

No. 12 BYU Hosts In-State Rival Utah

No. 12 BYU returns to the friendly confines of South Stadium this weekend to host in-state rival Utah on Friday. Cougar fans are encouraged to come early, as Utah is expected to draw a large crowd. As is customary at the last home game of each season, the seniors will be recognized at Friday's game. This year's senior class includes Nicole Anderson, Natalie Evans, Charlene Lui, Jaime Rendich Beck and Ashley Smith. Game time is slated for 7 p.m., and will be televised on BYU TV. BYU's offensive attack is overwhelming for opponents, as ten Cougars have earned five or more points. Jaime Rendich Beck is a force to be reckoned with, netting ten goals and accumulating seven assists on the season. Rendich Beck's sidekick is Bobbi Tillotson, who was scored six goals and posted seven assists of her own. Following close behind is Katie Larkin and Jessica Aquino, recording 13 points and 12 points, respectively. Natalie Nate, Annie Zwahlen and Carolyn Swenson have all amassed seven points, while Brooke Thulin has earned six points. Goalkeeper Erika Woodbury protects the net, saving the ball 44 times in over 1,500 minutes of action.

The BYU women's soccer team is accustomed to players stepping up and making the big play. Thursday evening was no different, as sophomore Carolyn Swenson scored the game-winner to defeat UNLV,1-0, in Las Vegas.

The time came when No. 7 turned on her lightening speed.

Swenson showed off her quickness in the 63rd minute, scrambling to collect a loose ball and then driving the ball down the left sideline, firing off a loft toward the net. The ball bounced off Rebel goalkeeper Jenna Huff, marking Swenson's third of the sea-

BYU only had three shots and one shot on goal in the second half, although that was all the Cougars needed to pull out the victory.

BYU Ties SDSU

BYU, only one of seven teams in the nation to have lost one or fewer games this season, drew even with San Diego State in California on Saturday. The only way the Aztecs were able to get passed the smothering BYU defense was through a disputed penalty kick.

Aztec forward Amanda Swaider scored in the 21st minute after drawing a foul on goalkeeper Erika Woodbury that awarded her a penalty kick. The officials were divided on the call, as they struggled to agree whether or not the foul occurred in the box. Woodbury was able to stretch and slightly deflect the shot, but it wasn't enough as the ball scored to give SDSU a 1-0 lead. The goal marked only the second time this season that BYU has trailed.

Freshman Katie Larkin responded to the pressure, coming back 3 minutes later to net her fourth goal of the season. Larkin wove in and out of several Aztec defenders before firing her shot from eight yards out into the upper-left corner of the net.

The next 60 minutes of action remained scoreless, despite BYU outshooting SDSU 20-11, including 10-1 in shots on the goal. Larkin dominated the Aztecs with nine shots, six of which were on goal.

Bobbi's World

After a week when junior Bobbi Tillotson was named Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week, Tillotson was named to two national teams on Oct. 20.

She was one of two midfielders named to the Soccer America Team of the Week, as well as one of three named to the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week.

During the week, Tillotson posted ten points in Cougar wins over Air Force (6-0) and Wyoming (2-0). Tillotson scored four goals against Air Force, tying BYU's single game scoring record for an individual player, earning her first hat trick in the process. She also assisted on both scores in the victory over Wyoming.

Scouting the Utes:

The University of Utah scored the lone goal on Saturday to defeat UNLV, 1-0, and claim the Mountain West Conference regular season championship.

Utah, which has won six games in a row, remains undefeated at 6-0 in Mountain West play and cannot be caught by second-place BYU. The Utes clinched their second Mountain West Conference regular-season championship in the last three years, also claiming the title in 2003.

Ashley Mason came up with a big performance for the Utes, denying all three of UNLV's shots on goal. Katie Carney fired twice on Mason while Brie Kuhne had one shot on goal. It was Mason's seventh complete-game shutout this season.

UNLV had a 7-6 advantage in shots and a 4-3 edge in corner kicks, but the Utes were able to convert on their best scoring opportunity of the afternoon.

Rebel keeper Jenna Huff had allowed just one goal in 555 minutes all season before Amanda Feigt got to her in the 63rd minute. The Utes worked the ball to the right side of the field, where Whitney Dorsey crossed it to Feigt. Feigt got her foot on the ball and immediately took the shot with good pace from 10 yards out. Huff couldn't get to it in time as the ball sailed into the upper right corner of the net.

Statistical Leaders: Adele Letro and Amanda Feight pack a powerful one-two punch, posting 17 points and 14 points, respectively. Adele has scored seven goals and contributed three assists, while Feight has found the back of the net six times and assisted for two goals. Following close behind are Melissa Wayman with nine points, while Katy Reineke, Kim Lloyd, and Whitney Dorsey have each recorded eight points, scoring two goals and posting four assists apiece. Goalkeeper Ashley Mason has saved the ball 73 times in over 1,600 minutes of action.

Cougars Picked Second in MWC

In a vote by the league's coaches, BYU was selected to finish second in the 2005 Mountain West Conference women's soccer regular-season championship in the preseason poll.

Utah, which received seven first-place votes and collected a total of 49 points, was selected to win the regular-season championship. BYU picked up the final first-place vote.

BYU welcomes ten of 11 starters back, including First Team All-MWC selections Jaime Rendich Beck and Claire Thomas. The 2005

Record Breaking Attendance

The Cougar fans have shown undaunted support for the women's soccer team, averaging over 2,600 fans per home game. Entering the 2005 season, the attendance record was 2,758 fans, set in 2003. On Sept. 12 against No. 22 Texas, the Cougars broke that record with 3,322. After adding more bleachers to accommodate the fans, BYU blasted that number with an overwhelming 3,810 Friday against No. 9 California.

South Stadium

South Stadium is the place the Cougars love to call home, a home all opponents hate to visit.

For the past ten years, South Stadium (formerly South Field), has been the battlefield for the Cougars as the team has taken on, and defeated, the top teams in their conference and in the NCAA.

The Cougars have amassed an 86-19-4 (.807) record at home, which is among the best in the nation over the same time period. Of those 86 home wins, an outstanding 47 have ended in a shutout.

BYU consistently manages to hold its opponents scoreless when playing at South Stadium with 43 percent of all the Cougars' wins ending in shutout victories, while BYU has been shutout only nine times in the stadium's history.

Aside from the Cougars' history of defeating tough teams at home, another factor making South Stadium a formidable place for opponents is the large and loud crowd of fans that pack the stadium at every game.


Consistently among the top 15 in the NCAA, South Stadium packs in some of the largest crowds in the country. With an average attendance of 1,191 fans during the 2004 campaign, the Cougars rank among the highest every year for largest attendance average in the country. BYU also packed in a total of 13,106 fans over 11 games, recording the second highest mark in the MWC and making South Stadium one of the toughest

places for opponents to play in women's college soccer today.

Located just south of the Smith Fieldhouse, South Stadium boasts one of the best-maintained grass playing surfaces in the NCAA. The Wasatch Mountains serve as a scenic backdrop for the capacity crowd of 3,000 fans. South Stadium is also equipped with state-of-the-art field lights, making night games a favorite among fans.

The Rockwood File



Rockwood currently ranks tenth in winning percentage among active NCAA coaches with an impressive 165-56-10 overall record for her career. Over the last ten seasons, Rockwood accumulated a .736 winning percentage.

In the past ten years, Rockwood has guided the Cougars to five conference championships. On the national scene, her teams have made seven appearances in the NCAA Tournament in the last eight years and reached the "Sweet Sixteen" in 1998, 2000 and 2003. The Cougars regularly maintain a consistent top-25 ranking. During Rockwood's tenure, the team finished in the top-10 three times, including a recent run in the 2003 NCAA College Cup. The tournament ended with BYU finishing No. 5 in the country after making their first "Elite Eight" appearance in the program's history.

Among the many achievements and awards she has received over her career, Rockwood has been honored with two Coach of the Year citations, one by the Western Athletic Conference in 1996, and again by the MWC in 2000. She also became the first MWC coach to eclipse the 100-win total mark when the Cougars shutout Milwaukee-Wisconsin 2-0 on Sept. 23, 2000.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Aleisha Rose, Jeni Viernes and Michelle Jensen. Among the players who have been coached by Rockwood are four additional All-

American athletes that were drafted by the women's United Soccer Association: Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Rick's College on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management.

Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs, and the high school level.

Rockwood Among Coaching Elite

Rockwood currently ranks 10th in winning percentage among active NCAA Division I coaches with an impressive 165-56-10 (.735) overall record after the 2004 season. Anson Dorrance, Becky Burleigh, Jerry Smith, Chris Petrucelli, Len Tsantiris, John Walker, Randy Waldrum, G. Guerrieri and Patrick Farmer are the only coaches ahead of her.
