#### FALCON-COUGAR MATCHUP IN PROVO

No. 22 BYU (8-2, 5-1 MWC) hosts Air Force (7-4, 5-2) in the first of two final regularseason games on Saturday at LaVell Edwards Stadium. The game will be broadcast live on CBS College Sports.

The Cougars are coming off a hard-fought 24-19 victory over the New Mexico Lobos last week, securing an undefeated road record for the first time since the 1984 national championship season.

Air Force comes to town for its final game of the regular season, coming off a 45-17 win over UNLV. The Falcons ran for a total of 431 yards against the Rebels, contributing to 557 total offensive yards.

#### ON THE TUBE



Saturday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on CBS-College Sports. Tom Hart will call the action and Aaron Taylor will lend analysis. The game will mark the first of two BYU games available on CBS-C during the 2009 season. The Utah game next week will be simulcast on CBS-C and The Mtn.

#### WHAT THE GAME MEANS

- A victory on Saturday would give quarterback Max Hall a total of 30 career wins, surpassing Heisman Trophy winner Ty Detmer's 29 wins and setting a new BYU record.
- Since Bronco Mendenhall took over the program in 2005, BYU has earned 9-2 records or better (through 11 games) in three straight seasons. Defeating Air Force would give the Cougars another 9-2 season record, marking the 17th time in program history and extending the current streak to four. Never before has a BYU coached led his team to four consecutive 9-2 records.
- Junior running back Harvey Unga needs just 21 yards and four carries to surpass Curtis Brown (2002, 04-06) as BYU's all-time leading rusher in yards and attempts.

#### THE BYU-AIR FORCE SERIES



The Cougars hold an all-time record of 23-6 against the Falcons, most recently claiming a 38-26 victory at Falcon Stadium in 2008. Beginning with the first time the two teams played in 1956, BYU won 16 out of its first 17 match-ups against Air Force. The Cougars won 12 in a row from 1983-94 but have gone just 7-5 against the Falcons since the 1995 season. BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall is 4-0 all-time against Air Force, winning those games by an average of 19 points per game. The Cougars last lost a

game home game to the Falcons back in 2003.

#### LAST TIME: BYU 38, AIR FORCE 26 (NOV. 15, 2008)

USAFA, Colo. (Nov. 15, 2008) – All-America candidate Austin Collie continued his record-setting pace with 130 receiving yards and two touchdowns while quarterback Max Hall threw for 354 yards to lead No. 14 BYU to a 38-24 win at Air Force on Saturday. With the victory the Cougars have achieved 10 wins for the third straight season. BYU improves to 10-1 overall and 6-1 in the Mountain West Conference while the Falcons fall to 8-3 and 5-2.

Collie, one of 10 receivers selected as a Biletnikoff Award finalist, totaled more than 100 receiving yards for the ninth straight game to extend his MWC record while setting the new conference mark for total 100-yard games overall at nine. With 1.315 receiving yards on the season. Collie is now BYU's all-time single-season leader.

Collie was joined by tight end Dennis Pitta, who caught nine balls for 113 yards as the Cougars rolled up 354 passing yards among 480 yards of total offense. Air Force gained 323 yards on the ground and totaled 421 yards overall in the competitive contest.

Nixon led BYU in tackles with 10 while David Tafuna and Matt Ah You added nine apiece. Brandon Howard added an interception for the Cougars.

#### AIR FORCE'S LAST OUTING

AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. (Nov. 14, 2009)—Asher Clark ran for career highs of three touchdowns and 160 yards and Air Force totaled 431 yards on the ground Saturday in a 45-17 romp over UNLV. Clark scored on runs of 40, 24 and 2 yards. He had his first 100-yard game of the season and surpassed his career best of 131 yards.

Jared Tew, Savier Stephens and Nathan Walker also ran for touchdowns. Air Force (7-4, 5-2 Mountain West) won its third in a row. Tim Jefferson threw for 126 yards and ran for another 63 yards.

The game matched the Air Force, the nation's fourth-best rushing offense, against a team that ranked 111th of 120 FBS teams against the run.

#### BYU'S LAST OUTING



ALBUQUERQUE (Nov. 14, 2009) — Max Hall tied Tv Detmer for the most career wins by a BYU quarterback as the No. 22 Cougars improved to 8-2 for the fourth straight season with a 24-19 road victory at New Mexico on Saturday.

Hall passed for more than 300 yards for the seventh time in 10 outings this year, totaling 314 yards and two touchdowns while guiding BYU to its 29th win with Hall behind center. Having previously passed

the other great quarterbacks in BYU's storied history in total wins, Hall now has the chance to make the mark his own when BYU faces Air Force next Saturday in LaVell Edwards Stadium.

Hall's achievement was not the only all-time standard set on the day. With the win, the Cougars have achieved an 8-2 or better record four straight years for the first time in program history. Three other times the Cougars put together a string of three consecutive 8-2 starts, the most recent being in the Detmer era from 1988-90. BYU teams also accomplished the feat from 1979-81 and from 1983-85.

Saturday's game in Albuquerque proved to be a hard-fought contest down to the wire with a few unique twists along the way. The first of the twists started Friday night when Cougar tight end Andrew George returned to Provo to witness the birth of his first child and then caught an early flight back in time to not only play in the game but also make a touchdown reception.

On the Lobo side of the ball, New Mexico kicker James Aho had the unique distinction of hitting the goal post upright with three consecutive attempts—none of which fell on the Lobo side of the cross bar.

#### 2009 BROADCAST PLANS

All 12 of BYU's games this season will be broadcasted to a national audience on ESPN, ESPN2, The Mtn., VERSUS and CBS College Sports Network. The season opener against Oklahoma was shown on ESPN, while ESPN2 covered the Tulane game the following week. The Cougars will have seven games televised on The Mtn., including a simulcast of the season ender against the University of Utah with CBS-C. Direct TV launched The Mtn. nationally on Aug. 27, 2008, giving fans from across the country ultimate access to Mountain West Conference sports. VERSUS carried the Florida State and TCU games, while CBS-C will televise the Air Force and Utah games.

### COMPETING AS A RANKED TEAM

With the New Mexico win the Cougars improve to 156-46 when nationally ranked in the Top 25. A ranked BYU team has won 25 of its last 30 games dating back to 2006.

#### **COIN TOSS**

New Mexico won the coin toss last week and elected to receive, marking only the fourth time this season the Cougars have not won the toss. BYU is now 4-0 when losing the toss.

#### PERFECT ON THE ROAD

With the win at University Stadium against New Mexico, BYU secured an undefeated 6-0 road record for the first time since 1984.

Defeating New Mexico also gave the Cougars a perfect 4-0 road record against MWC opponents for the fifth time since the inception of the league. BYU also went undefeated in MWC road games in 2001, 2006 and 2007.

#### ENDING AN 18-YEAR DROUGHT

Before securing a 14-13 win over No. 3
Oklahoma on Sept. 5, the last time BYU beat a nonconference team ranked in the Top 10 was its 28-21 win over No. 1 Miami on Sept. 8, 1990. The win over the Sooners gave the Cougars their first win over a ranked nonconference opponent since it defeated No. 14
Arizona State, 26-6, on Sept. 12, 1998. Since that day, BYU lost 12 consecutive games to ranked nonconference opponents. The last time BYU beat a ranked nonconference opponent on a neutral field was the Cotton Bowl game of Jan. 1, 1997, when BYU beat No. 14
Kansas State, 19-15.

#### **TEAM CAPTAINS**

Offensive seniors Max Hall and Dennis Pitta, along with defensive seniors Matt Bauman, Scott Johnson and Jan Jorgensen, have been selected by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2009 football season.

Collectively the captains have 151 starts, with Hall, Bauman and Jorgensen starting each game last season.

#### PULLING OUT THE CLOSE ONES

After a close 24-19 victory over the Lobos last week the Cougars have won 10 consecutive games decided by seven points or fewer. BYU pulled out a narrow 14-13 win against No. 3 Oklahoma in its season opener.

#### MENDENHALL TEAMS VERSUS RANKED FOES

Under Bronco Mendenhall, BYU is now 2-7 vs. ranked foes, with its wins being a 31-17 victory over No. 15 TCU on Sept. 28, 2006 and a 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Sept. 5, 2009.

#### DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 40-4 when leading at halftime and 38-1 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter.

Mendenhall's teams have won 26 straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 73 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987 when it lost, 29-27, in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

#### 8-2 THROUGH 10 GAMES

With the win last week, the Cougars have an 8-2 record or better through their first 10 games for the 21st time in program history. BYU has now achieved 8-2 records in a program-best four consecutive seasons (2006-09). The team reached three straight 8-2 records or better three times previously—1979-81, 1983-95 and 1988-90.

#### FLAG BEARER



BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition—an alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Their signatures reflect their commitment to uphold the tradition, spirit and honor of the BYU football program and to be a flag

bearer of the University. As part of the 25-year anniversary celebration of BYU's national championship, each alumni chosen to carry out the flag this year will be a member of the 1984 team.

## THREE COUGARS NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

ESPN the Magazine announced its Academic All-District Football Teams, a list that included three seniors on the BYU football team. Linebacker Matt Bauman, defensive lineman Brett Denney and defensive back Scott Johnson were all voted to the District 8 First Team and are now eligible for Academic All-America consideration.

Both Bauman and Johnson received district honors in 2008, with Bauman going on to earn Academic All-America distinction.

Majoring in finance, Bauman has a 3.91 GPA, the second-highest on the team. A team captain, he has started seven of BYU's eight games this season after starting all 13 in 2008. The native of Salt Lake City is a three-time Academic All-Mountain West Conference selection and a two-time MWC Scholar Athlete. Bauman plans to attend business school following graduation and has already been named a 2009 National Scholar Athlete by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame.

Also majoring in finance, Denney is in his final semester as an undergraduate. A native of Thornton, Colo., he has been named to the Academic All-MWC team and a MWC Scholar Athlete the past three years. In his third season starting for the Cougars, Denney currently has two sacks on the season along with a fumble recovery he recorded in BYU's 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma.

Johnson, an exercise science major, has started seven games this season to go along with the nine he started in 2008. A three-time Academic All-MWC selection and two-time MWC Scholar Athlete, he plans to attend medical school following graduation. Johnson leads the team with three interceptions, including two in the Cougars' 59-21 win over UNLV. He is currently second on the team with 42 tackles, 31 of those solo takedowns.

BYU's three honored players is second-most in District 8, behind only Fresno State's five.

#### **CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...**

There are 45 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 18 different countries, including Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Ghana, Japan, Korea, Madagascar, Marshall Islands, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Phillipines, Puerto Rico, Russia, South Africa and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of eight different foreign languages, including Filipino, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish.

#### SERVED MISSIONS...

The September issue of ESPN the Magazine featured a story on sophomore defensive lineman, Romney Fuga, one of the 60 players on the team roster who has served a church mission (57-percent). Fuga recently returned home from a mission to Madagascar.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 23 different countries around the world, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, England, Germany, Honduras, Italy, Japan, Madagascar, Mozambique, New Zealand, Phillipines, Puerto Rico, Samoa, Spain, Taiwan, United States and Uruguay. Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 15 different states, including California, Colorado, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, New Mexico, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas. Current members of the BYU football team who have previously

served church missions speak a total of nine different foreign languages, including Filipino, German, Italian, Japanese, Malagasy, Mandarin, Portuguese, Samoan and Spanish.

#### WHAT IS A MISSION, YOU ASK?

The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. "Mormon" missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities. More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world. Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language. Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 17 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Guatemala, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, Spain and South Korea. A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m. In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize. Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services. Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. ### LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

#### "FAN"TASTIC FANS

The 64,601 fans in attendance for the Cougars' 38-7 loss to TCU marked the 16th consecutive sell-out at LaVell Edwards Stadium. The current streak marks the longest streak of consecutive sellouts since the 1990-92 seasons. In three games this season BYU is averaging 64,251 fans per game. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

#### TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWD

The crowd of 64,601 at the TCU game marked the third-highest since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. It ranks in behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game.

#### TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh in at an average 317 pounds and average 6-feet-4. The front five will be going up against an Air Force defensive front that measures an average 6-feet-3, 266 pounds. Defensively, the Cougars front three average 6-feet-3, 262 pounds, while the Falcon offensive line tips the scales at an average 6-feet-5, 311 pounds per man.

#### T-BIRDS CONTRIBUTE



BYU's 2005 recruiting class boasted four Timpview HS (Provo, Utah) graduates, three of which are current starters on the BYU offense-

-wide receiver Luke Ashworth, offensive lineman Matt Reynolds and running back Harvey Unga. Reserve wide receiver Stephen Covey was the fourth T-Bird to sign that year.

As seniors the foursome led Timpview to the 2004 4-A State Championship and each received numerous all-state and all-region honors.

Ashworth earned his first start of the 2009 season during the Utah State game when he set career highs with five receptions for 91 yards and his first touchdown as a Cougar.

As the only returning starter on BYU's offensive line, Reynolds earned freshman All-America honors in 2008 and continues to provide consistent play at the left tackle spot.

Since earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2007, Unga has recorded back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons and is on pace to break BYU's career rushing record before the end of his junior season.

There is a total of nine Timpview graduates on the current BYU roster.

New Mexico was the first to score last week on a Donovan Porterie 3-yard run with 8:43 remaining in the first quarter. BYU opponents have been the first to score in five games this season, the others being Oklahoma, Florida State, Utah State and TCU. The Cougars are 3-2 in those five games.

#### THIRD-DOWN CONVERSIONS

The Cougars lead the nation in third-down conversion percentage, converting a total of 74-of-127 attempts. In its eight wins this season, the offense converted 62-percent of its third-downs.

#### WELCOME BACK MCKAY

Sophomore wide receiver Mckay Jacobson was back in action against Wyoming after sitting out the previous four games due to a hamstring injury. Jacobson caught his first pass of the game with 12:50 remaining in the first quarter on the Cougars' first drive of the game. His 13-yard reception was for the first-down. He also recorded a 79-yard touch-down reception early in the second quarter to give the Cougars a 24-0 lead. The scoring drive consisted of one play for 79 yards in 12-seconds. Jacobson ended the afternoon with three receptions for 100 yards. He now has two 100-plus yard receiving games, his other being Florida State (111).

#### GEORGE SCORES ONE FOR JACK

Senior tight end Andrew George scored a 27-yard touchdown with 1:56 to play in the first half against New Mexico, extending BYU's lead to 17-7. George's score came less than 24-hours after the birth of his son, Jack Andrew George. Andrew was present with his wife Tawny for Jack's birth at 10:15 p.m. Friday night in Provo, Utah, before catching an early-morning flight to Albuquerque Saturday morning.



# 2009 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

#### DOUBLE THREAT

With his 10-yard reception with 6:35 remaining in the third quarter against SDSU, junior running back Harvey Unga became one of only nine Cougars to record over 1,000 career yards through the air and on the ground. Unga currently has 1,058 yards receiving and 3,201 yards rushing.

Other Cougars who accomplished this feat are Curtis Brown, Jamal Willis, Lakei Heimuli, Luke Staley, Hema Heimuli, Todd Christensen, Scott Phillips and Fred Whittingham.

#### LONGEST RUN IN THREE YEARS

Harvey Unga's 52-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter against UNLV marked the longest BYU run since 2006. As a freshman that year Mike Hague ran for an 87-yard touchdown against UNLV on Oct. 21, 2006 as the Cougars went on to win 52-7.

#### UNGA REACHES 3,000 YARDS

After running for 123 yards against No. 8 TCU, Unga reached the 3,000 career yard mark, making him only the second Cougar to do so. Curtis Brown leads BYU all-time with 3,221 yards on the ground (2002, 2004-06). Unga currently has 3,201 career yards.

#### PUTTING UP POINTS

Junior Harvey Unga scored BYU's first touchdown of the TCU game off a 3-yard reception





#### CONSECUTIVE CATCHES

All-American tight end Dennis Pitta caught his first pass of the New Mexico game with 9:36 remaining in the second quarter for an 18-yard gain. The senior has caught a pass in 40 consecutive games dating back to Oct. 23, 2004 (at Air Force), prior to his mission. Those 40 games extends a BYU program record previously held by Glen Kozlowski with 38.

#### SURPASSING HUDSON

With his 9-yard reception with 4:00 remaining in the second quarter of the SDSU game, Dennis Pitta became BYU's all-time leading tight end,

surpassing Gordan Hudson's 2,484 career receiving yards during the 1981-83 seasons. As a Cougar, Pitta has racked up 2,714 receiving yards.

He also passed Hudson as BYU's career receptions leader among tight ends earlier this season during the CSU game and now has 205 career catches. Those receptions move him into second place in the BYU record books for receivers overall, behind Austin Collie (215).

His 18 career touchdowns also place him second behind Hudson (22) in touchdown receptions by a tight end.

#### FIRST HALF PASSING YARDS

Max Hall's 265 yards passing in the first two quarters of the Wyoming game were more than his game totals in three complete contests this season, including, Colorado State (241), Utah State (218) and TCU (162).

#### HALL TIES DETMER'S WIN RECORD

With the Cougars' 24-19 win over New Mexico, senior quarterback Max Hall now has 29 career wins as the starting play-caller for BYU, tying Heisman Trophy winner Ty Detmer on BYU's all-time list, who racked up 29 wins during his career from 1988-91

#### **SCORING HALL PASSES**

Quarterback Max Hall recorded two touchdown passes against New Mexico, giving him 23 on the year. Those 23 touchdown passes have been to nine different members of the BYU receiving corp. Hall has now thrown a touchdown pass in 33-of-36 career games for a total of 84.

#### 10,000 YARDS PASSING

Hall's 314 yards passing against New Mexico give him 10,662 career passing yards, third-most in BYU program history. The only other two BYU quarterbacks to have ever surpassed the 10,000-yard mark were John Beck (2003-06) with 11,021 and Heisman Trophy winner Ty Detmer (1988-91) with 15,031.

#### REWRITING MWC RECORD BOOK

After throwing four touchdown passes against Wyoming, Hall became the MWC leader in career touchdown passes, surpassing former Cougar John Beck who had 79. Another one of Beck's league record was broken during the Wyoming game—his 17 career 300-yard passing games. Throwing for 312 yard versus the Cowboys, Hall achieved his 18th 300-yard passing game. After the New Mexico game he now has 19 300-yard games and 84 touchdown passes.

#### COMPARED TO THE GREATS...

As he plays through his senior season, quarterback Max Hall is putting up numbers similar to, if not better than, the legendary quarterbacks that came before him.

#### CONSECUTIVE STARTS

The New Mexico game marked senior defensive lineman Jan Jorgensen's 49th straight career start. During that streak, Jorgensen has started every game of his collegiate career and set a new MWC all-time career sack record in 2008 with 22.5. Jorgensen's first career start came against Arizona on Sept. 2, 2006.

#### **FUMBLE RECOVERIES**

Senior linebacker Shawn Doman recovered a Wyoming fumble in the third quarter, forced by defensive back Brandon Bradley. With the BYU offense back on the field, Max Hall led a four-play, 38-yard scoring drive, capped by a 15-yard touchdown pass to JJ DiLuigi to give the Cougars a 45-0 lead.

The Cougars have now recovered six fumbles in 10 games.

#### HOLDING THE SOONERS

When facing an offense that averaged 51.1 points per game in 2008, the Cougar defense successfully held Oklahoma to 13 points. In the first half alone, BYU forced three-and-outs on four of OU's six possessions.

#### **BLOCK PARTY**

Defensive back Andrew Rich kept the Lobos from scoring a late field goal to end the first half last week after blocking a 46-yard attempt. It marks the junior's first career block. As a team, BYU has blocked two kicks this season. The first was a blocked punt by sophomore Matt Marshall in the USU game.

#### PAPER OR PLASTIC?

The Cougar defense recorded a season-high four sacks against New Mexico, the team's most since getting five in a 34-14 win at Utah State in 2008. Linebacker Jordan Pendleton recorded the first two sacks of his career during the UNM game, for losses of seven and 10 yards, respectively. Andrew Rich picked up a sack with 7:00 remaining in the third quarter for a loss of one yard. Defensive lineman Jan Jorgensen and linebacker Coleby Clawson recorded back-to-back sacks as the Lobos attempted a game-winning drive late in the fourth quarter.

Collectively the Cougars have recorded 22 sacks in their 10 games this season.

#### COUGAR PICKS

Defensive back Brian Logan intercepted his third pass of the season with 5:32 remaining in the third quarter against Wyoming. True freshman Craig Bills picked off his second career interception with 2:36 to play in the game for a 24-yard return.

The Cougar defense has snagged 10 interceptions through 10 games.

#### BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS

BYU's 52-0 win over Wyoming marked its second consecutive shutout win against the Cowboys after a 44-0 victory in Provo last season. It also marks the Cougars' first shutout win on the road since a 27-0 win at UNLV in 1999.

Dating back to Harvey Unga's 2-yard touchdown run in BYU's 35-10 win over Wyoming on Nov. 17, 2007, the Cougars have scored 103 unanswered points against the Cowboys. Over the past three meetings, BYU has outscored Wyoming 186-17. Including the last two shutouts, the Cougars defeated the Cowboys 35-10 in 2007 and 55-7 in Provo in 2006.



#### BAUMAN NAMED NFF SCHOLAR ATHLETE

Senior linebacker Matt Bauman was recognized by The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) as they announced the 2009 National Scholar-Athlete class. The 16 members of the class will each receive an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship and vie as finalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy, formally known as the Draddy Trophy.

Student-athletes were selected as the best and the brightest from the college gridiron, from a nationwide pool of 154 semifinalists among all NCAA divisions and the NAIA.

A team captain and a two-year starter at linebacker, Bauman is BYU's fourth NFF National Scholar-Athlete and its first since 2000. Other Cougars who received the honor were Stephen Miller (1976), Steve Young (1983) and Jared Lee (2000).

#### NO PUNTS


Freshman Riley Stephenson did not punt the entire Tulane game, marking the first time that has happened to BYU since a 56-34 win over Colorado State on Nov. 1, 2001.

He also did not punt during the first half of the Florida State game. Stephenson's first and only punt of the game came early in the third quarter.

#### PAYNE PUTTING UP POINTS

Junior kicker Mitch Payne scored 12 points in BYU's 54-3 win over Tulane. He made two field goals from 31 and 20 yards, respectively, and also converted PAT's on six of the Cougars' seven touchdowns.

The junior has converted 47-of-48 PATs on the season and 6-of-9 field goal attempts, giving him a total of 65 points, the most on the team.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9, 2006 when freshman McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards. Thirty-nine games have passed since then.

With a 38-28 win over San Diego State on Oct. 17, 2009, the Cougars picked up their sixth win of the season, qualifying for their fifth straight bowl game. ## 2009 COUGAR FOOTBALL HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



### BRONCO MENDENHALL FIFTH SEASON

During his four seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that had not enjoyed a winning season since 2001, Mendenhall has guided his teams to four straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and consistent national top-25 rankings.

After a 6-6 season in 2005, Mendenhall's Cougars have earned a 32-7 record over the past three seasons, including two Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl victories in 2006 and 2007. Only five teams in the last three years have won more games than BYU. Boasting a 38-13 overall record, Mendenhall has coached his team to 20 wins in the last 23 games to help the Cougars become one of only nine teams to be ranked in the final BCS standings in each of the last three seasons.

In his first season, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5 regular-season record and earned an invitation to the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl -- the team's first postseason bowl appearance in three seasons. Over the next two seasons, he coached the Cougars to back-to-back 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents.

In 2008, BYU posted a 10-2 regular season to achieve three straight 10-win seasons for only the third time in school history. In doing so, Mendenhall's teams became the first in Cougar history to go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons. While defending its home turf in 2008, BYU produced many memorable moments, including a 59-0 win over 2007 Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl opponent UCLA.

Vegas Bowl, Mendenhall became the first coach in BYU football history to take a team to a bowl game in three straight seasons during his first three years as a head coach.

On November 17, 2007, Mendenhall led the Cougars to a 35-10 victory over Wyoming to record his 25th career win. With the victory, Mendenhall became the only coach in BYU football history to win 25 games in his first 35 attempts.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

In 2007, BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll, marking the highest finish for the Cougars since finishing No. 5 following the 1996 season. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

In 2008, BYU earned a spot in the national polls each week of the season, including a ranking as high as No. 7. With just two regular-season blemishes on its resume with road losses at No. 6 Utah and No. 11 TCU, BYU earned a No. 16 ranking in the final BCS standings and an invitation to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl. Off the field, only Penn State (4) placed more student-athletes on the ESPN the Magazine Academic

All-America First Team than BYU in 2008. Cougar starters David Oswald (offensive tackle), Matt Bauman (linebacker) and Kellen Fowler (safety) each earned the high honor as BYU had three first-teamers for the first time during the same season.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship.

That same season, he earned many accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers.

Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple has three sons.

#### OTHER PLAYERS TO WATCH...

#### LUKE ASHWORTH-WR

In his best game as a Cougar, Ashworth caught five passes for a career-high 91 yards and one touchdown against Utah State on Oct. 2, including a long pass for 48 yards. He has started four games this season and is third on the team with 24 receptions for 340 yards. The junior also caught a touchdown pass in BYU's 24-19 win over New Mexico.

#### O'NEILL CHAMBERS-WR/KR/PR

As BYU's primary kick returner in 2008, Chambers returned 35 kicks for 809 yards, averaging 23.1 yards per return. His 35 kick returns set a BYU and MWC record for most kickoff returns in a season. So far this season he is averaging 12.0 yards per reception and had a career-long kickoff return for 97 yards against UNLV.

#### **COLEBY CLAWSON-LB**

Clawson currently leads the team with seven quarterback hurries and 4.5 sacks. After transferring from Snow College, Clawson saw action in all 13 games for the Cougars in 2008, including 11 starts at outside linebacker. He totaled 55 tackles on the season, including 25 solo takedowns and led the team with 11.5 tackles for loss. He also led the team with three forced fumbles, including two against Utah State and one in the season opener against Northern Iowa.

#### **BRETT DENNEY-DL**

The third Denney brother to play for the Cougars, he recovered a fumble in BYU's upset victory over Oklahoma and a sack against TCU's Andy Dalton. In his first three seasons Denney totaled 78 total tackles and 5.5 sacks. He led the 2008 Cougars with three fumble recoveries, including recoveries against Northern Iowa, UCLA and SDSU.

#### JJ DI LUIGI-RB

Di Luigi recorded his first touchdown in a BYU uniform during the third quarter of the Tulane game and soon added a second score to start the fourth quarter. During that game he ran for a team-high 71 yards. He is currently second on the team with seven touchdowns and 220 yards rushing.

### OTHER PLAYERS TO WATCH...

#### ANDREW GEORGE-TE

The other half of what might be the best tight end tandem in the country, George returns for his senior year after scoring six touchdowns in 2008. He picked up his first in 2009 during BYU's upset win over No. 3 Oklahoma in its season opener. He also scored less than 24-hours after the birth of his son Jack, in BYU's 24-19 win at New Mexico.

#### MCKAY JACOBSON-WR

Jacobson started the 2009 season with a fourth quarter touchdown reception to secure BYU's 14-13 upset win over No. 3 Oklahoma. He continued to be a favorite target of Hall's, catching a touchdown in the first three games this year, but suffered a hamstring injury, keeping him on the sideline for four games. Before his LDS mission to Japan, Jacobson totaled 28 receptions for 547 yards in 2006. His first-ever punt return went for a 77-yard touchdown, marking BYU's first punt return for a touchdown in 113 games.

#### SCOTT JOHNSON-DB

A second-year starter, Johnson recorded the first two interceptions of his career in BYU's win over UNLV. He picked up his third the following week against San Diego State. Johnson started the first nine games of the 2008 season, totaling 59 tackles, including 28 solo takedowns. He also recovered a fumble and returned it for a 64-yard touchdown in BYU's shutout win over Wyoming.

#### **BRYAN KARIYA-RB**

Filling in for an injured Harvey Unga, Kariya recorded his second career start in the season opener against No. 3 Oklahoma. He totaled a team-high 42 yards rushing against the Sooners, also adding 76 yards receiving. In the season's second game against Tulane, Kariya's impact continued as he scored two touchdowns, one on the ground and one through the air.

He also saw some playing time in the fourth quarter of the FSU, Utah State, UNLV, TCU and Wyoming games. Nelson has 21 rushing attempts for 126 yards. He transferred from Utah State following his LDS mission to Spain. While at USU he started the final eight games of the 2006 season, completing 55-percent of his passes for 925 yards and six touchdowns.

#### **ANDREW RICH-DB**

After starting three games in 2008, Rich has become a vocal leader for the BYU defense. He was named MWC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in BYU's win over Oklahoma on Sept. 5. During that game he recorded five tackles, including four solo stops, one tackle for loss and two forced fumbles to aid the BYU upset victory. Rich intercepted his first pass of the season against CSU on Sept. 26. He currently leads the team in tackles with 67.

#### MANASE TONGA-RB

After sitting out the 2008 season due to academics, Tonga returns to the Cougar backfield for his senior season. He scored his first receiving touchdown in almost three years during the FSU game. Against Wyoming he helped put 14 points on the board after both a receiving and rushing touchdown.
