FRIDAY MATCHUP WITH AGGIES

BYU (3-1, 1-0 MWC) will compete in its final non-conference matchup of the season when it hosts in-state rival Utah State (1-2) Friday evening at 7 p.m. MT. The Cougars, who are coming off a 42-23 win in their Mountain West Conference opener against Colorado State last week, have a 2-1 nonconference record with wins against No. 3 Oklahoma and Tulane.

First-year USU head coach Gary Andersen led Utah State in its first win of the 2009 season, a 53-34 homecoming victory over Southern Utah on Sept. 26. The Aggies dropped contests against No. 19 Utah and Texas A&M prior to last Saturday's win.

ON THE TUBE



Friday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on The Mtn. Bill Doleman will provided play-by-play coverage, with Blaine Fowler lending analysis and Toby Christensen reporting from the sidelines.

A network anchor for The Mtn., Doleman was a regular on ESPN's regional coverage of Big-12 Conference men's basketball for 14 seasons and has

performed extensive work for several other conferences as well. Since his career as a quarterback at BYU from 1981-85, Fowler has broadcast nearly 500 live college football and basketball games, for networks such as Video West Sports, the Blue and White Network and SportsWest before joining The Mtn. A four-year wide receiver at BYU, Christensen earned Academic All-Mountain West Conference honors two years in a row and ranked third in academic performance on the BYU roster before graduating in 2003.

The game will mark the second of seven BYU games available on The Mtn. during the 2009 season.

WHAT THE GAME MEANS



- With a win at LaVell Edwards Stadium on Friday the Cougars would improve their home-field dominance, posting a 20-1 record in their last 21 games played at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

- A win would improve the Cougars' season record to 4-1. Before its 6-0 record to open the 2008 season, the last time BYU had a 4-1 start or better was in 2001, when the program posted 12 consecutive wins before ending

with back-to-back losses to Hawaii and Louisville.

THE BYU-UTAH STATE SERIES

One of the state's oldest rivalries, the Cougars and Aggies have met 78 times, with BYU owning a 42-33-3 record in the 87-year-old history. The two teams met every year from 1922 through 1942 and again from 1946 through 1994. They then played every year except 1995 and 1998 before the series stopped after 2002. Over the years, the losing team has been shutout 19 times, most recently the Aggies in a 38-0 loss to BYU in 2006.

BYU has won nine straight since the Aggies posted a thrilling 58-56 victory in 1993. In their last meeting in 2008, the Cougars defeated Utah State, 34-14, in Logan.

LAST TIME: BYU 34, USU 14 (OCT. 3, 2008)

Junior wide receiver Austin Collie recorded his third-straight game with more than 100 receiving yards as No. 7 BYU improved to 5-0 on the season with a 34-14 victory at Utah State (1-4). The Cougars extended the nation's top winning streak to 15 games.

Collie hauled in eight catches for 132 yards and two touchdowns against the Aggies, moving into eighth place all-time in career receiving yards (2,235) at BYU. Heisman Trophy candidate Max Hall threw for 303 yards and connected with seven different receivers while going 23-for-37. Running back Harvey Unga led the Cougar ground attack with 92 yards on 22 carries to help BYU total 406 yards of total offense.

The Cougars extended their streak of shutout quarters to 11 before Utah State running back Robert Turbin scored with 13:47 to go in the fourth quarter. Turbin broke a tackle attempt by BYU safety David Tafuna and raced 40 yards to the end zone. The Cougars had not given up a score since the fourth quarter at Washington on Sept. 6. BYU went on to score 137 straight points against UCLA, Wyoming and Utah State before the Aggies finally broke through with a score.

UTAH STATE'S LAST OUTING

LOGAN, Utah (Sept. 26, 2009) - Utah State erupted for 53 points en route to a 53-34 Homecoming win over Southern Utah Saturday night at Romney Stadium. The Aggies won first-year head coach Gary Andersen's USU home debut, improving to 1-2 on the season while the Thunderbirds dropped their third in a row, falling to 1-3. It was Utah State's first home-opening win since 2005 and the Aggies' first Homecoming win since 2006, improving to 49-28-2 all-time in celebrating the navy and white tradition.

USU amassed 604 yards of total offense, the most since 2001 and the ninth-most in school history and reached many other milestones along the way. Most noteable was the running back tandem of sophomore Robert Turbin (17 carries, 104 yards) and junior Michael Smith (eight carries, 100 yards), who became the first pair of Aggie backs to both rush for 100 yards since 1989.

With 108 receiving yards, Turbin also became the first USU running back to have 100-yard receiving and rushing in the same game since Emmett White in 2000. Additionally, Turbin became the first Aggie back to have three-straight 100yard rushing outings since White in 2001.

COUGAR-AGGIE TIES

- There are 29 Utah natives on the USU roster, including three from Provo (Alder, Asisi and Van Leeuwen).

- Cougar back-up quarterback Riley Nelson transferred to BYU from Utah State following his mission to Spain. Nelson started the final eight games for USU during the 2006 season.

- Aggie freshman defensive lineman DJ Tialavea is the cousin of BYU's Russell Tialavea.

- BYU wide receiver McKay Jacobson and USU offensive lineman Robert Hill both graduated from Carroll HS in Southlake, Texas.

- BYU defensive back Robbie Buckner and USU defensive end Antonio May both graduated from Ashdown HS in Ashdown. Ark.

BYU'S LAST OUTING



PROVO, Utah (Sept. 26, 2009) -- A quick start in the first guarter propelled No. 19 BYU (3-1) over Colorado State (3-1), 42-23, to open Mountain West Conference play with a win at LaVell Edwards Stadium in front of a sellout crowd of 64,091.

The Cougar offense scored all three first quarter touchdowns on drives of less than forty seconds, with each possession taking just two plays thanks to the defensive and special teams units. All three scores came on the ground for the Cougars, the first time BYU has rushed for three touchdowns in a quarter since a 62-41 win against Air Force in 2005.

Davey O'Brien candidate Hall added two touchdown passes to a scoring run of his own, completing 18-of-29 passes for 241 yards and two interceptions.

Senior tight end Dennis Pitta snagged a catch on third-and-goal from the 18-yard line in the third quarter. The touchdown was the first for Pitta since last year's contest against Colorado State in November. During the drive, Pitta made four of his five catches on the night and passed Hall of Famer Gordon Hudson to become the Cougars' all-time receptions leader among tight ends with 180.

2009 BROADCAST PLANS

All 12 of BYU's games this season will be broadcasted to a national audience on ESPN, ESPN2, The Mtn., VERSUS and CBS College Sports Network. The season opener against Oklahoma was shown on ESPN, while ESPN2 covered the Tulane game the following week. The Cougars will have seven games televised on The Mtn., including a simulcast of the season ender against the University of Utah with CBS-C. Direct TV launched The Mtn. nationally on Aug. 27, 2008, giving fans from across the country ultimate access to Mountain West Conference sports. VERSUS will carry the Florida State and TCU games, and CBS-C will televise the Air Force and Utah games.

NATIONAL RANKINGS

One of two Mountain West Conference schools ranked among the nation's top-25 teams, BYU entered the season nationally ranked in both major college football polls for the second consecutive year. The Cougars were ranked No. 20 in The Associated Press Top 25 after receiving a No. 24 preseason ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll earlier in August

Last year, BYU ranked No. 16 in the preseason AP poll and No. 17 in the preseason Coaches' poll after going unranked in the preseason polls since 1997. The Cougars finished 2008 with a 10-3 record and a No. 21 national ranking in the Coaches' poll and No. 25 ranking by AP. BYU has been ranked in both the Coaches' poll and AP Top 25 each week dating back to Nov. 18, 2007, following a 35-10 win over Wyoming.

COMPETING AS A RANKED TEAM

With the win over Colorado State last week, the Cougars are 151-45 when nationally ranked in the Top 25. A ranked BYU team has won 20 of its last 24 games dating back to 2006.

The Cougars' No. 7 national ranking in the AP Top 25 Rankings after back-to-back wins over Oklahoma and Tulane was their highest since finishing the 1996 season at No. 5. BYU entered the top 10 in the coaches' poll following Week 2 after earning a ranking as high as No. 7 last season.

Team Notes

AGAINST THE BIG 12 With the Oklahoma victory the Cougars now have a 15-22 overall record against Big 12 opponents. BYU has faced every team in the conference except Nebraska, and has a winning record against Missouri, Oklahoma. Texas and Texas A&M.

The last Big 12 vs. BYU matchup was on Jan. 1, 1997 when the Cougars defeated Kansas State, 19-15, at the Cotton Bowl.

The Cougars' first game against a current Big 12 opponent was the University of Colorado, which handed BYU a 41-0 loss on Oct. 20. 1923.

AGAINST CONFERENCE USA

The Cougars now have a 39-13-1 overall record against current Conference USA opponents. BYU has faced seven of the 12 teams in the conference, including Marshall, Southern Mississippi, Rice, SMU, Tulane, Tulsa and UTEP. The Cougars have a winning record against Tulsa (6-1) and UTEP (28-7-1).

ENDING AN 18-YEAR DROUGHT

Before securing a 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Šept. 5, the last time BYU beat a nonconference team ranked in the Top 10 was its 28-21 win over No. 1 Miami on Sept. 8. 1990. The win over the Sooners gave the Cougars their first win over a ranked nonconference opponent since it defeated No. 14 Arizona State, 26-6, on Sept. 12, 1998. Since that day, BYU lost 12 consecutive games to ranked nonconference opponents. The last time BYU beat a ranked nonconference opponent on a neutral field was the Cotton Bowl game of Jan. 1, 1997, when BYU beat No. 14 Kansas State, 19-15.

PULLING OUT THE CLOSE ONES

After a close 14-13 victory over the Sooners in their season opener, the Cougars have won nine consecutive games decided by seven points or fewer. Last season BYU pulled out nail-biters against Washington, UNLV and Colorado State.

MENDENHALL TEAMS DEFEATING RANKED FORS Under Bronco Mendenhall, BYU is now 2-6 vs. ranked foes, with its wins a 31-17 victory over No. 15 TCU on Sept. 28,

2006 and a 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Sept. 5, 2009.

DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 35-4 when leading at halftime and 33-1 when taking a lead into the fourth guarter.

Mendenhall's teams have won 23 straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 70 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987 when it lost, 29-27, in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

NIGHT GAMES

The Utah State game will mark the third of five night games for the Cougars this season, with later starts (after 5 p.m.) also against UNLV and TCU. BYU is 1-1 in night games so far after defeating Oklahoma in its season opener and dropping the contest to FSU on Sept. 19.

FIRST CAREER STARTS

The Colorado State game marked the first career starts for senior linebacker Terrance Hooks and sophomore defensive lineman Romney Fuga. Hooks started in place of senior Matt Bauman who suffered a knee injury during the Florida State game. Fuga started in place of the injured Russell Tialavea.

FLAG BEARER



BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition-an alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Their signatures reflect their commitment to uphold the tradition, spirit and honor of the BYU football program and to be a flag bearer of the University. As part of the 25-year anniversary celebration of BYU's national champion-

ship, each alumni chosen to carry out the flag this year will be a member of the 1984 team.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 45 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 18 different countries, including Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Ghana, Japan, Korea, Madagascar, Marshall Islands, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Phillipines, Puerto Rico, Russia, South Africa and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of eight different foreign languages, including Filipino, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish.

SERVED MISSIONS ...

The September issue of ESPN the Magazine featured a story on sophomore defensive lineman, Romney Fuga, one of the 60 players on the team roster who has served a church mission (57-percent). Fuga recently returned home from a mission to Madagascar.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 23 different countries around the world, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, England, Germany, Honduras, Italy, Japan, Madagascar, Mozambique, New Zealand, Phillipines, Puerto Rico, Samoa, Spain, Taiwan, United States and Uruguay. Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 15 different states, including California, Colorado, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, New Mexico, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas. Current members of the BYU football team who have previously served church missions speak a total of nine different foreign languages, including Filipino, German, Italian, Japanese, Malagasy, Mandarin, Portuguese, Samoan and Spanish.

WHAT IS A MISSION, YOU ASK?

The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. "Mormon" missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities. More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world. Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language. Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 17 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Guatemala, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, Spain and South Korea. A typical missionaries of neworld, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries of not proselytize. Missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries of not proselytize fuels of labor — and are not paid for their services. Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

CELEBRATING 25 YEARS



2009 is the 25-year anniversary of BYU's 1984 National Championship season. The 2009 BYU football team will be honoring the 1984 team this coming season. The 25-year Silver Anniversary logo will be displayed on the players' helmets and on season tickets, game programs, the media guide, team posters and the annual game-day t-shirt.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Offensive seniors Max Hall and Dennis Pitta, along with defensive seniors Matt Bauman, Scott Johnson and Jan Jorgensen, have been selected by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2009 football season.

Collectively the captains have 121 starts, with Hall, Bauman and Jorgensen starting each game last season.

Hall ended the 2008 season ranked No. 6 in the nation in passing yards per game (304.38). Pitta, an All-American tight end, was a unanimous first-team All-MWC selection and John Mackey Award semifinalist last season.

At linebacker, Bauman was credited with a team-high 108 tackles on the 2008 season, including a career-best 50 solo tackles. Johnson has moved over to safety from corner, where he recovered a fumble and returned it for a 64-yard touchdown against Wyoming. After picking up five sacks last year, Jorgensen is now the MWC's all-time career sack leader with 22.5.

Their accomplishments extend off the field as well, with Pitta, Bauman, Johnson and Jorgensen earning Academic All-MWC honors last year. Both Bauman and Johnson were named to the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District team, with Bauman going on to earn Academic All-America honors.

HOME WIN STREAK SNAPPED

BYU's 54-28 loss to Florida State on Sept. 19, 2009 snapped an 18-game BYU win streak at home in LaVell Edwards Stadium—a program record spanning 2006-08. The Cougars had not lost in Edwards Stadium since a 41-34 overtime thriller to Utah on November 19, 2005. Dating back to September 9, 2006 the Cougars beat their opponents by an average of 27.8 points per game and allowed just 11.3 points per game. The Cougars won 17 consecutive home games 16 seasons ago from Oct. 7, 1989 to Nov. 23, 1991. Since the stadium was built in 1964, BYU has gone undefeated at home 15 times:

The 64,091 fans in attendance for the Cougars' 42-23 win over CSU marked the 14th consecutive sell-out at Edwards Stadium. The current streak marks the longest streak of consecutive sellouts since the 1990-92 seasons. In two games this season BYU is averaging 64,150 fans per game. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance-231 short of a sellout.

DOUBLE THREAT

Junior running back Harvey Unga needs only 32 more receiving yards to become one of only nine Cougars to record over 1,000 career yards through the air and on the ground. Unga currently has 969 yards receiving and 2,385 yards rushing.

Other Cougars who accomplished this feat are Curtis Brown, Jamal Willis, Lakei Heimuli, Luke Staley, Hema Heimuli, Todd Christensen. Scott Phillips and Fred Whittingham.

TALE OF THE TAPE BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh

in at an average 317 pounds and average 6-feet-4. The front five will be going up against a Utah State defensive front that measures an average 6-feet-2, 249 pounds. Defensively, the Cougars front three average 6-feet-3, 262 pounds, while the USU offensive line tips the scales at an average 6-feet-3, 294 pounds per man.

CONSECUTIVE CATCHES

All-American tight end Dennis Pitta caught his first pass of the Colorado State game with 52-seconds remaining in the first guarter for a 13-yard gain. The senior has caught a pass in 34 consecutive games dating back to Oct. 23, 2004 (at Air Force), prior to his mission.

UNGA IS BACK

Junior running back Harvey Unga scored his third touchdown of the day with 7:04 remaining in the game against CSU, capping a 16-play drive and giving BYU a 35-17 lead after the made PAT. His first two rushing touchdowns came in the first quarter. Three rushing touchdowns tie a career-high for Unga, a mark he also reached in BYU's 43-27 win at San Diego State in 2007.

With a 4-yard carry on BYU's final possession of the game, Unga surpassed the 100-yard rushing mark for the first time this season and the first time since the Cougars' 48-24 loss to Utah on Nov. 22, 2008.

After suffering a hamstring injury during fall camp, Unga did not play in BYU's win over Oklahoma and saw limited action against Tulane. This was his first rushing touchdown since the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl against Arizona.

HE WHO SCORES FIRST ...

BYU was the first to score last week on a 4-yard touchdown run by Harvey Unga with 12:44 remaining in the first quarter. BYU has been the first to score in two games this season, the other being Tulane. The Cougars are 2-0 in those two dames.

PITTA SCORES SIX

In the CSU game senior tight end Dennis Pitta recorded an 18-vard touchdown reception with 6:56 remaining in the third quarter, marking his first receiving touchdown of the season and 14th of his career. Pitta last scored a touchdown in BYU's 45-42 win at CSU on Nov. 11, 2008.

SURPASSING HUDSON With his five catches against CSU, All-American tight end Dennis Pitta passed Hall of Fame tight end Gordon Hudson to become BYU's career receptions leader among tight ends. Hudson had 178 receptions during the 1981-83 seasons. Pitta now has 180 career catches. He equaled Hudson on a 13-yard catch on third down during BYU's second possession of the third quarter and then set the new mark two plays later on a 14-yard reception to the CSU 29-yard line. The drive ended with Pitta catching an 18-yard touchdown for his fourth catch of the drive, fifth of the game and 180th of his career.

RUSHING SCORES

The Cougars offense recorded three rushing touchdowns in the first quarter against CSU, two from Unga and one by Hall. The last time BYU scored three touchdowns on the ground in a single quarter was on Oct. 29, 2005 in a 62-41 win over Air Force. Running back Curtis Brown found the endzone three times in the fourth quarter of that game.

Last week also marked the second time this season the Cougars have scored four rushing touchdowns in a game. JJ DiLuigi, Riley Nelson and Bryan Kariya recorded running scores in BYU's 54-3 win over Tulane on Sept. 12.

Fellow lineman Vic So'oto picked up his first career sack about a minute later, while senior linebacker Coleby Clawson recorded his first sack of the season on CSU's first drive of the second half.

Collectively the Cougars have recorded five sacks in their first four games this season.

Junior defensive lineman Jan Jorgensen's sack against CSU's Billy Farris in 2008 gave him 21.5 career sacks, breaking the previous MWC record of 20.5 he shared with New Mexico's Michael Tuohy, TCU's Chase Ortiz and former Cougar Brady Poppinga. Jorgensen added a second sack and forced a fumble with just 22 seconds remaining to help secure the win and bring his career sack total to 22.5. He recorded four sacks his freshman season in 2006, 13.5 his sophomore season and five in 2008.

QUARTER REPORT

The BYU defense has held its opponents scoreless in a total of five quarters this season. The Cougars held the Tulane Green Wave scoreless in that game's final three quarters after keeping the Oklahoma Sooners off the board during the third guarter in the season opener. CSU's offense was unable to score in the first guarter last week.

The junior college transfer recorded a 20-yard return, setting the BYU offense up on the Rams' 15-yard line. Harvey Unga ran in a 4-yard touchdown two plays later.

With 3:41 remaining in the first quarter, a hard hit by Logan jarred the ball loose, getting picked off by junior defensive back Andrew Rich. The interception set up a 1-yard touchdown run by guarterback Max Hall as the Cougars went up 14-0.

The Cougar defense has now snagged four interceptions through their first four games.



SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

NO PUNTS

Freshman Riley Stephenson did not punt the entire Tulane game, marking the first time that has happened to BYU since a 56-34 win over Colorado State on Nov. 1, 2001.

He also did not punt during the first half of the Florida State game. Stephenson's first and only punt of the game came early in the third quarter.

PAYNE PUTTING UP POINTS

Junior kicker Mitch Payne scored 12 points in BYU's 54-3 win over Tulane. He made two field goals from 31 and 20 yards, respectively. He also converted PAT's on six of the Cougars' seven touchdowns.

A BYU COACHING FIRST

With a 21-3 win over New Mexico on Oct. 11, 2008, the Cougars picked up their sixth win of the season, qualifying for their fourth straight bowl game. BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall became the first coach in BYU history to qualify for four straight bowl games in his first four years. Mendenhall currently ranks second behind LaVell Edwards with the most postseason appearances in BYU football history.

BRONCO MENDENHALL

FIFTH SEASON

During his four seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that had not enjoyed a winning season since 2001, Mendenhall has guided his teams to four straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and consistent national top-25 rankings.

After a 6-6 season in 2005, Mendenhall's Cougars have earned a 32-7 record over the past three seasons, including two Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl victories in 2006 and 2007. Only five teams in the last three years have won more games than BYU. Boasting a 38-13 overall record, Mendenhall has coached his team to 20 wins in the last 23 games to help the Cougars become one of only nine teams to be ranked in the final BCS standings in each of the last three seasons.

In his first season, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5 regular-season record and earned an invitation to the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl -- the team's first postseason bowl appearance in three seasons. Over the next two seasons, he coached the Cougars to back-to-back 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents.

In 2008, BYU posted a 10-2 regular season to achieve three straight 10-win seasons for only the third time in school history. In doing so, Mendenhall's teams became the first in Cougar history to go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons. While defending its home turf in 2008, BYU produced many memorable moments, including a 59-0 win over 2007 Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl opponent UCLA.

The Cougars have received four straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first four teams to a bowl game. In fact, with BYUs invitation to attend the 2007 Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl, Mendenhall became the first coach in BYU football history to take a team to a bowl game in three straight seasons during his first three years as a head coach.

On November 17, 2007, Mendenhall led the Cougars to a 35-10 victory over Wyoming to record his 25th career win. With the victory, Mendenhall became the only coach in BYU football history to win 25 games in his first 35 attempts.

Building on the success of his first-ever season as a head coach in 2005, Mendenhall and the Cougars posted an 11-2 record in 2006, winning the outright Mountain West Conference Championship with a perfect 8-0 record. As a result, BYU returned to the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl to represent the MWC. In dominating fashion, and with a swagger similar to that of the glory years of BYU football, the Cougars handed Oregon a 38-8 defeat in the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

The 2007 season started out in similar fashion, winning just one of the team's first three games; however, under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars rebounded to win the final 10 games of the season, and like the previous year, garnered the attention of local, regional and national voters. BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll, marking the highest finish for the Cougars since finishing No. 5 following the 1996 season.

During the regular season, the Cougars did not allow a single 100-yard rusher. One of Mendenhall's jobs as the head coach and defensive coordinator is to manage points. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

In 2008, BYU earned a spot in the national polls each week of the season, including a ranking as high as No. 7. With just two regular-season blemishes on its resume with road losses at No. 6 Utah and No. 11 TCU, BYU earned a No. 16 ranking in the final BCS standings and an invitation to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl. Off the field, only Penn State (4) placed more student-athletes on the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America First Team than BYU in 2008. Cougar starters David Oswald (offensive tackle), Matt Bauman (linebacker) and Kellen Fowler (safety) each earned the high honor as BYU had three first-teamers for the first time during the same season.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple has three sons.

OTHER PLAYERS TO WATCH...

LUKE ASHWORTH-WR

Ashworth caught three passes for a careerhigh 49 yard against Tulane, including a long pass for 30 yards. After returning home from an LDS mission in 2007, Ashworth saw action in all 13 games in 2008, including four starts. He caught three passes for 49 yards, averaging 16.3 yards per reception.

BRANDON BRADLEY-DB

After three games Bradley currently leads the team in tackles with 20, including 18 solo. As a sophomore he earned letterman honors in 2008, seeing action in 12 games for the Cougars, including three starts at corner. He totaled 40 tackles on the season, including 33 solo takedowns, recorded three pass breakups and returned a fumble for a 38-yard touchdown in the game at Utah State.

O'NEILL CHAMBERS-WR

As a true freshman in 2008, Chambers saw action in all 13 games for the Cougars, including his first career start in the game against Utah State. As BYU's primary kick returner, he returned 35 kicks for 809 yards, averaging 23.1 yards per return. His 35 kick returns in 2008 set a BYU and MWC record for most kickoff returns in a season. So far this season he is averaging 11.9 yards per reception.

COLEBY CLAWSON-LB

After transferring from Snow College, Clawson saw action in all 13 games for the Cougars in 2008, including 11 starts at outside linebacker. He totaled 55 tackles on the season, including 25 solo takedowns and led the team with 11.5 tackles for loss. He also led the team with three forced fumbles, including two against Utah State and one in the season opener against Northern Iowa.

BRETT DENNEY-DL

The third Denney brother to play for the Cougars, he recovered a fumble in BYU's upset victory over Oklahoma. Over the past three seasons Denney has totaled 78 total tackles and 5.5 sacks. He led the 2008 Cougars with three fumble recoveries, including recoveries against Northern Iowa, UCLA and SDSU.

JJ DI LUIGI-RB

Di Luigi recorded his first touchdown in a BYU uniform during the third quarter of the Tulane game, and soon added a second score to start the fourth quarter. During that game he ran for a team-high 71 yards. Di Luigi earned letterman honors as a redshirt freshman last year. A main contributor on special teams, he also gained 48 yards rushing on 13 carries.

OTHER PLAYERS TO WATCH...

ANDREW GEORGE-TE

The other half of what might be the best tight end tandem in the country, George returns for his senior year after scoring six touchdowns in 2008. He picked up his first in 2009 during BYU's upset win over No. 3 Oklahoma in its season opener. Earning three starts last season, he set season highs with five receptions for 62 yards against Air Force and caught two touchdown passes in BYU's win over New Mexico. He has seen action in 36 games over the past three seasons.

TERRANCE HOOKS-LB

Hooks started his senior season with a sack against Oklahoma's Landry Jones in BYU's season opener and later earned his first career start against CSU. He saw action in five games in 2008 after returning from a knee injury suffered during spring ball. He competed in 12 games in 2007, recording a season-high five tackles against Eastern Washington.

MCKAY JACOBSON-WR

Jacobson started the 2009 season with a fourth quarter touchdown reception to secure BYU's 14-13 upset win over No. 3 Oklahoma. He has continued to be a favorite target of Hall's, catching a touchdown pass in the first three games this year. Before his LDS mission to Japan, Jacobson totaled 28 receptions for 547 yards in 2006. His first-ever punt return went for a 77-yard touchdown, marking BYU's first punt return for a touchdown in 113 games.
