No. 16 BYU Heads to Jayhawk Invitational

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 5, 2006) – The No. 16 BYU women's volleyball team will put its 6-0 record on the line this week at the Jayhawk Invitational hosted by the University of Kansas. The Cougars will take on the Jayhawks (6-1) Thursday at 7 p.m. CT before facing Arkansas (6-0) on Friday at 3 p.m. CT.

"Both Kansas and Arkansas are well coached and experienced teams," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "They play in outstanding volleyball conferences so the challenge for our program will be great. I believe this will be another great weekend to learn more about our team prior to opening MWC play."

BYU enters the week coming off of a spectacular weekend at the BYU Molten Classic. The Cougars won the tournament title with three wins, including a four-game upset of then-No. 4 Stanford in front of a BYU women's volleyball record 4,050 fans on Friday night. The team completed the event on Saturday with sweeps of Texas A&M Corpus Christi and Virginia Commonwealth.

Junior rightside hitter Erica Lott earned tournament MVP honors for the second week in a row and Mountain West Conference Player of the Week accolades after averaging 4.60 kills and 2.00 blocks per game. Senior middle blocker Lindsay Hartsock and sophomore setter Amy Schlauder were also named to the All-Tournament Team.

Kansas is currently 6-1 in 2006 after winning the Temple Classic last weekend. The Jayhawks' only loss came Aug. 26 at Alabama. Kansas is led by outside hitters Jana Correa and Emily Brown, who average 3.67 and 3.58 kills per game, respectively. BYU is 3-0 all-time against Kansas.

Arkansas enters the Jayhawk Invitational undefeated in 2006 at 6-0, winning tournament titles at the Oklahoma Invitational and the Arkansas Invitational. The Razorback offense is led by senior outside hitter Denitza Koleva, who averages 3.79 kills per game while hitting .278. BYU is 0-2 all-time against Arkansas.

The Jayhawks' top blocker is freshman Brittany Williams with 1.00 blocks per game while senior libero Jamie Mathewson paces Kansas with 3.92 digs per game. As a team, the Jayhawks are hitting .273 while holding opponents to a .154 hitting mark.

Weekly Notes:**Week #2 In Review: BYU Claims Molten Classic Title; Records Upset Over No. 4 Stanford**

The Cougars claimed the BYU Molten Classic title last weekend with wins over No. 4 Stanford, Texas A&M Corpus Christi and Virginia Commonwealth to move to 6-0 on the year. A BYU women's volleyball record 4,050 fans saw the Cougars down the No. 4 Cardinal 17-30, 30-25, 30-25, 30-16 to open the tournament on Friday night. Led by junior outside hitter Erica Lott with 20 kills and sophomore libero Janvier Beaumont with 20 digs, BYU made a case for national recognition with the upset. Lott earned tournament MVP honors for the second week in a row after averaging 4.60 kills and 2.00 blocks per game while senior middle blocker Lindsay Hartssock and sophomore setter Amy Schlauder were also named to the All-Tournament Team.

Lott Named MWC Player of the Week

BYU rightside hitter Erica Lott has earned Mountain West Conference volleyball Player of the Week honors, marking her first career award. Lott led BYU to a 3-0 record at the BYU Molten Classic in Provo, Utah, last weekend, including a 3-1 upset victory over then-fourth ranked Stanford. Lott was awarded tournament MVP honors. She led the Cougars in kills in all three matches, starting with her match-high 20 vs. then-No. 4 Stanford. She also turned in six digs and total blocks, and one assist against Stanford, as BYU defeated its highest ranked opponent since November 18, 2000 (No. 4 Colorado State). She followed that outing with a 13 kill (.480 hitting efficiency), five dig, four total block performance vs. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. Lott concluded the tournament notching a career-high 10 total blocks to go along with 13 kills, six digs and a service ace against Virginia Commonwealth.

The Nation's Best ...

With a 974-268-5 all-time record in the 37-year recorded history of BYU women's volleyball, the Cougars are one of the best teams in the nation, ranking third in all-time wins as of Sept. 4. UCLA tops the list with 1009 victories while Missouri State is just two wins ahead of BYU at 976. The top ten is rounded out by Nebraska (969), Long Beach St. (953), Penn State (916), Hawaii (909), Texas (889), Texas-Arlington (875) and Illinois State (857).

Racking Up The Wins

BYU's 6-0 start to the 2006 season is not unusual for the Cougars, who have begun a season at least 5-0 in 15 of 37 recorded seasons. The BYU record for opening wins is 23 set in 1977 when the Cougars went 23-0 before losing to UC Santa Barbara on Nov. 5. Last season, BYU went 20-0 before losing at Utah on Nov. 4. The Cougars have also started a season 18-0 once (1970-71), 13-0 three times (1972-73, 1976, 1987), 12-0 once (1973), 7-0 once (1986) and 6-0 three times (1978, 1991, 2006).

With their win on Friday against No. 4 Stanford, the Cougars are now 117-129 (.476) all-time against ranked opponents. BYU head coach Jason Watson is now 2-0 including last season's win over No. 14 Ohio State. As for other ranked opponents on BYU's 2006 schedule, only Utah, whom the Cougars will play on Sept. 29 and Oct. 27, is currently ranked, coming in at No. 24 in this week's poll.

Blocking Machines

The BYU block is on a roll six matches into the season, coming in sixth among teams ranked in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Poll for Sept. 4 with 3.52 blocks per game. Second-ranked Penn State is averaging 4.22 blocks per game to lead all teams ranked in the poll. Top-ranked Nebraska is second with 3.96 blocks per game while No. 20 Louisville is third with 3.75 bpg. Rounding out the top 10 are No. 13 Cal (3.61) at fourth, No. 6 Florida (3.53) at fifth, No. 11 Wisconsin and No. 24 Utah (3.50) tied for seventh, No. 8 Stanford (3.46) at ninth and No. 12 Tennessee (3.39) at 10th.

A Clean Sweep

The Cougars are 6-0 this season, including five sweeps over Florida International, Central Florida, Stetson, Texas A&M CC and Virginia Commonwealth. BYU was 12-1 last season in three-game matches, including seven consecutive sweeps and the Cougars' first sweep of Colorado State in Fort Collins, Colo., since 1988.

Wilson Returns

2004 All-MWC outside hitter Kim Wilson returns to the Cougar line up this season after sitting out all of last year. Wilson underwent shoulder surgery following the 2004 season and was forced to redshirt in 2005 while recovering.

BYU In the Polls

With a 6-0 start to the 2006 season, including a win over No. 4 Stanford, the Cougars roared into the CSTV / AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll this week, coming in at No. 16. BYU was listed No. 26 in the nation in the preseason poll, exactly where the team finished in last season's final poll. In-state rival and MWC-foe Utah is ranked No. 24. Nebraska is No. 1 while the defending-champion Washington Huskies are ranked No. 5. BYU-opponent Stanford fell to No. 8 with its loss to the Cougars. Among NCAA Division I programs through 2005, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (264) and 11th for weeks ranked No. 1 (4) and weeks ranked in the top 10 (122). BYU has traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in weeks ranked in the final poll (19), sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1) and 10th in weeks ranked in the top 5 to end the year (3).

Tops in the MWC

BYU also received another preseason nod as the Cougars were selected as the preseason favorite to win the Mountain West Conference regular-season title in 2006 along with Utah. Voted on by league coaches and selected media members, the Cougars and Utes each received six first-place votes while Colorado State was picked third with two first-place votes. UNLV, San Diego State, Wyoming, New Mexico, TCU and Air Force rounded out the preseason pecking order. The Cougars were also selected to win the conference title prior to beginning the 2005 season and made good on that prediction with a league-best 14-2 MWC record.

Preseason All-MWC

Three Cougars were selected to the 2006 Preseason All-MWC team including 2005 MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartsock, who was selected as the 2006 preseason favorite for Player of the Year. Fellow 2005 all-conference honorees Chelsea Goodman and Erica Lott - both junior outside hitters - also received nods as preseason all-league favorites. Hartsock, a senior middle blocker, finished second in the nation in hitting percentage last year with .444. Goodman led the league with 4.25 kills per game while Lott ranked second with 4.05.

Home Sweet Home

The Cougars made their home debut last weekend in very friendly territory, going 3-0 in the BYU Molten Classic and hosting a Cougar women's volleyball record 4,050 fans on Friday night in their win over No. 4 Stanford. BYU is now 30-6 in home openers and 452-81 (.848) all-time at home. The Cougars were virtually invincible on their home court last season as BYU went 10-0 on Elaine Michaelis Court and 11-1 at home including the two matches played in the Marriott Center. BYU also showed their support as an average 1,864 true blue Cougars turned out to cheer BYU to victory, the best average in program history. The mark also ranked 14th in the nation.

Newcomers

The Cougars added just one recruit in the offseason as setter Kiana Rogers, a true freshman from Diamond Springs, Calif., joined the team. However, several Cougars are making their first on-court appearance for BYU this year as middle blockers Marisa Vandersteen and Ashton Hansen and defensive specialist Stephanie Lau are coming off of their redshirt years. Rachel Gleed, a junior outside hitter who transferred from Davidson College and redshirted in 2004 and then served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in 2005, will also be playing in a Cougar uniform for the first time this season.

Record Crowd Sees BYU Down No. 4 Stanford

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 1, 2006)--A BYU women's volleyball record 4,050 fans came to the Smith Fieldhouse hoping to see the Cougars beat No. 4 Stanford. They got what they came for as No. 4 went down in four with BYU winning 17-30, 30-25, 30-25 and 30-16 Friday night to open the Molten Classic.

"We thought this match was going to go long," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "Even though the first game went the way it did, I thought we were playing well. We kept our composure, and that's something I don't think we would have done last year."

The Cougars were led by juniors Goodman (14 kills) and Erica Lott (20 kills). Goodman also recorded 18 digs for her second double-double of the season. Orem native Kristin Richards (14 kills, 11 digs) was one of three Cardinal to score double-doubles along with Cynthia Barboza and Franci Girard.

The last time BYU beat an opponent as highly ranked as Stanford was the 2000 season when the Cougars defeated the nation's No. 1, 2, 3 and 4 teams, including No. 1 Stanford.

"A key factor for us is we dug a lot of balls," Watson said. "We created all these opportunities for us to score points, and that sustained the pressure we established earlier in the game. It was fun."

Cougars Claim Molten Classic Title With Sweep Lott Named MVP; Joins Hartsock, Schlauder on All-Tournament Team

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 2, 2006) -- After upsetting No. 4 Stanford in four games Friday night and rolling over Texas A&M Corpus Christi early Saturday afternoon, BYU capped off an undefeated weekend with a convincing three-game win over Virginia Commonwealth University to clinch the Molten Classic trophy. Erica Lott was named Tournament MVP while fellow Cougars Lindsay Hartsock and Amy Schlauder were named to the All-Tournament team.

"I think we're progressing at a rate that is really quite nice," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "It's more than performance, but composure."

Chelsea Goodman racked up her third double-double in six matches with 10 kills and 10 digs, and Lott got her first double-double of the season with 13 kills and a career-high 10 blocks. After the match Watson lauded many of his players, saying that Janvier Beaumont had done exceptionally well at the libero position all week and setter Amy Schlauder has stepped up to fill big shoes.

"It was just another Goodman performance," Watson said. "She's fun to watch, and she inspires us to be better."

Despite a valiant effort, VCU's five blocks and .120 hitting percentage could not stack up against BYU's 13 blocks and .337 hitting percentage. The Cougars also racked up 45 kills and 46 digs in the victory.

The win over VCU brings BYU's record this year to 6-0 with five sweeps.

JASON WATSON HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the program.

He was selected as the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He came back to BYU in 2002 as the assistant head coach of the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001, and an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in five of the last seven seasons. In addition to his 25-4 (.862) head-coaching record, Watson's teams have compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson becomes only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnne Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

Coaching Career

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1998. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best start in school history.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game. BYU also finished among the top four teams in the conference in four other statistical categories, including assists (14.60, second), opponent hitting percentage (.165, second), blocks (2.70, third) and digs (14.26, fourth).



In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartscock led the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both were named AVCA Honorable Mention All-Americans.

In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the Mountain West Conference and were fifth and 13th in the nation in blocks per game in 2004 and 2003, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the

Cougars had put up since 1997. BYU's Lindsay Hartscock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by College Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation, averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable mention All-America recognition, as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No.3 in school history) and a .245

team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts.

Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.

COUGARS PREPARE TO DEFEND MWC TITLE IN 2006

After winning their first regular-season Mountain West Conference title since 1999 and returning to the NCAA Tournament with a 25-4 overall record, the Cougars are preparing to improve upon last year's successes in 2006 with a talented cast of returners and newcomers.

BYU head coach Jason Watson was named the MWC Coach of the Year last season after coaching the Cougars to a 14-2 league record in his first year as a Division I head coach. Watson and assistants Brent Aldridge and Brooke Huebner are optimistic about the Cougars' potential to make a run for consecutive MWC Championships.

"We made significant advances during the spring season," Watson said. "Our athletes have become more comfortable within our systems. As we further define our approach to the game I expect to see further gains. We have a lot of work to do, but our staff has tremendous confidence in each of our student-athletes."

The Cougars return 11 letterwinners and six starters this season, including one All-American and four players who have received All-MWC honors. Below is a look at the 2006 Cougar squad by position.

MIDDLE BLOCKER

Senior Lindsay Hartsock, last year's MWC Player of the Year, returns after completing an impressive season in 2005. The 6-foot-4 Idaho native ranked second in the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark while ranking sixth in the league in blocks with 1.23 blocks per game. Hartsock received AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition for her performance last year and will be a major contributor again in her senior season. She is joined on the block by sophomore Rachel Dyer, a 2005 MWC All-Tournament team honoree who ranked fourth and eighth in the league, respectively, in hitting percentage and blocks. Returning redshirts Ashton Hansen and Marisa Vandersteen will also compete for playing time. Hansen led the state of Idaho in blocks as a high school senior in 2004 while Vandersteen earned first-team all-state honors.

OUTSIDE HITTER

With the return of senior Kim Wilson, who redshirted in 2005 due to injury, and juniors Erica Lott and Chelsea Goodman, the outside hitter position will be a major strength for the Cougars in 2006. Wilson was named All-MWC in 2004 and is a three-year starter. She was second

on the team in kills per game at 3.15 while adding 2.04 digs per contest. Goodman and Lott ranked first and second, respectively, in the league in kills per game last season while earning All-MWC honors. Goodman's 4.25 kpg, the most by a Cougar since Nina Puikkonen in 1999, were coupled with 2.67 digs per game, second on the team. Lott recorded 4.05 kpg. BYU's outstanding hitting trio will be supplemented by sophomore Bryn Porter, who averaged 1.56 kpg in 18 games as a redshirt freshman, and returning redshirt Rachel Gleed, a Davidson College transfer who sat out the 2004 season before serving a mission to Argentina for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

The right side is the only position with major question marks going into the 2006 season as the Cougars have not had a true rightside since losing Lindsey Metcalf, a four-year starter, to graduation in 2004. However, with BYU's depth on the outside, any one of a number of players may be counted on to fill this role. Junior Catherine Parker made the transition from middle blocker to rightside in the spring and may contribute at that position.

SETTER

With the loss of All-American Lauren Richards Evans, who finished her career fourth all-time at BYU in assists, three players will be making a case for starting time at the setter position. Sophomore Amy Schlauder showed significant promise last season as a backup to Richards Evans. Against No. 14 Ohio State, the 6-foot-1 setter entered the match in game two with the Cougars trailing and led BYU to a .310 hitting percentage and a five-game upset. Schlauder also saw action in six other matches with two starts, including piloting the Cougars to a sweep over UVSC. Junior Jenna Judkins also returns as an option to quarterback the Cougar attack along with BYU's lone newcomer, true freshman Kiana Rogers. A California native, Rogers comes to the Cougars ranked as one of the top 100 volleyball players in the nation by prepvolleyball.com and could be counted on to play an immediate role.

LIBERO

The departure of starting libero Lindsey Evans, who elected to forego her remaining years of eligibility, creates opportunities for BYU's three remaining liberos. Sophomore Janvier Beaumont returns after a breakout freshman year in which she played in every match and recorded 1.63 digs per game. Junior Annie Kemp Pinegar

also saw significant action in 2005, averaging 1.85 dpg. The two veterans will be joined in the back row rotation by returning redshirt Stephanie Lau.

SCHEDULE

Continuing its tradition of competitive scheduling, BYU will play eight teams that qualified for the 2005 NCAA Tournament, including two that were ranked in the final CSTV/AVCA Top 25 Poll. In addition to a full slate of Mountain West Conference action, the Cougars will play in three tournaments beginning with a four-team event hosted by the University of Central Florida at the end of August. BYU will then host the Molten Classic featuring Stanford, a perennial top-10 team, Texas A&M Corpus Christi and Virginia Commonwealth.

2005 SEASON REVIEW

Under first-year head coach Jason Watson, the Cougars returned to the ranks of national contenders in 2005 with a 25-4 overall record and their 22nd NCAA Tournament appearance while bringing home their first Mountain West Conference regular-season title since 1999 with a 14-2 mark in league play.

"It was important for our program to return to the postseason and to experience success on a national level," said Watson, who was named the MWC Coach of the Year. "Coming into the 2005 season I felt we had a chance to be a good team, a team that could have a successful preseason, compete within our conference and put ourselves in a position to make the NCAA Tournament. I believe our athletes shared in that goal. It was a very productive season."

BYU made noise early on with a 20-0 start, its best since 1977, while steadily rising to No. 12 in the nation in the AVCA / CSTV Top 25 Coaches Poll, the Cougars' highest ranking since 2000. Of BYU's nine nonconference opponents, five received invitations to the 2005 NCAA Tournament, including then-No. 14 Ohio State, whom the Cougars defeated in five games to bring home the Buckeye Classic Tournament title. BYU also recorded victories over NCAA invitees Nevada, Kansas, Utah State and Duke in addition to defeating Montana State, Idaho State, Utah Valley State and Weber State in nonleague action.

MWC play began early for BYU as the league welcomed conference-newcomer TCU into the fold and moved to a nine-week schedule. The Cougars recorded tough five-game wins at New Mexico and Air Force at the end of September before returning home to defeat in-state rival Utah. The four-game win marked BYU's first over the Utes in 10 tries dating back to 2001.

A sweep of TCU to open the month of October proved prophetic as the Cougars put together a string of eight straight three-game wins, including BYU's first sweep of Colorado State in Fort Collins, Colo., since 1988. The Cougars looked unstoppable as they rolled through league play and racked up a 20-0 record through the first two months of the season.

On Nov. 4, BYU headed north for a rematch with Utah on the Crimson Court and found itself on the other end of the sweep with a three-game loss, its first of the year. The Cougars received more bad news the next day as a water pipe under the Smith Fieldhouse broke, flooding the entire building, including BYU's Elaine Michaelis Court, and forcing the Cougars to move to the Marriott Center for practice and for their weekend matches against CSU and Wyoming. Anxious to avenge their earlier loss, the Rams came out firing on all cylinders, winning the first two games and forcing BYU to come from behind. The Cougars responded to tie the match at two games apiece but could not hold off CSU in game five, losing 17-15.

However, BYU got back on track with two more sweeps and a four-game win over UNLV to end the season, winning the outright MWC title and earning the top seed heading into the conference tournament. The Cougars advanced to the semifinals with a sweep of TCU but had a tougher time against Tournament-host UNLV in the second round, allowing the Rebels to come back from two games down to force a fifth game. BYU fought off match point at 14-12 and eventually triumphed 16-14 to set up a rematch between BYU and Utah for the MWC Tournament title. The Cougars fought hard but could not come up with the victory, losing in four games to the Utes.

On their way home from Las Vegas, the Cougars received word that they would be making their 22nd NCAA Tournament appearance, facing Pepperdine in the first round at USC. BYU entered the match with high hopes but suffered a four-game defeat at the hands of the Waves, ending the season with a 25-4 record and listed just out of the final rankings at No. 26 in the nation.
