Cougars Play Nebraska

Two games against Nebraska is all the BYU women's softball team has on its mind this week.

The 12-10 Cougars travel to Las Vegas to face Nebraska on both Friday and Saturday at the UNLV Round Robin. Nebraska is 8-8 on the season.

"With Christina Gwyn-Trice out this weekend, we will look for a lot of leadership from our young pitchers," BYU head coach Gordon Eakin said. "Both younger pitchers are very talented and will see a lot more time in the circle against Nebraska."

The Cougars will be without leading hurler, senior Gwyn-Trice. Most likely, she will not see many innings, if any at all. She is out with a finger minor finger injury. Sophomore pitcher Christie Zinanti and freshman Paige Affleck will lead the team through the week.

Zinanti is just one of two BYU pitchers to ever record a 20-win season. She had a stand-out freshman season when she went 20-8. She has seen 42.1 innings this season and holds a 3.47 ERA. Affleck joined the Cougars and immediately made an impact. She is 3-2 on the season with 40 strike outs in 29 innings. She has recorded two shut outs so far.

Nebraska is 8-8 on the season and head to the UNLV Round Robin coming off four shut-out wins against Northern Colorado.

About the Team . . .

Last Week

At the 2008 Aggie Classic the Cougars went 1-3 to bring their record to 12-10. Due to weather-related causes BYU's first game against No.3 Texas A&M was cancelled. On Friday the Cougars beat Illinois 10-0 and put up a good fight against No. 3 Texas A&M, falling 3-1. Saturday became a different story for BYU when they fell to Illinois 14-5 in six innings, and to No. 20 Louisiana Lafayette, 7-4. Despite three losses the Cougars hit five home runs. In the loss to Illinois, Stephanie Platt-Hopkins hit her first career grand slam, and Dani Snow smashed three long balls during the Aggie Classic.

Heading Outdoors

With spring in the near future, the Cougars were able to hold their first outdoor practice at Gail Miller Field. While game situations are easily simulated in the Indoor Practice Facility, practicing outdoors will give the team an advantage they were missing with indoor practices.

On the Road Again

The Cougars will continue traveling when they play at the UNLV Round Robin. BYU has played all 22 games on the road, with 19 played at neutral sites. The Cougars home opener is March 17 at 3 p.m. against South Dakota State.

Going, Going, Gone

BYU has hit 26 home runs on the season, with 10 coming from Angeline Quiocho and seven from Dani Snow. Both Jessica Purcell and Amanda Vance have hit three bombs, and Stephanie Platt Hopkins has two home runs, including a grand slam, and Whitney Nix has one.

Injuries Impacting the Cougars

With only minor injuries the Cougars have not been significantly affected by injuries this season. Senior pitcher Christina Gwyn-Trice will likely not see action this weekend, due to a hurt finger. Her status is day-to-day and may see a few innings, but may not see any at all. Adrea Ramirez has been out all season with a knee injury.

Cougar Bloodlines

Freshman Jessica Purcell joins her cousin Angeline Quiocho as a Cougar. Daniela Snow and Emi Snow Willing are sisters-in-law. Daniela married Emi's brother.

Did You Know...

- With the road trip to the UNLV Round Robin, it marks BYU's second of three trips to UNLV this season.
- The Cougars enter the women's softball program's ninth season with eight winning seasons in the past.
- BYU has had four consecutive berths to the NCAA Regional Tournament and the Cougars have hosted a Regional Tournament for the past two years.
- The Cougars have four married players on the team.
- During the BYU women's softball program's short life, it has carried six different All-Americans.

Freshmen Making Big Impact

With three freshman in the starting lineup and one making big contributions from the circle, the young team has worked to gain as much experience while still early in the season. Jessica Purcell has seen significant time at both shortstop and catcher. Caschjen Davis has seen most of her time in left field and has made significant contributions offensively, maintaining a .357 batting average with seven doubles. Kristin Dealhoussaye stepped in at second base for the Cougs, she is the only freshman to start in all 22 games. Paige Affleck brings a lot of power and speed to the circle. She holds a 2.17 ERA and is 3-2 on the season.

From the Circle

Three skilled pitchers make up BYU's rotation. Both Christina Gwyn-Trice and Christie Zinanti return from last season, with Paige Affleck joining the two. Gwyn Trice leads the Cougars with a 1.29 ERA. She is 6-3 so far, and has struck out 102 batters in 65.1 innings.

2007 Mountain West Conference Champions

For the second time since the program's inception in 2007, the Cougars were named MWC Champions. The Cougars went 16-4 in conference play last year.

Cougars At Home

Home Opener

BYU has 18 games at home this season. The home opener is Monday, March 17 when the Cougars take on South Dakota State at 3 p.m.

Miller Park

Miller Park, a unique, combined baseball-softball facility, is the home to BYU baseball and softball. Baseball plays on Larry H. Miller Field, while softball calls Gail Miller Field, a back-to-back mirror image of the pre-existing baseball field, home. It is the first combined facility of its kind.

Head-to-Head with Baseball

Miller Park is one of the unique facilities in the country which can host softball and baseball at the same time. On five days Miller Park hosts both softball and baseball. On March 18 softball hosts Utah St. at 4 p.m. and baseball hosts Kansas State at 6 p.m. On April 8 softball hosts Southern Utah at 3 p.m. and baseball hosts Utah in a non-league game at 2 p.m. On Apr. 18 & 19 softball hosts Utah at 7 & 2 p.m., and baseball hosts TCU at 7 & 1 p.m. those days. On May 6 softball hosts Utah Valley at 5 p.m. and baseball hosts Washington State at 7 p.m.

Versus Ranked Opponents

At the UNLV Round Robin the Cougars will not face a ranked opponent. It will be the team's first week without a ranked opponent since the first week of the season. BYU is 1-5 against ranked opponents this season. The Cougars lost to No. 2 Arizona State, No. 3 Texas A&M, No. 6 Tennessee, No. 9 Oklahoma and No. 22 Louisiana Lafayette. In the Cougars second game against a ranked opponent they came out on top of No. 22 Missouri, 4-0.

Senior Trio

The Cougars are led by seniors Gwyn Trice, Daniela Snow and Emi Snow Willing. With only three seniors on the roster, BYU has a lot of young athletes competing for positions. The Cougs look to gain experience and cement positions early during their competitive schedule.

MWC Preseason Champs

The Cougars were selected to win the Mountain West Conference, after finishing last season as conference Champions. Despite losing a slew of seniors, including two All-Americans, BYU looks to repeat another year of conference success.

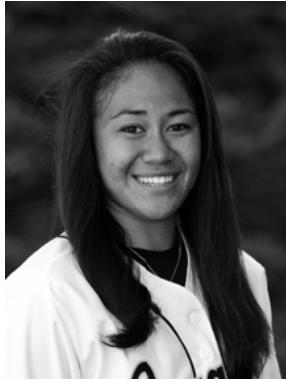
