MATCH OUTLOOK



It's a clash between two top-five teams this week as No. 5 BYU (4-1, 2-0 MPSF) hosts No. 3 Stanford (2-0, 2-0 MPSF) at the Smith Fieldhouse for a two-match series on Friday and Saturday nights. Both undefeated in Mountain Pacific Sports Federation play, the Cardinal and Cougars share the lead in the loss column, along with USC and Cal State Northridge with three wins apiece.

The Cardinal opened the 2010 season 2-0 after back-to-back sweeps of No. 8 Hawaii last weekend. Evan Romero, Spencer McLachlin, and Brad Lawson recorded a combined 38 kills as the Cardinal hit a strong .413 as a team against the Warriors (2-3, 0-2).

SERIES INFO

BYU holds a 23-12 lead in the series between these two teams dating back to March 2, 1990. The Cougars hold a 10-4 record against the Cardinal in Provo, with their most recent victory coming in 2008. BYU has won nine of the past 13 matches and swept Stanford in six of those. Two of those matches went to four games, while BYU and Stanford each won a five-set match last season.

COMING OFF...

The Cougars are coming off back-to-back sweeps over Pacific last week to open the MPSF season 2-0. The 4,024 fans in attendance for the home opener on Friday marked the largest home crowd since the Cougars played then-No. 2 UC Irvine in front of 5,603 fans in 2007. Outside hitters Andrew Stewart and Kevin Sagers led BYU with nine kills apiece on Friday, while the team tied a season-high 18 blocks. Saturday Robb Stowell and Stewart led the Cougars with 13 and 10 kills, respectively, on way to a 30-21, 30-26, 30-23 win.

BYU IN THE MPSF TOURNAMENT

Since 1993, BYU has qualified for the MPSF postseason tournament in 14 of 15 seasons, including 13 consecutive trips. The Cougars' all-time record in the MPSF tournament is 19-13. BYU has won the MPSF tournament three times and holds an 11-6 record in the first round, 5-5 record in the semifinals and 3-2 record in tournament finals. The Cougars won consecutive MPSF tournament championships in 2003 and 2004.

BYU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Cougars have made four NCAA tournament appearances in the program's history. Impressively, BYU has brought home the hardware in three of its four NCAA tournament appearances. The Cougars boast a 7-1 overall record in NCAA tournament play and a perfect 4-0 record in national semifinal matches. The Cougars only loss in the NCAA tournament was in 2003 when they lost to Lewis in a five-game thriller. BYU has earned automatic bids to the Final Four by winning the MPSF tournament three times: 1999, 2003 and 2004.

ALL-AMERICANS

Since 1993, 20 different players have earned All-America 38 citations, 14 of which are first-team honors and 13 of which are second-team honors. Most recently, Russell Holmes (First Team) and Ivan Perez (Second Team) were named AVCA All-Americans in 2008.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

BYU finished its 2009 season with a 9-3 (.750) record at the Smith Fieldhouse, facing teams like No. 1 UC Irvine, No. 5 Long Beach State, No. 10 UC San Diego and No. 10 UCLA. The Cougars have only lost six home matches dating back to the 2006 season.

PRESEASON EXHIBITION

BYU finished its exhibition schedule having won five of seven matches. The preseason opened with the annual Alumni Match. The team of former Cougars pulled out a 3-1 win over the current team. BYU then played against Long Beach State, Grand Canyon and Long Beach City College in Las Vegas, going undefeated in the tournament.

The Cougars then returned home to host the BYU Tournament, defeating Arizona and UVU, while losing again to the alumni. Seniors Andrew Stewart and Reed Chilton were named to the all-tournament team, while BYU assistant Rob Neilson coach earned MVP honors.

WHERE ARE YOU FROM?

Players come from all over the world to play with BYU's volleyball team. The Cougars have players from Brazil, Puerto Rico and Venezuela on their roster. Seven states are also represented on this year's team: Arizona, California, Ohio, Hawaii, Illinois, Nevada and Utah. California leads the way with six players hailing from the Golden State.

COUGAR COACHING STAFF



HEAD COACH SHAWN PATCHELL

With a career record of 65-24, Shawn Patchell is in his fourth year as head coach and eighth year overall as a member of BYU's staff. Patchell came to BYU from Laguna Beach High School where he was head coach for both the boys and girls volleyball teams.

In addition to his BYU coaching responsibilities, Patchell was selected to be the 2008-09 Junior National Team Head Coach. His team competed at the Junior National Team World

Championships in Pune, India this past summer and was in El Salvador last summer where it took the bronze medal. Patchell also coached the Youth National Team at the FIVB World Championships in Mexico in 2007, the first US team to qualify and participate in the Youth World Championships. In 2006 Patchell assisted the Youth National Team to a win over Cuba and a silver medal at the Dominican Republic NORCECA tournament, which qualified Team USA for the World Championships.

During the summer of 2005, Patchell coached the US World University Games team.

A member of BYU's first NCAA mens volleyball team, Patchell was a starter from 1990-93 and recorded a .398 career hitting percentage. In 1992, Patchell's junior year, he led the nation in hitting percentage at .488 and was honored as All-Academic Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. He was ranked fourth and 10th nationally in hitting and blocking his senior year. Patchell played professionally in Spain for the Euro Cup qualifier and No. 1 ranked Gran Canaria Team in the Canary Islands and also represented the US in the Federation International Volleyball AVolssociation Sand Volleyball Circuit in Europe.

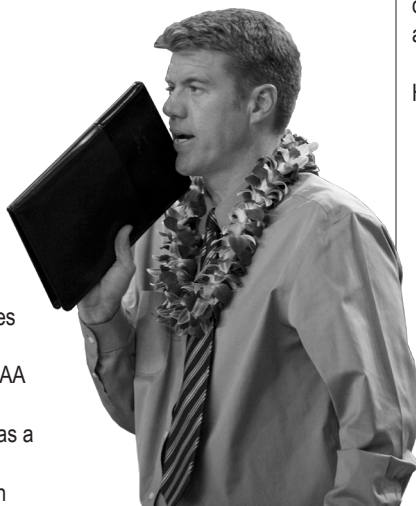
Patchell earned his BA in English with a minor in business management from BYU in 1993 and a master's degree in English Literature from the University of California at Irvine in 2000. He is a part-time member of the BYU English Department and Business School where he teaches literature and composition classes. ASSISTANT COACH ROB NEILSON

Rob Neilson enters his fourth season as an assistant coach at BYU. Neilson has been coaching volleyball at summer camps since 2000. He played for and coached under former BYU coaches Carl McGown and Tom Peterson.

Neilson is no stranger to BYU volleyball. He was the starting setter for two years with the Cougars in 2005 and 2006. As a junior in 2005, Neilson earned All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Honorable Mention status while

also being named Academic All-MPSF. He started every match in his junior and senior year. Neilson was named the USA Today/AVCA National Player of the Week in his junior season from his play against Hawaii.

As a senior, Neilson earned All-MPSF Honorable Mention and Academic All-MPSF honors for his second consecutive season. All totaled, Neilson played in 314 career games for BYU which is seventh in BYU history. He was a member of BYU's 2004 National Championship team.

Neilson, who was raised in Pacific Palisades, Calif., served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Croatia. He earned a BS degree in neuroscience from BYU in 2006. Neilson married Sarah Wheatly in September 2006.



VOLUNTEER COACH RODRIGO GOMES

Gomes is a native of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil who played one year on the BYU squad. He began his volleyball training on the beaches of Rio de Janeiro with his father as his coach. He went on to lead his Impacto High School team to a Rio de Janeiro Championship and two second place finishes in the national tournament. He also played two years of club volleyball for Tisuca Tennis Club, Fluminense under Gilberto Girino before coming to Provo.

As a freshman in 2006, Gomes played in 22 matches and started one. He recorded 44 kills and eight aces on the year to go along with his 32 digs and five blocks at the outside hitter position. He recorded a career-high 13 kills, two aces and four digs against Ohio State in arguably his best performance of the year.

He is currently in his third year as a volunteer assistant coach with the team.

A LOOK BACK AT 2009

Despite a young roster, the 2009 BYU men's volleyball team (17-13, 13-9 MPSF) finished the season with a No. 7 national ranking after seeing its share of upsets over several of the top teams in the country. The Cougars posted an 8-4 record against six top-10 teams to conclude the regular season, earning their 13th consecutive trip to the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation playoffs.

Leading the Cougars were All-MPSF Second Team selections Andrew Stewart and Futi Tavana, along with Yamil Perez who received honorable mention.

As a co-team captain, along with setter Reed Chilton, Stewart was a mainstay at outside hitter for BYU. As a junior he led the team with 408 kills on the season, averaging 3.64 per set. Stewart recorded double-digit kills 22 times throughout the year, including 13 consecutive matches. His 854 kill attempts in 2009 sits fourth on BYU's rally scoring record list.

A redshirt freshman middle blocker, Tavana played in and started all 30 matches following his return home from an LDS mission to Riverside, Calif. and was named Walk-On of the Year at BYU's 2009 Y Awards. His average of 1.47 blocks per set led the MPSF and ranked third nationally. A native of Kalaheo, Hawai'i, he led the Cougars with 169 blocks, second-most in BYU rally scoring history.

Stewart and Tavana weren't the only Cougars to rewrite the record books in 2009. Freshman middle Russell Lavaja racked up 123 block-assists on the season, placing him seventh on the rally scoring record list. Libero Joel Silva's 249 digs tied a program record he set in 2008.

As a team, the Cougars' five five-set match wins are second-most in program history, while their 404.5 total blocks top the BYU record list, 23 more than the previous record set in 2001. On the season BYU ranked third in the country, averaging 3.43 blocks per set.

BYU's winning tradition at the Smith Fieldhouse—the site of the 2009 NCAA National Championship—continued with the Cougars earning a 9-3 home record. BYU's teams have lost only five home matches in the past three years.

With no seniors and the addition of seven newcomers in 2009, the team had its work cut for it early after suffering back-to-back losses to No. 8 Stanford and No. 6 UC Irvine at the UC Santa Barbara Elephant Bar Invitational to open the season. After dropping a tough 3-2 home match to Cal Baptist on Jan. 15, the Cougars found themselves with an early 1-3 record.

Three wins at home over two 11th-ranked teams, Lewis and Hawai'i, gave BYU a record above .500 as it traveled to No. 10 UC Santa Barbara and No. 5 USC for a two-week road trip. The Cougars split match wins with the Gauchos before the Trojans handed them two losses on Feb. 6-7. Consecutive wins over No. 10 UC San Diego at home on Feb. 20-21 gave BYU the necessary momentum to sweep a two-match series at Pacific the following weekend.

March started with a road trip to No. 1 Cal State Northridge. The Matadors snapped BYU's four-match win streak with back-to-back sweeps. The Cougars had little time to dwell on the losses as they prepared to face the reigning national champion, Penn State, at the Long Beach State Active Ankle Tournament on March 13.

Stewart led the Cougars to a 3-2 win over the No. 4 Nittany Lions with a match-high 20 kills. While Penn State totaled five players with double-digit kills that night, compared to BYU's two, the Cougars pulled out a crucial win that would change the team's perspective on the remainder of the season.

After a 3-0 sweep over IPFW the following night, the Cougars returned home for a three-week home stand, hosting No. 5 Long Beach State, No. 10 UCLA and No. 1 UC Irvine. Tavana led the Cougars to a pair of five-set wins over the 49ers on March 20-21 with a pair of his own double-doubles, the first of his young career. His 13 blocks on March 21 tied a BYU rally scoring record. Garnering both national and MPSF Player of the Week honors following his performances, Tavana and the Cougars split a pair of contests with UCLA the next week.

Hoping to clinch an MPSF playoff spot, then-No. 6 BYU hosted top-ranked UC Irvine on April 2-3, a team that went on to win the 2009 National Championship in Provo. The Anteaters' visit marked the first No. 1 team to come to the Smith Fieldhouse since the Cougars hosted No. 1 Pepperdine in 2006. BYU made the most of its opportunity for an upset, snapping UCI's seven-match win streak in a four-set thriller. Kent Tuttle recorded 10 kills on the night with a .350 hitting percentage, despite suffering a head injury requiring ten staples after he dove for a ball near the bleachers.

While BYU played its final home match of the season in front of a season-high 3,878 fans, the Anteaters came away with their own 3-1 win, resulting in a series split for the two teams. The crowd of 3,878 not only marked the largest to visit the Fieldhouse in 2009, but the largest since Feb. 3, 2007 when 5,603 came to watch No. 1 BYU fall to No. 2 UCI.

BYU hit the road for the final two weeks of the regular season, splitting series at both No. 5 Stanford and No. 2 Pepperdine. Stewart was named MPSF Player of the Week, a career first, after contributing 18 kills both nights against the Waves.

Tied for fifth in the final conference standings, the sixth-seeded Cougars faced third-seed CSUN in the opening round of the MPSF playoffs. The Matadors were the only team to defeat and sweep both matches against BYU during the regular season. The Cougars hoped to pull out a win over CSUN after having secured series splits against the nation's first-, second- and fifth-ranked teams in each of the three weeks leading up to the first round, however, BYU fell short of a comeback after losing the first two sets, eventually falling 3-1.
