ROAD PLAY CONTINUES IN SANTA BARBARA

Having won four consecutive matches to offset a streak of four straight losses previously, BYU heads back out on the road for a crucial showdown with No. 4 UC Santa Barbara. The Gauchos are fourth in MPSF play, just a half-game behind third-place BYU. UCSB is led by Evan Patak, who is second in the MPSF and fourth nationally in kills per game, averaging 5.77. Patak also leads the nation with 85 service aces. Patak's 85 aces are more than double the person in second place.

SERIES INFORMATION



BYU and UC Santa Barbara have battled fairly evenly since the Cougars officially started Division I play in 1990. BYU holds a 20-15 series advantage over the Gauchos thanks mostly to a 10-match winning streak between 1998 and 2003. UCSB beat BYU in seven of the first eight matches and won 12 of the first 17 the two teams played.

Last season, BYU won two in a row against the Gauchos, getting revenge against UCSB for knocking them out of the tournament in 2005. BYU will look to extend its streak to four over the Gauchos. The Cougars have won 15 of the last 18 matches between the two teams.

BYU's entire coaching staff is coaching at its alma mater. Co-interim head coaches Ryan Millar and Shawn Patchell both starred for the Cougars in their playing days while assistant coach Rob Neilson played for earned All-MPSF honors for BYU just last season.

COUGARS IN PRESEASON RANKINGS

For the second consecutive season, BYU made an appearance in the preseason top-5. Last season the Cougars were ranked preseason No. 1. This year, BYU starts the season ranked second behind reigning Mountain Pacific Sports Federation regular season champion UC Irvine.

BYU IN THE MPSF TOURNAMENT

Since 1993, BYU has qualified for the MPSF postseason tournament in 12 of 13 seasons including nine 10 consecutive trips. The Cougars all-time record in the MPSF tournament is 15-10. BYU has won the MPSF tournament three times and hold an 8-5 record in the first round, 4-4 record in the semifinals and a perfect 3-0 record in tournament finals. BYU has lost in the first round of the MPSF tourney in two consecutive seasons including a 3-1 setback to Long Beach State last year. The Cougars won consecutive MPSF tournament championships in 2003 and 2004.

EVERY THREE YEARS...

Since BYU's first national championship in 1999, the Cougars have won the NCAA tournament a total of three times (1999, 2001 and 2004). Since the '99 season, BYU has won the NCAA Championship at least once every three years.

BYU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Cougars have made four NCAA tournament appearances in the program's history. Impressively, BYU has brought home the hardware in three of its four NCAA tournament appearances. The Cougars boast a 7-1 overall record in NCAA tournament play and a perfect 4-0 record in national semifinal matches. The Cougars only loss in the NCAA tournament was in 2003 when they lost to Lewis in a five-game thriller.

BYU has earned automatic bids to the Final Four by winning the MPSF tournament three times: 1999, 2003 and 2004.

ALL-AMERICANS

With Russell Holmes being named a Second Team AVCA All-American last year, it marked the 14th consecutive season the Cougars have had an All-American. Since 1993, 20 different players have earned 36 citations, 13 of which are first-team honors and 12 of which are second-team honors.

20-WIN SEASONS

After finishing the 2006 season with a 18-9 record, BYU was held without 20 wins for the first time since the 2000 season. The Cougars have recorded eight 20-win seasons. The first BYU team to record 20 wins was the 1994 team. The 1994 team finished its season with a 21-6 record and advanced to the final of the MPSF Tournament, losing to Stanford in four games.

PRESEASON EXHIBITION

BYU finished its exhibition schedule having won four of six matches. The Cougars previously played against four of Canada's best teams in Edmonton, Alberta, going 2-2 including a victory over defending Canadian Collegiate Champion Trinity Western. Impressively, the Cougars won two matches against Canada's best with just one week of practice whereas the Canadian teams had been practicing for two months.

After the Canadian tournament, BYU played two home matches against conference rival Pepperdine. The Cougars won both matches in four games.

LAST WEEK RECAP

FRIDAY--A balanced attack and a strong block performance led No. 3 BYU to a four-set victory over No. 12 USC 30-26, 30-24, 28-30 and 30-21. The Cougars had four players reach double-digits in kills led by Robby Stowell's 18 on a .400 hitting percentage. Rodney Santos added a career high in kills with 11 and block assists with seven while swinging at a team-best .714 clip. Russell Holmes also had an efficient night from the middle, collecting eight kills while hitting .438.

SATURDAY--Yosleyder Cala's near-record performance and an overall offensive onslaught led No. 3 BYU to a dominating sweep over No. 12 USC, 30-22, 30-22 and 30-25. The win gives the Cougars a weekend sweep of the Trojans and pushes BYU's overall winning streak to 12 over USC. Cala led the Cougars with 19 kills on just 21 swings while committing no errors. Cala's .905 hitting performance is second all-time in BYU rally scoring history. Not far behind Cala, Robby Stowell knocked down 17 kills while hitting at a .727 clip. As a team, BYU hit an astounding .571 while committing only nine hitting errors. Ivan Perez had nine kills and hit .615 while Russell Holmes had seven and swung .600.

STO "WELL DONE"

In the first two matches of his collegiate career, 18-year-old true freshman Robby Stowell led BYU to a weekend sweep of three-time defending NAIA champion Cal-Baptist. In his first match, Stowell recorded 11 kills—good for second on the team in the three-game sweep—against only three attack errors. Stowell hit .400, recorded a service ace, five digs and three block assists. On Saturday evening, Stowell recorded a double-double with 17 kills and 10 digs. He recorded a .429 hitting percentage on Saturday and picked up two block assists.

Stowell's weekend totals included 28 kills (a team-best four KPG) on a .417 hitting percentage. He started all seven games in the two matches and was second on the team over the weekend with 15 digs.

HOT HITTING

The Cougars got off to a hot start hitting the ball against Cal-Baptist. Ivan Perez, Russell Holmes and Robby Stowell all hit over .400 in BYU's first two matches. Perez hit .488 (26-5-43) for the Cougars while Holmes hit .452 (18-4-31) and Stowell hit at a .417 clip (28-8-48).



NEAR RECORD PERFORMANCES

BYU dominated UCLA in its Friday match. Two players had near-record setting nights in hitting percentage. Yosleyder Cala had the fifth best hitting night in BYU history when he posted a .789 hitting percentage (15-0-19). Not far behind him, Russell Holmes posted the sixth best performance when he hit at a .786 clip (12-1-14).

As a team, the Cougars had a top-10 performance all time in hitting performance as they hit .500 collectively (51-12-78). The performance was witnessed by one of the top-15 largest crowds to watch a BYU volleyball match (5,537).

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Redshirt freshman setter Yamil Perez has been spreading the wealth evenly in the early going for the Cougars. Against UCLA, four different BYU players had double figures in kills with only Ivan Perez doing in twice. Along with Perez, Yosleyder Cala, Russell Holmes and Robby Stowell posted double-digit kills in a match.

Yamil Perez has kept the Cougars' opponents off balance as several BYU players posted double-digits in swings. The Cougars hit .500 against UCLA on Friday night while three BYU players posted over .500 hitting percentages.

DOMINATING START

BYU is off to its most dominating start in program history (in terms of sets won vs. sets lost) in its first nine matches. BYU has won 27 sets against only one loss. Previous to this season, the next best start in school history was the 2001 championship season when the Cougars started 10-0. In its first nine matches, BYU won 27 sets while losing three sets (two against Lewis and one against UCLA). The Cougars swept eight of their first 10 matches in 2001. This season BYU swept eight of its first nine matches and 10 of 13 matches overall.

"ALL-RETURNING" TEAM

Last season BYU had one All American and five All-MPSF performers. Three of the five return this season including second team AVCA All American Russell Holmes. Holmes was also second team All-MPSF. Ivan Perez earned an MPSF honorable mention citation last season and was the first BYU player to be named to an All America team as a freshman two seasons ago. Yosleyder Cala was named to the All-MPSF third team last year.

SEASON AWARDS

Russell Holmes -- AVCA National Player of the Week (Jan. 29) Outrigger Hotels Invitational Tournament MVP

Holmes led his team to two top-15 sweeps this weekend at the Outrigger Hotels Invitational at Hawai'i, as the Cougars' record improves to 8-0 to begin the 2007 season. Against then-No. 9 Penn State on Friday, Holmes planted 11 kills on 15 attempts, hitting .667. He also added two digs and six total blocks. The next night against then-No. 13 Loyola-Chicago, the Cougar captain tallied seven kills on 13 attempts, hitting .462, and added five total blocks.

Yosleyder Cala -- AVCA National Player of the Week (Mar. 5)

Cala's strong play lead the Cougars to two wins over Southern California last week. In BYU's Friday night match against the Trojans, Cala scored 13 kills with a .333 hitting percentage, adding a team best seven digs, three aces and four total blocks in BYU's four-game win. On Saturday night, Cala was even better, as he led the Cougars with 19 kills on 21 attempts with zero errors for a career-high .905 hitting percentage. He also posted two aces and five digs in the three-game sweep of the Trojans. For the week, Cala averaged 4.57 kills, a .583 hitting percentage, 1.71 digs and .7 blocks per game.

Robby Stowell -- Molten MPSF Player of the Week

Stowell from San Juan Capistrano, Calif., played a major role in the Cougars' two wins at USC. Friday, he posted 18 kills at .400 with seven digs and five blocks. Saturday, he attacked with a career-high .727 clip (17-1-22) while adding five more blocks. Stowell totaled 35 kills in seven games and hit .538.

BRING OUT THE BROOMS

With the Cougars sweep over Loyola-Chicago Jan. 27, it marked a record sixth consecutive match BYU won in straight sets. Previously the record was in 2001 when the Cougars swept five consecutive matches. The record for sweeps in a season was the 1999, 30-1 National Championship squad that swept 20 matches. With the Cougars sweep over UC Irvine, they upped their record to seven consecutive sweeps.

"SMITH PSYCHOS"

Duke University has coined the term "Cameron crazies" for their basketball home court presence. The Smith Fieldhouse may soon need to adopt its own moniker. The Smith Fieldhouse has been packed in each of BYU's last four matches. In fact, the Cougars have set a record with four consecutive over-capacity crowds. BYU has had crowds over the capacity of 5,000 at the Smith Fieldhouse in each of the last four home matches.

ALL-OUTRIGGER HOTELS INVITATIONAL

Over half of BYU's starting line up was recognized for their efforts last weekend by being named to the Outrigger Hotels Invitational's All-Tournament team. Russell Holmes, who was also named AVCA National Player of the Week, was also named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Also recognized was outside hitter Yosleyder Cala, opposite hitter Robby Stowell and setter Yamil Perez.

PATCHELL NAMED USA VOLLEYBALL ASSISTANT

The U.S. Boys' Youth National Team will be guided by University of Hawai'i Assistant Coach Tino Reyes. He will be assisted by Brigham Young University Co-Head Coach Shawn Patchell and Stanford University Assistant Coach Ken Shibuya. The U.S. Boys' Youth National qualified for the 2007 FIVB World Championships Aug. 15-26 in Mexico by finishing second at the 2006 NORCECA Continental Boys' Youth Championship.

During the summer of 2005, Patchell coached the US World University Games team and in 2006, he was part of the U.S. Boys' Youth National Team coaching staff.

SEASON'S TWO BEST KILL PERFORMANCES...

The two weekend matches against Hawaii showcased BYU's two best individual kill efforts...all in the same night. On Friday evening, Yosleyder Cala set a team season high with 26 kills on .639 hitting. Not far behind him was Ivan Perez, who notched the second best team kill total with 23 while hitting .529.

OFFENSIVE ONSLAUGHT

BYU's hitting performance in Saturday evening's three-set sweep of USC ranks third all-time in BYU rally scoring history. The Cougars hit .571



(61-9-91) as a team. BYU was led by Yosleyder Cala's .905 (19-0-21) hitting percentage, while Robby Stowell hit .727 (17-1-22). Russell Holmes and Ivan Perez also hit over .600 on the evening. The Cougars all-time best hitting performance was also against USC on Jan. 31, 2001 when BYU hit .655 (42-4-48).

HOLMES RECORD WATCH

Russell Holmes created a wall in the Saturday evening Hawaii match. In the sweep, Holmes knocked down seven block assists and a career-high four block solos in just three sets. The four block solos ranks second alone all-time in BYU history. The Cougars record for block solos is five by Kevin Hambly on Feb. 29, 1992 against Ball State. Holmes is currently second in the nation with 17 block solos. He is just five block solos away from tying the record of 22 held by co-head coach Ryan Millar.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

vs. Cal-Baptist (Jan. 5-6, 2007)

FRIDAY--The No. 2 ranked BYU Men's Volleyball team began the 2007 campaign the same way they did the 2006 season by beating Cal Baptist in three games 30-26, 30-18, 30-25 in front of 1,631 fans at the Smith Fieldhouse Friday night. Junior Ivan Perez had a team-best 13 kills on .550 hitting percentage while All-American Russell Holmes had seven kills and on a team-high .636 hitting percentage. Freshman Robby Stowell had a stellar performance in his first match as a Cougar with 11 kills, five digs and three blocks.

SATURDAY--Freshmen Robby Stowell and Andrew Stewart paced a balanced BYU attack as the Cougars cruised to a 3-1 victory over Cal-Baptist 30-24, 30-20, 24-30, 30-21. BYU (2-0) hit over .400 in the first two games before struggling in game three and only hitting .105. The Cougars finished the match hitting at a .338 mark.

vs. UCLA (Jan. 12-13, 2007)

FRIDAY--For the first time since 2003, No. 2 BYU took No. 3 UCLA down in three straight games, as the Cougars remained undefeated 30-28, 30-22 and 30-26. Sophomore Yosleyder Cala led BYU with game-highs of 15 kills and an astounding .789 hitting percentage. Juniors Ivan Perez (11 kills) and Russell Holmes (12 kills) combined for 23 of BYU's 51 total kills. Freshman Robby Stowell received game-high honors in digs with eight on the night. As a team, BYU recorded 27 digs to UCLA's 13. The Cougars hit .500 for the match while holding the Bruins to 41 kills on .330 hitting.

SATURDAY--For only the third time in the programs history, and the first time since 2003, the No. 2 BYU men's volleyball team completed a weekend sweep of No. 3 UCLA 30-21, 30-23 and 33-31 Saturday night at the Smith Fieldhouse. Freshman Robby Stowell led the Cougar charge Saturday night. He finished with a career-high 19 kills with five blocks while hitting .654. Ivan Perez also enjoyed a strong night with 16 kills on .542 hitting. Yamil Perez controlled the hard-hitting offense with 46 assists.

at Stanford (Jan. 19-20)

FRIDAY--BYU extended its winning streak over Stanford to seven consecutive matches as the Cougars swept the Cardinal, 30-23, 30-25 and 30-28. The sweep marks the third consecutive match between the two teams that BYU won in three straight games. BYU was led by Yosleyder Cala's 11 kills on .450 hitting. The middle tandem of Rodney Santos and Russell Holmes had an efficient night hitting .750 and .667, respectively. Senior Scott Cox also hit well on the night, swinging at a .444 clip.

SATURDAY--BYU's perfect season start continued, as the Cougars swept Stanford for the second consecutive night and the fourth consecutive match overall, 30-24, 30-20 and 30-28. Ivan Perez led BYU with 14 kills while hitting .524 (14-3-21) while Rodney Santos registered his second consecutive .750 (6-0-8) hitting performance. Perez added six digs and three service aces on the night. BYU hit .374 on the match while holding the Cardinal to just a .219 performance. Russell Holmes led Cougar blockers with four while adding seven kills and hitting .438 (7-0-16).

Outrigger Hotels Invitational (Jan. 26-27)

FRIDAY--Russell Holmes and Robby Stowell, coupled with hot serving, led No. 2 BYU to a dominating sweep over No. 9 Penn State (1-2), 30-22, 30-23, 30-18. The sweep was the fifth consecutive for the Cougars. Holmes dominated the middle, leading the Cougars in kills (11), blocks (six) and hitting percentage (.667). Stowell added 11 kills of his own while swinging at a .474 mark. Ivan Perez (four aces) and Yosleyder Cala (three aces) were dominating behind the service line.

SATURDAY--It was the eighth consecutive victory and sixth consecutive sweep for No. 2 BYU as the Cougars swept No. 13 Loyola-Chicago, 30-16, 30-22 and 30-22. The dominating BYU win came just one night after the Ramblers upset No. 3--and tournament host--Hawaii in five games. Interestingly, BYU did not trail at any point in any of the sets against Loyola Chicago. Russell Holmes was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Yosleyder Cala, Robby Stowell and Yamil Perez were also named to the Outrigger Hotels Invitational's All-Tournament team.

vs. UC Irvine (Feb. 2-3)

FRIDAY--BYU avenged last season's loss to No. 2 UC Irvine in a three-set sweep, 30-21, 30-22 and 30-27 Friday night at the Smith Fieldhouse. With the victory, BYU improves to 9-0 overall and 5-0 in MPSF play. The win set the tone for the weekend series between the two clubs who will face each other again Saturday night. Last season, the Cougars took a No. 1 ranking into the Anteaters' home and were swept 2-0 in a weekend series. This year, the match-up got off to a decidedly different outcome behind Yosleyder Cala, Ivan Perez and Robby Stowell, who combined for 27 of BYU's 38 kills. The trio each had nine kills in front of a crowd of 5,753, the largest of the season and ninth largest in Smith Fieldhouse history. Junior Russell Holmes recorded a game-high six total blocks.

SATURDAY--No. 1 BYU didn't have enough to complete the weekend sweep against No. 2 UC Irvine losing 3-2, as the Cougars went the distance for the first time this season 30-26, 23-30, 31-33, 31-29 and 8-15. Robby Stowell led BYU with a career-high 22 kills, while Ivan Perez recorded 20 kills for the night.

at Cal-Baptist (Feb. 13)

TUESDAY--In a battle of top-ranked teams, the NAIA prevailed over the NCAA as Cal-Baptist swept No. 1 BYU, 30-25, 30-23 and 31-29. The loss was the second consecutive for the Cougars.

As the Cougars get ready for a weekend showdown with No. 2 Pepperdine, BYU played much of the match with players who normally come off the bench. The seven starters for the Cougars included only one player--Rodnei Santos--with significant starting experience. For the second consecutive match--both losses--BYU had a sub-.300 hitting day as the Lancers outit the Cougars, .273 to .239. Scott Cox led the way for BYU, knocking down a career-high 19 kills. Cox also led the Cougars in hitting percentage (.364) and tied for the team lead in total blocks (three) and service aces (one).

at Pepperdine (Feb. 15-17)

THURSDAY--In a battle of the NCAA's two highest ranked teams No. 2 Pepperdine edged No. 1 BYU in a five-set thriller, 30-20, 27-30, 32-30, 25-30, 15-13. The Cougars were out-hit .412 to .214 in the decisive fifth set but battled to a tie at 13 before ultimately falling to the Waves. Yosleyder Cala led BYU with 20 kills and a .545 hitting percentage. Cala was the only Cougar to hit over the .300 clip.

SATURDAY--Southern California was unfriendly to No. 1 BYU, as the Cougars dropped their third consecutive match in the Golden State and fourth overall. BYU fell to No. 2 Pepperdine in three, 30-28, 30-23 and 30-21. For the second consecutive match, the Cougars were led by Yosleyder Cala who had 17 kills on .324 hitting. Ivan Perez added eight kills, four blocks, seven digs and a service ace for BYU.



vs Hawaii (Feb. 23-24)

FRIDAY--A hot offensive performance coupled with a strong floor defensive effort led No. 4 BYU to a 3-1 win over No. 12 Hawaii. The Cougars hit a scorching .455 compared to the Warriors' .244. BYU also combined for 53 digs. The win snapped the Cougars current four-match skid. BYU was led on the outside by Yosleyder Cala, who had a double-double with 26 kills and 11 digs. Ivan Perez added 23 kills on a .529 hitting percentage while adding eight digs. Russell Holmes led BYU's blocking with one block solo and six block assists while collecting 10 kills and two service aces.

SATURDAY--Another dominating effort from No. 4 BYU's outside hitters, coupled with a strong blocking performance led the Cougars to a three game sweep over No. 12 Hawaii, 35-33, 30-22 and 30-27. Ivan Perez led the Cougars with 15 kills on his second consecutive night of over .400 hitting. Robby Stowell and Yosleyder Cala added 13 and 12 kills, respectively. BYU also had a dominating blocking presence, led by Russell Holmes. Holmes posted a career-high four block solos and 11 total blocks.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

BYU finished its 2006 regular season with a 13-1 (.929) record at the Smith Fieldhouse. The record was the fourth best mark in Cougar history behind the 1998 (11-0, 1.000), 2004 (16-1, .941) and 1999 (15-1, .938) seasons. BYU started last season with seven consecutive home wins before losing to Pepperdine. The Cougars then ran off six straight wins to finish the season.

Attendance was also up in 2006. For the first time in program history, BYU had at least 2,000 fans in attendance at every home match. The Cougars drew an average of 3,516 fans per match, the second highest average per match. The 1999 team drew an average of 4,748.

COACH RYAN MILLAR



Ryan Millar and Shawn Patchell were named co-interim head coaches by athletics director Tom Holmoe prior to the season.

Millar is entering his first season coaching at BYU. Millar, a four-time All-America selection and 1999 National Player of the Year, led arguably the best BYU men's volleyball team to a 30-1 record and the first of three national championships in five years.

Millar owns most of the BYU school records for rally scoring statistics. He holds single match records for kills (48), kill attempts (95), block assists (16) and total blocks. Millar's single season records include kills (648), kill attempts, (1,259), block assists (192) block solos (22) and total blocks (214). His career marks include records for kills (1,797), kills per game (5.19), kill attempts (3,338), block assists (590), block solos (72), total blocks (662) and blocks per game (1.91).

After Millar's dominating career with the Cougars, he was selected to the USA National Team. As a member of team USA, he has participated in two Olympic Games (2000 Sydney and 2004 Athens).

Most recently, in November 2006, Millar competed with the USA National Team at the World Championships in Japan.

Millar also played six years of professional volleyball in Italy. His major international competition includes the FIVB World Championship Qualifying Tournament, the NORCECA Continental Championships and the World Grand Champions Cup, where he was named "Best Blocker" of the tournament. Since his college days he has played in several places in the United States, Korea, Japan, Australia and Italy.

Millar has played under and coached with some of the best volleyball minds including former BYU head coach Carl McGown and former Olympic coaches Doug Beal and Marv Dunphy.

Millar currently owns and operates a volleyball camp called the Next Level Volleyball Camps where he coaches volleyball.

A native of Palmdale, Calif., Millar is married to Suzanne Millar. The couple has one son, Max Ryan Millar born in July 2006. Millar earned a Bachelor's degree from BYU in Sociology.

COACH SHAWN PATCHELL



Shawn Patchell and Ryan Millar were named co-interim head coaches by athletics director Tom Holmoe prior to the season.

Patchell enters his first year as head coach and fifth year on BYU's staff. Patchell came to BYU from Laguna Beach High School where he was head coach for both the boy's and girl's volleyball teams. In six seasons, Patchell's teams qualified for the CIF playoffs every year and were CIF finalists in 1998, 1999 and 2001 and state qualifiers in 1998 and 2001. The Laguna Beach Artists won seven Pacific Coast League Titles with Patchell at the helm. In six seasons, Coach Patchell posted a 137-67 record at LBHS and twice was selected to coach the South Orange County All-Stars. Patchell also coached basketball at Irvine High School and assisted the men's volleyball team at the University of California at Irvine along with coaching at Pepperdine and Stanford during the summer.

During the summer of 2005, Patchell coached the US World University Games team and in 2006, he was an assistant coach for the Youth National Team that took second place in the 2006 NORCECA Boys Youth Continental Championship (U-19) in Bayaguana, Dominican Republic.

A member of BYU's first NCAA men's volleyball team, Patchell was a starter from 1990-93 and recorded a .398 career hitting percentage. In 1992, Patchell's junior year, he led the nation in hitting percentage at .488 and was honored as All-Academic Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. He was ranked fourth and 10th nationally in hitting and blocking his senior year.

Patchell played professionally in Spain for the Euro Cup qualifier and No. 1-ranked Gran Canaria Team in the Canary Islands and also represented the US in the Federation International Volleyball Association Sand Volleyball Circuit in Europe.

Patchell earned his BA in English with a minor in business management from BYU in 1993 and a master's degree in English Literature from the University of California at Irvine in 2000. He is a member of the BYU English Department where he teaches Masterpieces of American and British Literature and a composition class. Patchell taught English Literature in high schools in Kauai, Hawai'i, and Irvine and Laguna Beach, California.

Shawn and his wife Davis enjoy surfing, skiing, snowboarding, horseback riding, reading and camping with their three daughters: Jordan (9), Sage (7) and Soren (3).

LAST YEAR VS. UCSB

Jan. 20, 2006

Taylor Evans and Ivan Perez recorded season-high kill totals to lead the Cougars past UC Santa Barbara 3-1 (30-17, 37-35, 23-30, 32-30) Friday.

Perez had a season-high 23 kills and hit .472 while Evans had 19, a career and season high, and hit .433. It was the third time this season Perez has recorded more than 20 kills. Victor Batista and Jonathan Charette were the other two Cougars in double digits with 14 and 10, respectively. As a team, BYU hit .443 (80-22-131) and had 31 digs and 8.5 blocks.

BYU led the match 2-1 but trailed 25-20 in game four. The Cougars then scored four-straight points to cut the lead to 24-25, two on kills by Batista and Jonathan Charette and then on back-to-back Santa Barbara hitting errors. The teams then traded points until the score was 28-26 in favor of the Gauchos. A Santa Barbara service error cut the lead to one and Perez added a kill to tie the score. Patak and Batista then traded kills to keep the score tied and Patak added another to give the Gauchos their final lead. Evans then tied the score at 30 with a kill and Patak registered a hitting error to give BYU its first lead of the game at 31-30. On the next play, Perez and Batista blocked Patak to score the match-winning point.

Game one belonged to the Cougars from the opening serve. After Holmes was dug on the first attempt of the match, BYU recorded a kill on 14-straight hitting attempts and built a 25-12 lead. The Cougars were hitting .933 at that point (14-0-15). BYU put the game away with a 6-0 run that started with a service error by Max Klineman. Batista then served five-consecutive points, including an ace and two kills by Perez, who connected on his first six attempts. Evans finished the game at 30-17 with a kill and was 5-of-5. For the game, BYU hit .682 (17-2-22) and limited the Gauchos to .250 (11-5-24). It was the biggest single-game margin of victory for the Cougars since they defeated Pacific 30-17 on March 12, 2005 in game one of a 3-1 loss.

Jan. 21, 2006

The undefeated No. 2 Cougars completed the weekend against No. 8 UC Santa Barbara Saturday with a three-game sweep (30-24, 30-28, 30-24).

Ivan Perez led BYU in kills with 19, Rob Neilson had 43 assists, and Victor Batista had six block assists.

As a team, BYU hit .337 (50-15-104) and had 20 blocks and 25 digs. Neilson had a match-high 6 digs while Batista added 5.

Evan Patak dominated for the Gauchos with 18 kills and almost half of the kill attempts, while the team hit .214. Max Klineman had 41 of 46 assists and Aaron Richman had seven digs on the night.

Santa Barbara was once again disadvantaged by the crowd of 3,592 fans. Peterson commented on home court advantage.

BYU started the match with an easy 30-24 win in game one. The Cougars dominated the entire game and had their biggest lead at game point. Perez went 8-for-12 on the attack while Batista went 5-for-8. The Gauchos trickled off at the end when BYU put it away with a kill by Neilson.

Game two was a scary one for Cougar fans while they were down until game point when they achieved their first lead, then put it away after an error by the Gauchos (30-28). Santa Barbara held an average of three points ahead the entire game, but the Cougars came out on top in the end. In the fifth rally of the game, the crowd went wild as the ball went off the ceiling into deep court where Perez saved it with a free ball to land in the middle of Gauchos players, staring in amazement.

BYU led all of game three (30-24), achieving an eight-point lead late in the game at 27-19. Perez had six kills in game three, while Santa Barbara's leading hitter, Patak, had only four.

ALL-AMERICAN RUSSELL HOLMES

Peer pressure doesn't always have to be negative. Just ask BYU middle blocker Russell Holmes.

Holmes, who demands attention with his 6-foot-8 frame, didn't start playing volleyball until he was a junior in high school. It was then that Holmes followed a friend's suggestion to give the sport a try.

Volleyball Beginnings

"I started playing volleyball as a junior in high school," Holmes said. "I had a friend who was on the volleyball team while I was playing varsity soccer. My friend suggested that I should come and try out."

If the learning curve was steep, Holmes didn't show it as he made an immediate impact on his various teams that caught the attention of NCAA recruiters. Holmes lettered twice at Fountain Valley High School and was named first-team All-Sunset League. He also played club volleyball for the Long Beach Club and went to the Junior Olympics. He was heralded as an All-American at the Junior Olympics and was named to the Volleyball Magazine Fab 50 in 2001.

"Based on my height and athletic ability, my friends helped convince me to play and were the biggest influence on me early on," Holmes said.

Ironically, Holmes had all his success in just two years of competitive volleyball. He earned more soccer letters (three) than volleyball letters while in high school.

"You can start playing volleyball at such a young age in Southern California," Holmes said. "It is a lot bigger there and it helps that you can go to the beaches and play."

Coming to BYU

As a high school star, Holmes got a lot of attention from colleges. Former BYU head coach Carl McGown recruited Holmes heavily as he came out of high school. For Holmes, the choice to come to BYU was a no-brainer.

"I always wanted to be affiliated with BYU," he said. "My older sister came to BYU, and I really looked up to her. I always wanted to come here and be involved in athletics. As I progressed in volleyball and got better and I saw that BYU had built such a great volleyball program, I knew it was the right place. The LDS [The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints] environment helped solidify my decision."

The fact that Holmes came out of high school in 2001, the same year the Cougars won their second National Championship in three years, further encouraged him to make the decision to come to BYU.

"I wanted to be a part of a great program," Holmes added. "Seeing BYU win the National Championship made me excited to come here."

Holmes's dream came true when he signed with the Cougars out of high school. He notes that his most memorable volleyball moment was not on the court or towering above the net, but it was in his home



with a pen in hand signing his letter of intent with BYU.

Holmes put off his playing career when he decided to serve a church mission right out of high school. He spent two years in London, England, doing what he called the most important work of his life.

Upon returning, Holmes was asked to redshirt as a freshman in 2004. The Cougars went on to win their third National Championship in six years.

"Because of my competitive nature, I would have liked to have played a larger role on the National Championship team," Holmes said. "But I learned from those that won that year. I tried to learn what I need to know and what I need to do to help my team compete at that level and to hopefully get another championship. Seeing from the outside ended up being a good experience because I could see how winning affected the guys."

Holmes began to get his chance to shine as a redshirt freshman in 2005. He played in all 30 matches, starting 13. On March 26, Holmes came off the bench to spark his team in a win over No. 7 Long Beach State. He tallied four kills, four blocks and three digs in the 3-2 victory.

Last season as a sophomore, Holmes entered the year with high expectations. He delivered, earning second-team AVCA All-America and second-team All-MPSF honors while leading the Cougars to a No. 1 ranking. Holmes's 155 blocks were second most in a BYU rally scoring season.

"Russell deserved the all-conference and All-American honors last year because of his dedication and consistency," BYU co-interim head coach Shawn Patchell said. "He has the possibility of being first team All-American and even national player of the year if he continues to work hard and leads by example."

Holmes doesn't dwell on his personal accomplishments. In fact, he attributes most of his

success to other people.

"I couldn't pinpoint one single person that had the biggest influence on my playing career," Holmes said. "My parents were key in supporting what I did and making sure I could get into all of the camps and clubs. Also, since I didn't start playing until I was 17, I have had great coaches teach me what I need to know fundamentally to succeed."

Holmes adds that his current coaches help him improve on the court while his wife, Julie, helps him maintain balance off the court.

"Life is very busy as a married student athlete," he said. "But it is also a lot of fun. Before we met, my wife didn't even follow volleyball. Now, she has a bigger heart than I do for volleyball. She is a great support system. She is motivating and encouraging and is always there for me."

Holmes's selfless play is evident when asked what his goals for the upcoming season will be.

"Our goal is to win a National Championship," he said.

When asked what personal goals he has, the conversation swings back to the team.

"My personal goal would be to help this team in any way possible to be champions," Holmes said. "I would like to help my team by improving as a leader and helping the underclassman coming in."

High Hopes

Looking to the 2007 season, the Cougars have a lot of returning talent from a team that was ranked preseason No. 1 a year ago. BYU will draw heavily on Holmes for his ability and leadership.

BYU has won a National Championship at least every third year since 1999, winning national crowns in 1999, 2001 and 2004. This season the Cougars will look to maintain their championship prowess going for a fourth championship in eight years.

What can BYU fans expect to see from the 2007 version of Cougar men's volleyball?

"Some exciting volleyball," Holmes says. "We have a lot of talent on our team and they can expect a lot of wins."

What should fans expect to see from Holmes?

"Russell has shown early on that he will be a leader on this year's team." Co-interim head coach Ryan Millar said. "His presence on the court will be a valuable asset to this team's success."

As a returning All-American, Holmes has only played volleyball since 2001. And that doesn't take into account the two years away from the sport on his mission. In his amazing rise from a 17-year-old soccer player that hadn't thought of playing volleyball to a junior leader on one of the best men's volleyball programs in the nation, Holmes keeps everything in perspective.

"I'm just a laid back guy," Holmes says. "I like to hang out with my wife and my friends."

Hanging out with the right friends six years ago helped change Holmes's life and helped maintain BYU men's volleyball as a dominant program.

BYU volleyball fans can give a collective thanks to positive peer pressure.



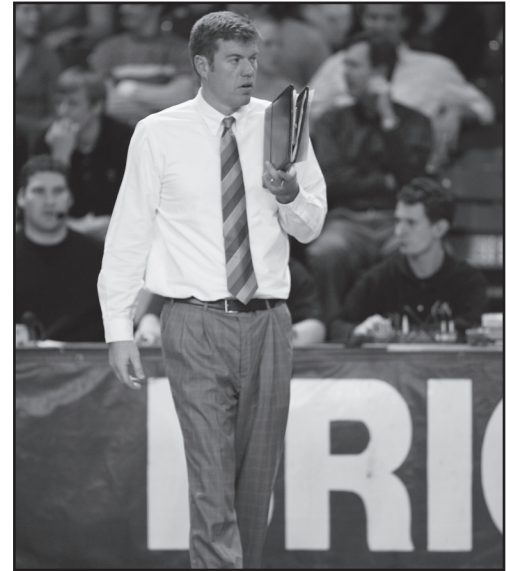
BYU DOES IT WITH TWO

Millar, probably the most decorated player in Cougar history including three first-team All-America selections and the 1999 Player of the Year award during his time in Provo from 1996-99, holds a lot of school records but is in the process of transferring what he learned from playing under a number of great coaches at BYU and on the Olympic team to the current Cougar squad.

“As a player it is more individualistic,” Millar said. “What I got out of playing was entirely up to me. The coaches are going to teach me about the things that they think are the right way to play volleyball, but when it comes down to it I am the one that determined how much work I would put forth into play, how much advice I take and use in my game, and as a coach, you are more as a teacher role and more of a motivator role. It is an interesting dynamic that I really like to dissect and look at. I like to take the things that make me a good player and make those things help me be a good coach. This is definitely what I want to do for a long time down the road.”

When one thinks of famous coaches from famous teams in men’s collegiate volleyball, singular names come to mind - Scates, Beal, Dunphy, McGown.

Rarely does one refer to famous coaching tandems. Double billing is usually associated with singers more than coaches.

Which is why the situation at Brigham Young University is interesting.

“It is unique to say the least,” said Ryan Millar who along with Shawn Patchell forms the duo that serves as co-interim head coaches for the No. 3 Cougars. “It is not something that I would highly recommend but it is just the way that it played out this year and our administration thought it was the best solution to the problem of finding a new head coach after coach [Tom] Peterson resigned. It is in both of our best interests to do as well as we can because both of our names are on the line here.”

Having their team in the No. 1 spot in the nation for three weeks earlier this season has reflected well on both of the former Cougars who are now competing for the head coaching position at their alma mater.

Patchell, who played from 1990-93 and was a member of the first NCAA men’s volleyball team at BYU, has the most coaching experience of the two, having served as an assistant for the previous five seasons under Peterson and six seasons as the head volleyball coach for the boy’s and girl’s teams at Laguna Beach High School.

Brigham Young, which is 7-1 overall and 5-1 in Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) play at home but only 2-3, 2-2 MPSF on the road, begins an important six match road swing that will go a long way to determining where the Cougars are seeded in the MPSF tournament.

“We have a young team,” said Patchell. “And when you take a young team on the road, it is a learning experience. So far, it has been a struggle to win on the road. The good news about a young team is that we have matured quickly and so we’ll see how it goes against USC. On the road it is hard, but it is something that a team has to do to make sure that we play well in the playoffs. As far as the playoffs, it is out of our hands now, having lost two to Pepperdine, but because of the parity in the league we have a great chance to play at home in the first round and possibly host the playoffs if we start doing our job on the road.”

The co-head coaches are also doing good job of blending the diverse group of players on the BYU roster.

“I think that our team believes in accountability and role playing,” Patchell said. “The guys have been accountable about how hard they have worked in the off-season and they understand their role on the team. It is defined for them and that is really what it takes in volleyball to win. Not everyone is going to be able to get thirty kills a night. And I think that our guys are continuing to define their role on the floor and regardless of the culture or background, we have a pretty tight knit family.”
