No. 16 BYU Volleyball Set to Face No. 18 Utah in Rivalry Match

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 26, 2006) – The No. 16 BYU women's volleyball team will face a tough test this weekend as No. 18 Utah comes to town for a matchup between the Mountain West Conference's top two teams on Friday at 7 p.m. in the Smith Fieldhouse.

"Utah's ranking is very well-deserved," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "They are a confident team that has been tested early in nonconference play and has had success. This will be a great match between two very competitive volleyball programs. We hope that our fans will come out and support us."

At 12-1 overall so far this season and 4-0 in league action, the Cougars are once again on pace for another conference title. Despite losing starting setter Amy Schlauder to injury three weeks ago, BYU has been dominant throughout the early part of the season, recording nine sweeps and ranking in the top 10 nationally in hitting percentage (7th - .308) and win/loss percentage (10th - .923) in addition to ranking 28th in blocks per game. Senior middle blocker Lindsy Hartsock also ranks nationally in blocks and hitting percentage while sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer joins Hartsock among the nation's best in hitting efficiency.

The Smith Fieldhouse has been particularly kind to the Cougar squad as BYU is 5-0 at home this season and was 10-0 in the Fieldhouse last year. An average of 1,965 Cougar faithful have shown their support at each home match this season, which ranks 11th in the nation. A BYU women's volleyball record 4,050 fans saw the Cougars shock then-No. 4 Stanford in four games in BYU's first home match of the year.

The Utes are ranked No. 18 in the nation after beginning the 2006 season 11-2 overall and 4-0 in the Mountain West Conference. Their only two losses came against then-No. 5 Florida and then-No. 14 USC, both of which were on the road. Utah leads the nation in blocks per game behind junior middle blocker Emillie Toone, who also leads the country individually with 2.12 blocks per game. The Utes are also ranked in the top 25 nationally in hitting percentage (14th - .290), assists (19th - 15.10) and kills (24th - 16.33). Sophomore Airial Salvo, the 2005 MWC Freshman of the Year, is second in the league in kills per game (4.24) and points (5.11), behind BYU's Erica Lott in both categories. She is also tied with BYU's Chelsea Goodman for the league lead in aces per game with 0.50.

In last season's match in Provo, the Cougars defeated the Utes in four games, ending a 10-match Utah winning streak in the series. BYU owns a 62-19 overall advantage in the rivalry.

Weekly Notes:

Week #5 In Review: No. 16 Cougars Move to 4-0 in MWC Play

No. 16 BYU recorded two more wins last week at San Diego State and UNLV to improve to 12-1 overall and 4-0 in Mountain West Conference play. While the Cougars beat the Aztecs in four games and recorded their ninth sweep of the year in their win at UNLV, both matches were battles as BYU had to respond after losing the second game at SDSU and fight off game point in all three games at UNLV to win 31-29, 31-29, 33-31, displaying the team's resiliency and determination. Junior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman earned MWC Player of the Week honors for her superb play in both matches as she posted her seventh double-double of the year with 15 kills and 16 digs against the Aztecs and led BYU in kills with 17 against the Rebels.

Goodman Named MWC Player of the Week

BYU junior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman earned Mountain West Conference Volleyball Player of the Week, marking her first award of the season and third of her career. Goodman, a Mesa, Ariz., native, led the Cougars to conference wins over San Diego State and UNLV last week. Against the Aztecs, she recorded her seventh double-double of the season (15 kills, 16 digs), hitting .361 for the match. Against the Rebels, she had a matchhigh 17 kills, nine digs, four total blocks three assists and two service aces. Facing gamepoint at 29-28 in game one, she put down two straight kills, which put BYU in a position to take the game, 31-29. With the Cougars trailing 20-17 in game three, Goodman recorded three kills, a block assist and a service ace as part of a 9-3 Cougar run on the way to a 33-31 win.

The Nation's Best ...

With a 980-269-5 all-time record in the 37-year recorded history of BYU women's volleyball, the Cougars are one of the best teams in the nation, ranking third in all-time wins as of Sept. 26. UCLA tops the list with 1019 victories while Missouri State is just one win ahead of BYU at 981. The top ten is rounded out by Nebraska (977), Long Beach St. (957), Penn State (923), Hawai'i (913), Texas (894), Texas-Arlington (882) and Illinois State (859).

Vs. Ranked Teams

With their win on Sept. 1 against No. 4 Stanford, the Cougars are now 117-129 (.476) alltime against ranked opponents. BYU head coach Jason Watson is now 2-0 including last season's win over No. 14 Ohio State. As for other ranked opponents on BYU's 2006 schedule, only Utah, whom the Cougars will play this Friday and on Oct. 27, is currently ranked, coming in at No. 18 in this week's poll.

Cougars Lose Twice at Kansas

The Cougars' loss at Kansas on Sept. 7, their only defeat of the season so far, was twice as hard as BYU also lost starting setter Amy Schlauder in the match. Schlauder suffered a broken finger early in game one and has subsequently been forced to miss BYU's last six matches. She has undergone surgery and will be reevaluated by team doctors next week.

Judkins Steps Up

BYU's Jenna Judkins has stepped up nicely to fill the starting setter void created by Amy Schlauder's injury. The junior setter who entered the season having played in just nine matches and recorded 15 career assists has started the last six matches for the Cougars, helping BYU win all six, and currently leads the league in assists per game in conference play with 13.73.

Home Sweet Home

BYU is 5-0 this season at home with an attendance average of 1,965, which ranks 11th in the nation. The Cougars began their home season going 3-0 in the BYU Molten Classic and hosting a Cougar women's volleyball record 4,050 fans in their win over No. 4 Stanford. BYU is now 454-81 (.849) all-time at home. The Cougars were virtually invincible on their home court last season as BYU went 10-0 on Elaine Michaelis Court and 11-1 at home including the two matches played in the Marriott Center. BYU fans also showed their support as an average 1,864 true blue Cougars turned out to cheer BYU to victory, the best average in program history. The mark also ranked 14th in the nation.

BYU In the Polls

With a 12-1 start to the 2006 season, including a win over No. 4 Stanford, the Cougars are ranked No. 16 in the CSTV/AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll this week. BYU was listed No. 26 in the nation in the preseason poll, exactly where the team finished in last season's final poll. In-state rival and MWC-foe Utah is ranked No. 18. Nebraska is No. 1 while the defending-champion Washington Huskies are ranked No. 4. Stanford, whom the Cougars defeated in four games earlier in the season, is No. 6. Among NCAA Division I programs through 2005, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (264) and 11th for weeks ranked No. 1 (4) and weeks ranked in the top 10 (122). BYU has traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in weeks ranked in the final poll (19), sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1) and 10th in weeks ranked in the top 5 to end the year (3).

Wedding Bells

Kim Wilson Sorensen is sporting a new last name this week after marrying Trent Sorensen on Monday. The senior outside hitter for the BYU women's volleyball team and the junior middle blocker for the BYU men's volleyball team are the third pair of Cougar volleyballers to find marital bliss in the last 18 months, joining Lauren (Richards) and Taylor Evans and Lexi (Brown) and Casey Patterson from last year's squad. Wilson Sorensen is one of three married athletes on the BYU women's team this season including Annie Kemp Pinegar and Lindsy Hartsock.

A Clean Sweep

The Cougars are 9-1 this season in three-game matches, including sweeps over Florida International, UCF, Stetson, Texas A&M CC, Va. Commonwealth, Arkansas, Utah State, Air Force and UNLV. BYU was 12-1 last season in three-game matches, including seven consecutive sweeps and the Cougars' first sweep of Colorado State in Fort Collins, Colo., since 1988.

Injury Report

BYU starting setter Amy Schlauder suffered a broken finger in game one of the Cougars' match against Kansas on Sept. 7. The sophomore underwent surgery on Sept. 10 to repair the damage and will be reassessed next week. Freshman setter Kiana Rogers has been cleared to return to full activity after suffering a stress fracture in her foot in the offseason.

The Cougars added just one recruit in the offseason as setter Kiana Rogers, a true freshman from Diamond Springs, Calif., joined the team. However, several Cougars are making their first on-court appearance for BYU this year as middle blockers Marisa Vandersteen and Ashton Hansen and defensive specialist Stephanie Lau are coming off of their redshirt years. Rachel Gleed, a junior outside hitter who transferred from Davidson College and redshirted in 2004 and then served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in 2005, will also be playing in a Cougar uniform for the first time this season.

MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars have a 75-25 regular season record in seven years of MWC play after winning the 2005 regular-season title with a 14-2 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and finished second in 2000 with a 12-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. The 2006 MWC Tournament will be held Nov. 22-25 in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2005, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Utah (automatic) and Colorado State (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 22 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 17, SDSU with 13, Utah with eight, New Mexico with seven and Wyoming with four.

In 2005, BYU was ranked as high as No. 12 in the CSTV/USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll while Utah finished the season ranked tied for 25th.

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .814.

Balanced Effort Leads To Win For No. 16 BYU

SAN DIEGO (Sept. 21, 2006) – The No. 16 BYU women's volleyball team overcame a tough challenge from the San Diego State Aztecs Thursday night in San Diego to record their fifth straight win, 30-28, 20-30, 30-18, 30-27.

"We continue to find a way to win, and we show great character and resolve under pressure," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "SDSU played a wonderful match, but we were able to at times get on a run behind the play of Rachel Dyer and Chelsea Goodman. Both of them played an outstanding match and carried us at times."

The win showcased a very balanced BYU attack as four Cougars recorded double-digit kills and four Cougars posted double-digit digs. Junior rightside hitter Erica Lott led the BYU offense with 20 kills, marking the third time she has recorded 20 or more kills this season, while adding 13 digs for her third double-double of the year. Junior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman also notched a double-double, her seventh of the season, with 15 kills and 16 digs. Sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer tied her career-high with 17 kills on .609 hitting, and senior middle blocker Lindsy Hartsock added 10 kills and four blocks on the night. Sophomore libero Janvier Beaumont posted 15 digs while junior setter Jenna Judkins tallied a career-high 10.

"We have to rely on everyone," said Watson. "It was most definitely a team effort. Everybody had to contribute. I'm glad that our team has progressed to a point where we can spread the responsibility of performance out over the whole team and not rely on the same people night in and night out to get the job done. It's a sign of us maturing and progressing thoughout the course of the season."

Goodman Drives No. 16 BYU To Victory

LAS VEGAS (Sept. 23, 2006) – The No. 16 BYU women's volleyball team overcame a stiff challenge from the UNLV Rebels Saturday night in Las Vegas to record its ninth sweep of the season, 31-29, 31-29, 33-31, and remain undefeated in Mountain West Conference action at 4-0 in league play and 12-1 overall.

"We feel good about where we're at this point in the season," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "This was a difficult road trip for us, and it comes on the end of a stretch of three weeks without much rest. But we're making progress and finding ways to win under pressure."

Junior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman recorded a match-high 17 kills and was one dig shy of her eighth double-double on the year with nine. Junior rightside hitter Erica Lott also reached double-digit kills with 15 and was one dig off of a double-double with nine. Sophomore libero Janvier Beaumont led BYU with 14 digs. Sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer led the Cougars with six blocks while Lott and senior middle blocker Lindsy Hartsock each added five and Goodman posted four rejections.

"Goodman was unbelievable again," said Watson. "She was good at San Diego State, and she was good again this evening. She came up big for us."

The Cougars had to fight off a UNLV game-point opportunity in each of the three games as both teams battled to the finish for every point. However, it was the resiliency of the BYU squad that won out in the end, leading to the Cougars' ninth sweep of the season and 12th win overall.

JASON WATSON HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the program.

He was selected as the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU,

Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He came back to BYU in 2002 as the assistant head coach of the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001, and an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in five of the last seven seasons. In addition to his 25-4 (.862) head-coaching record, Watson's team's have compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson becomes only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnne Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

Coaching Career

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1998. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the secondbest start in school history.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game. BYU also finished among the top four teams in the conference in four other statistical categories, including assists (14.60, second), opponent hitting percentage (.165, second), blocks (2.70, third) and digs (14.26, fourth).

In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third alltime at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsy Hartsock led the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both were named AVCA Honorable Mention All-Americans.

In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the Mountain West Conference and were fifth and 13th in the nation in blocks per game in 2004 and 2003, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the

Cougars had put up since 1997. BYU's Lindsy Hartsock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by College Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation, averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back topthree finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable mention All-America recognition, as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No.3 in school history) and a .245

team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts.

Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.


