Cougars 2008 Home Opener

After playing a grueling 24 games on the road, the BYU women's softball team (13-11) opens its home season on March 17, against South Dakota State at 3 p.m.

The Cougars will play another home game on Tuesday, against Utah State at 4 p.m., before heading to the Stanford invitational to face Princeton, Eastern Carolina, Stanford and Wisconsin.

The first home contest of 2008 will mark the first meeting between BYU and SDSU. The Jackrabbbits are 6-15 on the season and arrive in Provo after going 2-1 against Southern Utah. BYU defeated Southern Utah, 4-1, during its season opener.

In the all-time series against Utah State, the Cougars lead the Aggies 24-2. The two teams faced one another last season and BYU took the victory, 5-1.

The Cougars are 7-2 during the program's home opening games. Last year BYU defeated Idaho State, 3-1, during the home opener.

About the Team . . . Last Week

At the UNLV Round Robin BYU went 1-1 against Nebraska. During the first game on March 14 the Cougars fell to the Huskers 2-0. Christie Zinanti received the loss. The following day BYU beat Nebraska 2-1. Freshman Jessica Purcell hit the go-ahead, two-run homer in the sixth inning for the win.

Heading Outdoors

With spring in the near future, the Cougars were able to hold their first outdoor practices at Gail Miller Field. While game situations are easily simulated in the Indoor Practice Facility, practicing outdoors will give the team and advantage they were missing with indoor practices.

Home Sweet Home

The Cougars have spent the last 24 games on the road, traveling all over the country. Monday's game marks the BYU home opener and the Cougars will play 18 games at home.

Going, Going, Gone

BYU has hit 27 home runs on the season, with 10 coming from Angeline Quiocho and seven from Dani Snow. Jessica Purcell has hit four home runs and Amada Vance has three. Stephanie Platt Hopkins has two home runs, including a grand slam, and Whitney Nix has one.

Injuries Impacting the Cougars

With only minor injuries the Cougars have not been significantly affected his season. Senior pitcher Christina Gwyn-Trice was a day-to-day decision during the UNLV Round Robin, but will likely be able to play during the Cougars home opener and Stanford Tournament. Adrea Ramirez has been out all season with a knee injury.

Cougar Bloodlines

Freshman Jessica Purcell joins her cousin Angeline Quiocho as a Cougar. Daniela Snow and Emi Snow Willing are sisters-in-law. Daniela married Emi's brother.

Did You Know...

- The Cougars enter the program's ninth season with sevenstraight winning seasons.
- BYU has had three consecutive berths to the NCAA Regional Tournament and the Cougas have hosted a Regional Tournament for the past two year.
- The Cougars have four married players on the team.
- During the program's existence it has carried six different All-Americans, incluing Jodi Norton and Jennifer Whitely from the 2007 MWC Champions.

Freshmen Making Big Impact

With three freshman in the starting lineup and one making big contributions from the circle, the young team has worked to gain as much experience while still early in the season. Jessica Purcell has seen significant time at both shortstop and catcher. Caschjen Davis has seen most of her time in left field and has made significant contributions offensivley, maintaining a .344 batting average with seven doubles. Kristin Dealhoussaye stepped in at second base for the Cougs, she is the only freshman to start in all 24 games. Paige Affleck brings a lot of power and speed to the circle. She holds a 1.75 ERA and is 4-2 on the season.

From the Circle

Three skilled pitchers make up BYU's rotation. Both Christina Gywn-Trice and Christie Zinanti return from last season, with Paige Affleck joining the two. Gwyn Trice leads the Cougars with a 1.29 ERA. She is 6-3 so far, and has struck out 102 batters in 65.1 innings.

2007 Mountain West Conference Champions

For the third time since the program's inception in 2000, the Cougars were named MWC Champions. The Cougars went 16-4 in conference play last year.

Cougars At Home

Home Opener

BYU has 18 games at home this season. The home opener is Monday, March 17 when the Cougars take on South Dakota State at 3 p.m.

Miller Park

Miller Park, a unique, combined baseball-softball facility, is the home to BYU baseball and softball. Baseball plays on Larry H. Miller Field, while softball calls Gail Miller Field, a back-to-back mirror image of the pre-existing baseball field, home. It is the first combined facility of its kind.

Head-to-Head with Baseball

Miller Park is one of the unique facilities in the country which can host softball and baseball at the same time. On five days Miller Park hosts both softball and baseball. On March 18 softball hosts Utah St. at 4 p.m. and baseball hosts Kansas State at 6 p.m. On April 8 softball hosts Southern Utah at 3 p.m. and baseball hosts Utah in a non-league game at 2 p.m. On Apr. 18 & 19 softball hosts Utah at 7 & 2 p.m., and baseball hosts TCU at 7 & 1 p.m. those days. On May 6 softball hosts Utah Valley at 5 p.m. and baseball hosts Washington State at 7 p.m.

Versus Ranked Opponents

BYU is 1-5 against ranked opponents this season. The Cougars lost to No. 2 Arizona State, No. 3 Texas A&M, No. 6 Tennessee, No. 9 Oklahoma and No. 22 Louisiana Lafayette. In the Cougars second game against a ranked opponent they came out on top of No. 22 Missouri, 4-0.

Senior Trio

The Cougars are led by seniors Gwyn Trice, Daniela Snow and Emi Snow Willing. With only three seniors on the roster, BYU has a lot of young athletes competing for positions. The Cougs look to gain experience and cement positions early during their competitive schedule.

MWC Preseason Champs

The Cougars were selected to win the Mountain West Conference, after finishing last season as conference Champions. Despite losing a slew of seniors, including two All-Americans, BYU looks to repeat another year of conference success.
