No. 21 Cougars Prepare To Wrap Up Home Season

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 7, 2006) – In what will be the final two home matches of the season, the No. 21 BYU women's volleyball team (20-4, 10-3 MWC) will host Nevada on Thursday night at 5 p.m. before taking on Wyoming Saturday at 7 p.m. in the Smith Fieldhouse. The Cougars' match against the Cowgirls will also be Senior Night as BYU honors its two outgoing seniors.

"Our goal is always to end better than we start, and this weekend will be a great chance for us to make that happen as we approach the end of the regular season," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "There are still a lot of things to be decided both in the conference race and with respect to the NCAA Tournament. We plan on being heavily involved in both discussions and need to play well this weekend in order to do that."

BYU's Senior Night celebration will pay tribute to the outstanding careers to two Cougar greats - Lindsay Hartsock and Kim Sorensen. Hartsock, a 2005 All-American, is a three-time All-Mountain West Conference selection in addition to receiving 2003 Freshman of the Year and 2005 Player of the Year honors. She is on pace to finish fourth all-time at BYU in career blocks, career block assists and career block average. The 2004 Collegiate Volleyball Update Magazine Blocker of the Year is third all-time in season blocks per game (1.86 in 2004) and season hitting percentage (.444 in 2005). Sorensen, a 2004 All-MWC selection, has been named to multiple all-tournament teams during her BYU career and has ranked in the top 10 in the MWC statistical categories several times.

Both seniors, who represent the first class Coach Watson has ever coached throughout their college careers, will be honored prior to the match.

"Our senior class has certainly risen to the challenge to end better than we start," said Watson. "They will always be special to me. We began our careers together at BYU. It has passed by too quickly. I am honored to have been a part of their athletic careers and look forward to watching them continue to push our team to a great finish."

LOOKING AT NEVADA

The Wolfpack is 15-10 this season and 9-4 in the WAC, including a sweep of BYU-opponent Utah State and a three-game loss at UNLV. Nevada is led by junior Teal Ericson with 4.13 kills per game. Junior middle blocker Karly Sipherd is second on the team averaging 2.83 kpg while senior outside hitter Carly Sorensen is third at 2.59 kpg. Sorensen is also second on the team in digs per game at 2.70 as sophomore libero Allison Hernandez paces the Wolfpack with 2.96 dpg. Sipherd leads the Nevada block with 1.30 bpg and hits a team-leading .285. As a team, the Wolfpack hit .192 while allowing opponents a .203 mark.

LOOKING AT WYOMING

The Cowgirls are 11-12 overall and 5-7 so far in Mountain West Conference play including a five-game loss at BYU earlier this season. Junior Rachel Smith leads the team and is sixth in the conference in kills per game with 3.65 followed by freshman Annie Meyers at 3.05 kpg. Freshman libero Micah Lines ranks sixth in the league putting up 3.77 digs per game. Senior Andrea Seele leads the Cowgirl block with 1.05 per game. As a team, Wyoming hits .189 while allowing opponents a .210 efficiency. The Cowgirls are third in the league in digs with 16.13 per game.

Record-Blocking Seals BYU Win

LARAMIE, Wyo. (Oct. 12, 2006) – Less than one week after an incredible fifth-game comeback win against TCU, the No. 19 Cougars once again won in dramatic fashion as BYU defeated Wyoming in a five-game thriller (27-30, 30-18, 30-24, 23-30, 15-11) Thursday night in Laramie.

While the sport of volleyball is typically thought to be defined by kills and hitting percentage, it was the Cougar block that sealed the BYU victory over Wyoming as the Cougars set a BYU record for block assists in a match with 61 and posted the second-most total blocks in Cougar volleyball history with 30.5. Both are MWC records.

“We struggled at time offensively so it was nice that our defensive systems certainly turned things around for us,” said Watson. “We were able to get on some tendencies and maintain some pressure on them. In game five when we needed it, the block was huge for us. It’s been a system we’ve been looking to upgrade, and I think we did a wonderful job on that this evening.”

While the BYU block was definitely a sight to behold, the Cougar offense was not far behind as two players posted 20 or more kills on the night and one other was just two kills behind. Lott notched her fifth double-double of the season by adding 20 kills to her 14 blocks and was just one dig away from a triple-double with nine. The match was the fourth time this season she has reached the 20-kill mark. Sorensen led the BYU attack with a season-high 22 kills on .396 hitting, while outside hitter Chelsea Goodman posted her MWC-leading 12th double-double with 18 kills and 15 digs. Libero Annie Kemp Pinegar led the Cougars with a career-high 21 digs.

Weekly Notes:**Last Week's Results: Cougars Go 1-1 On The Week**

Despite an impressive performance from outside hitter Chelsea Goodman, the Cougars began the weekend losing to New Mexico for the first time since 1995, falling in four games (29-31, 27-30, 30-21, 23-30) in Albuquerque. Goodman posted her 14th double-double of the season with 22 kills and 11 digs along with Erica Lott (11 kills and 13 digs) and Amy Schlauder, whose 52 assists were complimented by a team- and career-high 17 digs. BYU rebounded the following night with a dominating sweep of TCU, bolstered by 14 kills and 11 digs from Goodman and a match-high 17 digs from Janvier Beaumont. BYU hit .303 in the match while holding TCU to just .034.

Senior Night

Saturday night's match against Wyoming will be more than just BYU's last home contest of the year. It will also be Senior Night for two Cougars - Lindsay Hartsock and Kim Sorensen. Hartsock, a 2005 All-American, is a three-time All-MWC selection in addition to receiving 2003 Freshman of the Year and 2005 Player of the Year honors. She is on pace to finish fourth all-time at BYU in career blocks, career block assists and career block average. The 2004 *Collegiate Volleyball Update* Magazine Blocker of the Year is third all-time in season blocks per game (1.86 in 2004) and season hitting percentage (.444 in 2005). Sorensen, a 2004 All-MWC selection, has been named to multiple all-tournament teams during her BYU career and has ranked in the top 10 in the MWC statistical categories several times. Both seniors, who represent the first class BYU head coach Jason Watson has ever coached throughout their college careers, will be honored prior to the 7 p.m. match.

Home Sweet Home

BYU is 10-1 this season at home with an attendance average of 2,038, which ranks 11th in the nation. The Cougars began their home season hosting a Cougar women's volleyball record 4,050 fans in their win over No. 4 Stanford. BYU fans broke that record on Sept. 29 as 4,455 Cougar faithful packed the Smith Fieldhouse to see the Cougars take on in-state rival and then-18th-ranked Utah. BYU is now 458-82 (.848) all-time at home and 20-1 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the last two years.

Double the Fun

Chelsea Goodman has recorded an MWC-leading 15 double-doubles on the year out of 22 matches in which she has played, including eight of the last 10. With 31 career double-doubles, Goodman is currently tied for fourth on the MWC's all-time double-double list.

The Nation's Best ...

With a 988-271-5 all-time record in the 37-year recorded history of BYU women's volleyball, the Cougars are one of the best teams in the nation, ranking third in all-time wins as of Oct. 30. UCLA tops the list with 1028 victories while Missouri State is just four wins ahead of BYU at 992. The top ten is rounded out by Nebraska (987), Long Beach St. (966), Penn State (934), Hawai'i (925), Texas (903), Texas-Arlington (892) and Illinois State (868).

A Clean Sweep

BYU is 14-2 this season in three-game matches, with sweeps over Florida International, Central Florida, Stetson, Texas A&M CC, Virginia Commonwealth, Arkansas, Utah State, Air Force, UNLV (2), UVSC, San Diego State, Weber State and TCU. BYU was 12-1 last season in three-game matches, including seven consecutive sweeps and the Cougars' first sweep of Colorado State in Fort Collins, Colo., since 1988.

Pacing The League

Of the seven overall statistical categories tracked by the Mountain West Conference, BYU players lead the league in four of them (hitting percentage - Lindsay Hartsock; kills - Chelsea Goodman; assists - Amy Schlauder; points - Chelsea Goodman) and are second in one other (blocks - Lindsay Hartsock). Goodman is also ranked fifth in aces. BYU packs one-two punches in the hitting percentage category as Hartsock and Rachel Dyer rank first and second, respectively.

Back In Business

The return of starting middle blocker Rachel Dyer to the line up against Weber State after missing two weeks with a foot injury marked the first time in 14 matches that the Cougars have had the services of their entire starting rotation. Starting setter Amy Schlauder missed eight matches with a broken finger suffered on Sept. 7 while starting rightside hitter Erica Lott missed two matches (Sept. 29 against Utah and Oct. 3 at UVSC) with a back injury. Dyer injured her foot the day before Lott and Schlauder returned to the starting line up on Oct. 6.

BYU In the Polls

With a 20-4 record this season, including a win over then-No. 4 Stanford, the Cougars are ranked No. 21 in the CSTV/AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll this week. BYU was listed No. 26 in the nation in the preseason poll, exactly where the team finished in last season's final poll.

Wedding Bells

Kim Wilson Sorensen is sporting a new last name after marrying Trent Sorensen on Sept. 25. The senior outside hitter for the BYU women's volleyball team and the junior middle blocker for the BYU men's volleyball team are the third pair of Cougar volleyballers to find marital bliss in the last 18 months, joining Lauren (Richards) and Taylor Evans and Lexi (Brown) and Casey Patterson from last year's squad. Wilson Sorensen is one of three married athletes on the team this season including Annie Kemp Pinegar and Lindsay Hartsock.

Blocking Machines

While the sport of volleyball is typically thought to be defined by kills and hitting percentage, it was the Cougar block that sealed the BYU victory over Wyoming on Oct. 12 as the Cougars set a BYU and Mountain West Conference record for block assists in a match with 61 and posted another league record as well as totaling the second-most total blocks in Cougar volleyball history with 30.5. In an impressive display of blocking prowess, three players posted double-digit blocks in the win as middle blocker Lindsay Hartsock and rightside hitter Erica Lott each posted 14 and middle blocker Ashton Hansen, just a red-shirt freshman, notched 12. Hartsock and Lott's numbers tied the conference record for block assists in a match (14) set by Cougar Lindsey Metcalf in 2002. Outside hitter Kim Wilson Sorensen was just one away from double figures with nine rejections while setter Amy Schlauder added seven. All five players set career blocking marks on the night.

MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars have a 75-25 regular season record in seven years of MWC play after winning the 2005 regular-season title with a 14-2 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and finished second in 2000 with a 12-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. The 2006 MWC Tournament will be held Nov. 22-25 in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2005, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Utah (automatic) and Colorado State (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 22 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 17, SDSU with 13, Utah with eight, New Mexico with seven and Wyoming with four.

In 2005, BYU was ranked as high as No. 12 in the CSTV/USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll while Utah finished the season ranked tied for 25th.

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .814.

No. 18 BYU Falls at New Mexico

ALBUQUERQUE (Nov. 3, 2006) -- Despite an outstanding night from outside hitter Chelsea Goodman, the No. 18 BYU women's volleyball team fell to New Mexico Friday night, 29-31, 27-30, 30-21, 30-23 in Albuquerque. The loss is just the fourth of the year for the Cougars, who fall to 19-4 overall and 9-3 in the Mountain West Conference.

"Tonight was a disappointing result," BYU coach Jason Watson said. "Our resolve now is to prepare to play a TCU team on the road that is every bit as challenging as New Mexico." BYU will play at TCU Saturday night at 7 p.m. CT.

Goodman recorded her MWC-leading 14th double-double of the year in the match with 22 kills and 11 digs while setter Amy Schlauder posted the second of her career with 52 assists and a career- and team-high 17 digs. Two other Cougars reached double-digit digs as Annie Pinegar posted 15 and Erica Lott recorded 13. Lott also notched 11 kills while Lindsay Hartssock tallied 10 and led BYU with five blocks.

New Mexico jumped out to an early 5-2 lead in game one before a dump from Cougar setter Amy Schlauder generated some BYU momentum and got the offense going. However, after taking their first lead of the game at 9-8, the Cougars allowed the Lobos to go on a 10-3 run to take an 18-12 advantage. BYU responded with a 7-2 scoring spree of its own thanks in part to three kills from Erica Lott to get back to within two points. The two teams traded scores from there as BYU continued fighting to retake the lead but could never quite get there, finally falling 31-29 despite seven kills from Goodman.

No. 18 Cougars Dominate TCU

FORT WORTH, Tex. (Nov. 4, 2006) -- The No. 18 BYU women's volleyball team made short work of the TCU Horned Frogs Saturday night, winning 30-22, 30-25, 30-20 in Fort Worth. With their 14th sweep of the season, the Cougars improved to 20-4 overall and 10-3 in the Mountain West Conference.

"I'm very happy that we were able to rebound and find our identity again," said BYU head coach Jason Watson, whose team suffered just its fourth loss of the season at New Mexico Friday night. "We progressed throughout the match and stayed composed. This was exactly the kind of performance we needed to feel good about the push we need to make to the postseason in the month of November."

Chelsea Goodman posted her 15th double-double of the year, which leads the MWC, with 14 kills and 11 digs, while Rachel Dyer also posted double-digit kills with 10 and Janvier Beaumont led BYU in digs with 17. The Cougars posted 12.5 team blocks in the three-game match, paced by five each from Dyer and Lindsay Hartssock. As a team, BYU hit .303 while allowing TCU just a .034 mark.

The Cougars got off to a quick start in game one, jumping out to an early 6-1 lead on the strength of two blocks and Goodman's serve. The Horned Frogs stormed back to make it 8-7 but BYU denied TCU the chance to tie things up, instead putting together an 8-2 spurt to go up 16-9. The Horned Frogs tried again with four straight points to get to within three, but the Cougars reeled off seven scores of their own to take a commanding 24-14 lead on the way to a 30-22 win. BYU hit a blistering .471 in the game with 17 kills and only one error combined to go along with six team blocks.

JASON WATSON HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the program.

He was selected as the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He came back to BYU in 2002 as the assistant head coach of the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001, and an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in five of the last seven seasons. In addition to his 25-4 (.862) head-coaching record, Watson's teams have compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson becomes only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnne Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

Coaching Career

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1998. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best start in school history.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game. BYU also finished among the top four teams in the conference in four other statistical categories, including assists (14.60, second), opponent hitting percentage (.165, second), blocks (2.70, third) and digs (14.26, fourth).



In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartscock led the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both were named AVCA Honorable Mention All-Americans.

In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the Mountain West Conference and were fifth and 13th in the nation in blocks per game in 2004 and 2003, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the

Cougars had put up since 1997. BYU's Lindsay Hartscock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by College Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation, averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable mention All-America recognition, as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No.3 in school history) and a .245

team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts.

Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.
