No. 16/14 BYU men's basketball (23-3, 8-2 MWC) hits the road for a Mountain West Conference matchup with Colorado State on Wednesday, Feb. 17, at 6 p.m. MST. The game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 5 p.m. MST on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

The Cougars play the second of back-to-back road games on Saturday, Feb. 20, at 4 p.m. MST, at Wyoming. ### COUGAR QUICK HITS

- Jimmer Fredette set BYU single-game records with 49 points and nine threes against Arizona in the Fiesta Bowl Classic in Tucson, Ariz., at the McKale Center. BYU handed Arizona its worst loss at the McKale Center, 99-69.
- BYU's 15-game winning streak, it's second-longest winning streak in school history ended on Jan. 27 at New Mexico, 76-72.
- Fredette is 21st all-time in scoring at BYU with 1,282 career points. He leads the conference in scoring at 20.9 points per game. He is also 13th at BYU in career assists with 309 and 12th in steals with 111.
- Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has five-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight postseason appearances. At 120-37 (.764) overall, he is BYU's all-time leader in winning percentage.
- Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers with two treys vs. San Francisco to give him 214. He is now at 245 after hitting five threes vs. Air Force. He is also climbing the lists for points (12th with 1,421) and steals (3rd with 145).
- Since Jonathan Tavernari's freshman year, BYU has won 100 games — the best four-year stretch in BYU basketball history — and he has played in 96. The only Cougar to have played in more wins in BYU history is Lee Cummond, who played in 97 victories.

**LOOKING AT COLORADO STATE**

Colorado State is 15-9 overall and 6-4 in the Mountain West Conference. The Rams are 10-2 in Moby Arena including 3-2 in conference games. In MWC play the Rams have defeated Wyoming, TCU and Air Force at home while losing to San Diego State and UNLV. Colorado State has won three straight with a 65-50 win at Utah, a 80-64 home win against Wyoming and a 51-47 win at Air Force. Freshman Dorian Green leads the Rams in scoring (12.8 ppg), assists (2.3) and threes (4.5). Junior Andy Ogide adds 11.5 ppg and a team-best 5.9 rpg while shooting a team-best .545 from the field. Travis Franklin is third on the team in scoring (10.9 ppg) and second in rebounding (5.3 rpg). Adam Nigon adds 8.2 ppg and 42 threes while Greg Smith averages 7.7 ppg and 4.4 rpg and Andre McFarland adds 6.6 ppg. As a team the Rams average 67.3 ppg, shoot .430 from the field, .356 from three and .684 from the free throw line. Their opponents average 64.4 ppg, shoot .418 from the field and .332 from three. Colorado State out-rebounds its opponents 35.9 to 31.9. Tim Miles is in his third season coaching the Rams. He is 31-56 at Colorado State.

**COLORADO STATE'S LAST OUTING — RAMS ESCAPE AIR FORCE FOR 51-47 WIN**

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Andy Ogide tallied 12 points, and freshmen Dorian Green and Greg Smith each scored 10, helping CSU escape with a 51-47 victory at Air Force on Tuesday night. The Rams overcame a 29-21 halftime deficit, closing the contest on a 12-4 run over the final 6:30. "In our prep, we talked about winning the paint and not turning the ball over, and at halftime we're getting beat in both categories," said Head Coach Tim Miles. "I credit the kids. They really came back and won with defense. We got stops, we got stops, we got stops, and even though we weren't doing a lot on offense, we did enough." Air Force built a halftime lead by outscoring the Rams 14-6 in the paint in the opening 20 minutes, and turning nine Rams' turnovers into nine points. Colorado State responded, outscoring the Falcons 10-4 in the paint and allowing the Falcons only two more points off turnovers in the final 20 minutes. Those improvements helped the Rams stay within striking distance for much of the second half, as the Air Force lead never reached more than two possessions over the final 18 minutes of action. "We worked harder in the second half to loosen things up and attack the rim," added Miles. But it was a Green three-pointer with 6:30 left to play that cut the CSU deficit to 43-42 and sparked a 12-4 Rams' run to end the game, completing the second-half comeback and the regular-season sweep of the Falcons. The Rams, who missed both of their foul shots in the first half, hit 10-of-15 in the second half, led by a 5-for-6 performance from junior F Travis Franklin at the charity stripe. Green hit 4-of-5 attempts in the closing stanza, and Smith iced the game, hitting 1-of-2 with three seconds left on the clock to put the game out of reach. Smith turned in another stellar performance for the Rams, tallying nine rebounds to go along with his 10 points. Ogide and Green each finished with four rebounds, while junior G Adam Nigon pulled down seven rebounds to go along with his five points. The win marked the fourth consecutive regular-season victory over the Falcons for CSU, and gave the Rams a regular-season sweep over a second conference opponent (Wyoming) for the first time since the 1999-2000 season.

**SERIES NOTES**

BYU leads the all-time series against Colorado State 87-46 and has won the last seven meetings, including a 91-47 victory in Provo this season. BYU has won the last two games at Colorado State. Dave Rose is 9-1 all-time against the Rams.

**LAST YEAR AT COLORADO STATE — BYU CLAIMS MWC SEASON OPENER**

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (Jan. 10, 2009) – The BYU men's basketball team (13-2) defeated the Colorado State Rams (5-11) 86-60 to open Mountain West Conference play on Saturday. Senior reigning MWC Player of the Year Lee Cummond led the Cougars in scoring, posting 18 points on the afternoon. Sophomore Jimmer Fredette had 15 points while junior Lamont Morgan, Jr., tallied 11. The Cougars kicked off conference play with a 6-0 run in the first two minutes of the game. CSU's only lead of the game was at 13-12 and the final tie of the game was 15-all at the 11:20 mark. Making adjustments to the defensive play before halftime, BYU was able to shut down the CSU offense, pulling away with a 16-point lead going into the locker room. The BYU bench helped the Cougars post a 46-30 lead at the half with Lamont Morgan, Jr. scoring nine points while adding two assists and one steal. Charles Abouj had five points and three rebounds while Gavin MacGregor tallied two points, two boards and a block. "The more time they can get on the floor, the more confident they become and the better they play," said Rose concerning his bench players. In the last seven minutes of the half, 14 of the 16 bench points came during a 21-8 run. Jimmer Fredette led the Cougars in the first half scoring 12 points, dishing out two assists and grabbing two boards. With BYU only three points ahead of CSU, he scored seven points during a 9-2 run to extend the lead to 34-24. Lamont Morgan, Jr., had his best first half of the season, scoring nine points on 4-for-6 shooting. He also grabbed three boards and two assists in the first half. The Cougars pulled away in the second half with Cummond leading his team in the second half posting 11 points. He posted 18 total points and eight rebounds on the afternoon. Cummond shot 8-for-10 from the field with 2-for-2 treys.

**WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...**

**BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

- "The more time they [BYU's bench players] can get on the floor, the more confident they become and the better they play."
- "We spend a lot of time in practice preparing for our opponent's specific actions, but Colorado State was running something they just put in. We were surprised for a minute or two but I think we did a good job adjusting to their scheme."

- BYU's bench came alive in the first half to help the Cougars claim a 46-30 lead at the break. Lamont Morgan, Jr., scored nine points, dished out two assists and had one steal, Charles Abouj had five points and three boards and Gavin MacGregor chipped in two points, two boards and a block. Fourteen of the 16 first half bench points came in during a 21-8 run in the last seven minutes of the half. The bench finished with 32 points, two shy of the season-high 34 points set against Western Oregon.
- For the eighth time this season and the first time in four games BYU shot 50 percent or better from the field in the first half, hitting 55.9 percent (19-of-34). The last time the Cougars won a conference road opener before the CSU win was in 2003 at San Diego State, 80-69.

**THIS YEAR VS. COLORADO STATE IN PROVO — STRONG TEAM PLAY GIVES BYU WIN OVER CSU**

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 16, 2009) – The depth of the No. 18/17 BYU bench showed in their 91-47 victory over Colorado State in the Marriott Center on Saturday. With ten players seeing double-digit minutes, the Cougars received positive contributions from their entire lineup. BYU (18-1, 3-0 MWC) was led by Jimmer Fredette, who returned to the Cougar starting lineup with 21 points. Jonathan Tavernari continued to provide strong performances coming off the bench as the senior posted 14 points, four steals, three rebounds and two assists in just 19 minutes. Freshman Tyler Haws sparked the Cougars in the first half as the guard shot .750 from the field and scored nine points. It rained threes early initially for the Cougars while the Rams found early success with their post play. The first two made baskets for BYU came from downtown with treys by Jackson Emery and Haws to give the Cougars a 6-2 before CSU (11-6, 2-1) showed their strength down low and tied the score at 8-8. Rose looked to his bench for a significant contribution throughout the game. Freshman center Brandon Davies came into the game and provided an instant spark for the Cougars, scoring on his first possession of the game and finishing with eight rebounds and four points. Tavernari hit a three soon after entering the game, but the Rams continued to battle and took a 16-15 lead with twelve minutes to play in the first half. The Cougars were finally able to pull away after a 12-0 run thanks in large part to the continued strong play of the BYU bench gave the Cougars a 38-22 lead going into the break. Strong defensive play by BYU prevented CSU from scoring a field goal in the last eight minutes of the half. Cougar fans stayed on their feet much of the second half as Fredette added eight points in the first five minutes.

– “I was really pleased with how our team responded in the first half against a great team and how they handled themselves throughout the whole game. During the second half we played terrific. It is a good win and we look forward to playing a tough Wyoming team next.”  
– “I have been really pleased with how this team has stuck together. These guys have great chemistry and it shows on the floor. This is a team that is playing together well and can overcome anything.”  
– “One of the things that has really helped our team defensively is our depth in the post position. Chris Miles, Brandon Davis, Noah Hartsock and James Anderson really give us power down low on defense.”  
– “In order to have a good team, you have to be the best from your number one player, down to the 13th. Brock is a tough, physical player who plays hard in practice and in a game situation. He leaves his heart on the court every day.”  
– “I believe that we are a team filled with competitors. Having said that, I don’t believe that they are fully satisfied yet. It’s a healthy feeling that we have and I really enjoy coaching players with this kind of attitude.”

**BYU'S LAST OUTING — STRONG FIRST HALF IGNITES WIN OVER AIR FORCE**

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 13, 2010) – A big first half helped the No. 17 BYU men's basketball team secure a 91-48 victory over Air Force at the Marriott Center on Saturday. With the win the Cougars improve to 23-3 overall and 8-2 in Mountain West Conference play. "I was really pleased with how we started the game and how we kept the momentum going in the first half," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "We shared the ball well, played on attack and took good shots. Defensively we did really well. This was a good game for our team, especially after sitting out this week." Senior Jonathan Tavernari led all scorers with 19 points, including five three-pointers. Other Cougars scoring in double figures included Jackson Emery with 18 and Tyler Haws with 16. It is BYU's second game this season with three players scoring 15 points or more. Emery made two quick three-pointers to open the game, but the Falcons scored the next seven points to gain their only lead of the game. Coming out of a timeout, the Cougars went on a 12-0 run, which included an Emery steal and fast-break layup with 14:26 to play in the first half. Tavernari capped the run with his first of four consecutive treys in two minutes. His quick 12 points gave BYU a 27-12 lead. "Jonathan's been terrific the last month," said Rose. "He's shooting the ball with a lot of confidence. If we get him playing with that look in his eye, knowing his shot will go in, it will be a real bonus for this group." A strong defensive effort by the Cougars kept the Falcons from scoring back-to-back baskets for the final 15 minutes of the half. "Defensively we were really engaged," said Rose. "We had a good game plan going in, but our guys executed it well. We challenged shots, were able to run and we shared the ball really well. It was good to see extra passes." Emery made two additional three-pointers during a 13-0 BYU run. A three-point play converted by senior Chris Miles extended the BYU lead to 30 points with 1:44 to play in the first half. The half ended with a jumper by Haws, sending the Cougars into the locker room with a 53-20 lead. BYU shot 66.7 percent from the field in the first half and outrebounded Air Force 19-to-7. Jimmer Fredette opened the second half scoring a jumper for BYU. Haws soon followed with a make from behind the arc, bringing the score to 58-22. The freshman went 5-of-6 on three trips to the free throw line, accounting for nine of the Cougars' next 14 points. Tavernari and Michael Loyd, Jr. were perfect on two trips to the charity stripe with eight minutes to play in the game. A three-pointer by Charles Abouo extended the BYU lead to 80-42. Playing in his first game since an appendectomy last week, freshman Brandon Davies made two free throws with just over six minutes to play. He and James Anderson converted late free throws as time ran off the clock.

With one steal against Air Force, Jackson Emery has 66 steals this season, tied for the most in a single season in school history. Marty Haws had 66 steals in the 1989-90 season.

**FOUR GAME STRETCH**

Jimmer Fredette's four-game stretch from Jan. 23 to Feb. 2 was his best this season as he averaged 30.5 points per game. He posted 33 at San Diego State, 27 at New Mexico, 36 at home against Utah and 26 at home against TCU. He shot .475 (38-80) from the field, .680 (17-25) from three and .935 (29-31) from the free throw line during the four-game stretch. Fredette was especially efficient in the second halves of those games, averaging 17.8 points while shooting .733 (11-15) from three and .947 (18-19) from the free throw line.

**1,600 WINS**

BYU's 76-56 win over TCU was the 1,600th victory in program history. BYU is the 19th program in NCAA history to win 1,600 games. Oregon State, Washington, Louisville and Texas also reached the plateau this season.

**IN THE RANKINGS**

BYU men's basketball entered the top-25 rankings for the first time this season on Jan. 4 at No. 25 in the AP Poll and No. 23 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Cougars are currently ranked No. 16 in the AP Poll and No. 14 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. BYU has been ranked as high as No. 12 in the AP Poll and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Rose has led his teams to the rankings in each of the last four seasons to become the first Cougar coach to lead BYU into the rankings in four-straight seasons. The Cougar basketball program has now been ranked in the AP Poll during 18 seasons since its first national ranking in 1950-51.

**BYU AS A RANKED TEAM**

BYU owns a 146-60 record as a ranked team, including 9-2 this season. The Cougars are 85-12 at home, 39-30 on the road and 22-18 at neutral sites when nationally ranked. BYU is 18-8 as a ranked team under Dave Rose.

**ROAD SUCCESS**

In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU was 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU is 6-3 on the road this season — including 2-2 in MWC play — with four road games to play.

**100 VICTORIES AND COUNTING**

With BYU's 83-65 win over Hawai'i, Dave Rose earned his 100th career victory in his 134th game as BYU's head coach. He reached the 100-win plateau faster than any coach in BYU history. Roger Reid previously held the record, achieving the mark in 143 games. **FREE THROW STREAKS**

Junior guard Jimmer Fredette set a BYU record with 39-consecutive made free throws from Nov. 17 to Dec. 12. Fredette broke the record when he hit his 33rd-consecutive free throw with 16:56 remaining in the second half against Arizona State. He's also had streaks of 13, 15, 20 and 23 this season. For the season he is shooting .898 from the line and his career percentage is .872 (292-335) — second in Cougar history. Tyler Haws is shooting .870 from the line and had a streak of 20-straight made free throws end against Eastern New Mexico. Jackson Emery had a streak of 14-straight free throws end at UTEP and is shooting .759 for the season.

**MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS**

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU junior Jimmer Fredette has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for games through January 31. This is the fourth weekly accolade of the season for Fredette and the sixth of his career overall. A 6-2 guard from Glens Falls, N.Y., Fredette averaged 31.5 points and 4.5 assists per game while leading BYU to a 1-1 mark in MWC action last week. In a 76-72 loss at then-No. 23 New Mexico, Fredette hit 4-of-6 from 3-point range and was 7-of-7 from the free throw line en route to a game-high 27 points. He also dished out seven assists. Fredette followed that performance with a game-high 36 points in an 82-69 win over in-state rival Utah at home, marking the most points scored by a BYU player in the history of the rivalry. He netted 23 of his points in the second half, including 20 in the final 10:26, to help the Cougars hold off a late Ute rally. With BYU holding a 66-61 edge with 5:31 left to play, Fredette scored 12 straight points to give the Cougars a 78-65 lead. He shot 4-of-5 from beyond the arc and 10-of-12 from the charity stripe. For the week, Fredette shot 72.7 percent (8-of-11) from 3-point range and 89.5 percent (17-of-19) from the free throw line.

**ROSE NAMED WINNER OF USBWA MOST COURAGEOUS AWARD**

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association named both men's and women's winners of the Most Courageous Award for the first time this season, with the men's honor going to Brigham Young coach Dave Rose and the women's to Farmingdale State point guard Tiffara Steward. Rose nearly lost his life last June to pancreatic cancer – a form of cancer that few beat – but was back on the recruiting circuit the following month and is back coaching a BYU team that had won all but one of its games through mid-January. The 4-foot-6 Steward is believed to be the smallest player in college-basketball history. She was born three months premature, weighing just 2 1/2 pounds and measuring eight inches, and she underwent three surgeries by the time she was 3 years old. She has been a starter and team captain the past two seasons at Farmingdale State, a Division III school on Long Island, N.Y., though she is blind in her right eye, has over a 50-percent hearing loss, has one leg that is shorter than the other and battles severe scoliosis.

After becoming severely ill while on a flight to Las Vegas for a family reunion, according to a story by Andy Katz on espn.com, Rose was diagnosed with a pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor, one of the deadliest forms of cancer. When the plane landed, Rose was removed from by emergency medical personnel. Rose was vomiting blood by the time he reached a Spring Valley area hospital. The tumor and lower part of his pancreas were removed during emergency surgery. Rose met with his team a few days after being released from his six-day stay in the hospital, much skinnier and his hair turned gray. His players fasted for one day, praying for their coach. By July 22, Rose was even allowed to recruit in Las Vegas. Rose was declared cancer-free last September, making him of the few to beat the deadly disease. He must continue to receive scans every six months for the next two years and, if he clears those, every year after that. "I'm honored to be chosen," Rose said. "I feel extremely fortunate to overcome the situation I had this past summer. I'm so grateful to the staff at Spring Valley Hospital in Las Vegas and the Huntsman Medical Center in Salt Lake City for their care. "There's so much uncertainty when cancer strikes. But, I had great family support and our players and coaches were unbelievable throughout this entire ordeal. This group of players will always be special to me." Through mid-January, Rose's Cougars were 16-1 and had risen to No. 19 in the AP poll.

**FREDETTE, EMERY AND HAWS EARN VEGAS CLASSIC HONORS**

LAS VEGAS (Dec. 23, 2009) – After leading the Cougars to the 2009 HoopTV Las Vegas Classic championship, BYU's Jimmer Fredette was named tournament MVP while Jackson Emery and Tyler Haws were named to the all-tournament team. The guard trio led the Cougars' high-octane attack at the Orleans Arena as BYU defeated Nevada 110-104 and Nebraska 88-66. The combined for 132 points – 66.0 per game – and to shoot .705 (43-61) from the field, .545 (12-22) from three and .971 (34-35) from the free throw line. Fredette posted averages of 28.5 points and 5.0 assists while shooting .679 (19-28) from the field and .944 (17-18) from the free throw line. Against Nevada he scored a career-high 33 points – including a 22-point second half – while dishing out six assists. He went for 24 points and four dimes against Nebraska in the championship game. Emery accounted for 24.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals while shooting .667 (14-21) from the field, .692 (9-13) from three and 1.000 (11-11) from the free throw line. Emery set a career high with 25 points in the Nevada win and added 23 points against Nebraska. Haws added 13.5 points and 3.5 rebounds per game in the Vegas Classic. He shot .833 (10-12) from the field and 1.000 (6-6) from the free throw line. He was perfect shooting the ball against Nebraska, hitting 7-of-7 from the field and 6-of-6 from the free throw line for a career-best 20 points.

**ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) – BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons.

**ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6-foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the three-time defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points.

**SELLOUT IN THE MARRIOTT CENTER**

The attendance for BYU's 82-69 win over Utah was 22,644, the first sellout in the Marriott Center since March 7, 2009 when the Cougars defeated Air Force 54-49 to earn a share of the 2008-09 regular season conference title. BYU was close to a sellout against Colorado State on Jan. 16 as 20,155 packed the seats in the Marriott Center.

**INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU**

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

**NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE**

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire) gained valuable experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA AfroBasket Tournament.

**FIRST HALF LEADS, MARGIN OF VICTORY**

BYU has led at the half in all but three games this season and has held double-digit halftime leads in 14 games. The Cougars held their biggest halftime lead of 41 against Eastern Washington (55-14). BYU has won by at least 10 points in 18 of the team's 23 wins, 20-plus 10 times and 30-plus seven times.

"We feel privileged that Nike has chosen us to help bring awareness to the Coaches vs. Cancer Suits and Sneakers cause," BYU head coach Dave Rose said. "We'll do anything we can to aide in the fight against this terrible disease."

IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (232).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (102).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

PRESEASON MWC POLL

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavernari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the pre-season squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring (16.2 ppg) and assists (1.35) for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavernari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder (7.2 rpg) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring (6th/15.7 ppg) and 3-point percentage (8th/.381) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining first-place vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU (82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force (25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior TreVon Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the

national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 12 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 26 years of coaching experience—including 14 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college and high school levels—Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

**SUMMARY:** A prolific scorer, guard Jimmer Fredette is a tough, hard-nosed competitor who was ranked by ESPN.com among the nation's top 75 high school shooting guards. Known for his shooting touch, Fredette set the league scoring record at Glens Falls High School (Glens Falls, N.Y.) with 2,404 career points. He was a significant contributor as a freshman, averaging 7.0 points off the bench. In 2008-09 he became BYU's first point guard to earn first-team all-conference honors since Marty Haws in 1990. Fredette averaged 16.2 points and 4.1 assists while contributing a team-best 50 steals.
