LOOKING FOR PROGRAM'S 500TH WIN

Coming off a 59-21 win at UNLV last week, No. 18 BYU (5-1, 2-0 MWC) plays at San Diego State (2-3, 0-1 MWC) on Saturday in pursuit of the program's 500th win. Dating back to 1922 the Cougars have a 499-373-26 all-time record with a .570 winning percentage.

Coming off a bye week, the Aztecs host the Cougars after defeating New Mexico State, 34-17, on Oct. 3. Their other win of the season was a 35-19 victory over Southern Utah back on Sept. 12.

ON THE TUBE



Saturday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on The Mtn. Ari Wolfe will provide play-by-play coverage, with Blaine Fowler lending analysis and Jenny Cagner reporting from the sidelines. The game will mark the fourth of seven BYU games available on The Mtn. during the 2009 season.

The Mtn. introduces Wolfe to a portion of its MWC football telecasts this season as he splits time between The Mtn. and Big Ten Network. Since his career as a quarterback at BYU from 1981-85, Fowler has broadcast nearly 500 live college football and basketball games, for networks such as Video West Sports, the Blue and White Network and Sports-West. Cagner currently works for the Home of the San Diego Padres where she reports and anchors the pre and post game shows, as well as a nightly sports show.

WHAT THE GAME MEANS



- With a win on Saturday, BYU will notch its 500th all-time win, improving its program record to 500-373-26 (.571).

- With a win at Qualcomm Stadium on Saturday, BYU will improve its 2009 away record to 4-0 for the first time since 2001. That year the Cougars posted wins at California, UNLV, New Mexico and San Diego State.

- A win would improve the Cougars' season record to 6-1. Before its 6-0 record to open the 2008 season, the last time BYU had a 6-1 start or better was in 2001, when the program posted 12 consecutive wins before ending with back-to-back losses to Hawaii and Louisville.

- A 6-1 record would also earn the Cougars bowl eligibility status for the fifth consecutive season, making head coach Bronco Mendenhall the only coach in program history to qualify his team for bowl games each of his first five seasons.

Series 25-7-1

THE BYU-SDSU SERIES

Saturday's contest will be the 34th all-time between BYU and San Diego State. The Cougars have won seven of the last eight games against SDSU, including a 41-12 victory last season in Provo. In those seven games the Cougars have averaged 46 points. In the series that dates back to 1947, BYU enjoyed its longest winning streak against San Diego State from 1976-85 when it defeated the Aztecs nine straight times. Since the 1985 season the Cougars have not won more than five consecutive games against SDSU, while the Aztecs have never beaten BYU twice in a row. The two teams played to a 52-all tie in 1991, the only draw in the history of the series.

LAST TIME: BYU 41, SDSU 12 (NOV. 8, 2008)

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 8, 2008) – The BYU football team capped a remarkable third-straight undefeated home season with its 41-12 win over San Diego State on Saturday afternoon at LaVell Edwards Stadium. The Cougars improve to 9-1, 5-1; while the Aztecs fall to 1-9, 0-6.

The game marked many milestones for individuals and the team alike while 22 seniors were honored in their final home game. With the win the Cougars remain undefeated at home dating back to 2005, while the 18-straight home wins marks the most in BYU history.

BYU junior quarterback Max Hall led the Cougars, passing for 317 yards, completing 25-of-30 passes.

In nine of Hall's completions he met junior receiver Austin Collie, who entered the game as the nation's leading receiver in both total yards and yards per game. Collie had another standout game with a total of 127 yards, marking his eighth-straight game over the century mark and 14th overall. With that, Collie became the Mountain West Conference all-time leader for 100-yard games.

On the defensive side of the ball, BYU senior linebacker David Nixon had a career-best 14 total tackles and one interception. Nixon served as a catalyst for the entire defense who limited SDSU to 280 offensive yards and only one touchdown.

SDSU'S LAST OUTING

SAN DIEGO (Oct. 3, 2009) -- Freshman halfback Walter Kazee rushed for 101 yards on 22 carries and scored a touchdown Saturday as San Diego State defeated New Mexico State 34-17.

The Aztecs (2-3) scored half of their points in the final seven minutes with the help of Kazee's TD carry and a scoring pass by Ryan Lindley to Willie Watters. Lane Yoshida also connected for a field goal, his second of the game, during the final minutes. The Aggies (2-3) tied it at 17 early in the fourth quarter when quarterback Trevor Walls connected with wide-receiver Todd Lee.

However, the Aztecs took the ensuing kickoff and marched 78 yards on nine plays for the TD. The Aztecs' Vincent Brown, who came into the game No. 3 in the nation in receiving yards, caught three passes for 84 yards including a 21-yard touchdown. Teammate Dey Juan Hemmings also ran in a fumble recovery.

- Aztec quarterback Kelsey Sokoloski, linebacker Willie Watters and BYU's tight end Andrew George all graduated from Cherry Creek HS in Colorado.

- BYU's Tyler Holt (P) and SDSU's Miles Burris (LB) both attended Granite Bay HS in Granite Bay, Calif.

- SDSU defensive lineman Eron Moses shares the same hometown as BYU deep snapper John Pace. Both hail from Yorba Linda, Calif. and graduated from Esperanza HS.

- Aztec tight end Waika Spencer graduated from Kamehameha HS in Honolulu, Hawaii, as did Cougars Travis Uale (DB) and RJ Willing (OL).

BYU'S LAST OUTING



LAS VEGAS (Oct. 10, 2009) – Led by Harvey Unga's 149 yards rushing and Max Hall's 320 yards passing, No. 18 BYU crushed UNLV 59-21 Saturday night at Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas to improve to 5-1 overall and 2-0 in the Mountain West Conference. BYU amassed a season-best 611 yards of total offense in the win while holding UNLV to 337 yards. The Rebels fall to 2-4 overall and 0-2 in the MWC with the loss. BYU improves to 14-3 all-time against UNLV, including an 8-0 record in Las Vegas.

Quarterback Max Hall finished his night with 320 yards and two touchdowns, completing 21-of-27 attempts while adding six yards on the ground.

Led by Unga's season-high 149 yards on 20 carries in just over two quarters of play, BYU churned out a season-best 291 yards on the ground. J.J. Di Luigi added 67 yards on only six carries as the Cougars averaged 6.8 yards per carry overall on the night.

Unga and the run game were not the only things that proved to be consistent for BYU on Saturday. The team scored early and scored consistently over the entire game to reach double-digit points in every quarter for the first time since 2006 and only the second time since 1982. The Cougars scored on their first four possessions and never looked back.

2009 BROADCAST PLANS

All 12 of BYU's games this season will be broadcasted to a national audience on ESPN, ESPN2, The Mtn., VERSUS and CBS College Sports Network. The season opener against Oklahoma was shown on ESPN, while ESPN2 covered the Tulane game the following week. The Cougars will have seven games televised on The Mtn., including a simulcast of the season ender against the University of Utah with CBS-C. Direct TV launched The Mtn. nationally on Aug. 27, 2008, giving fans from across the country ultimate access to Mountain West Conference sports. VERSUS will carry the Florida State and TCU games, and CBS-C will televise the Air Force and Utah games.

NATIONAL RANKINGS

One of three Mountain West Conference schools ranked among the nation's top-25 teams, BYU entered the season nationally ranked in both major college football polls for the second consecutive year. The Cougars were ranked No. 20 in The Associated Press Top 25 after receiving a No. 24 preseason ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll earlier in August.

Last year, BYU ranked No. 16 in the preseason AP poll and No. 17 in the preseason Coaches' poll after going unranked in the preseason polls since 1997. The Cougars finished 2008 with a 10-3 record and a No. 21 national ranking in the Coaches' poll and No. 25 ranking by AP. BYU has been ranked in both the Coaches' poll and AP Top 25 each week dating back to Nov. 18, 2007, following a 35-10 win over Wyoming.

TEAM NOTES

COMPETING AS A RANKED TEAM

With the win over UNLV last week, the Cougars are 153-45 when nationally ranked in the Top 25. A ranked BYU team has won 22 of its last 26 games dating back to 2006.

The Cougars' No. 7 national ranking in the AP Top 25 Rankings after back-to-back wins over Oklahoma and Tulane was their highest since finishing the 1996 season at No. 5. BYU entered the top 10 in the coaches' poll following Week 2 after earning a ranking as high as No. 7 last season.

AGAINST THE BIG 12

With the Oklahoma victory the Cougars now have a 15-22 overall record against Big 12 opponents. BYU has faced every team in the conference except Nebraska, and has a winning record against Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas and Texas A&M.

The last Big 12 vs. BYU matchup was on Jan. 1, 1997 when the Cougars defeated Kansas State, 19-15, at the Cotton Bowl.

The Cougars' first game against a current Big 12 opponent was the University of Colorado, which handed BYU a 41-0 loss on Oct. 20, 1923.

AGAINST CONFERENCE USA

The Cougars now have a 39-13-1 overall record against current Conference USA opponents. BYU has faced seven of the 12 teams in the conference, including Marshall, Southern Mississippi, Rice, SMU, Tulane, Tulsa and UTEP. The Cougars have a winning record against Tulsa (6-1) and UTEP (28-7-1).

ENDING AN 18-YEAR DROUGHT

Before securing a 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Sept. 5, the last time BYU beat a nonconference team ranked in the Top 10 was its 28-21 win over No. 1 Miami on Sept. 8, 1990. The win over the Sooners gave the Cougars their first win over a ranked nonconference opponent since it defeated No. 14 Arizona State, 26-6, on Sept. 12, 1998. Since that day, BYU lost 12 consecutive games to ranked nonconference opponents. The last time BYU beat a ranked nonconference opponent on a neutral field was the Cotton Bowl game of Jan. 1, 1997, when BYU beat No. 14 Kansas State, 19-15.

PULLING OUT THE CLOSE ONES

After a close 14-13 victory over the Sooners in their season opener, the Cougars have won nine consecutive games decided by seven points or fewer. Last season BYU pulled out nail-biters against Washington, UNLV and Colorado State.

MENDENHALL TEAMS DEFEATING RANKED FOES

Under Bronco Mendenhall, BYU is now 2-6 vs. ranked foes, with its wins being a 31-17 victory over No. 15 TCU on Sept. 28, 2006 and a 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Sept. 5, 2009.

DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 37-4 when leading at halftime and 35-1 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter.

Mendenhall's teams have won 25 straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 72 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987 when it lost, 29-27, in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

NIGHT GAMES

The UNLV game marked the fourth of five night games for the Cougars this season, with a later start (after 5 p.m.) also against TCU. BYU is 3-1 in night games so far after defeating Oklahoma in its season opener, dropping the contest to FSU on Sept. 19 and defeating Utah State and UNLV.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

With the win over Utah State on Oct. 2 the Cougars improved their Friday night record against the Aggies to 13-0. BYU holds an 18-3 overall record in Friday night games.

5-1 START TO THE SEASON

Last week's win improved the Cougars' season record to 5-1. Before its 6-0 record to open the 2008 season, the last time BYU had a 5-1 start or better was in 2001, when the program posted 12 consecutive wins.

FLAG BEARER



BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition—an alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Their signatures reflect their commitment to uphold the tradition, spirit and honor of the BYU football program and to be a flag bearer of the University. As part of the 25-year anniversary celebration of BYU's national championship, each alumni chosen to carry out the flag this year will be a member of the 1984 team.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 45 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 18 different countries, including Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Ghana, Japan, Korea, Madagascar, Marshall Islands, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Phillipines, Puerto Rico, Russia, South Africa and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of eight different foreign languages, including Filipino, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish.

SERVED MISSIONS...

The September issue of ESPN the Magazine featured a story on sophomore defensive lineman, Romney Fuga, one of the 60 players on the team roster who has served a church mission (57-percent). Fuga recently returned home from a mission to Madagascar.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 23 different countries around the world, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, England, Germany, Honduras, Italy, Japan, Madagascar, Mozambique, New Zealand, Phillipines, Puerto Rico, Samoa, Spain, Taiwan, United States and Uruguay. Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 15 different states, including California, Colorado, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, New Mexico, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas. Current members of the BYU football team who have previously served church missions speak a total of nine different foreign languages, including Filipino, German, Italian, Japanese, Malagasy, Mandarin, Portuguese, Samoan and Spanish.

WHAT IS A MISSION, YOU ASK?

The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. "Mormon" missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities. More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world. Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language. Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 17 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Guatemala, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, Spain and South Korea. A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m. In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize. Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services. Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

CELEBRATING 25 YEARS



2009 is the 25-year anniversary of BYU's 1984 National Championship season. The 2009 BYU football team will be honoring the 1984 team this coming season. The 25-year Silver Anniversary logo will be displayed on the players' helmets and on season tickets, game programs, the media guide, team posters and the annual game-day t-shirt.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Offensive seniors Max Hall and Dennis Pitta, along with defensive seniors Matt Bauman, Scott Johnson and Jan Jorgensen, have been selected by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2009 football season.

Collectively the captains have 131 starts, with Hall, Bauman and Jorgensen starting each game last season.

Hall ended the 2008 season ranked No. 6 in the nation in passing yards per game (304.38). Pitta, an All-American tight end, was a unanimous first-team All-MWC selection and John Mackey Award semifinalist last season.

At linebacker, Bauman was credited with a team-high 108 tackles on the 2008 season, including a career-best 50 solo tackles. Johnson has moved over to safety from corner, where he recovered a fumble and returned it for a 64-yard touchdown against Wyoming. After picking up five sacks last year, Jorgensen is now the MWC's all-time career sack leader with 22.5.

Their accomplishments extend off the field as well, with Pitta, Bauman, Johnson and Jorgensen earning Academic All-MWC honors last year. Both Bauman and Johnson were named to the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District team, with Bauman going on to earn Academic All-America honors.

HOME WIN STREAK SNAPPED

BYU's 54-28 loss to Florida State on Sept. 19, 2009 snapped an 18-game BYU win streak at home in LaVell Edwards Stadium—a program record spanning 2006-08. The Cougars had not lost in Edwards Stadium since a 41-34 overtime thriller to Utah on November 19, 2005. Dating back to September 9, 2006 the Cougars beat their opponents by an average of 27.8 points per game and allowed just 11.3 points per game. The Cougars won 17 consecutive home games 16 seasons ago from Oct. 7, 1989 to Nov. 23, 1991. Since the stadium was built in 1964, BYU has gone undefeated at home 15 times:

The 64,103 fans in attendance for the Cougars' 35-17 win over USU marked the 15th consecutive sell-out at LaVell Edwards Stadium. The current streak marks the longest streak of consecutive sellouts since the 1990-92 seasons. In three games this season BYU is averaging 64,134 fans per game. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh in at an average 317 pounds and average 6-feet-4. The front five will be going up against a SDSU defensive front that measures an average 6-feet-2, 253 pounds. Defensively, the Cougars front three average 6-feet-3, 262 pounds, while the SDSU offensive line tips the scales at an average 6-feet-3, 293 pounds per man.

T-BIRDS CONTRIBUTE



BYU's 2005 recruiting class boasted four Timpview HS graduates, three of which are current starters on the BYU offense--wide receiver Luke Ashworth, offensive

lineman Matt Reynolds and running back Harvey Unga. Reserve wide receiver Stephen Covey was the fourth T-Bird to sign that year.

As seniors the foursome led Timpview to the 2004 4-A State Championship and each received numerous all-state and all-region honors.

Ashworth earned his first start of the 2009 season during the Utah State game when he set career highs with five receptions for 91 yards and his first touchdown as a Cougar.

As the only returning starter on BYU's offensive line, Reynolds earned freshman All-America honors in 2008 and continues to provide consistent play at the left tackle spot.

Since earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2007, Unga has recorded back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons and is on pace to break BYU's career rushing record before the end of his junior season.

HE WHO SCORES FIRST...

BYU was the first to score last week on a 29-yard field goal by Mitch Payne with 5:20 remaining in the first quarter. BYU has been the first to score in three games this season, the other being Tulane and Colorado State. The Cougars are 3-0 in those three games.

DOUBLE-DIGIT QUARTERS

The UNLV game marked the first time since 2006 and only the second time in 27 years a BYU team has scored double digits in all four quarters of a game. The last time was a 55-7 win against Wyoming in 2006 with the prior occasion being a 58-8 triumph over San Diego State on Nov. 13, 1982.

THIRD-DOWN CONVERSIONS

The Cougars lead the nation in third-down conversion percentage, converting a total of 36-of-60 attempts. Last week BYU continued that success, moving the chains on 8-of-11 third-down attempts against the UNLV defense.

CAREER FIRSTS

True freshman JoJo Pili made the most of his first play in a Cougar uniform last week, recording a 1-yard touchdown run to give the Cougars a 38-14 advantage over UNLV in the third quarter.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

DOUBLE THREAT

Junior running back Harvey Unga needs only 32 more receiving yards to become one of only nine Cougars to record over 1,000 career yards through the air and on the ground. Unga currently has 969 yards receiving and 2,385 yards rushing.

Other Cougars who accomplished this feat are Curtis Brown, Jamal Willis, Lakei Heimuli, Luke Staley, Hema Heimuli, Todd Christensen, Scott Phillips and Fred Whittingham.

LONGEST RUN IN THREE YEARS

Harvey Unga's 52-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter against UNLV marked the longest BYU run since 2006. As a freshman that year Mike Hague ran for an 87-yard touchdown against UNLV on Oct. 21, 2006 as the Cougars went on to win 52-7.

UNGA ON THE RUN

After Harvey Unga's 33-yard touchdown with 1:09 to play in the first quarter against UNLV, the junior has now recorded a rushing score in each of the past four games. He also crossed the 100-yard rushing mark for the third consecutive week after his 52-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. The last time Unga recorded three 100-yard rushing games in a row was during the end of his freshman season in 2007 when he passed the century mark against Wyoming, Utah and San Diego State.

His three rushing touchdown in the first half tie a career-high for Unga, a mark he also reached in BYU's 43-27 win at San Diego State in 2007 and against CSU earlier this season.



CONSECUTIVE CATCHES

All-American tight end Dennis Pitta caught his first pass of the UNLV game with 13:49 remaining in the second quarter for a 25-yard gain bringing up first-and-goal. The senior has caught a pass in 36 consecutive games dating back to Oct. 23, 2004 (at Air Force), prior to his mission.

SURPASSING HUDSON

With his five catches against CSU, All-American tight end Dennis Pitta passed Hall of Fame tight end Gordon Hudson to become BYU's career receptions leader among tight ends. Hudson had 178 receptions during

the 1981-83 seasons. Pitta equaled Hudson on a 13-yard catch on third-down during BYU's second possession of the third quarter and then set the new mark two plays later on a 14-yard reception to the CSU 29-yard line. The drive ended with Pitta catching an 18-yard touchdown for his fourth catch of the drive, fifth of the game and 180th of his career. As of now Pitta has 187 career catches.

Over his career Pitta has racked up 2,471 receiving yards, needing only 14 more to surpass Hudson as BYU's all-time leading tight end.

WHO'S NO. 75?

Sophomore tight end Braden Hansen switched jersey numbers from No. 89 to No. 75 in the fourth quarter of the UNLV game as he saw his first action as a member of the BYU offensive line. He has been cross training as both a tight end and offensive tackle.

HALL CREEPS UP ON DETMER'S WIN RECORD

With the Cougars' 59-21 win over UNLV, senior quarterback Max Hall now has 26 career wins as the starting play-caller for BYU. As far as where that puts him on BYU's all-time list, Hall trails only Ty Detmer, who racked up 30 wins during his career from 1988-91.

As he plays through his senior season, quarterback Max Hall is putting up numbers similar to the legendary quarterbacks that came before him.

HOLDING THE SOONERS

When facing an offense that averaged 51.1 points per game in 2008, the Cougar defense successfully held Oklahoma to 13 points. In the first half alone, BYU forced three-and-outs on four of OU's six possessions.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

Junior defensive back Andrew Rich recovered a USU fumble with 55-seconds remaining in the second quarter last week. With the BYU offense back on the field, Max Hall led a two-play, 29-yard scoring drive, capped by a 3-yard touchdown run by senior Manase Tonga.

Linebacker Coleby Clawson picked up two sacks against UNLV's Omar Clayton last week, giving him three on the season.

Junior defensive lineman Jan Jorgensen's sack against Utah State's Diondre Borel late in the first quarter on Oct. 2 extended his MWC career sack record to 23.5. The previous record of 20.5 was held by New Mexico's Michael Tuohy, TCU's Chase Ortiz and former Cougar Brady Poppinga. Jorgensen recorded four sacks his freshman season in 2006, 13.5 his sophomore season and five in 2008.

Collectively the Cougars have recorded 11 sacks in their first six games this season.

COUGAR PICKS

Sophomore linebacker Jordan Pendleton recorded his first interception of the 2009 season with 4:45 remaining in the first quarter against UNLV, picking off an intended throwaway pass from Rebel quarterback Omar Clayton. The Cougars capitalized on the turnover, scoring two plays later on a 33-yard touchdown run by Harvey Unga.

Senior defensive back Scott Johnson intercepted the first pass of his career with 7:22 remaining in the second quarter. He followed that with another pick with just over seven minutes to play in the third quarter. The last time BYU had a defender intercept two passes in a game was back in 2002 when Brandon Heaney did so against Georgia Tech.

The Cougar defense has now snagged seven interceptions through their first six games.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9, 2006 when freshman McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards. Thirty-five games have passed since then.

HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



BRONCO MENDENHALL FIFTH SEASON

During his four seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that had not enjoyed a winning season since 2001, Mendenhall has guided his teams to four straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and consistent national top-25 rankings.

After a 6-6 season in 2005, Mendenhall's Cougars have earned a 32-7 record over the past three seasons, including two Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl victories in 2006 and 2007. Only five teams in the last three years have won more games than BYU. Boasting a 38-13 overall record, Mendenhall has coached his team to 20 wins in the last 23 games to help the Cougars become one of only nine teams to be ranked in the final BCS standings in each of the last three seasons.

In his first season, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5 regular-season record and earned an invitation to the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl -- the team's first postseason bowl appearance in three seasons. Over the next two seasons, he coached the Cougars to back-to-back 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents.

In 2008, BYU posted a 10-2 regular season to achieve three straight 10-win seasons for only the third time in school history. In doing so, Mendenhall's teams became the first in Cougar history to go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons. While defending its home turf in 2008, BYU produced many memorable moments, including a 59-0 win over 2007 Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl opponent UCLA.

The Cougars have received four straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first four teams to a bowl game. In fact, with BYUs invitation to attend the 2007 Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl, Mendenhall became the first coach in BYU football history to take a team to a bowl game in three straight seasons during his first three years as a head coach.

On November 17, 2007, Mendenhall led the Cougars to a 35-10 victory over Wyoming to record his 25th career win. With the victory, Mendenhall became the only coach in BYU football history to win 25 games in his first 35 attempts.

Building on the success of his first-ever season as a head coach in 2005, Mendenhall and the Cougars posted an 11-2 record in 2006, winning the outright Mountain West Conference Championship with a perfect 8-0 record. As a result, BYU returned to the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl to represent the MWC. In dominating fashion, and with a swagger similar to that of the glory years of BYU football, the Cougars handed Oregon a 38-8 defeat in the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

The 2007 season started out in similar fashion, winning just one of the team's first three games; however, under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars rebounded to win the final 10 games of the season, and like the previous year, garnered the attention of local, regional and national voters. BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll, marking the highest finish for the Cougars since finishing No. 5 following the 1996 season.

During the regular season, the Cougars did not allow a single 100-yard rusher. One of Mendenhall's jobs as the head coach and defensive coordinator is to manage points. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

In 2008, BYU earned a spot in the national polls each week of the season, including a ranking as high as No. 7. With just two regular-season blemishes on its resume with road losses at No. 6 Utah and No. 11 TCU, BYU earned a No. 16 ranking in the final BCS standings and an invitation to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl. Off the field, only Penn State (4) placed more student-athletes on the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America First Team than BYU in 2008. Cougar starters David Oswald (offensive tackle), Matt Bauman (linebacker) and Kellen Fowler (safety) each earned the high honor as BYU had three first-teamers for the first time during the same season.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple has three sons.

OTHER PLAYERS TO WATCH...

LUKE ASHWORTH-WR

In his best game as a Cougar, Ashworth caught five passes for a career-high 91 yards and one touchdown against Utah State on Oct. 2, including a long pass for 48 yards. After returning home from an LDS mission in 2007, Ashworth saw action in all 13 games in 2008, including four starts. He caught three passes for 49 yards, averaging 16.3 yards per reception.

BRANDON BRADLEY-DB

After six games Bradley leads the team in solo tackles with 24. As a sophomore he earned letterman honors in 2008, seeing action in 12 games for the Cougars, including three starts at corner. He totaled 40 tackles on the season, including 33 solo takedowns, recorded three pass breakups and returned a fumble for a 38-yard touchdown in the game at Utah State.

O'NEILL CHAMBERS-WR

As BYU's primary kick returner in 2008, Chambers returned 35 kicks for 809 yards, averaging 23.1 yards per return. His 35 kick returns set a BYU and MWC record for most kickoff returns in a season. So far this season he is averaging 11.4 yards per reception and had a career-long kickoff return for 97 yards against UNLV.

COLEBY CLAWSON-LB

Clawson currently leads the team with five quarterback hurries and three sacks. After transferring from Snow College, Clawson saw action in all 13 games for the Cougars in 2008, including 11 starts at outside linebacker. He totaled 55 tackles on the season, including 25 solo takedowns and led the team with 11.5 tackles for loss. He also led the team with three forced fumbles, including two against Utah State and one in the season opener against Northern Iowa.

BRETT DENNEY-DL

The third Denney brother to play for the Cougars, he recovered a fumble in BYU's upset victory over Oklahoma. Over the past three seasons Denney has totaled 78 total tackles and 5.5 sacks. He led the 2008 Cougars with three fumble recoveries, including recoveries against Northern Iowa, UCLA and SDSU.

JJ DI LUIGI-RB

Di Luigi recorded his first touchdown in a BYU uniform during the third quarter of the Tulane game, and soon added a second score to start the fourth quarter. During that game he ran for a team-high 71 yards. He is currently second on the team with five touchdowns and 168 yards rushing.

OTHER PLAYERS TO WATCH...

ANDREW GEORGE-TE

The other half of what might be the best tight end tandem in the country, George returns for his senior year after scoring six touchdowns in 2008. He picked up his first in 2009 during BYU's upset win over No. 3 Oklahoma in its season opener. Earning three starts last season, he set season highs with five receptions for 62 yards against Air Force and caught two touchdown passes in BYU's win over New Mexico. He has seen action in 42 games over the past four seasons.

TERRANCE HOOKS-LB

Hooks started his senior season with a sack against Oklahoma's Landry Jones in BYU's season opener and later earned his first career start against CSU. He saw action in five games in 2008 after returning from a knee injury suffered during spring ball. He completed in 12 games in 2007, recording a season-high five tackles against Eastern Washington.

MCKAY JACOBSON-WR

Jacobson started the 2009 season with a fourth quarter touchdown reception to secure BYU's 14-13 upset win over No. 3 Oklahoma. He continued to be a favorite target of Hall's before suffering a hamstring injury, catching a touchdown pass in the first three games this year. Before his LDS mission to Japan, Jacobson totaled 28 receptions for 547 yards in 2006. His first-ever punt return went for a 77-yard touchdown, marking BYU's first punt return for a touchdown in 113 games.

SCOTT JOHNSON-DB

A second-year starter, Johnson recorded the first two interceptions of his career in BYU's win over UNLV. He started the first nine games of the 2008 season, totaling 59 tackles, including 28 solo takedowns. He also recovered a fumble and returned it for a 64-yard touchdown in BYU's shutout win over Wyoming.

BRYAN KARIYA-RB

Filling in for an injured Harvey Unga, Kariya recorded his second career start in the season opener against No. 3 Oklahoma. He totaled a team-high 42 yards rushing against the Sooners, also adding 76 yards receiving. In the season's second game against Tulane, Kariya's impact continued as he scored two touchdowns, one on the ground and one through the air.

Nelson took his first snap as a Cougar during the fourth quarter of BYU's 54-3 win over Tulane. He completed 2-of-2 pass attempts for 12 yards and ran for the first touchdown of his BYU career. He also saw some playing time in the fourth quarter of the FSU game, passing for 59 yards and one touchdown. Nelson comes to BYU after transferring from Utah State following his LDS mission to Spain. While at USU he started the final eight games of the 2006 season, completing 55-percent of his passes for 925 yards and six touchdowns. He also rushed for 290 yards.

ANDREW RICH-DB

After starting three games in 2008, Rich has become a vocal leader for the BYU defense. He was named MWC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in BYU's win over Oklahoma on Sept. 5. During that game he recorded five tackles, including four solo stops, one tackle for loss and two forced fumbles to aid the BYU upset victory. Rich intercepted his first pass of the season against CSU on Sept. 26. He currently leads the team in tackles with 35.

VIC SO'OTO-DL

Playing at his third position while at BYU, So'oto is eager for a healthy start to the 2009 season. He picked up his first career sack in BYU's win over CSU.
