



Week in Review:

BYU Suffers First Loss to New Mexico No. 6 BYU opened up MWC play Thursday with a 1-0 loss to the University of New Mexico, at South Stadium in a game where the Cougars just could not seem to put everything together at the

right time.

BYU saw numerous opportunities in the first half, but could not find the back of the net. The Cougars outshot the Lobos 6-1 in the first half and 9-3 on the game, including a 6-3 advantage in shots on goal.

New Mexico came out with added intensity in the second half, scoring the lone goal in the 54th minute when Ashley Lowery found a wide-open Kristine Sweat, who drew out goalkeeper Erika Woodbury and buried the ball into the net. The goal marked the first time this season the Cougars found themselves trailing.

In the 65th minute Jaime Rendich Beck tried to even the score with a high-arching shot, but the New Mexico goalie stretched out to barely make the critical save.

lightening fast as they came together offensively and defensively, proving why they are one of the Top 10 teams in the nation.

Only nine minutes into the game, Natalie Nate sent a short, sideways pass to Jaime Rendich Beck off a free kick, who caught the ball 25 yards out and blasted it into the back of the net. The goal was Rendich Beck's seventh of the season.

BYU was a force to be reckoned with, as the Cougars saw numerous opportunities to score. Two plays in particular during the first half gave TCU quite the scare. Charlene Lui had one shot that hit the very bottom of the crossbar and gently bounced out. Later, Nate wove through four Horned Frog defenders and then passed the ball to Annie Zwahlen, whose shot was barely deflected by the TCU goal keeper as her fingertips barely grazed the ball enough to prevent the score.

The Cougars outshot the Frogs 11-2 in the first half, and 23-7 on the game, including a 12-4 advantage in shots on goal.

BYU again came out strong in the second half, as the scoring opportunities kept piling up, netting its first goal of the half in the opening eight minutes, as Carolyn Swenson sent a lob pass from the right corner to Charlene Lui. Lui took one dribble and then let the ball fly. It soared just over the fingertips of the TCU's goalie. The goal was Lui's second of the season.

Seven minutes minutes later, Brooke Thulin sent her characteristic flip-throw flying toward Rendich Beck, who collected the ball and tapped it past the goalie for her eighth goal of the season and second on the game.

After a handful of possible scoring opportunities, Zwahlen finally connected in the 77th minute. Heidi Dearborn kicked a pass up field in the to Whitney Feller, finding Zwahlen on a break away. Zwahlen faked her defender and then sent her shot toward the right corner of the net. The TCU goalkeeper deflected the shot, which hit the bottom of the cross bar and bounced in. The goal marked Zwahlen's second of the season.

Scouting the Falcons

Three unanswered goals rallied San Diego State to a 3-1 win over Air Force, in a Mountain West Conference women's soccer match Sunday afternoon.

The Falcons jumped out to an early lead on Brittney Perkowski's team-leading fifth goal of the season in the 14th minute. From near midfield, sophomore Rhett Chase sent a pass to the front of the box to Perkowski, who lofted a perfect shot over goalkeeper. The assist was Chase's first of her career.

San Diego State came back and tied the match in the 31st minute, as Jen Mello cleaned up on a deflected shot. Sutton then put the Aztecs up 2-1 in the 38th minute, taking a pass from Becky Ryan and slipping the ball past Wallace to the left corner. SDSU put the match away in the 59th minute, as Mello scored her second goal on the day.

The Aztecs out-shot the Falcons 12-10, with both teams taking six shots on goal. Perkowski led the way for the Falcons, with four shots, three on goal.

Statistical Leaders: Air Force's offense is lead by Brittney Perkowski, who has scored five goals and tallied a total of 11 points. Meredith Benson and Katherine Taylor trail Perkowski, netting three goals and two goals, respectively. Taryn Nicoladies leads the Falcons with two assists on the season. Goalkeepers Erin Wallace and Jennifer Drew split time in the net, while saving a combined 57 shots.

Scouting the Cowgirls

In a cold, rain soaked Mountain West Conference match, the Wyoming soccer team surrendered a last second goal to UNLV and fell to the Rebels 1-0, Sunday afternoon.

After 89 minutes and 51 seconds of scoreless soccer, UNLV sophomore Ashly O'Harrow scored the game-winning goal with just nine seconds remaining in regulation. On the scoring play, Cowgirl goalkeeper Ashley Sheppard made saves on two consecutive UNLV shots, causing deflections, but was unable to do so on a third and O'Harrow's shot scored.

After being outshot 11-2 in the first half, the Cowgirls rebounded in the second and matched UNLV's seven shots with seven of their own.

Sheppard had one of her best games of the season in the UW goal, making a season high nine saves. Her best save came in the 36th minute of the first half when she made a diving play on a point blank UNLV shot in the middle of the 18-yard box.

Statistical Leaders: Mercy Adetoye fronts the Cowgirl's offensive attack with six goals for a total of 12 points on the season. Tamika Wilson is close behind with four girls of her own. Amanda Lathrop leads Wyoming with three assists in 12 games. Jaime Scarcliff and Ashley Sheppard have compiled a total of 40 saves during their combined 12 games in the goal.

South Stadium

South Stadium is the place the Cougars love to call home, a home all opponents hate to visit.

For the past ten years, South Stadium (formerly South Field), has been the battlefield for the Cougars as the team has taken on, and defeated, the top teams in their conference and in the NCAA.

The Cougars have amassed an 86-19-4 (.807) record at home, which is among the best in the nation over the same time period. Of those 86 home wins, an outstanding 47 have ended in a shutout.

BYU consistently manages to hold its opponents scoreless when playing at South Stadium with 43 percent of all the Cougars' wins ending in shutout victories, while BYU has been shutout only nine times in the stadium's history.

Aside from the Cougars' history of defeating tough teams at home, another factor making South Stadium a formidable place for opponents is the large and loud crowd of fans that pack the stadium at every game.

Consistently among the top 15 in the NCAA, South Stadium packs in some of the largest crowds in the country. With an average attendance of 1,191 fans during the 2004 campaign, the Cougars rank among the highest every year for largest attendance average in the country. BYU also packed in a total of 13,106 fans over 11 games, recording the second highest mark in the MWC and making South Stadium one of the toughest places for opponents to play in women's college soccer today.

Located just south of the Smith Fieldhouse, South Stadium boasts one of the best-maintained grass playing surfaces in the NCAA. The Wasatch Mountains serve as a scenic backdrop for the capacity crowd of 3,000 fans. South Stadium is also equipped with state-of-the-art field lights, making night games a favorite among fans.

Record Breaking Attendance

The Cougar fans have shown undaunted support for the women's soccer team, averaging over 2,600 fans per home game. Entering the 2005 season, the attendance record was 2,758 fans, set in 2003. On Sept. 12 against No. 22 Texas, the Cougars broke that record with 3,322. After adding more bleachers to accommodate the fans, BYU blasted that number with an overwhelming 3,810 Friday against No. 9 California.

The Rockwood File

After completing her tenth season, head coach Jennifer Rockwood has taken the BYU women's soc cer team to national prominence and established herself as one of the premier coaches in Division I soccer today.

Rockwood currently ranks tenth in winning percentage among active NCAA coaches with an impressive 165-56-10 overall record for her career. Over the last ten seasons, Rockwood accumulated a .736 winning percentage.

In the past ten years, Rockwood has guided the Cougars to five conference championships. On the national scene, her teams have made seven appearances in the NCAA Tournament in the last eight years and reached the "Sweet Sixteen" in 1998, 2000 and 2003. The Cougars regularly maintain a consistent top-25 ranking. During Rockwood's tenure, the team finished in the top-10 three times, including a recent run in the 2003 NCAA College Cup. The tournament ended with BYU finishing No. 5 in the country after making their first "Elite Eight" appearance in the program's history.

Among the many achievements and awards she has received over her career, Rockwood has been honored with two Coach of the Year citations, one by the Western Athletic Conference in 1996, and again by the MWC in 2000. She also became the first MWC coach to eclipse the 100-win total mark when the Cougars shutout Milwaukee-Wisconsin 2-0 on Sept. 23, 2000.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Aleisha Rose, Jeni Viernes and Michelle Jensen. Among the players who have been coached by Rockwood are four additional All-American athletes that were drafted by the women's United Soccer Association: Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years

she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Rick's College on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management.

Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs, and the high school level.

Rockwood Among Coaching Elite

Rockwood currently ranks 10th in winning percentage among active NCAA Division I coaches with an impressive 165-56-10 (.735) overall record after the 2004 season. Anson Dorrance, Becky Burleigh, Jerry Smith, Chris Petrucelli, Len Tsantiris, John Walker, Randy Waldrum, G. Guerrieri and Patrick Farmer are the only coaches ahead of her.
