#### Last Game Recap vs. Portland

In a back-and-forth battle that saw each team go on runs and scoring droughts, BYU held on to beat the University of Portland 64-55 Friday in the Marriott Center.

The runs came early and often for both teams, with BYU going on three 7-0 runs and Portland going on one 9-0 run and a 7-0 run of their own. The Cougars used their first run to put them in the lead 15-9, behind 4 points from Nancy Seljaas. But Portland answered back quickly, scoring seven unanswered of their own and taking the lead 18-17, one of eight lead changes in the game.

The second half picked up where the first left off, as BYU came out hot, starting the half on another 7-0 run and increasing their lead to 40-31. However, staying true to form, the Pilots answered back again, scoring nine points in 30 seconds and tying the game at 45-45. BYU Coach Jeff Judkins called a timeout to halt Portland's momentum, and his team responded by going on their third 7-0 run of the game and taking the lead 52-45. The run gave BYU enough of a cushion that they didn't trail again in the game on their way to the win.

The Cougars were led by senior forward Ambrosia Anderson, who led all scorers with 17 points. Anderson also pulled down 10 rebounds on her way to her fourth double-double of the season and tenth of her career.

### Player Injury Report

Sophomore forward Mary Martha Abell, from Monroe, Louisiana suffered a torn ACL injury to her knee in the exhibition game against Westminster College on Nov. 1. She will use this season as an injury redshirt year.



**Head Coach - Jeff Judkins**Overall Record: 87-47, in his fifth season at BYU.

An all-state selection in basketball, football and baseball, Judkins played basketball for the University of Utah Utah from 1974-78. While playing for the Utes, he helped the team win one conference championship and two berths in the

#### NCAA Tournament.

He was a second-team academic All-American and three-time first-team District VII academic selection. Judkins earned three first-team All-WAC honors and was a member of the 1977 United States World Games team that captured the gold medal.

He played five years in the NBA for the Boston Celtics, Portland Trailblazers, Detroit Pistons and the Utah Jazz. He was a second-round pick by the Celtics in 1978, the same year the Celtics selected Larry Bird with the sixth pick overall. After his NBA career, he returned to the U of U in 1989, and remained with the men's program for 10 years. Judkins, a Salt Lake City native, graduated from Utah in 1978 with a degree in health and physical education. He is a member of the Utah Sports Hall of Fame and the Crimson Club Hall of Fame.

He and his wife Mary Kay, are the parents of five children: Jessica (25), Jordan (23), Jenna (21), Jaime (18), Jaxson (15).

#### This Week's Cougar Opponents

#### Air Force Academy

The Air Force Academy has compiled a 8-2 record to date, one of their best seasons ever. The team returns four starters and six letterwinners from last year's team that went 7-21 and finished tied for seventh with a 2-12 league record. Head Coach Ardie NcInelly is in her fifth season with the Falcons. Two players are scoring in double figures for AF led by forward Pamela Findlay who is averaging 12.3 points and 4.3 rebounds a game. She's followed by sophomore forward Alecia Steele who is picking up 10.5 points and



tops the team in rebounds grabbing 7.4 per game. The Air Force Falcons are shooting 41 percent from the field, 79 percent at the free throw line and 36 percent from three-point range. The team is getting 70.4 points a game and holding opponents to just 60.6 points.

#### University of Utah

No. 24 ranked University of Utah is currently 9-2 on the season. The team returns four starters and nine letter-winners from last year's team that went 26-8 overall and tied for first place with a 12-2 conference record. Elaine Elliott begins her 23rd year at the helm of the Utes program. Seniors Kim Smith and Shona Thorburn lead the Utes in scoring with 19.0 points from Smith and 13.4 for Thorburn. The duo also top the list in the rebound category with 7.4 and 6.3 boards per game respectively. The University of Utah is shooting 40 percent from the field, 69 percent at the free throw line and 33 percent when shooting from behind the arc. They are holding opponents to just 54 points while they score 67.1 points per game.
