## COUGARS WELCOME EASTERN WASHINGTON FOR SECOND GAME OF HOOPTV LAS VEGAS CLASSIC

BYU men's basketball (9-1) will host Eastern Washington on Saturday for its second home game of the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic. The Cougars defeated Wagner 77-61 on Thursday in its Las Vegas Classic opener while Eastern Washington fell 73-70 at Nevada. The matchup with Eastern Washington is scheduled to tip at 7 p.m. MST and will be televised live on BYU TV. Saturday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. MST on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com.

The game will be tele vised live on BYU TV and ESPN Full Court and online at BYU.tv, ESPN360.com and HoopTV.net.

## COUGAR QUICK HITS

- Jimmer Fredette is shooting . 919 from the free throw line to lead the Mountain West Conference. He had hit 57 -of-60 since missing his first two attempts this season and hit 39-straight at one point, a BYU record - Fredette's streak of double figure scoring ended when he netted nine points against Wagner. He continues to lead the MWC in scoring at 17.7 points per game.
- Since Rose took over as head coach of BYU basketball, the Cougars are 67-3 (.957) in the Marriott Center, including a 53 -game winning streak from 2005 to 2008 - the longest in school history. With the win over Wagner, the Cougars have an 12-game home winning streak.
- Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has four-straight 20 -win seasons and fourstraight postseason appearances. At 106-35 (.752) overall, he reached 100 wins faster than any other coach in BYU history. Roger Reid held the previous record, reaching 100 wins in 143 games.
- Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers with two treys vs. San Francisco to give him 214. He is now at 217 after hitting two at Fresno State. He is also climbing the lists for points (20th with 1,266) and steals (T6th with 128).

## LOOKING AT EASTERN WASHINGTON

Eastern Washington has started the 2009-10 season with a 4-6 record, including 3-2 at home and 1-4 on the road. The Eagles are coming off a 73-70 loss at Nevada as part of the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic. Prior to the loss at Nevada Eastern Washington won 100-97 at home over Seattle in overtime. Forward Mark Dunn leads the team in scoring ( 13.3 ppg ) while shooting a team-best .576 from the field. He also averages 5.0 boards per game, second on the team. Center Brandon Moore is second on the team in scoring (12.4 ppg ) and leads the Eagles in rebounding (8.9). Their starting guards Glen Dean and Jeffrey Forbes are both $5-10$ and average 10.1 points and 9.0 points per game, respectively. Dean leads the team in assists at 4.3 dimes per game and three-point shooting with 17 makes with a .486 percentage. Benny Valentine provides a boost off the bench, averaging 10.4 points and 3.8 assists. Eastern Washington averages 74.8 points per game while shooting .431 from the field. Opponents average 77.4 points and shoot .461 against the Eagles Kirk Earlywine is in his third season at Eastern Washington where he is 27-43.

## EASTERN WASHINGTON'S LAST OUTING — EAGLES LOSE NIP-AND-TUEK GAME 73-70

In a game that featured 15 ties and seven lead changes, one shot with 4.3 seconds left determined the winner. Nevada's Brandon Fields nailed a three-pointer with 4.3 seconds to play to defeat Eastern Washington University 73-70 Thursday (Dec. 17) in Reno, Nev., as the Eagles began a stretch of four games in a span of just seven days. Freshman guard Glen Dean missed a desperation three-pointer at the buzzer as the Eagles fell to 4-6 for the season. Eastern missed four of its last five shots, including three with the game knotted at 70, as Nevada improved to 5-4. It was EWU's third loss this season against a Western Athletic Conference opponent. Eastern head coach Kirk Earlywine was disappointed with Eastern's defense on the game-winning shot, as well as EWU's possession just before that that yielded a pair of misses. Fields, who finished with 17 points and eight rebounds, had missed his last five three-pointers until making his game-winner. Nevada's Luke Babbitt, who entered the game averaging 18.1 points and 10.5 rebounds per game, made 10 -of- 18 shots to finish with 29 points and nine rebounds. Dean finished with a double-double for the Eagles with 13 points on 5 -off-7 shooting from the field and had 10 assists with only two turnovers. He equaled the 14th-best recorded assists total in school history, and was the most since Rodney Stuckey had 10 versus Idaho State on Feb. 22, 2007. Freshman Kevin Winford added 14 points, hitting four three-pointers in the second half as he made 5 -of-8 shots from the field. Senior forward Mark Dunn, who scored EWU's first six points of the game, finished with 15 points and a team-high five rebounds. Although the Eagles were out-rebounded 33-29 and had 12 turnovers to Nevada's nine, Earlywine was pleased with the improved performance against the WAC foe. Eastern lost to Idaho by 22 points and Boise State by 13.

## SERIES NOTES

Saturday's game will be the third meeting between BYU and Eastern Washington - with all three being played at the Marriott Center. The Cougars defeated Eastern Washington 97-66 on Dec. 27, 2005, in Dave Roses's first season as head coach at BYU. The other meeting came in 1989 and ended with a $96-84$ BYU victory.

LASt TIME VS. EASTERN WASHINGTON: COUGARS RACE TO WIN OVER EASTERN WASHINGTON
PROVO, Utah (Dec. 27, 2005) - BYU's fast-break offense and hot shooting were too much for Eastern Washington as the Cougars earned a 97-66 victory over the Eagles Tuesday. Six players scored in double figures for BYU, improving the team to 7-3 on the season while Eastern Washington fell to 5-6. "We want all our players to play at the highest level," BYU coach Dave Rose said. "The strength of this team is in the team itself and how we played showed that." Keena Young had a career-high 15 points off the bench to lead BYU. Fernando Malaman had 14, Brock Reichner and Mike Rose had 12 each and Trent Plaisted and Jimmy Balderson had 11 apiece. As a team BYU shot 64.5 percent (40-62), a season high, led by Plaisted's perfect 5 -of-5 and Malaman hitting 6 -of-8. The Cougars made 8 -of-16 three pointers, including Rose hitting 4 -of-4 and Balderson 3-of-4. The 97 points scored by the Cougars tied a season high, set in a win over Lamar in the Delta Center. BYU outscored Eastern Washington 21-10 on fast break points and had 45 bench points compared to just 13 for the Eagles. "Shooting percentage is indicative of effort," Eastern Washington coach Mike Burns said. "BYU showed tremendous effort and it showed in their shooting." Rashaun Broadus engineered the offense, dishing out nine assists, which tied his career high. Reichner shared the ball as well, setting a career high with six assists. As a team, the Cougars had 29 assists, a season high. Young had a team-high eight rebounds, while Malaman, Balderson and Plaisted each had five. Rodney Stuckey led Eastern Washington with 19 points, despite hitting just 6-of-21 shot attempts. Kellen Williams and Deuce Smith were the other Eagles in double figures with 15 and 12 points, respectively. BYU started the game out on fire, hitting 11 of their first 12 shot attempts, including eight in a row at one point. With the game tied at four, the Cougars outscored the Eagles $17-1$ to go up 21-5, including a string of 14 -consecutive points. The Cougars extended the lead to 18 at 28-10, but Eastern Washington trimmed the lead back down to eight at 38-30 led by eight points from Stuckey. Just when the Eagles seemed to have slowed the BYU offense, the Cougars went on a $15-4$ run to end the half and lead by 19, 53-34. The 19-point lead marked BYU's biggest halftime lead of the year and the 53 points were the most scored in a half this season. Malaman and Reichner had the hot hands in the first period, combining to hit 10 -of-12 shots for 22 points. Malaman had 14 points and Reichner eight, including BYU's first four of the game. The Cougars continued their strong play in the second half, extending their lead to as many as 36 at 91-55. BYU outscored Eastern Washington 44-32 in the second period. BYU will play its final nonconference game against Tulsa at home on Friday at 7 p.m. The Cougars begin Mountain West Conference action Jan. 5 against Air Force in Colorado Springs, Colo.

## BYU'S LAST OUTING - BYU WINS FIRST GAME OF VEGAS CLASSIC; DEFEATS WAGNER

PROVO, Utah (Dec. 17, 2009) - BYU stayed perfect at home on the season, winning its sixth on the year after defeating the Wagner at the Marriott Center, 77-61, on Thursday. Freshman Tyler Haws led the Cougars with 16 points on the night, adding five rebounds while senior Jonathan Tavernari finished off the night with 14 points and four rebounds for BYU (9-1). It was a career night for Cougar assists with Michael Loyd, Jr., and Noah Hartsock both of whom posted career-highs of four assists each. Hartsock led BYU with eight rebounds and added 12 points. Three Cougars had five rebounds each including Haws, Charles Abouo and James Anderson who grabbed his five rebounds in only six minutes of play. After trading baskets, the Cougars posted a 20-2 run, including a 14-0 streak with scores from Tavernari, Miles, Jimmer Fredette, Haws and Abouo. Tavernari had back-to-back-to-back baskets, the first coming from a reverse layup on a fast break. Cutting down into the lane after another BYU steal, Tavernari posted the 24th point of the game off a layup, bringing the score to 24-9. Both teams continued to trade baskets for the remainder of the half, with BYU's Lamont Morgan, Jr., and Haws hitting a three-pointer each for the Cougars, sending the game into halftime, 41-23. Tavernari led BYU with 10 points at half, hitting $5-\mathrm{of}-7$ from the field. Haws followed with nine points, making 3 -of-4 field goals and 2 -of-2 from the charity stripe. Emery's unselfish play earned him five assists out of 13 for BYU in the first half. Hartsock led the team on the boards with four rebounds, also adding four points. BYU came out of the locker room trading points with Wagner. Haws tallied a three-point play at the 16:37 mark to bring the score to $48-27$. The Seahawks tried to gradually chip away at the score, but couldn't match the unselfish play BYU as the Cougars had ten players score and all thirteen players see minutes. The Cougars finished off the game with a dunk by Anderson with 19 seconds left, leading the Seahawks by 16 with a final score of 77-61.

## WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

## BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "We got a lot out of this win. It was competitive and we
got a chance to play a lot of our players. We had good energy and attacked well. We didn't shoot as well as I would have liked seeing as how we never really got into a rhythm."
- "Early on in the game we struggled a little, but as it went on we got better at challenging their threes. On some possessions we really made it tough on them."
- "Of those 19 offensive rebounds we're concerned with about half of them because they took the ball away from us and really muscled us out."
- "You try to play and execute every possession a certain way. I think we were engaged, but not perfect. We never had a good offensive showing, but we did a good job guarding."


## Wagner Head Coach Mike Deane

- "It was a bit disappointing that we didn't give our best effort. We need to be more competitive on defense and more patient with the ball on offense."
- "BYU is a very good team. They don't play a pressure defense but are solid and play contained basketball.

Although we are young and inexperienced, we need to take better shots, make better decisions, rebound the ball and play with more patience."

- "It was a good opportunity for us to come out to a first-class arena and play against a good team. Hopefully this experience will help us in the future."


## BYU NOTES FROM LAST OUTING

Player Notes

- Dating back to last season, with 9 points against Wagner, Jimmer Fredette ends his double-digit scoring streak at 23 consecutive games. It was the longest streak in double-digits since Russell Larsen put together 44 consecutive games scoring at least 10 points during the 1993-94 and 1994-95 seasons.
- Jimmer Fredette went 5-6 tonight from the free throw line, his 8th game this season missing one foul shot or less. He has made 57 of his last 60 free throws and leads the MWC in FT\%.
- Jackson Emery had a season-high 5 assists. His career high is nine.
- Noah Hartsock dished out 4 assists, a new career-high. He added 12 points, 8 rebounds, 3 blocks (tied for career high) and 1 steal.
- Tyler Haws led the Cougars in scoring for the second time this season, finishing with 16 points, one shy of his career high.
- Michael Loyd, Jr., had a career-high 4 assists, surpassing his previous high of 3, accomplished seven times. - James Anderson's 7 points and 5 rebounds are both season highs.

## 39-STRAIGHT FREE THROWS

Junior guard Jimmer Fredette set a BYU record with 39-consecutive free throws without missing. Fredette broke the record when he hit his 33 rd-consecutive free throw with 16:56 remaining in the second half against Arizona State. The streak started in the second game of the season when he made his last five attempts against Idaho State. For the season he is shooting .919 from the line and has hit 57-of-60 after missing his first two attempts of the season. His career percentage is .867 . The previous record was 32 by Michael Smith in 1989.

## 100 VICTORIES AND COUNTING

With BYU's 83-65 win over Hawai'i, Dave Rose earned his 100th career victory in his 134th game as BYU's head coach. He reached the 100 -win plateau faster than any coach in BYU history. Roger Reid previously held the record, achieving the mark in 143 games. ## WHEN JIMMER SCORES 20...

Jimmer Fredette had 24 points in BYU's $72-67$ win at Fresno State, his fifth 20-point game this season and 13th of his career. BYU is 11-2 when Fredette scores 20 or more and has won the last 10 games in which he has reached the 20-point mark. With three-straight 20-point games to start 2009-10, he matched his longest streak for consecutive games with 20 or more points. The first streak came last season when he had 21 at Utah (Jan. 27, 2009), 28 at home against Wyoming (Jan. 31) and 20 at Air Force (Feb. 3).

## FIRST CAREER START

Freshman Tyler Haws started for the first time in his young career at Hawaili, helping the Cougars to an $83-65$ win over the Rainbow Warriors. He chipped in 12 points, one assist and one steal in the victory while playing 25 minutes. He has now started eight-straight games for the Cougars. Noah Hartsock made his first career start vs. San Francisco and turned in five points, two assists, two blocks, two steals and two points in 28 minutes of action. Hartsock has started the last four games for the Cougars.

## FRESHMAN DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Freshman Tyler Haws recorded his first career double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds against Arizona State, an 81-68 home win for the Cougars. He also had career highs of six free throw attempts, six free throw makes and 10 field goal attempts while tying a career high with five makes from the field. His double-double marks the first double-double by a Cougar freshman since Trent Plaisted had 18 points and 13 rebounds against Houston in the NIT on March 15, 2006. Plaisted had six double-doubles his freshman year. Jimmer Fredette has BYU's other double-double this season, a 12-point, 10-rebound effort vs. Southern.

- At 12-4 in the MWC in 2008-09, BYU shared the regular season title with Utah and New Mexico and became the first team to win three-straight league titles after winning the championship outright in 2007 and 2008. The titles mark the first stretch of three-straight titles for the Cougars since 1932-34. BYU is tied for seventh among all NCAA Division I programs for most regular-season titles won or shared with 28. BYU's 99 MWC wins in the 10 -year history of the league leads all MWC teams.
- BYU won its first six home games in 2008-09 to extend its program record home winning streak to 53 games. The streak ended on Jan. 3, 2009 with a $94-87$ loss to then-No. 6 Wake Forest. BYU finished 14-2 at home and is $439-118$ (.788) all-time in the Marriott Center. Cougar head coach Dave Rose is 67-3 (.957) all-time in the Marriott Center. BYU is currently on a 12-game home win streak.
- Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari is BYU's 20th all-time leading scorer with 1,266 points. He joined the 1,000-point club on Feb. 3, 2009 when he scored 17 points at Air Force. He climbed to 25th by the end of the 2008-09 season and is currently 20th all-time. With 217 threes Tavernari is first all-time in school history in career threes.
- Junior guard Jimmer Fredette earned first-team All-MWC honors in 2008-09 and was the only sophomore to receive first, second or thirdteam honors. BYU is 84-24 (.778) all-time in home openers, including a 28-11 (.718) mark in the Marriott Center. The Cougars won their home opener in 2008-09, 75-65 over Long Beach State, and this season BYU defeated Bradley 70-60 in their home opener behind 25 points from Jimmer Fredette.

## ROAD SUCCESS

In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU is 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU is 2-1 on the road this season with wins at Hawai'i and Fresno State and a loss at Utah State.

The Cougars will then travel to Las Vegas and play Nevada at noon PT on Dec. 22 at the Orleans Arena. The winner of the BYU vs. Nevada game will face the winner of Tulsa vs. Nebraska on Dec. 23 at 7:30 p.m. PT. The losing teams will play on Dec. 23 at 5 p.m. PT.

## FREDETTE NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK [NOV. 16]

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (Nov. 16, 2009) - BYU junior Jimmer Fredette has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for games through November 15. This is the third weekly accolade of his career. A 6-2 guard from Glen Falls, N.Y., Fredette led the Cougars to a seasonopening win over Bradley (70-60) last Friday, Nov. 13. He scored a game-high 25 points on 6 -of-14 shooting, while also recording five rebounds and four assists in 37 minutes. Fredette scored 16 of his 25 points in the second half, while also dishing out three assists. He also went 12-of-14 from the charity stripe in the second half, including hitting his last 12 attempts, six of which came in the final five minutes of the contest. Fredette has 805 career points and earned first-team all-MWC honors in 2008-09. He averaged 16.2 points and 4.1 assists while shooting . 382 from downtown and .847 from the free throw line. Fredette was voted the MWC Preseason Player of the Year by the media for the 2009-10 season.

## ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) - BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons. In his four seasons at the helm, Rose has helped BYU establish one of the best home court advantages in the nation. After dropping his first home game as a head coach, Rose led the Cougars to a school record 53-game winning streak in the Marriot Center. His overall home record stands at 61-3 (.953) and includes two undefeated seasons - 16-0 in 2007-08 and 17-0 in 2006-07.

## ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) - BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6 -foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the threetime defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. As a sophomore Collinsworth averaged 14.7 points, 3.0 assists and 4.8 rebounds and earned first-team all-state honors from the Deseret News and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points. A 6-foot-9 forward with the skills to play at both the small and power forward positions, Chris Collinsworth helped lead BYU to 27-8 record and an outright regular season MWC title while averaging 3.2 points and 4.8 rebounds and chipping in 14 blocks, 19 assists and nine steals. He led the Cougars in rebounding seven times while posting double-digit boards on three occasions. Martineau, a 5-11 point guard out of Fruit Heights, Utah, played in 20 games as a true freshman. He averaged 5.8 minutes per game and totaled 13 points, 14 assists and eight rebounds. Martineau posted career highs of six points and four assists against Loyola Marymount.

## EMERY AND MORGAN NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 20, 2009) - BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced Tuesday that senior Lamont Morgan, Jr., and junior Jackson Emery have been named captains for this year's team. "Jackson and Lamont are team players," Rose said. "They are proven leaders and have the respect of their teammates. They are willing to do whatever it takes to make this team better. Their teammates voted them as captains and I couldn't ask for better leaders." Morgan enters his third year in the program after redshirting in 200708 and playing a key role off the bench last season. The 5 -foot-10 senior guard averaged 3.6 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists while shooting .461 from the field and .412 from downtown. In his first season back from a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Mexico, Emery started 32 of 33 games while posting averages of 7.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists. He was third on the team with 47 steals and shot 480 from the field, 377 from downtown and .738 from the free throw line. Known for his hustle and defensive play, Emery earned a spot on the 2009 MWC All-Defensive Team.

## HOME OPENER ATTENDANCE MARKS

The 16,276 on hand to witness BYU's $70-60$ season-opening win over Bradley in the Marriott Center was the largest crowd for a home opener since 1994-95 when there were 17,654 in the stands for BYU's $96-80$ win over Nevada. The attendance for home openers has increased each year since 2006-07, when 8,854 were on hand to see BYU outlast Idaho State $84-78$ in overtime. In 2007-08 the Cougars got the best of Idaho State again, winning $90-69$ with 12,153 in the Marriott Center. Last season 15,753 seats were full as BYU defeated Long Beach State 75-65 in the season/home opener.

## INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award [Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six AllAmerica citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."


## NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'lvoire) gained valuble experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'lvoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA Afrobasket Tournament.

## FIRST HALF LEADS, MARGIN OF VICTORY

BYU has led at the half in every game this season and has held double-digit halftime leads in six games. The Cougars led by 19 vs. Idaho State, 10 at Hawail', 35 vs. Southern, 11 vs. San Francisco, 16 vs. Arizona State and 18 vs. Wagner. BYU has won by at least 10 points in eight of the team's nine wins and 20 -plus three times.

## NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

PROVO, Utah (July 16, 2009) - BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2009-10 nonconference schedule Thursday, which features matchups with Arizona, Arizona State and Utah State as well as a trip to the Las Vegas Classic. The 16 -game nonconference slate includes teams from nine different conferences and nine teams that qualified for postseason play in 2009. The Mountain West Conference schedule will be announced at a later date. On Nov. 17 BYU will host Idaho State, a team the Cougars have defeated in fivestraight contests including $85-65$ in 2008. Three days later BYU will head to the Aloha State to play Western Athletic Conference member Hawaili. The two teams last played in 1999, the Cougars' final season as members of the WAC. After the Hawai'i game the blue and white will host Southern University (Nov. 24) and Weber State (Nov. 27). BYU will look to protect its unbeaten home record (17-0) against the Wildcats. The Cougars will open the month of December with instate rival Utah State. BYU owns a 135-90 record against the Aggies but has lost four-straight in Logan. The game is scheduled for Dec. 2. On Dec. 5 the Cougars will play at Energy Solutions Arena for the fifth time since 2003 when they host San Francisco. BYU defeated Utah State 68-63 in 2008 at Energy Solutions where the Cougars are 2-2 all-time. BYU will remain in Utah and host Arizona State on Dec. 8 at the Marriott Center. The Cougars will be looking to avenge last season's one-point loss at the Stadium Shootout at the University of Phoenix Stadium. BYU will head to southern California to take on Fresno State at the Galen Center in Los Angeles on Dec. 12. Former Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland is at the helm of the Bulldog program. BYU returns to the Marriott Center following the neutral tilt at the Galen Center to host Wagner (Dec. 17) and Eastern Washington (Dec. 19) for its first two games of the Las Vegas Classic. The final two games of the Classic will be at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on Dec. 22 and 23. Nebraska, Nevada and Tulsa will also compete in the Classic. Matchups will be announced at a later date. BYU's last game of the 2009 calendar year will be at Arizona on Dec. 28. The Cougars and Wildcats were conference rivals in the 1960s and 70s when both teams were members of the WAC. The final home nonconference game will be against Eastern New Mexico on Jan. 2 and the nonconference schedule will conclude at UTEP on Jan. 9.

## IMPROVED DEPTH

BYU's bench has scored at least 21 points seven times and in double figures in all 10 games this season, including 21 against Bradley, 30 vs. Idaho State, 23 at Hawaili, a season-high of 46 vs. Southern, 25 vs. Weber State, 23 vs. San Francisco and 32 vs. Wagner. Last season the BYU bench scored 20 -plus points just eight times all season. The 46 bench points vs. Southern are the most bench points by a BYU team since the reserves scored 59 vs. Western Oregon on Dec. 22, 2006.

## IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (214).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (99)
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.


## PRESEASON MWC POLI

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavernari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the preseason squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring ( 16.2 ppg ) and assists [135] for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavernari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder ( 7.2 rpg ) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring ( $6 \mathrm{th} / 15.7 \mathrm{ppg}$ ) and 3-point percentage ( $8 \mathrm{th} / .381$ ) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining firstplace vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU ( 82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force ( 25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior Tre'Von Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20 -game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 12 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 26 years of coaching experience-including 14 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college and high school levels-Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College [St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

Dave Rice joined the BYU coaching staff as an assistant in May 2005 and was promoted to Associate Head Coach in April 2008. Rice has 18 years of coaching experience, including 16 seasons at the Division I leve at BYU, UNLV and Utah State. As a player, Rice was a member of UNLVs 1989-90 National Championship and 1990-91 Final Four teams that won a school-record 45 consecutive games During his time as both a player and a coach, he has played with or helped guide 13 players who went on to play in the National Basketball Association, eight of whom were drafted in the first round, including six lottery picks.

An excellent recruiter and on-the-floor coach, Rice coordinates the teams offense and recruiting efforts. In his four seasons coordinating the Cougar offense, BYU has generated the Mountain West Conferences top attack three years and ranked second once. This past season the Cougars ranked among the top 20 nationally in numerous offensive categories, including scoring margin (9th, 11.9), field goal percentage (8th, 48.4), assists per game (16th, 16.3) and assist to turnover ratio (7th, 1.43). In 2007-08 BYU ranked 21st in assists per game (16.8) and 22 nd in scoring margin $(+10.5)$ while also setting a school record for assist-to-field goal ratio at 64.8 percent. In 2006-07, the Cougars ranked among the top 30 in the nation in threepoint field-goal percentage ( 5 th, . 415 ), scoring ( $24 \mathrm{th}, 78.1 \mathrm{ppg}$ ) and scoring margin ( 25 th, +9.0 ). In his first season at BYU, Rice helped the Cougars become the nations second-most improved team with a $20-9$ overall record.

Rice has helped BYU earn four straight 20 -win seasons and a 97-34 overall record while recording back-to-back outright Mountain West Conference Championships in 2007 and 2008 and sharing the title in 2009 the programs first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. The Cougars have also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time BYU was ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982.

Rice came to BYU from Utah State University where he helped Coach Stew Morrill and the Aggies earn a 24-8 record, Big West Conference Tournament title and an NCAA Tournament bid in 2004-05. In his one season at Utah State, Rices coaching duties included working with the offense and coaching the guards. In 2004-05, the Aggies led the nation in field-goal percentage (school-record .525) and ranked fourth nationally in scoring margin ( +14.6 ), 10th in assists (17.2) and 20th in three-point field goal percentage (.391).

Rice spent 11 seasons as an assistant coach at UNLV, which is the second-longest tenure ever for an assistant in that program. While in Las Vegas, Rice worked under four head coaches including Jerry Tarkanian, Tim Grgurich, Bill Bayno and Charlie Spoonhour. In his last eight seasons at UNLV, the Runnin Rebels received seven postseason invitations and averaged 20 wins per year.

In addition to his Division I experience, Rice served as an assistant coach for one season at Chaffey [Calif.) College in 1994, helping the Panthers to a $32-6$ record and an appearance in the California State Final Four. He also spent one season at Claremont (Calif.) High School, where he was an assistant coach under his father Lowell, a long-time high school coach. That team went 21-7, winning the Baseline League Championship and reaching the CIF quarterfinals. Rice earned his bachelors degree in political science from UNLV in 1991 and his MBA in 1993. He was also a two-time UNLV Scholar Athlete of the Year and a Rhodes Scholar candidate.

Prior to playing at UNLV, Rice began his college career at MIt. San Antonio College in Walnut, Calif., where he earned All-South Coast Conference honors as a sophomore and was chosen from among more than 13,000 student-athletes as the 1989 Calfornia Junior College Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He graduated from Claremont High School. A native of Claremont, Calif., Rice and his wife Mindy have two sons, Travis and Dylan.

On Roses staff the past four seasons, Wardenburg has helped the Cougars earn four-straight 20 wins seasons and a 97-34 overall record while recording back-to-back outright Mountain West Conference Championships in 2007 and 2008 and sharing the title in 2009 the programs first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. BYU has also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time the Cougars were ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982 and the previous Cougar team to be ranked was in 1993. During their first season with Rose at the helm in 2005-06, BYU became the nations second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record.

In addition to field-goal percentage defense in 2007-08, the Cougars were also the MWCs top team in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.300) and had the largest margin on the boards, grabbing 4.3 more rebounds per game than their opponents.

Prior to coming to BYU, Wardenburg had 13 years of coaching experience at the high school and junior college levels. He compiled a 105-62 record in seven years as a head coach at Payson High School (1988-93) and Pine View High School (1999-01) while guiding his teams to five league titles and seven state tournament berths. In those seven years, his teams earned three fifth-place state tournament finishes, one thirdplace finish and a 3A Utah State Championship with his 2001 Pine View team.

After Wardenburg's Payson teams claimed three league titles and posted a 76-43 overall record, he served as an assistant coach from 1993-97 at Dixie State College under current BYU head coach Dave Rose and helped the Rebels to a 95-31 record and a national ranking as high as No. 2. Wardenburg left coaching for two years to serve as Dixies Director of Athletics. He returned to coaching as the head coach at Pine View High School in St. George where he recorded two highly successful seasons before joining BYUs staff in 2001.

Wardenburg's Pine View teams won the league title both seasons he was the coach while achieving a 29-19 record. Wardenburg earned 3A Coach of the Year honors in 2000 after coaching his team to a third-place state finish and was named Championship Coach of the Year in 2001 after guiding his team to the state title.

A former BYU point guard, Terry Nashif was hired as an assistant coach in June 2007 after serving two seasons on Dave Rose's staff as the Cougars' Director of Basketball Operations from 2005-07.

In his first season as an assis-

tant coach, Nashif helped the Cougars achieve the second most wins in school history with a 27-8 record and become the only team in Mountain West Conference history to win two outright league titles. The 2007-08 Cougars won their second-straight outright regular-season MWC Championship with a 14-2. In Nashif's second season as an assistant BYU went 25-8 and earned a third-straight league title at 12-4 - the program's first string of three-straight titles since 1932-34. BYU has also appeared in the national top-25 polls and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons. The last time the Cougars were ranked in three-consecutive seasons was in 1980, 1981 and 1982 and the previous Cougar team to be ranked was in 1993

In his four years overall on Rose's staff, Nashif has been a part of four straight 20-win seasons and a 97-34 overall record Nashif's efforts in 2008-09 assisting with game film and defensive game plan preparation helped the Cougars finish ranked first in the MWC and 11th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage defense. BYU was also second in the league in steals and rebounding margin. In 2007-08 the Cougars were 11th in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, holding opponents to a combined 38.9 percent on the year. In addition to field-goal percentage defense in 2007-08, the Cougars were also the MWC's top team in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.300) and had the largest margin on the boards, grabbing 4.3 more rebounds per game than their opponents.

A native of Vancouver, Wash., Nashif first came to BYU in 2001 as a walk-on point guard and eventually earned a scholarship. A smart floor leader, Nashif appeared in 103 games for the Cougars, including 14 starts, as a member of two NCAA Tournament teams. As a sophomore in 2002-03, Nashif helped the Cougars claim a share of the Mountain West Conference regular-season title by ranking first among MWC players in assist/turnover ratio during league games. That season he played in every game, including six starts, and led BYU in assists (3.0) while averaging 2.2 points, his highest scoring average of his four-year career. He posted a careerhigh 11 points on 3 -for- 3 three-point shooting in 30 minutes at San Diego State and had one of the best games of his career against UNLV, tallying seven assists, four rebounds and two blocks while matching up against future NBA first-round draft pick Marcus Banks.

As a junior, Nashif played in 23 of 30 games despite missing a month due to illness, averaging 1.1 assists and 1.0 points per game. During his senior campaign in 2004-05, Nashif achieved a career-high eight rebounds against California and dished out a career-best 10 assists at USC while averaging 1.7 assists per game. He led the team in assists six times in 27 appearances with seven starts.

After graduating from BYU in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in physical education, Nashif was hired as the Director of Basketball Operations in Rose's first season at the helm. Nashif's primary responsibilities included coordinating team travel and providing support for academics, marketing and recruiting. He also organized team banquets and golf tournaments and provided assistance with all team-related activities.

Prior to coming to BYU, Nashif prepped at Evergreen High School in Vancouver, Wash., where he was the KVAN Radio Athlete of the Year, Columbian Player of the Year and Evergreen Defensive Player of the Year.

Nashif served a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Columbia, S.C. from 1999-2001. He and his wife Katie have one daughter, Macie.

Morgan, Jr., averaged 3.6 points and 1.8 assists off the bench while shooting 41.4 percent on threes. He brings excellent ball-handling, court vision and an up-tempo style to the court. A highly successful junior college program, SCC advanced to the state semifinal game in 2007 behind the play of Morgan, who started every game at the point and averaged 4.4 assists per contest.

SUMMARY: The 2007 Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year, Jonathan Tavernari followed a standout season in his first year with the Cougars with a record-setting sophomore campaign.
