## Home Sweet Home

The BYU women's softball team (18-9) is home at last after a long 27 games on the road. The Cougars will host the University of Nevada, Las Vegas on Thursday (3 p.m./5 p.m.) and San Diego State on Friday (4 p.m./6 p.m.) to mark the beginning of Mountain West Conference play.

UNLV is posting a 17-21 overall record heading into conference play coming off three losses to ranked teams including No. 1 Arizona and No. 20 Nebraska. SDSU, last year's regular-season conference champs, is notching a 21-16 overall record and is currently on a five-game win streak.

The first game of Friday's doubleheader against SDSU will be broadcast live on KBYU TV. Jay Monson will provide the play-by-play and Garry Sheide will be the color analyst. Live stats will be provided for both games. A link is available on the BYU softball schedule page.

BYU is coming off two wins from neighboring Utah Valley State College on Tuesday in Orem. The Cougars defeated the Wolverines 15-2 and 11-1 in five-inning games. BYU was hot at the plate with seven hitters batting .333 or better. The team recorded four doubles and two homers in the contests.

The Cougars are also coming off the Stanford Classic in Palo Alto, Calif. last weekend. BYU posted a 2-2 record against tough competition. The Cougars got a big 5-2 win over Hawai`i in California after losing to the Wahine the first game of the season in Hawai`i. In the third match up of the season against UC Riverside, BYU also got a nice 9-5 win over the Highlanders. BYU was defeated by two quality opponents including a 3-2 loss to Illinois (receiving votes in the top-25) and a close 7-5 loss to No. 12 Stanford.

"It was a good weekend for us," BYU defense and recruiting coach Mindy Hanson said. "We feel confident that we're in the right spot to start conference."

Overall in the Stanford Classic, the Cougars hit five doubles and six home runs. Freshman Jodi Norton led BYU offensively batting 6-13 (.462), nailing three home runs and bringing in seven RBI. Defensively, she posted 10 assists and two putouts.

Senior Lindsey Gerhauser also did an excellent job at second base in both games on Saturday as she filled in for an injured Kate Walker.

"Lindsey stepped up and did a great job," Hanson said. "We have a very tough bench who comes through for us."

For the pitching squad, Niki Andersen stepped up to lead the Cougars over Hawai`i 5-2. She recorded eight strikeouts and allowed no earned runs. Andersen is also coming off her first MWC Pitcher of the Week award (March 23). Against Central Connecticut State, Andersen pitched solid to record her first no-hitter of her career, which marks only the second one in BYU's history. The first was set by Maryon DeWitt-Wallentine on March 21, 2001 against Utah State.

UNLV is posting a 17-21 overall record and is coming off three losses to ranked teams including two to No. 1 Arizona and one to No. 20 Nebraska. In the Preseason MWC Rankings, the Rebels were picked to finish No. 5 in conference this season. As a team, the Rebels are hitting .257, fielding .950 and have turned nine double plays so far this year. The team has played a mixture of quality teams including eight top-25 ranked teams. Starting in all 38 games for the Rebels and leading the way offensively is senior outfielder Bridget Byrne. Bryne bats .455, has tallied 55 hits, scored 21 runs, stolen 9-11 bases, hit six doubles and a triple on the year. Freshman outfielder Brittany Freight is next batting .325 with 26 hits, five doubles, 11 RBI and 11 walks. Teammate senior outfielder Lisa Sampson is batting .288 with 30 hits, six doubles, one triple, 15 RBI and 14 walks on the season. Pitcher and first baseman Kacey Ellis leads the team in RBI with 20. UNLV only has two home runs so far this season, both coming from junior third baseman Pauline Glenn. For the pitching staff, Jacqueline Kerrigan leads the trio with an impressive 1.74 ERA, 32 appearances and 170 strikeouts in 172.2 innings pitched. The squad posts an overall 2.70 ERA.

#### SDSU www.goaztecs.com

SDSU is posting a 21-16 overall record and is currently on a five-game win streak. The Aztecs return as a strong conference opponent after winning the regular-season title last year and were picked to finish No. 1 in the 2004 MWC Preseason Rankings. As a team, the Aztecs are hitting .245, fielding .963 and have turned 11 double plays so far this season. Leading the team for the SDSU is sophomore infielder Meagan Hartung batting .368. She is followed by teammates Janna Kovensky .343, Kelcy Murphy .289, Bree Boyer .286 and Joann Figueroa .250. Hartung leads the team in hits (39), doubles (6) and triples (2). Senior outfielder Kovensky has four doubles, two triples, two home runs, 14 RBI, 19 walks and is an impressive 10-10 in stolen bases this year. Senior infield/outfielder Murphy leads the team in RBI with 20 and has three doubles, one triple and two home runs on the season. For the pitching staff, sophomore Celena Velasquez leads the squad in wins with nine and strikeouts with 61. Teammates Cori Janelli and Deanna Richards also post six wins each and have a 0.89 and 1.44 ERA, respectively. The trio posts a strong 1.34 overall ERA.
