to then-No. 6 Wake Forest. BYU finished 14-2 at home and is 437-118 (.787) all-time in the Marriott Center. Cougar head coach Dave Rose is 65-3 (.956) all-time in the Marriott Center. BYU is currently on a 10-game home win streak.

— Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari is BYU's 20th all-time leading scorer with 1,233 points. He joined the 1,000-point club on Feb. 3, 2009 when he scored 17 points at Air Force. He climbed to 25th by the end of the 2008-09 season and has a chance to crack the top-10 with another strong season. With 214 threes Tavernari is first all-time in school history in career threes.

— Junior guard Jimmer Fredette earned first-team All-MWC honors in 2008-09 and was the only sophomore to receive first, second or third-team honors. He also became BYU's first point guard to earn all-conference honors since Marty Haws in 1990. Fredette has 914 career points and will become BYU's 40th member of the 1,000-point club if he maintains his scoring pace from 2008-09. He is also the owner of an .867 career free throw shooting percentage, currently second all-time on BYU's career list.

**FREDETTE NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (NOV. 16)**

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (Nov. 16, 2009) – BYU junior Jimmer Fredette has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for games through November 15. This is the third weekly accolade of his career. A 6-2 guard from Glen Falls, N.Y., Fredette led the Cougars to a season-opening win over Bradley (70-60) last Friday, Nov. 13. He scored a game-high 25 points on 6-of-14 shooting, while also recording five rebounds and four assists in 37 minutes. Fredette scored 16 of his 25 points in the second half, while also dishing out three assists. He also went 12-of-14 from the charity stripe in the second half, including hitting his last 12 attempts, six of which came in the final five minutes of the contest. Fredette has 805 career points and earned first-team all-MWC honors in 2008-09. He averaged 16.2 points and 4.1 assists while shooting .382 from downtown and .847 from the free throw line. Fredette was voted the MWC Preseason Player of the Year by the media for the 2009-10 season.

**ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) – BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons. In his four seasons at the helm, Rose has helped BYU establish one of the best home court advantages in the nation. After dropping his first home game as a head coach, Rose led the Cougars to a school record 53-game winning streak in the Marriott Center. His overall home record stands at 61-3 (.953) and includes two undefeated seasons – 16-0 in 2007-08 and 17-0 in 2006-07.

**ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6-foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the three-time defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. As a sophomore Collinsworth averaged 14.7 points, 3.0 assists and 4.8 rebounds and earned first-team all-state honors from the Deseret News and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points. A 6-foot-9 forward with the skills to play at both the small and power forward positions, Chris Collinsworth helped lead BYU to 27-8 record and an outright regular season MWC title while averaging 3.2 points and 4.8 rebounds and chipping in 14 blocks, 19 assists and nine steals. He led the Cougars in rebounding seven times while posting double-digit boards on three occasions. Martineau, a 5-11 point guard out of Fruit Heights, Utah, played in 20 games as a true freshman. He averaged 5.8 minutes per game and totaled 13 points, 14 assists and eight rebounds. Martineau posted career highs of six points and four assists against Loyola Marymount.

**EMERY AND MORGAN NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS**

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 20, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced Tuesday that senior Lamont Morgan, Jr., and junior Jackson Emery have been named captains for this year's team. "Jackson and Lamont are team players," Rose said. "They are proven leaders and have the respect of their teammates. They are willing to do whatever it takes to make this team better. Their teammates voted them as captains and I couldn't ask for better leaders." Morgan enters his third year in the program after redshirting in 2007-08 and playing a key role off the bench last season. The 5-foot-10 senior guard averaged 3.6 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists while shooting .461 from the field and .412 from downtown. In his first season back from a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Mexico, Emery started 32 of 33 games while posting averages of 7.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists. He was third on the team with 47 steals and shot .480 from the field, .377 from downtown and .738 from the free throw line. Known for his hustle and defensive play, Emery earned a spot on the 2009 MWC All-Defensive Team.

**HOME OPENER ATTENDANCE MARKS**

The 16,276 on hand to witness BYU's 70-60 season-opening win over Bradley in the Marriott Center was the largest crowd for a home opener since 1994-95 when there were 17,654 in the stands for BYU's 96-80 win over Nevada. The attendance for home openers has increased each year since 2006-07, when 8,854 were on hand to see BYU outlast Idaho State 84-78 in overtime. In 2007-08 the Cougars got the best of Idaho State again, winning 90-69 with 12,153 in the Marriott Center. Last season 15,753 seats were full as BYU defeated Long Beach State 75-65 in the season/home opener.

**INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU**

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire) gained valuable experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA Afrobasket Tournament.

**FIRST HALF DEFENSE**

BYU is averaging a 12.7 point lead at the half thanks to its defense. Cougar opponents are shooting just 38.0 percent from the field in the first half of games, including 27.3 percent by Bradley and 26.7 percent by Idaho State. BYU has held the lead at the half in every game this season.

**NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED**

PROVO, Utah (July 16, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2009-10 nonconference schedule Thursday, which features matchups with Arizona, Arizona State and Utah State as well as a trip to the Las Vegas Classic. The 16-game nonconference slate includes teams from nine different conferences and nine teams that qualified for postseason play in 2009. The Mountain West Conference schedule will be announced at a later date. On Nov. 17 BYU will host Idaho State, a team the Cougars have defeated in five-straight contests including 85-65 in 2008. Three days later BYU will head to the Aloha State to play Western Athletic Conference member Hawai'i. The two teams last played in 1999, the Cougars' final season as members of the WAC. After the Hawai'i game the blue and white will host Southern University (Nov. 24) and Weber State (Nov. 27). BYU will look to protect its unbeaten home record (17-0) against the Wildcats. The Cougars will open the month of December with instate rival Utah State. BYU owns a 135-90 record against the Aggies but has lost four-straight in Logan. The game is scheduled for Dec. 2. On Dec. 5 the Cougars will play at Energy Solutions Arena for the fifth time since 2003 when they host San Francisco. BYU defeated Utah State 68-63 in 2008 at Energy Solutions where the Cougars are 2-2 all-time. BYU will remain in Utah and host Arizona State on Dec. 8 at the Marriott Center. The Cougars will be looking to avenge last season's one-point loss at the Stadium Shootout at the University of Phoenix Stadium. BYU will head to southern California to take on Fresno State at the Galen Center in Los Angeles on Dec. 12. Former Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland is at the helm of the Bulldog program. BYU returns to the Marriott Center following the neutral tilt at the Galen Center to host Wagner (Dec. 17) and Eastern Washington (Dec. 19) for its first two games of the Las Vegas Classic. The final two games of the Classic will be at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on Dec. 22 and 23. Nebraska, Nevada and Tulsa will also compete in the Classic. Matchups will be announced at a later date. BYU's last game of the 2009 calendar year will be at Arizona on Dec. 28. The Cougars and Wildcats were conference rivals in the 1960s and 70s when both teams were members of the WAC. The final home nonconference game will be against Eastern New Mexico on Jan. 2 and the nonconference schedule will conclude at UTEP on Jan. 9.

**IMPROVED DEPTH**

BYU's bench has scored at least 21 points six times and in double figures in all seven games this season, including 21 against Bradley, 30 vs. Idaho State, 23 at Hawai'i, a season-high of 46 vs. Southern, 25 vs. Weber State and 23 vs. San Francisco. Last season the BYU bench scored 20-plus points just eight times all season. The 46 bench points vs. Southern are the most bench points by a BYU team since the reserves scored 59 vs. Western Oregon on Dec. 22, 2006.

IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (214).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (99).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

PRESEASON MWC POLL

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavernari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the pre-season squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring (16.2 ppg) and assists (1.35) for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavernari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder (7.2 rpg) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring (6th/15.7 ppg) and 3-point percentage (8th/.381) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining first-place vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU (82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force (25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior TreVon Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the

national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

Dave Rice joined the BYU coaching staff as an assistant in May 2005 and was promoted to Associate Head Coach in April 2008. Rice has 18 years of coaching experience, including 16 seasons at the Division I level at BYU, UNLV and Utah State. As a player, Rice was a member of UNLV's 1989-90 National Championship and 1990-91 Final Four teams that won a school-record 45 consecutive games. During his time as both a player and a coach, he has played with or helped guide 13 players who went on to play in the National Basketball Association, eight of whom were drafted in the first round, including six lottery picks.

An excellent recruiter and on-the-floor coach, Rice coordinates the teams offense and recruiting efforts. In his four seasons coordinating the Cougar offense, BYU has generated the Mountain West Conferences top attack three years and ranked second once. This past season the Cougars ranked among the top 20 nationally in numerous offensive categories, including scoring margin (9th, 11.9), field goal percentage (8th, 48.4), assists per game (16th, 16.3) and assist to turnover ratio (7th, 1.43). In 2007-08 BYU ranked 21st in assists per game (16.8) and 22nd in scoring margin (+10.5) while also setting a school record for assist-to-field goal ratio at 64.8 percent. In 2006-07, the Cougars ranked among the top 30 in the nation in three-point field-goal percentage (5th, .415), scoring (24th, 78.1 ppg) and scoring margin (25th, +9.0). In his first season at BYU, Rice helped the Cougars become the nations second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record.

Rice has helped BYU earn four straight 20-win seasons and a 97-34 overall record while recording back-to-back outright Mountain West Conference Championships in 2007 and 2008 and sharing the title in 2009 the programs first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. The Cougars have also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time BYU was ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982.

Rice came to BYU from Utah State University where he helped Coach Stew Morrill and the Aggies earn a 24-8 record, Big West Conference Tournament title and an NCAA Tournament bid in 2004-05. In his one season at Utah State, Rices coaching duties included working with the offense and coaching the guards. In 2004-05, the Aggies led the nation in field-goal percentage (school-record .525) and ranked fourth nationally in scoring margin (+14.6), 10th in assists (17.2) and 20th in three-point field goal percentage (.391).

Rice spent 11 seasons as an assistant coach at UNLV, which is the second-longest tenure ever for an assistant in that program. While in Las Vegas, Rice worked under four head coaches including Jerry Tarkanian, Tim Grgurich, Bill Bayno and Charlie Spoonhour. In his last eight seasons at UNLV, the Runnin Rebels received seven postseason invitations and averaged 20 wins per year.

In addition to his Division I experience, Rice served as an assistant coach for one season at Chaffey (Calif.) College in 1994, helping the Panthers to a 32-6 record and an appearance in the California State Final Four. He also spent one season at Claremont (Calif.) High School, where he was an assistant coach under his father Lowell, a long-time high school coach. That team went 21-7, winning the Baseline League Championship and reaching the CIF quarterfinals. Rice earned his bachelors degree in political science from UNLV in 1991 and his MBA in 1993. He was also a two-time UNLV Scholar-Athlete of the Year and a Rhodes Scholar candidate.

Prior to playing at UNLV, Rice began his college career at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, Calif., where he earned All-South Coast Conference honors as a sophomore and was chosen from among more than 13,000 student-athletes as the 1989 California Junior College Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He graduated from Claremont High School. A native of Claremont, Calif., Rice and his wife Mindy have two sons, Travis and Dylan.

Boasting a 20-year, championship-filled coaching resume, John Wardenburg has been a key part of BYUs success since first coming to Provo in 2001.

Wardenburg joined the Cougar coaching staff as an assistant coach in May 2001 under former BYU coach Steve Cleveland before serving the past four seasons with current Cougar head coach Dave Rose. Wardenburg and Rose have a long coaching history together. Wardenburg served as an assistant to Rose at Dixie State College and before joining Rose as an assistant on Cleavelands staff at BYU.

On Roses staff the past four seasons, Wardenburg has helped the Cougars earn four-straight 20 wins seasons and a 97-34 overall record while recording back-to-back outright Mountain West Conference Championships in 2007 and 2008 and sharing the title in 2009 the programs first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. BYU has also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time the Cougars were ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982 and the previous Cougar team to be ranked was in 1993. During their first season with Rose at the helm in 2005-06, BYU became the nations second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record.

Wardenburg's primary responsibilities on the staff have included defensive skill development, game film preparation, defensive game plan preparation, summer basketball camp director and recruiting. His efforts on the defensive end helped the Cougars finish the 2008-09 season ranked first in the MWC and 11th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage defense. BYU was also second in the league in steals and rebounding margin. In 2007-08 the Cougars were the 11th-ranked team in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, holding opponents to a combined 38.9 percent on the year. In addition to field-goal percentage defense in 2007-08, the Cougars were also the MWCs top team in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.300) and had the largest margin on the boards, grabbing 4.3 more rebounds per game than their opponents.

Prior to coming to BYU, Wardenburg had 13 years of coaching experience at the high school and junior college levels. He compiled a 105-62 record in seven years as a head coach at Payson High School (1988-93) and Pine View High School (1999-01) while guiding his teams to five league titles and seven state tournament berths. In those seven years, his teams earned three fifth-place state tournament finishes, one third-place finish and a 3A Utah State Championship with his 2001 Pine View team.

After Wardenburg's Payson teams claimed three league titles and posted a 76-43 overall record, he served as an assistant coach from 1993-97 at Dixie State College under current BYU head coach Dave Rose and helped the Rebels to a 95-31 record and a national ranking as high as No. 2. Wardenburg left coaching for two years to serve as Dixies Director of Athletics. He returned to coaching as the head coach at Pine View High School in St. George where he recorded two highly successful seasons before joining BYUs staff in 2001.

Wardenburg's Pine View teams won the league title both seasons he was the coach while achieving a 29-19 record. Wardenburg earned 3A Coach of the Year honors in 2000 after coaching his team to a third-place state finish and was named Championship Coach of the Year in 2001 after guiding his team to the state title.

Born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Wardenburg was a multi-sport athlete at Kiel High School in Kiel, Wis. He served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to The Netherlands from 1977-79 and earned a BA in political science from BYU in 1986 and an MA in health, physical education and recreation from Utah State in 1992.

A former BYU point guard, Terry Nashif was hired as an assistant coach in June 2007 after serving two seasons on Dave Rose's staff as the Cougars' Director of Basketball Operations from 2005-07.

In his first season as an assistant coach, Nashif helped the Cougars achieve the second most wins in school history with a 27-8 record and win the only team in Mountain West Conference history to become two outright league titles. The 2007-08 Cougars won their second-straight outright regular-season MWC Championship with a 14-2. In Nashif's second season as an assistant BYU went 25-8 and earned a third-straight league title at 12-4 — the program's first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. BYU has also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time the Cougars were ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982 and the previous Cougar team to be ranked was in 1993.

In his four years overall on Rose's staff, Nashif has been a part of four straight 20-win seasons and a 97-34 overall record. Nashif's efforts in 2008-09 assisting with game film and defensive game plan preparation helped the Cougars finish ranked first in the MWC and 11th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage defense. BYU was also second in the league in steals and rebounding margin. In 2007-08 the Cougars were 11th in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, holding opponents to a combined 38.9 percent on the year. In addition to field-goal percentage defense in 2007-08, the Cougars were also the MWC's top team in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.300) and had the largest margin on the boards, grabbing 4.3 more rebounds per game than their opponents.

A native of Vancouver, Wash., Nashif first came to BYU in 2001 as a walk-on point guard and eventually earned a scholarship. A smart floor leader, Nashif appeared in 103 games for the Cougars, including 14 starts, as a member of two NCAA Tournament teams. As a sophomore in 2002-03, Nashif helped the Cougars claim a share of the Mountain West Conference regular-season title by ranking first among MWC players in assist/turnover ratio during league games. That season he played in every game, including six starts, and led BYU in assists (3.0) while averaging 2.2 points, his highest scoring average of his four-year career. He posted a career-high 11 points on 3-for-3 three-point shooting in 30 minutes at San Diego State and had one of the best games of his career against UNLV, tallying seven assists, four rebounds and two blocks while matching up against future NBA first-round draft pick Marcus Banks.

As a junior, Nashif played in 23 of 30 games despite missing a month due to illness, averaging 1.1 assists and 1.0 points per game. During his senior campaign in 2004-05, Nashif achieved a career-high eight rebounds against California and dished out a career-best 10 assists at USC while averaging 1.7 assists per game. He led the team in assists six times in 27 appearances with seven starts.

After graduating from BYU in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in physical education, Nashif was hired as the Director of Basketball Operations in Rose's first season at the helm. Nashif's primary responsibilities included coordinating team travel and providing support for academics, marketing and recruiting. He also organized team banquets and golf tournaments and provided assistance with all team-related activities.

Prior to coming to BYU, Nashif prepped at Evergreen High School in Vancouver, Wash., where he was the KVAN Radio Athlete of the Year, Columbian Player of the Year and Evergreen Defensive Player of the Year.

Nashif served a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Columbia, S.C. from 1999-2001. He and his wife Katie have one daughter, Macie.
