## No. 29 BYU Earns Regional Selection

PROVO, Utah (March 31, 2008) -- The BYU Gymnastics team learned of its NCAA Championship Regional berth today when NCAA officials announced the 2008 regional selections.

The Cougar squad will compete in the Northeast Region at Penn State University on Saturday, April 12. The meet will start at 4 p.m. MT.

"We're looking forward to going to Penn State," said BYU Head Coach Brad Cattermole. "We have never been there as a team. It will be a fun adventure."

BYU will face five other squads at the Regionals competition in University Park, Penn. Those teams include No. 1 Georgia, No. 12 Auburn, No. 13 Denver, No. 30 Iowa State and No. 22 Penn State.

This marks BYU's 19th Regional berth under Cattermole's direction. Though competition looks to be tight, Cattermole is looking ahead to prepare his team for the meet.

"We are going to rest up a bit and then train hard," Cattermole said. "Everyone knows what need to be done, and we'll work hard to be as prepared as we can for the competition."

Six teams, five all-around competitors (who are not on a qualifying team) and one individual event specialist per event [who has a minimum Regional Qualifying Score (RQS) of 9.4] were named to each of the six regions. The top two teams and the top two all-around competitors (who are not on an advancing team) from each regional will receive an automatic berth to the national championships in Athens, Georgia, April 24-26, hosted by the University of Georgia.

In addition, the event winners at the regional championships will advance to the national championships (in that event only) if they are not part of a qualifying team or the all-around qualifiers.

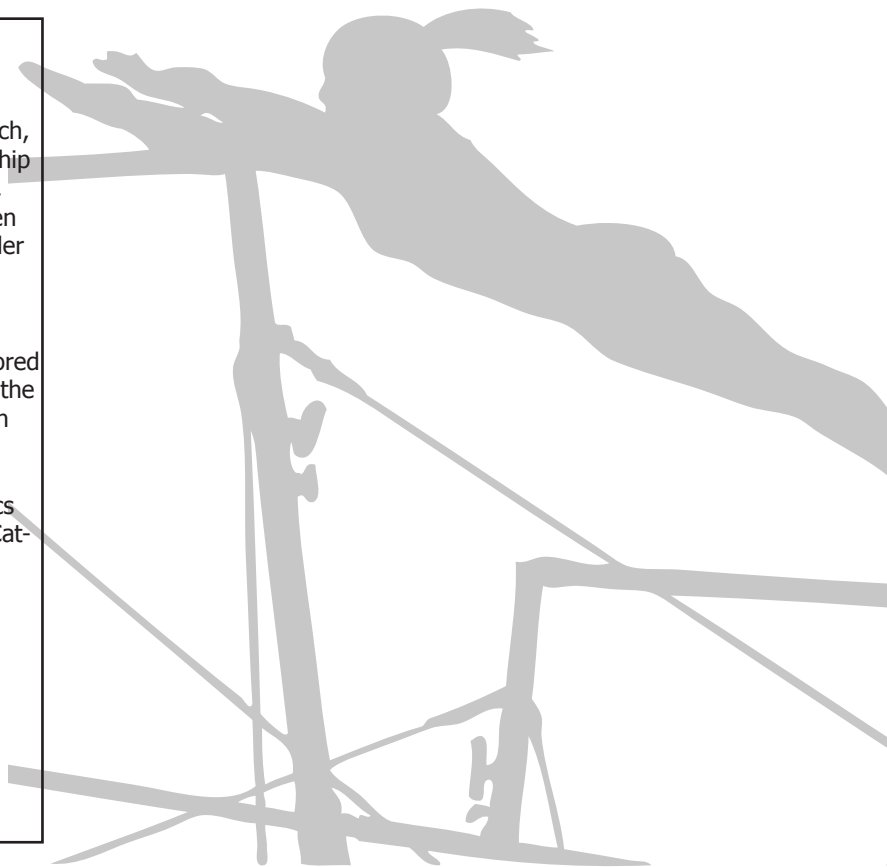
### Head Coach: Brad Cattermole

Brad Cattermole begins his 20th full season as the head coach of BYU gymnastics. Since becoming the head coach, he has guided the Cougars to eight National Championship Tournament Appearances and 18 NCAA Regional berths, missing Regionals just once since becoming coach. Seven gymnasts have earned 17 NCAA All-America awards under his tutelage.

Cattermole has quietly built the Cougar program into a respected national power. In 2004 the Cougar squad scored a school record 198.025 at Utah State. That same year, the team also set school highs of 49.625 on vault, 49.675 on beam and 49.675 on floor.

Cattermole competed on the 1971 BYU men's gymnastics team. Born in Stormlake, Iowa, he is married to Dawn Cattermole, an assistant coach at BYU.

# Cougar Notes:

## Rankings

The Cougar squad is currently ranked No. 29 nationally. BYU's RQS is 194.710. The highest BYU has been ranked this season is No. 29.

## Regional Regulars

This is the 19th time the Cougars have gone to the NCAA Gymnastics Regionals under Cattermoles direction, missing a Regionals berth only one time since Cattermole has been the BYU head coach. Last year the Cougars finished fourth in the region with a 193.300 recording. The team's final rank was No. 20.

## Nationals

Cattermole has guided his BYU squads to eight National Championship Tournament appearances since becoming coach. The last time the Cougars earned a spot at Nationals was in 2005 where they placed 11th with a 194.625 posting.

## Most Recent Meet

In BYU's last regular-season meet, the Cougars went head-to-head with in-state rival No. 2 University of Utah. In front of a record-breaking crowd, BYU recorded 193.850.

## Lucky Number Seven

BYU is a fairly young team. There are seven sophomores on the roster this year, which is nearly half of the 16 gymnasts on the squad. The remaining class breakdown is as follows: seniors (4), juniors (2), and freshmen (3).

## New Fresh-men Faces

BYU has three new freshmen on its roster this season: Madeleine Johnson, Whitney Olsen and Jessica Villegas.

## Cougar Captains

The BYU squad will look to senior Alethea Boon and sophomore Danielle Goldman for leadership this season, as the two serve as the team co-captains for 2008.

## Vault

BYU currently ranks No. 31 in the nation on vault. The Cougars stuck a event score as high as 49.200 this season, the highest event score all year for BYU.

## Bars

Ranking No. 28 nationally on the apparatus, the Cougars have recorded 49.075 as their season-best.

## Beam

The Cougar squad has recorded a score as high as 48.975 this year and is currently ranked No. 32 nationally.

## Floor

BYU is currently ranked No. 25 on the event. The highest score the Cougars have earned this year is 49.125.

### Boon Leads No. 28 Cougars at Utah

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (March 28, 2008) -- In her sixth all-around performance of the season senior Alethea Boon finished her career leading the No. 28 BYU gymnastics team to a 193.850 posting Friday night against the No. 2 University of Utah. The Utes came out on top recording 197.100 on the night.

“The girls did a pretty good job adjusting,” said BYU Head Coach Brad Cattermole. “Sometimes it’s hard to figure out reasoning behind the results of each meet, but with all things considered the girls did pretty well.”

Boon recorded 38.075 in the all-around and lead the squad on vault, scoring 9.850 on the apparatus.

The Cougars got off to a bit of a rough start and had a tough time recovering. Suffering two falls on the uneven bars, BYU recorded 48.075 on the event. Senior Kylee Draper-Marvin led the squad landing 9.825, with sophomores Megan Donehue and Melissa Hough at 9.750.

Moving to vault, BYU landed 48.700 on the apparatus. Senior Dayna Smart-Allen followed Boon’s 9.850, as she stuck a 9.825 score performance.

On floor exercises the Cougars recorded 48.450 on the event. Junior Hayley Jensen rounded out the Cougars’ performances with a 9.775 score, the highest for BYU on floor. Danielle Goldman, who lead off for BYU came in behind Jensen with 9.700.

Finishing the meet on beam, the Cougars landed 48.625 on the apparatus. Smart-Allen led the squad landing 9.850, with sophomore Kaylee Gallup just behind a 9.775.

With this meet finishing regular-season competition, the Cougar squad is now looking toward Regionals. The destination assignments for Regionals will be announced Monday at 3 p.m. MT. Cattermole said his team is ready to preparing for the competition.

“We’re going to give them a little rest and then hit it hard,” Cattermole said. “I think this meet will help us focus and work hard for what is ahead.”

The No. 30 Cougars' overall posting topped No. 40 Cal State Fullerton's 191.400, but was not enough as they fell behind No. 18 Arizona's 196.125.

Bars proved to be the Cougars' strongest event of the night landing an even 49. No BYU gymnast scored below 9.775 on the apparatus. Senior Kylee Draper-Marvin topped the bars squad recording 9.875 to tie her career-best. Donehue followed with 9.800, with the remaining four gymnasts at 9.775.

Performance was also sound on vault. The Cougars stuck 48.275 on the apparatus. Senior Alethea Boon topped the squad landing a score of 9.800, with sophomore Megan Donehue following at 9.750.

BYU scored 48.275 on beam. Hayley Jensen, Dayna Smart-Allen and Draper-Marvin, all posted 9.775 to lead the team. Sophomore Kaylee Gallup followed at 9.700.

The team remained strong as BYU with its 48.675 performance on floor. Draper-Marvin posted 9.825, a score that tied her season high. Sophomore Heidi Poulson-Rasmussen followed as she recorded 9.800 for the third meet in a row.

Senior Dayna Smart-Allen helped the Cougars land their second-highest overall score of the season. She claimed three of four individual titles with her performances throughout the meet.

"Dayna [Smart-Allen] did well and that helped us out tonight," Cattermole said.

BYU started off strong on the uneven bars as the squad recorded a season-high 49.075.

Kylee Draper-Marvin led the Cougars on the apparatus with 9.875, tying the senior's career-best. Freshman Madeleine Johnson followed landing a career-high 9.850.

The Cougars also proved to be solid as they moved to vault, sticking 48.775 on the apparatus. Smart-Allen topped the

squad with her 9.875 performance. With that score Smart-Allen claimed the individual title on the event, her first of the night. BYU is currently ranked No. 28 nationally on vault.

Smart-Allen also led the BYU squad on the floor exercises. She landed a season-high 9.875 as the 28th-ranked floor team bolstered 49.100. Sophomore Heidi Poulson-Rasmussen scored a solid 9.800 behind Smart-Allen.

Finishing on the balance beam, the Cougars recorded 48.200. Smart-Allen scored 9.825 to earn the individual title, with junior Hayley Jensen following with her 9.800 routine.

A tied score is not something the BYU squad encounters regularly. Cattermole said the last time the Cougars tied in a meet was in a meet against Utah State more than 15 years ago. Tie or not, Cattermole is pleased with BYU's posting.

"This score will definitely help our regional qualifying score," Cattermole said. "And we will have another chance to improve and get ready for Regionals on Friday."

### Season Highs Solidify 196.300

PROVO, Utah (March 10, 2008) -- Landing season-high scores in all four events, the No. 32 BYU gymnastics team recorded a season-best 196.300 over No. 45 Utah State's 194.250 Monday in the Cougars final home meet of the year.

"I am pleased with the results tonight," said BYU head coach Brad Cattermole. "I told the girls we need to be inspirational with our performances. That is exactly what happened tonight."

Four gymnasts claim career highs throughout the meet, but it was the seniors who took center stage in their last home meet at BYU. Senior Dayna-Smart Allen claimed individual titles on beam and floor, tying for first on vault with fellow senior Alethea Boon.

Senior Kylee Draper-Marvin took the final individual title on the uneven bars and landed two career-best scores on both bars (9.850) and beam (9.800). Boon, all-around competitor for the Cougars, claimed the all-around title against the Aggies.

"I expect that each of them hit their routines because they have the ability to," Cattermole said. "Tonight they performed just like they did in practice all week long."

The Cougars started strong on vault posting a remarkable 49.200. That is the highest score BYU has earned on any event all season. The vault team is currently ranked No. 29 nationally. Four of the six vault competitors tied or surpassed career-best scores. Boon and Smart-Allen led the Cougars with 9.900, a mark to tie Smart-Allen's career-best. Sophomore Megan Donehue, who has been steadily improving on the apparatus with each meet launched a career-high 9.825, along with junior Hayley Jensen whose 9.800 tied her career-best. Sophomore Kiki Berrett also earned a career-high 9.775.

Sticking a season-high event score on bars with an even 49, the BYU squad remained strong. Draper-Marvin earned a career-high posting of 9.850. Close behind the senior, Madeleine Johnson secured 9.825, a personal-best for the freshman.

BYU continued its season-high streak as the Cougars earned a season-best 48.975 on beam. Smart-Allen topped the squad with a season-high 9.875. Boon and Draper-Marvin followed as Boon claimed a sound 9.850 and Draper-Marvin recorded a career-high 9.800.

Rounding out the night BYU worked its way to a 49.125 posting on floor exercises. Smart-Allen and Jensen both launched a 9.850 performance, a season-best for Smart-Allen. Not far behind Draper-Marvin posted a season-high 9.825. The Cougars are currently ranked No. 29 on floor.

### Cougars Defeat No. 23 Thunderbirds

PROVO, Utah (March 7, 2008) -- With sound performances all around, the No. 34 BYU gymnastics team ousted No. 23 Southern Utah with a 194.550-193.300 win, Friday night in the Marriott Center.

"Overall it was a mediocre meet for us," said BYU head coach Brad Cattermole. "Nothing sticks out as being great. We definitely have practiced this week a lot better than we performed tonight."

The Cougars started with solid performances on vault sticking 48.700 on the event. Seniors Dayna Smart-Allen and Alethea Boon rounded out the event with the highest-scores for BYU, both earning 9.825 markings.

BYU retained its momentum as the Cougars moved to the uneven bars, landing a strong 48.625. That is the second-highest event score on the uneven bars for BYU this season. Sophomore Megan Donehue topped the squad for the second meet in a row posting 9.825 on the apparatus.

On the balance beam Junior Hayley Jensen and Smart-Allen, both earned 9.750, and led the squad to a 48.575 on the event. Boon followed suit earning 9.725 just behind the two.

Finishing the meet with the floor exercises, the Cougars posted 48.650. Kaylee Gallup topped the floor team with 9.775, tying her season-best. With that score Gallup claimed the individual title on floor, a first for the sophomore. Heidi Poulson-Rasmussen followed sticking 9.750 on the event.

The only Cougar to compete in the all-around, Boon earned 38.975 and tied for the individual title.

"They did stick their routines, but the girls wanted to do better," Cattermole said. "I can't put my finger on it. Nothing went wrong, we just weren't as crisp and clean as I would have liked."

Cattermole said it was an off night for the Cougars, and his team should be ready for its next meet. The Cougars will challenge in-state opponent Utah State University in their last home meet of the season on Monday. The meet will start at 4 p.m. in the Smith Fieldhouse.
