#### No. 32 Gymnastics Seek Higher Scores

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 13, 2007) — Coming off a season-high score, the No. 32 BYU gymnastics team hopes to continue to improve as they travel to face No. 45 Utah State and No. 41 New Hampshire in Logan, Utah, on Friday.

"We are looking forward to the meet," said BYU head coach Brad Cattermole. "We have been working to improve on all events."

Last week the Cougar squad landed a 193.925 on the night against No. 2 Utah, improving by 0.575 points since the last meet. Ten gymnasts posted season-high individual scores, including No. 18 senior Dayna Smart-Allen who stuck a season-high on the vault.

Junior Hayley Jensen walked away with a career-high 9.825 on floor. That score helped catapult her to a three-way tie for the individual title on the rotation, with two other Utah gymnasts. That score moved Jensen to be tied for No. 41 nationally on the event. This is only Jensen's fifth time competing in the event as a Cougar. Sophomore Melissa Hough also enjoyed a career-high posting a 9.775 on the uneven bars.

"I was fairly pleased with the meet last week," Cattermole said. "We were strong on vault and we did well on floor and bars. We struggled a little on beam, but we have a young beam team and this experience is helping them."

The Cougars have improved their scores in each meet as the 2008 season has progressed. Friday will be the first of two times that BYU will compete against No. 45 Utah State. This is the second time BYU will face No. 41 New Hampshire this season. At their last meet on Jan. 26, the Cougars fell to the Wildcats 191.200 to 192.400.

#### **Head Coach: Brad Cattermole**

Brad Cattermole begins his 20th full season as the head coach of BYU gymnastics. Since becoming the head coach, he has guided the Cougars to eight National Championship Tournament Appearances and 18 NCAA Regional berths, missing Regionals just once since becoming coach. Seven gymnasts have earned 17 NCAA All-America awards under his tutelage.

Cattermole has quietly built the Cougar program into a respected national power. In 2004 the Cougar squad scored a school record 198.025 at Utah State. That same year, the team also set school highs of 49.625 on vault, 49.675 on beam and 49.675 on floor.

Cattermole competed on the 1971 BYU men's gymnastics team. Born in Stormlake, Iowa, he is married to Dawn Cattermole, an assistant coach at BYU.

# **Opponent Notes...**

#### **Utah State**

The No. 45 Aggies are coached by Ray Corn, who is in his 31st year with USU. Corn has coached three All-Americans, three Olympians and nine NCAA national qualifying teams. This is the Aggies seventh meet of the season and the first of two times they will face the Cougars.

#### **University of New Hampshire**

The No. 41 Wildcats are coached by Gail Goodspeed, who is in her 29th year at UNH. In 2007, the Wildcats placed fourth at the NCAA Northeast Regionals and averaged a team score of 192.3083 through out the season. This is the second time the Cougars will face the Wildcats this season.

# **Cougar Notes:**

#### **National Rankings**

The Cougar squad moved their way up in the NCAA national rankings as they are currently tied for the No. 32 spot with Northern Illinois University.

#### **Continued Improvement**

The 193.925 BYU score is the highest team score this season, improving by 0.575 points since the last meet. The Cougars have improved their scores each meet as the 2008 season has progressed.

#### On Top

Dayna Smart-Allen posted the highest score of the meet for the Cougars last Friday on vault, with 9.875. She is currently ranked No. 18 individually on the event.

#### BYU vs. Opponents

This is the second time BYU will face No. 41 New Hampshire this season. Last meeting on Jan. 26, the Cougars fell to the Wildcats 191.200 to 192.400.

Friday will be the first of two times the BYU squad will compete against No. 45 Utah State. The two teams will go head-to-head again on Mar. 10 in Provo.

#### **Career-High Moment**

Junior Hayley Jensen walked away with a career-high 9.825 on floor. That score helped catapult her to a three-way tie for the individual title on the rotation, with two other Utah gymnasts. That score moved Jensen to be tied for No. 41 nationally on the event. This is only Jensen's fifth time competing in the event as a Cougar.

Sophomore Melissa Hough also enjoyed a career-high posting a 9.775 on the uneven bars.

#### **Season-High Success**

As part of the team goal to continue to improve, 10 BYU gymnasts claimed season-high scores on the evening. The gymnasts included Heidi Poulson-Rasmussen (9.625), Alethea Boon (9.850) and Dayna Smart-Allen (9.875) on vault, McKell Poulson (9.750) and Melissa Hough (9.775) on bars, and Boon (9.625), Goldman (9.675), Kiki Berrett (9.750), Heidi Poulson (9.700) and Hayley Jensen (9.825) on the floor rotation.

#### 2007 Rankings

In the 2007 final national polls the Cougars were ranked No. 28 and placed fourth at the NCAA Regionals Championships. The BYU gymnastics team ranked as high as No. 19 in the 2007 season.

#### Highs and Lows of 2007

BYU scored an overall season-high of 195.675 last year against Southern Utah and Arizona on March 23. The Cougars' lowest season score 192.300 came on Jan. 19 against Boise State. The Cougar squad scored a 194.094 average last season.

#### She Can't Hear You

Senior Aimee Walker Pond is blind in her right eye and deaf in both ears. Many of the girls on the team and the coaches know at least some sign language to be able to communicate with her.

#### **New Fresh-men Faces**

BYU has three new freshmen on its roster this season: Madeleine Johnson, Whitney Olsen and Jessica Villegas.

#### Vault

Seniors Alethea Boon and No. 18 Dayna Smart-Allen both stuck a season-high on the vault. Boon scored 9.850 while Smart-Allen grabbed a 9.875. The Cougars claimed a 48.700 on the apparatus.

#### **Bars**

The BYU bars team swung its way to a No. 28 national ranking last Friday. As the team made its way to a 48.650 on bars, sophomore McKell Poulson bolstered a season-best 9.750, while No. 38 Kylee Draper-Marvin grabbed the highest score for the Cougars with 9.800. Melissa Hough landed a career-high 9.775 on the event.

#### Beam

In a bit of a struggle, the Cougars only landed a 47.875 on the beam. No. 24 Dayna Smart-Allen topped the BYU team with 9.800. Hayley Jensen followed with 9.750.

#### **Floor**

The floor proved to be an improvement for the Cougars and was their strongest event of the evening last Friday as they landed 48.700. Hayley Jensen led the Cougars with her career-high 9.825 performance. Multiple gymnasts scored season-highs including Danielle Goldman with 9.675 and Kiki Barrett who posted 9.750 and Heidi Poulson with a 9.700.

# **2008 Meet Recaps:**

#### Season-High Against No. 2 Utah

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 8, 2008) -- The No. 36 BYU gymnastics team battled No. 2 Utah Friday night in the Marriott Center, falling to the Utes 193.925-196.700 in the Deseret Duel Rivalry Series. The Cougars continue to improve their score, with tonight's score being their best this season.

"I was very pleased with how we fought and stayed in the game," said BYU head coach Brad Cattermole. "People can get rattled when Utah is around, but our kids did a great job."

The Cougars began the night on the vault, quickly proving their strength by posting a team score of 48.700. Senior Dayna Smart-Allen, currently ranked No. 21 nationally on the vault, led BYU in the event with her season-best score of 9.875. Senior Alethea Boon bolstered the team score with her season-best 9.850.

Senior Kylee Draper-Marvin, No. 22 on the bars, led a strong BYU bar rotation with a score of 9.800. Despite a few slips by the Cougar squad, the team achieved a score of 48.650. Sophomore Melissa Hough's strong performance of 9.775 improved the team score, while sophomore McKell Poulson stuck a season high 9.750.

"McKell Poulson fought like a son-of-a-gun to stay on the bars, and she stuck a great landing," Cattermole said.

Moving to the balance beam, the Cougars made several key landings to post a team score of 47.875. Smart-Allen led BYU on the beam with a solid 9.800 performance. Junior Hayley Jensen proved her strength with a score of 9.750.

The Cougars concluded the night on the floor, the team's best event of the evening. Jensen led the team with a career-best score of 9.825, which catapulted her to tie for the individual title in the floor rotation. Sophomore Heidi Poulson not only pleased the crowd with her entertaining performance, but scored a season-high 9.700. Sophomore Kiki Berret also led the team with her season-high of 9.750.

"I think we're moving in the right direction," said Cattermole. "The girls are getting better and better, and working really hard in practice. I think that will pay off throughout the season."

#### **Gymnasts Improve Scores in Second Meet**

CEDAR CITY, Utah (Feb. 1, 2008)—With improved scores from last week's meet, the BYU gymnastics team posted an overall score of 193.350 at No. 17 Southern Utah with No. 18 Boise State and Cal State Fullerton.

Southern Utah came out ahead with 194.650, followed by Boise State at 194.425, and CS Fullerton posted 193.575 over BYU.

"Overall I was pleased with the team's performance," said BYU Head Coach Brad Cattermole. "They fought through the whole thing and they didn't give up."

Senior Dayna Smart-Allen earned her first individual title of the 2008 season as she posted a 9.825 on the balance beam, tying with two other gymnasts in the event. BYU earned a solid 48.000

"It was nice having [Dayna Smart-Allen] back in the line up," Cattermole said. "Getting both her and [Alethea] Boon back into more events is important. They are hard to replace."

Senior Kylie Draper-Marvin led the Cougar squad on the uneven bars with 9.825 as the team grabbed 48.125 in the event. Draper-Marvin and Jensen both tied for second on the floor exercise as they danced their way to a 9.800, season highs for the two gymnasts. BYU as a team earned 48.525 on the floor.

"We were pretty much right there in the game," said Cattermole. "But it is early in the season and the girls are still getting adjusted. Hopefully by next week we will have most of it worked out."

#### **Cougars Post Solid Scores in Tough Tri-Meet**
