No. 14/13 BYU men's basketball (18-1, 3-0 MWC) will look to keep its perfect MWC record and 13-game winning streak intact when it hosts Wyoming on Wednesday, Jan. 16, at 6 p.m. MST. The game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 5 p.m. MST on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

- Jimmer Fredette set BYU single-game records with 49 points and nine threes against Arizona in the Fiesta Bowl Classic in Tucson, Ariz., at the McKale Center. BYU handed Arizona its worst loss at the McKale Center, 99-69.
- Jimmer Fredette was named MVP of the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic after averaging 28.5 points, 5.0 assists and 2.0 steals in wins over Nevada and Nebraska. Jackson Emery (24.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 3.0 apg, 3.0 spg) and Tyler Haws (13.5 ppg, 3.5 rpg) earned all-tournament honors.
- Fredette is 31st all-time in scoring at BYU with 1,119 career points. He leads the conference in scoring at 19.9 points per game. He is also 15th at BYU in career assists with 283 and 12th in steals with 103.
- Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has four-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight postseason appearances. At 115-35 (.767) overall, he is BYU's all-time leader in winning percentage.
- Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers with two treys vs. San Francisco to give him 214. He is now at 232 after hitting two vs. Colorado State. He is also climbing the lists for points (16th with 1,352) and steals (4th with 138).
- Tavernari is on pace to become the BYU player with the most wins in a career. Since his freshman campaign, he has been a part of 91 Cougar wins, six behind former teammate Lee Cummond (2005-09), who was a part of 97 BYU wins, and three behind Russell Larson, who was a part of 94 wins (1991-95).

LOOKING AT WYOMING

Wyoming is 8-10 overall and 1-3 in Mountain West Conference action with a home win against San Diego State, home losses to Colorado State and New Mexico and a loss at TCU. Sophomore forward Afam Muojeke leads the team and is second in the MWC in scoring at 17.9 points per game. He adds 4.1 boards per game and leads the team with an .835 free throw percentage and 29 threes. A.J. Davis is second on the team at 11.1 ppg and Djibril Thiam (10.2) and Adam Waddell (10.5) also add double-figure averages. JayDee Luster leads the team with 4.5 assists per game while Davis leads with 32 steals. As a team Wyoming averages 78.1 points per game and shoots .447 from the field, .271 from three and .726 from the free throw line. Their opponents average 74.6 points and shoot .429. The Cowboys are out-rebounded by an average of 36.8-37.1. Heath Schroyer is in his third season at the helm and he owns a 39-42 mark with Wyoming.

WYOMING'S LAST OUTING — WYOMING FALLS LATE TO NEW MEXICO, 70-68

LARAMIE, Wyo. (AP) - A.J. Hardeman scored a career-high 18 points as New Mexico held off Wyoming 70-68 on Saturday. The Lobos (16-3, 2-2 Mountain West) took advantage of three straight Wyoming turnovers after the score was tied at 58, scoring six straight points, and never trailed again. Until that point, there were four ties and seven lead changes in the second half. Afam Muojeke led the Cowboys (8-10, 1-3) with 16 points. Adam Waddell and Djibril Thiam added 11 each. Phillip McDonald and Darrington Hobson both scored 15 points for New Mexico. Wyoming still had a chance in the final minute of the game, trailing by three and in possession of the basketball, but Muojeke was called for an offensive foul. The Lobos hit four free throws in the final 30 seconds to clinch the win.

SERIES NOTES

BYU and Wyoming play for the 171st time on Wednesday with the Cougars leading the overall series 101-69. BYU is 9-0 against the Cowboys under Rose. The Cougars won 84-60 at home and 78-68 at Wyoming last season. BYU is 64-14 at home (32-5 in the Marriott Center) against Wyoming and has won the last four home games against the Cowboys.

LAST YEAR VS. WYOMING AT BYU — FREDETTE LEADS BYU TO WIN OVER WYOMING

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 31, 2009) – The BYU men's basketball team ran to an 84-60 win against the Wyoming Cowboys on Saturday in the Marriott Center. With the win the Cougars improve to 16-5 on the season and 4-3 in Mountain West Conference play. Sophomore Jimmer Fredette led all scorers with a career-high 28 points, while Lee Cummard, Chris Miles and Noah Hartssock also scored in double-figures, with 17, 12 and 11 points, respectively. The Cougars quickly jumped out to an 8-2 lead to begin the game after Fredette's second three-pointer in the first two minutes. BYU steadily increased its lead with makes by Miles and Charles Abouo, who recorded his first career start as a Cougar. Fredette continued to dominate offensively, as he scored a total of 19 points in the first half—also a career high. His steal and fast-break layup gave BYU a 32-12 lead. With 5:28 remaining in the half, the sophomore took advantage of a Wyoming turnover and recorded his fourth dunk of the season. As the first half wound down Jonathan Tavernari scored his first points of the game off a three-point make. Hartssock's layin with 1:13 remaining until the break sent the Cougars into the lockerroom with a 43-27 halftime lead. Coming out of the break the Cowboys scored off three makes from beyond-the-arc to attempt an early comeback, but the Cougars continued putting points on the board. After a 1-for-2 trip to the free-throw line, Hartssock connected on a 10-foot jumper. The freshman also saved a ball from rolling out-of-bound, passing to Cummard who laid it in for two points. With just under eight minutes remaining in the game, a steal by Cummard set up a fast-break opportunity as Tavernari scored to give BYU the 70-49 lead. Multiple trips to the free-throw line for Wyoming could not make up for the hot shooting by BYU as it went on a 12-0 run late in the game. The Cowboys' Brandon Ewing made four free throws to end the game.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "Our preparation was really good the last two days. Our focus was good and we executed really well tonight."
- "Wyoming is a penetrating team, but we attacked early and that helped us to get into position and hold our lead really well."
- "I was proud of our consistent effort defensively."
- "Jimmer was really good at the start of the game and managed that consistent effort the duration of the game. He made some big shots at the end of the game for our team."

Wyoming Head Coach Heath Schroyer

- "They came out hitting on all cylinders and played well. They are notorious for that and are a very good team."
- "Jimmer Fredette is very good and I knew that from watching film on him, but tonight I saw it first hand. He's big, strong, can shoot the three and is strong on the dribble. He is very good."

NOTES FROM LAST YEAR VS. WYOMING AT BYU

Player Notes

- To break his previous career high first half points (18), Jimmer Fredette had his fourth dunk of the season giving him the new first half career high of 19 points. Fredette also broke his career high with 28 points on the afternoon versus the Cowboys.
- For the first time this season, Dave Rose started Charles Abouo who posted two points and three rebounds on the afternoon. Lee Cummard, Jonathan Tavernari and Chris Miles have started each game this season. The Cougars had used the same starting lineup for the 19 games prior to the Wyoming matchup.
- James Anderson came off the bench in the first half to go 2-for-2 from the field, grabbing one rebound and posting four points in four minutes. He has scored four points in each of the last three games.
- Saturday's game marks the first time center Chris Miles has had back-to-back games in double figures in his career. He posted 12 points at Utah Tuesday and 12 points at the Marriott Center against Wyoming on Saturday.
- For the 17th game this season, Lee Cummard posted double-figure points with 17 plus nine rebounds, four assists and two blocks. This is the fourth game in a row that he has scored more than 10 points.
- Noah Hartssock chalked up 11 points against Wyoming, a career high for the freshman. He also tallied four rebounds on the afternoon.

Team Notes

- For the 18th time this season the Cougars have led at the half and for the 14th time they have scored at least 40 points in the first period with a 43-27 margin at the half. For the ninth time this season BYU has led its opponent by over 11 points at the half, with a 16-point lead going into the locker room Saturday against Wyoming.

- Jonathan Tavernari hit one three-pointer against Wyoming to bring his career total to 172. He is now 42 thirds from passing Mark Bigelow (213) for first. He has 55 threes this season.
- Lee Cummard hit one trey against Wyoming to give him 26 for the season and 143 for his career. He is fourth all-time and 21 from passing Mike Rose for third.
- Jonathan Tavernari scored five points against Wyoming to bring his career total to 989. He needs 11 points to reach the 1,000-point mark for his career.

LAST YEAR AT WYOMING — COUGARS COMEBACK TO DEFEAT COWBOYS

LARAMIE, Wyo. (Feb. 4, 2009) – Despite being behind at the half, the BYU men's basketball team (23-6, 11-4) pulled into a three-way tie for first place in the Mountain West Conference defeating the Wyoming Cowboys 78-68. The Cougars are now tied for first in the conference standings with Utah and New Mexico. Leading the Cougars in the Arena-Auditorium was senior Lee Cummard who posted 24 points, eight rebounds, one steal and one block. Jonathan Tavernari had his sixth double-double of the season throwing up 19 points and 11 rebounds for the Cougars. Jimmer Fredette was also in double figures for the Cougars with 15 points and eight rebounds. He was perfect from the charity stripe, going 6-for-6. As a team, the Cougars grabbed 14 offensive rebounds and 34 defensive, for 48 total rebounds on the night, posting 12 second-chance points. The team also scored 12 points off turnovers. BYU started with the first points on the board at 2-0, the first and last lead of the first half. Wyoming answered with a two and a three, with BYU not scoring until Lamont Morgan, Jr. subbed in to post a bucket for the Cougars to bring the score to 4-5 at the 15:08 mark. The Cougars and the Cowboys would trade baskets until Cummard made two free throws and a three pointer to knot the score at 13. Wyoming would soon post its largest lead of the game at 10 – going on a 10-0 run to make it 30-20. The Cougars posted a 6-0 run with buckets from Fredette, Cummard and Tavernari. Fredette would make a tough turnaround jumper at the 2:17 mark to bring the Cougars within four. Trading baskets for the last two minutes, the Cowboys would lead 40-35 going into the locker rooms. Coming out running, the Cougars posted an 8-2 run to start the half, giving them their first lead of the game since 2-0 at 44-42. A fast break dunk by James Anderson later put the Cougars up by four points at 53-49. The Cowboys answered with a 7-0 run to regain the lead at 56-53, keeping it until Cummard hit two free throws, sparking an 11-0 run. Following the free throws, Cummard also made a three-point play at the 7:22 mark to give the Cougars a two-point lead. In the 11-0 run, Cummard had eight of the points. Wyoming knocked down 1-of-2 from the stripe at the 3:37 mark to end the 11-0 Cougar run. Trying to run down the clock, BYU kept the ball between the circles until Fredette made a three with the shot clock winding down, putting the Cougars up by nine points.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

– “This was a good game. Our guys played really hard defensively today. In this type of game where both teams are familiar with each other, I was really happy for our players, especially after a difficult week.”
– “I thought both teams played hard. Jimmer has been terrific the last month or so and he continues to get more experience. He’s making better decisions.”
– “In this game we actually got stops that allowed opportunity breaks. We got some separation and that gave us the confidence we needed.”

Player Notes

– Jonathan Tavernari posted his sixth double-double of the season and eighth of his career with 19 points and 11 rebounds at Wyoming. He hit 7-of-16 from the field and 3-of-6 from downtown and added one block.
– Lee Cummard posted 24 points – his 10th 20-point game of the season – and eight rebounds. He hit 13-of-15 from the free throw line – career highs in makes and attempts. He also had one block and one steal.
– Jimmer Fredette had 15 points and a career-high eight rebounds while adding two assists. He hit 6-of-6 from the free throw line, tying a career-best for free throw percentage.
– Jackson Emery led BYU with six assists as the Cougars had eight as a team.

– At 11-4 BYU is now tied with New Mexico and Utah for first in the conference. The Cougars will play for at least a share of the title on Saturday against Air Force at 7 p.m. in the Marriott Center. BYU will honor its seniors at the game.
– For the 27th time in 29 games this season, BYU head coach Dave Rose started Jimmer Fredette, Jackson Emery, Lee Cummard, Jonathan Tavernari and Chris Miles. The Cougars are 21-6 with that starting lineup. Lamont Morgan, Jr., started the first game of the season in place of Jimmer Fredette and Charles Abouo started the Wyoming game in Provo in place of Jackson Emery.
– Trailing 40-35 at Wyoming at the break the Cougars trailed at the half for the fourth-straight game and for the fifth-straight game BYU shot below 40.0 percent in the first half (32.4 percent). The Cougars came back to win for the third-straight game. BYU trailed at UNLV by two at the half but was unable to come all the way back for the win, losing 75-74.
– BYU set a season high with 26 makes from the free throw line. The Cougars hit 26-of-31 and were led by Lee Cummard (13-of-15) while Jimmer Fredette hit 6-of-6.
– At 5-3 on the road in league play the Cougars are the only team in the conference with a winning road record. BYU is 9-3 on the road overall, a conference record for league play.
– With a 78-68 win at Wyoming the Cougars are now 9-0 against Wyoming under BYU head coach Dave Rose. Lee Cummard has been there for every win.

BYU'S LAST OUTING — STRONG TEAM PLAY GIVES BYU WIN OVER CSU

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 16, 2009) – The depth of the No. 18/17 BYU bench showed in their 91-47 victory over Colorado State in the Marriott Center on Saturday. With ten players seeing double-digit minutes, the Cougars received positive contributions from their entire lineup. BYU (18-1, 3-0 MWC) was led by Jimmer Fredette, who returned to the Cougar starting lineup with 21 points. Jonathan Tavernari continued to provide strong performances coming off the bench as the senior posted 14 points, four steals, three rebounds and two assists in just 19 minutes. Freshman Tyler Haws sparked the Cougars in the first half as the guard shot .750 from the field and scored nine points. It rained threes early initially for the Cougars while the Rams found early success with their post play. The first two made baskets for BYU came from downtown with treys by Jackson Emery and Haws to give the Cougars a 6-2 before CSU (11-6, 2-1) showed their strength down low and tied the score at 8-8. Rose looked to his bench for a significant contribution throughout the game. Freshman center Brandon Davies came into the game and provided an instant spark for the Cougars, scoring on his first possession of the game and finishing with eight rebounds and four points. Tavernari hit a three soon after entering the game, but the Rams continued to battle and took a 16-15 lead with twelve minutes to play in the first half. The Cougars were finally able to pull away after a 12-0 run thanks in large part to the continued strong play of the BYU bench gave the Cougars a 38-22 lead going into the break. Strong defensive play by BYU prevented CSU from scoring a field goal in the last eight minutes of the half. Cougar fans stayed on their feet much of the second half as Fredette added eight points in the first five minutes.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...**BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

– “I was really pleased with how our team responded in the first half against a great team and how they handled themselves throughout the whole game. During the second half we played terrific. It is a good win and we look forward to playing a tough Wyoming team next.”
– “I have been really pleased with how this team has stuck together. These guys have great chemistry and it shows on the floor. This is a team that is playing together well and can overcome anything.”
– “One of the things that has really helped our team defensively is our depth in the post position. Chris Miles, Brandon Davis, Noah Hartssock and James Anderson really give us power down low on defense.”
– “In order to have a good team, you have to be the best from your number one player, down to the 13th. Brock is a tough, physical player who plays hard in practice and in a game situation. He leaves his heart on the court every day.”
– “I believe that we are a team filled with competitors. Having said that, I don't believe that they are fully satisfied yet. It's a healthy feeling that we have and I really enjoy coaching players with this kind of attitude.”

IN THE RANKINGS

The BYU men's basketball team entered the top-25 rankings for the first time this season on Jan. 4 at No. 25 in the AP Poll and No. 23 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Cougars are currently ranked No. 14 in the AP Poll and No. 13 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, their highest rankings in both polls since 1987-88. Rose has led his teams to the rankings in the each of the last four seasons to become the first Cougar coach to lead BYU into the rankings in four-straight seasons. ROAD SUCCESS

In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU was 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU is 5-1 on the road this season — including 1-0 in MWC play — with seven road games to play.

FREE THROW STREAKS

Junior guard Jimmer Fredette set a BYU record with 39-consecutive made free throws from Nov. 17 to Dec. 12. Fredette broke the record when he hit his 33rd-consecutive free throw with 16:56 remaining in the second half against Arizona State. He had a streak of 13 straight in the first two games and reached 20-straight before missing after six-straight makes against Nebraska. For the season he is shooting .911 from the line and his career percentage is .871 — second in Cougar history. Tyler Haws is shooting .885 from the line and had a streak of 20-straight made free throws end against Eastern New Mexico. Jackson Emery had a streak of 14-straight free throws end at UTEP and is shooting .816 for the season.

MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU senior Jonathan Tavernari and Colorado State junior Andy Ogide have been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Co-Players of the Week for games through January 10. This is the first career weekly accolade for both recipients. A 6-6 guard/forward from Sao Bernardo, Brazil, Tavernari led BYU to a Conference home win over UNLV (77-73) and a non-conference road win at UTEP (83-77) last week. Against UNLV, he came off the bench to score 17 points on 4-of-9 shooting from the field, including 4-of-8 from beyond the arc, and pull down a season-high nine rebounds. Tavernari scored 14 of his 17 points in the second half, shooting 3-for-5 from three-point range and knocking down 5-of-6 attempts from the charity stripe. He added three assists, two blocks and one steal in 30 minutes vs. the Runnin' Rebels. Tavernari followed with a season-high 19 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 3-of-6 from beyond the arc, vs. UTEP. He scored 11 of his points in the second half, while collecting five of his six total rebounds. Tavernari, also tallied two assists and one steal in 19 minutes off the bench. On the week, he averaged 18.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game, while shooting 11-for-21 from the floor (.524%), 7-for-14 from three-point range (.500%) and 7-for-8 from the charity stripe (.875%).

FREDETTE, EMERY AND HAWS EARN VEGAS CLASSIC HONORS

LAS VEGAS [Dec. 23, 2009] – After leading the Cougars to the 2009 HoopTV Las Vegas Classic championship, BYU's Jimmer Fredette was named tournament MVP while Jackson Emery and Tyler Haws were named to the all-tournament team. The guard trio led the Cougars' high-octane attack at the Orleans Arena as BYU defeated Nevada 110-104 and Nebraska 88-66. The combined for 132 points — 66.0 per game — and to shoot .705 (43-61) from the field, .545 (12-22) from three and .971 (34-35) from the free throw line. Fredette posted averages of 28.5 points and 5.0 assists while shooting .679 (19-28) from the field and .944 (17-18) from the free throw line. Against Nevada he scored a career-high 33 points — including a 22-point second half — while dishing out six assists. He went for 24 points and four dimes against Nebraska in the championship game. Emery accounted for 24.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals while shooting .667 (14-21) from the field, .692 (9-13) from three and 1.000 (11-11) from the free throw line. Emery set a career high with 25 points in the Nevada win and added 23 points against Nebraska. Haws added 13.5 points and 3.5 rebounds per game in the Vegas Classic. He shot .833 (10-12) from the field and 1.000 (6-6) from the free throw line. He was perfect shooting the ball against Nebraska, hitting 7-of-7 from the field and 6-of-6 from the free throw line for a career-best 20 points.

ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) – BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons.

ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6-foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the three-time defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. As a sophomore Collinsworth averaged 14.7 points, 3.0 assists and 4.8 rebounds and earned first-team all-state honors from the Deseret News and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points. A 6-foot-9 forward with the skills to play at both the small and power forward positions, Chris Collinsworth helped lead BYU to 27-8 record and an outright regular season MWC title while averaging 3.2 points and 4.8 rebounds and chipping in 14 blocks, 19 assists and nine steals. He led the Cougars in rebounding seven times while posting double-digit boards on three occasions. Martineau, a 5-11 point guard out of Fruit Heights, Utah, played in 20 games as a true freshman. He averaged 5.8 minutes per game and totaled 13 points, 14 assists and eight rebounds. Martineau posted career highs of six points and four assists against Loyola Marymount.

EMERY AND MORGAN NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 20, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced Tuesday that senior Lamont Morgan, Jr., and junior Jackson Emery have been named captains for this year's team. "Jackson and Lamont are team players," Rose said. "They are proven leaders and have the respect of their teammates. They are willing to do whatever it takes to make this team better. Their teammates voted them as captains and I couldn't ask for better leaders." Morgan enters his third year in the program after redshirting in 2007-08 and playing a key role off the bench last season. The 5-foot-10 senior guard averaged 3.6 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists while shooting .461 from the field and .412 from downtown. In his first season back from a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Mexico, Emery started 32 of 33 games while posting averages of 7.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists. He was third on the team with 47 steals and shot .480 from the field, .377 from downtown and .738 from the free throw line. Known for his hustle and defensive play, Emery earned a spot on the 2009 MWC All-Defensive Team.

HOME OPENER ATTENDANCE MARKS

The 16,276 on hand to witness BYU's 70-60 season-opening win over Bradley in the Marriott Center was the largest crowd for a home opener since 1994-95 when there were 17,654 in the stands for BYU's 96-80 win over Nevada. The attendance for home openers has increased each year since 2006-07, when 8,854 were on hand to see BYU outlast Idaho State 84-78 in overtime. In 2007-08 the Cougars got the best of Idaho State again, winning 90-69 with 12,153 in the Marriott Center. Last season 15,753 seats were full as BYU defeated Long Beach State 75-65 in the season/home opener.

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire) gained valuable experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA Afrobasket Tournament.

FIRST HALF LEADS, MARGIN OF VICTORY

BYU has led at the half in all but one game this season and has held double-digit halftime leads in 11 games. The Cougars held their biggest halftime lead of 41 against Eastern Washington (55-14). BYU has won by at least 10 points in 14 of the team's 18 wins, 20-plus eight times and 30-plus six times.

NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

PROVO, Utah (July 16, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2009-10 nonconference schedule Thursday, which features matchups with Arizona, Arizona State and Utah State as well as a trip to the Las Vegas Classic. The 16-game nonconference slate includes teams from nine different conferences and nine teams that qualified for postseason play in 2009. The Mountain West Conference schedule will be announced at a later date. On Nov. 17 BYU will host Idaho State, a team the Cougars have defeated in five-straight contests including 85-65 in 2008. Three days later BYU will head to the Aloha State to play Western Athletic Conference member Hawai'i. The two teams last played in 1999, the Cougars' final season as members of the WAC. After the Hawai'i game the blue and white will host Southern University (Nov. 24) and Weber State (Nov. 27). BYU will look to protect its unbeaten home record (17-0) against the Wildcats. The Cougars will open the month of December with instate rival Utah State. BYU owns a 135-90 record against the Aggies but has lost four-straight in Logan. The game is scheduled for Dec. 2. On Dec. 5 the Cougars will play at Energy Solutions Arena for the fifth time since 2003 when they host San Francisco. BYU defeated Utah State 68-63 in 2008 at Energy Solutions where the Cougars are 2-2 all-time. BYU will remain in Utah and host Arizona State on Dec. 8 at the Marriott Center. The Cougars will be looking to avenge last season's one-point loss at the Stadium Shootout at the University of Phoenix Stadium. BYU will head to southern California to take on Fresno State at the Galen Center in Los Angeles on Dec. 12. Former Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland is at the helm of the Bulldog program. BYU returns to the Marriott Center following the neutral tilt at the Galen Center to host Wagner (Dec. 17) and Eastern Washington (Dec. 19) for its first two games of the Las Vegas Classic. The final two games of the Classic will be at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on Dec. 22 and 23. Nebraska, Nevada and Tulsa will also compete in the Classic. Matchups will be announced at a later date. BYU's last game of the 2009 calendar year will be at Arizona on Dec. 28. The Cougars and Wildcats were conference rivals in the 1960s and 70s when both teams were members of the WAC. The final home nonconference game will be against Eastern New Mexico on Jan. 2 and the nonconference schedule will conclude at UTEP on Jan. 9.

IMPROVED DEPTH

BYU's bench has scored at least 21 points 14 times and in double figures in all 19 games this season. Last season the BYU bench scored 20-plus points just eight times all season. The 46 bench points vs. Southern are the most bench points by a BYU team since the reserves scored 59 vs. Western Oregon on Dec. 22, 2006.

IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (232).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (102).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

PRESEASON MWC POLL

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavarnari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the pre-season squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring (16.2 ppg) and assists (1.35) for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavarnari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder (7.2 rpg) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring (6th/15.7 ppg) and 3-point percentage (8th/.381) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining first-place vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU (82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force (25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior Tre'Von Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the

national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 12 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 26 years of coaching experience—including 14 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college and high school levels—Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

SUMMARY: A prolific scorer, guard Jimmer Fredette is a tough, hard-nosed competitor who was ranked by ESPN.com among the nation's top 75 high school shooting guards. Known for his shooting touch, Fredette set the league scoring record at Glens Falls High School (Glens Falls, N.Y.) with 2,404 career points. He was a significant contributor as a freshman, averaging 7.0 points off the bench. In 2008-09 he became BYU's first point guard to earn first-team all-conference honors since Marty Haws in 1990. Fredette averaged 16.2 points and 4.1 assists while contributing a team-best 50 steals. He also shot 48.0 percent from the field, 38.2 percent on threes and 84.7 percent from the free throw line. Fredette was inducted into the Capital District Basketball Hall of Fame in the summer of 2009.

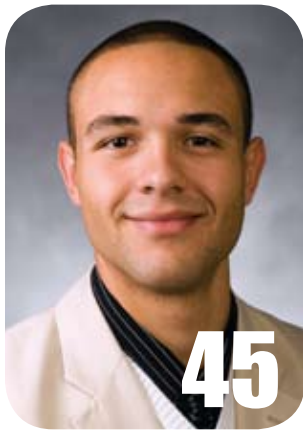

SUMMARY: The 2007 Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year, Jonathan Tavernari followed a standout season in his first year with the Cougars with a record-setting sophomore campaign. He earned All-MWC Third Team honors and set the BYU single-season and sophomore MWC three-point record with 88 triples. Tavernari repeated as a third-team selection in 2009 and posted averages of 15.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game. The 6-foot-6 forward was the lone non-professional to earn a spot on the 2008 Brazilian Senior National Team, playing in the Olympic Qualifying Tournament in Athens. He is participating with the team in the summer of 2009 and trying to help Brazil earn a spot in the 2010 World Championships in Turkey.
