## On The Road Again For BYU Volleyball

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 25, 2007) – After a brief one-match stay in the Smith Fieldhouse, the No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team will once again hit the road this week, playing at Wyoming on Friday and at Air Force on Saturday.

"This weekend will be another opportunity for us to improve our preparation to play on the road," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "As we close out the month of September, we want to put ourselves in a position to compete and succeed."

BYU has already played eight of 12 matches this year away from Provo, starting the season 8-4 overall and 1-2 in the Mountain West Conference. With the upcoming trip, the Cougars will have played 10 of 14 contests on the road by the end of September, the most since 1997.

Preseason MWC Player of the Year Chelsea Goodman has continued to lead the way for BYU as the senior outside hitter posts 4.35 kills per game and has tallied eight double-doubles. Her career mark of 42 double-doubles is just five off the all-time MWC record of 47. Junior middle blocker Rachel Dyer is 10th in the nation hitting at .436 and records 1.08 blocks per game.

The Cowgirls are 6-5 so far this year including a 1-2 mark in the Mountain West Conference after back-to-back losses at TCU and at New Mexico. Wyoming has recorded wins this year over fellow BYU opponents Utah Valley, who BYU will play on Oct. 9, and Weber State, who the Cougars defeated last week. The Cowgirls are led by senior outside hitter Rachel Smith, who ranks third in the league with 4.46 kills per game while adding 2.54 digs per contest, second on the team. BYU is 59-4 all-time against Wyoming.

The Falcons are 7-9 so far this year and 0-3 in the Mountain West Conference with losses to Wyoming and at New Mexico and TCU. Air Force began the year winning four of its first six to tie the second-best start in school history. At 7-9, the Falcons have already more than doubled their win total from last year (3-25). Air Force is led by sophomore outside hitter Katie Batchelder with 3.08 kills and 3.14 digs per game. The Cougars lead the all-time series, 18-1.

## WYOMING IN 2007

The Cowgirls are 6-5 so far this year including a 1-2 mark in the Mountain West Conference after back-to-back losses at TCU and at New Mexico. Wyoming has recorded wins this year over fellow BYU opponents Utah Valley, who BYU will play on Oct. 9, and Weber State, who the Cougars defeated last week. The Cowgirls are led by senior outside hitter Rachel Smith, who ranks third in the league with 4.46 kills per game while adding 2.54 digs per contest, second on the team. Senior Angie Hellbaum is right behind Smith with 4.20 kpg, fifth in the MWC, to go along with 2.35 dpg. Junior setter Tasha Weishahn averages 12.49 assists per game while leading the Cowgirls and ranking second in the conference with 0.44 aces per game. She also adds 2.44 dpg. Junior libero Carissa Lee paces the Cowgirls on the first ball with 3.78 dpg. As a team, Wyoming outperforms its opponents in kills (14.91-13.78), hitting percentage (.224-.199), assists (13.85-12.74) and aces (1.80-1.63).

## LAST OUTING

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (Sept. 21, 2007) - The Wyoming Cowgirl Volleyball team fell in three games (27-30, 25-30, 32-34) against the New Mexico Lobos on Friday night in Albuquerque. Senior Rachel Smith led the way for the Cowgirls with 13 kills, along with six digs and a .178 (13-5-45) hitting percentage. She was followed by Angie Hellbaum with nine kills and nine digs, and Lauren Whitney six kills. Wyoming hit .167 (42-20-132) and had six blocks. Jeanne Fairchild recorded a match high 17 kills, while hitting .270 (17-17-37). Lisa Meeter followed with 14 kills and 16 digs, and libero Gayle Tripp finished with 20 digs. The Lobos hit .216 (56-26-139) and had eight total team blocks.

The two teams traded points back and forth in the early going of the first game. Finally, the Lobos scored six of nine points to take a three point advantage, 26-23, but UW pulled to within one, 26-25. Unfortunately that would be as close as they would get as UNM went on a 4-2 run to close out the game 30-27. Game two started off very similar as it was even through the first 18 points at 9-9. The Lobos took the scoring edge as they went on a 6-3 run to open up a 15-12 lead. They extended that lead to seven points, 21-14, as the Cowgirls struggled to score points. With the score 25-15 in favor of New Mexico, the Cowgirls battled back and even held off four game points, but came up short 30-25 in the game.

The Cowgirls took a very early 3-1 lead to begin game three, but the Lobos responded with a 5-1 run to take a two point advantage, 6-4. Wyoming responded by scoring the next eight of twelve, 12-9. The game seemed to be in hand for the Cowgirls, but with the score 28-25 in their favor New Mexico made another run at them. They held off a game point at 29-28 and scored the next six of nine to win the game, 34-32, and the match 3-0.

### AIR FORCE IN 2007

The Falcons are 7-9 so far this year and 0-3 in the Mountain West Conference with losses to Wyoming and at New Mexico and TCU. Air Force began the year winning four of its first six to tie the second-best start in school history. At 7-9, the Falcons have already more than doubled their win total from last year (3-25). Air Force is led by sophomore outside hitter Katie Batchelder with 3.08 kills and 3.14 digs per game. Batchelder also paces the team and the conference in assists with 0.47 per contest. She recently tied Air Force's single-match record with seven aces against Quinnipiac on Sept. 1. Freshman Caroline Kurtz, one of 14 Falcon freshmen, is second on the team with 2.50 kpg while adding 2.15 dpg. Freshman middle blocker Nichole Stilwell boasts a team-best .275 hitting mark and 0.76 blocks per contest. Senior setter Kim Kallabis is averaging 7.67 assists per game and recently moved into 10th place all-time at Air Force in career assists with 1,210.

### LAST OUTING

FORT WORTH, Texas (Sept. 21, 2007) -Despite a career-best four service aces from freshman Stephanie Stanford, the Air Force volleyball team dropped a three-game set at TCU on Friday, Sept. 21, in Mountain West Conference action. The Falcons succumbed to the Horned Frogs by 30-15, 30-15 and 30-12 scores at the Rickel Building in Fort Worth, Texas.

Air Force took a 2-1 lead, backed by a block from junior Jasamine Pettie and freshman Nichole Stilwell. The Horned Frogs scored the next five points, before a pair of kills from freshman Caroline Kurtz brought the Falcons within three (7-4). Pettie added a trio of tallies, as did sophomore Katie Batchelder. Freshman Jessica Hellmann posted a quick kill, but TCU took the game by a 30-15 score.

TCU scored the first three points of the second set, but Batchelder served up an ace to bring the Falcons within one at 3-2. Air Force stayed just one down at the 5-4 mark, before Stanford recorded back-to-back aces to tie the game at seven. The two teams traded the next several points, until the Horned Frogs served the next eight points to take a 19-10 lead. Batchelder added another kill, but TCU responded with the next five points. Pettie posted one kill and teamed up with sophomore Michelle Harrington for a block, but Air Force fell 30-15.

Three different Falcons posted kills and Stanford tallied her third ace of the night during the first five points of the third set. TCU, which had taken an early 6-1 lead, pulled out to 18-7 lead midway through the set. Batchelder added another kill and Stanford put down her fourth ace, but Air Force dropped the set by a 30-12 score.

**Weekly Notes:****Week #5 In Review**

In the first of four in-state matches this season, the No. 17 BYU women's volleyball proved its penchant for drama at Weber State last Tuesday night, recording its second straight five-game win (28-30, 30-25, 28-30, 30-15, 19-17). Senior rightside hitter Erica Lott led the way for BYU with a season-best 23 kills while adding six blocks. Junior middle blocker Rachel Dyer also came up big for the Cougars with 17 kills and 11 blocks, her first double-double of the season and the most rejections posted by a Cougar this year. The Cougars attempted to make it three in a row against Colorado State on Saturday but came up short in the comeback bid, falling 32-34, 31-33, 31-29, 30-22, 9-15 despite a career-high 13 blocks from Ashton Hansen. The loss marked BYU's first five-game loss of the season and the first time in five matches the Cougars have fallen after forcing a fifth game despite being down 2-0.

**Block Party**

The BYU block came alive this week as the Cougars posted a season-high 17.0 rejections at Weber State and then surpassed that mark with 17.5 against Colorado State. Rachel Dyer led the way against the Wildcats with 11 blocks, marking the first time this season a Cougar has posted double-digit blocks. Ashton Hansen then followed suit with a career-high 13 blocks against the Rams. BYU will look to continue the trend this Friday at Wyoming, where last year the Cougars set a BYU record for block assists in a match with 61 and posted the second-most total blocks in Cougar volleyball history with 30.5.

**On The Road Again**

With two more road matches on tap this weekend at Wyoming and at Air Force, BYU will have played 10 of 14 matches on the road by the end of September. The Cougars began the season with two matches at the Hawkeye Challenge hosted by Iowa before hosting the BYU Molten Classic. BYU then played three matches at the Stanford Invitational and at UNLV, San Diego State and Weber State before facing Colorado State at home on Saturday. The Cougars have not begun the season with so many matches away from home before the end of September since playing 10 of their first 14 on the road in 1997.

**Comeback Kids**

BYU's five-game loss against Colorado State marked its first five-game defeat of the season and snapped a three-match winning streak when the Cougars have come back from an 0-2 deficit to force a fifth game. The streak began in the 2006 NCAA Tournament with a comeback against UC Santa Barbara (27-30, 30-32, 30-27, 30-21, 15-12) in the first round behind Annie Pinegar's school-record 42 digs. BYU then began this season with a five-game comeback at Iowa (21-30, 21-30, 30-19, 30-26, 15-13) on Aug. 25 before besting San Diego State (24-30, 25-30, 30-26, 30-24, 15-7) on Saturday. The Cougars also had to come from behind at Weber State on Tuesday night after falling behind two games to one. BYU is now 14-3 in five-game matches under head coach Jason Watson, including a 4-1 mark this season.

**Double the Fun**

With 42 career double-doubles to date, Chelsea Goodman is currently in second place on the MWC's all-time double-double list behind Wyoming's Michele Rauter (47; 2000-03), passing SDSU's Aspen McPartland (39; 2000-03). Goodman has recorded eight double-doubles already this season after posting an MWC-leading 18 double-doubles last year out of 29 matches in which she played. BYU's Erica Lott also appears on the active list with 21 double-doubles in her Cougar career, including four so far in 2007.

**Home Sweet Home**

The Cougars have gone 3-1 in the Smith Fieldhouse this season and are averaging 1,708 fans, 15th in the nation, including the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history with 3,880 fans against No. 10 Wisconsin in the Cougars' home opener. BYU went 12-1 in the Smith Fieldhouse last year and set a new program attendance record with an average of 1,902 fans, 13th in the nation. The Cougars are now 463-83 (.848) all-time at home and 25-2 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the last three years.

**BYU In the Polls**

The Cougars are ranked No. 23 in this week's AVCA poll after beginning the season No. 17 and being ranked as high as No. 9, their highest ranking since 1999. BYU has a rich history of rankings in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. Among NCAA Division I programs entering the 2007 season, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (279) and 11th in weeks ranked in the top 10 (122) and weeks ranked No. 1 (4). The Cougars have also traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in both weeks ranked in the final poll (20) and weeks ranked in the top five to end the year (3) and tied for sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1).

**Rivals in the Rankings**

Three Cougar opponents also appear in this week's rankings. Wisconsin, whom the Cougars defeated in the Molten Classic, is ranked No. 9 while Stanford comes in at No. 2 and Cal Poly is No. 20 this week (both teams beat BYU in the Stanford Invitational). MWC rival Colorado State is receiving votes and listed 27th along with UNLV at 31.

**Vs. Ranked Opponents**

BYU is now 1-2 this season against ranked opponents with a win over No. 10 Wisconsin on Aug. 31 and losses against No. 17 Cal Poly and at No. 2 Stanford at the Stanford Invitational. The Cougars were 1-3 in 2006 vs. ranked teams with the lone win coming against then-No. 4 Stanford.

**BYU Reaches 1,000-Victory Mark**

The BYU women's volleyball team celebrated a significant milestone on Sept. 15 as the Cougars became just the fourth program in NCAA volleyball history to record 1,000 wins. BYU's landmark 1,000th victory, which came at San Diego State, puts the Cougars in elite company with UCLA, Nebraska and Missouri State as the only programs to reach the 1,000-win mark. In the world of collegiate volleyball, few schools have a volleyball tradition as successful and rich as the history of the sport at BYU, whose all-time record now stands at 1,001-278-5 (.782). In the 38 seasons of its recorded history prior to this year, the Cougars have only suffered one losing season and have won 20 or more matches in 31 of the past 33 seasons.

**The Nation's Best ...**

The Cougars' 1,001-278-5 all-time record makes them one of the best teams in the nation, ranking fourth in all-time wins through Sunday's matches. UCLA tops the list with 1,049 victories while Missouri State ranks second at 1,016 and Nebraska is third at 1,009. The Cornhuskers passed up the Cougars at the end of 2006 with their six-match run to the NCAA Tournament title. The top 10 is rounded out by Long Beach St. (981), Penn State (952), Hawai'i (946), Texas (916), Minnesota (908) and Texas-Arlington (904).

**Team Captains**

The BYU women's volleyball team has selected two captains for its 2007 season in seniors Chelsea Goodman and Annie Pinegar. Goodman also served as a co-captain last year with Lindsay Hartsock.

### Another Big Comeback for BYU

OGDEN, Utah (Sept. 18, 2007) -- In the first of four in-state matches this season, the No. 17 BYU women's volleyball proved its penchant for drama at Weber State Tuesday night, recording its second straight five-game win (28-30, 30-25, 28-30, 30-15, 19-17).

"I'm very proud of our team," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "We've proven time and again that we know how to handle ourselves in five-game situations. There are valuable lessons to learn now with the competitive nature of our remaining schedule."

Making the first start of her career in place of the resting Chelsea Goodman, true freshman Christy Carpenter scored the first point of the match for BYU with a kill through the seam after a 2-0 Wildcat lead. Carpenter then gave BYU its first lead of the night at 14-13 with a cross-court winner that left the Wildcats playing catch up. However, after trailing 20-16, the Wildcats made their push, scoring nine of the next 13 points to retake the lead at 25-24. WSU then rode the momentum and the home crowd to take the opening game, 30-28.

After storming back to force a fifth game after being down two games to one, it was Weber State who came out hot to start the decisive frame, going up 5-2 early in the shortened game. However, the Cougars fought back with a 5-1 run behind two kills from Dyer to take a 7-6 lead. After trading points to 8-7, the momentum shifted the other way with three straight winners from the Wildcats. From there, the two teams traded points until WSU earned a pair of match points at 14-12. Porter saved the first one with a cross-court kill from the left, and the Wildcats hit long on the next ball to extend the game. BYU saved three more match points before finally earning one of its own on a block from Lott and Ashton Hansen. Stephanie Lau then stepped to the service line and delivered the win for the Cougars with an ace.

### Five-Game Battle Goes to CSU

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 22, 2007) -- Despite winning the statistical battle and holding the nation's No. 4 hitter well below her average, No. 17 BYU came up on the short end of a five-game match with Colorado State Saturday night in the Smith Fieldhouse. The Cougars fall to 8-4 overall and 1-2 in the Mountain West Conference after suffering the 32-34, 31-33, 31-29, 30-22, 9-15 defeat. The Rams improve to 8-4 and 3-1 with the win.

Both teams had two game-point opportunities they couldn't convert during an extremely competitive game one before the Rams recorded the game winner at 34-32. When the second game started it didn't appear the final score would again be pushed beyond the 30-point mark. CSU claimed the early momentum while building solid leads at 8-2 and 11-4 before the Cougars turned the game around with an 8-0 run to take a one-point advantage.

BYU had three chances to even the match in the second game, but the Cougars couldn't put down a point with leads at 29-27 and again at 31-30. The Rams didn't fare any better on their first game-point opportunity at 30-29 but later rallied with the last three scores of the contest for the 33-31 win.

The Cougars seemed destined for a three-game defeat when the Rams held a 27-23 lead in game three. But Chelsea Goodman's kill on the next possession was the beginning of six straight Cougar points to give the Cougars their sixth game-point opportunity of the match at 29-27. Back-to-back Ram points evened the game at 29-29 before BYU finally broke through for the win at 31-29.

BYU never trailed in the fourth game while hitting a match-high .467 in a 30-22 win. With the Cougars leading 6-4 in the decisive fifth game, the Rams scored seven straight points during an 11-3 run to earn the 15-9 triumph.

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars began 2007 with an 88-28 regular-season record in eight years of MWC play after finishing second in 2006 with a 13-3 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and won again in 2005 with a 14-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. Utah won the 2005 title, and Colorado State took home the crown in 2006, both in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2006, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Colorado State (automatic) and Utah (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 23 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 18, SDSU with 13, Utah with nine, New Mexico with seven and Wyoming with four.

So far in 2007, BYU is the only MWC team currently ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll, coming in at No. 12. Utah began the season ranked but is now receiving votes along with Colorado State

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .812.

## JASON WATSON

### HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the team.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has compiled a 50-10 (.833) overall record while leading the Cougars to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and a return to the national rankings. He was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He returned to BYU in 2002 as an assistant head coach for the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001 and as an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight seasons. In addition to his 50-10 (.833) head-coaching record, Watson's team's compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson is only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnn Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

#### COACHING CAREER

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU women's volleyball head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1999. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best in school history. The winning trend continued in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second-round NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars finished the year ranked No. 20 in the nation, their first final national ranking since 2001.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the 2005 season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game.

In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartssock was second in the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both received AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition.



In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the MWC and were 13th and fifth in the nation in blocks per game in 2003 and 2004, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the Cougars had put up since 1997. Hartssock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by Collegiate Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable-mention All-America recognition as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No. 3 in school history) and a .245 team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts. Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.

#### PLAYING CAREER

As a player, Watson was a four-year starter and two-time captain from 1990-94 as the BYU men's program grew from its infancy to a national power. After a 2-25 season in the program's second year as an NCAA sport, the Cougars achieved a 21-6 record and No. 2 national ranking in Watson's senior season in 1994. Watson is still BYU's all-time assist leader with 4,649 and single-game assist record holder with 128 against Hawai'i on March 27, 1993. He was named a second-team American Volleyball Coaches Association All-American, Volleyball Magazine honorable-mention All-American and a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Third Team in 1994. He was a member of the Australian Men's National Team from 1990-91 and a member of the Junior National Team from 1987-90.

#### PERSONAL

A physical education and sports business management graduate of BYU in 1995, Watson is a native of Homebush, Australia. He and his wife, Larissa, have two sons and one daughter.

**2006 SEASON REVIEW**

The No. 20 BYU women's volleyball team continued its tradition of excellence in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second round NCAA Tournament appearance.

"I'm pleased with the progress we made this year," said BYU head coach Jason Watson, whose teams have gone 50-10 in his two years at the helm. "The season we were able to put together this year was representative of the direction we want the program to go. We feel like we have work to do, but we are going to get better."

The Cougars finished in second place in the Mountain West Conference with a 13-3 league record and spent the season ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Poll, ending the year at No. 20 after making their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance in the 26-year history of the Championship. The Smith Fieldhouse once again proved to be a dominant homecourt advantage as BYU went 12-1 on Elaine Michaelis Court during 2006 while setting a program attendance record with an average crowd of 1,902.

Injuries plagued the Cougars throughout the year as the team played 13 matches without the services of all of their starters. Sophomore setter Amy Schlauder sat out eight matches with a broken finger while junior rightside hitter Erica Lott missed two contests and sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer was unavailable on five occasions due to injury. However, despite going more than a month without their full starting rotation, the Cougars rallied around their teammates as several players stepped up and made the most of their playing opportunities, ensuring continued success.

BYU began the year taking consecutive tournament titles with three sweeps at the UCF Fall Invitational followed by a win over then-No. 4 Stanford, the eventual national runner-up, in Provo the next weekend in front of a record crowd of 4,050 while earning the BYU Molten Classic crown. The Cougars then took their 6-0 record on the road to the Jayhawk Invitational where they suffered their first defeat of the season against host Kansas after Schlauder broke her finger in the first game. But BYU bounced back the next day to beat Arkansas behind the play of back-up setter Jenna Judkins, who paced the Cougars to a 7-1 record in Schlauder's absence while leading the MWC in assists during her stint at the net.

After going 8-1 prior to starting league play, BYU won its first four conference matches, including its first home win over Colorado State since 2000. Without the services of Schlauder or Lott, however, the Cougars then suffered their only home loss of the year to in-state rival Utah in front of another record-breaking crowd of 4,455. But the loss was quickly forgotten with a seven-match winning streak, including four sweeps, that saw the Cougars improve to 19-2 overall and rise as high as No. 16 in the nation.

Unfortunately, BYU's winning streak came to an end when the Cougars suffered their only back-to-back defeats of the year at then-No. 9 Utah and at New Mexico. But BYU rebounded with five straight wins to end the regular season. As part of the run, the Cougars beat the Rams in Fort Collins, Colo., to complete the season sweep of CSU for the first time since 1995.

Postseason play did not begin as the Cougars hoped with an early exit from the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas, but the time off prepared BYU for a tough first round NCAA Tournament matchup against UC Santa Barbara in Los Angeles. The Cougars completed an incredible comeback from two games down to earn the five-game win behind the strength of Annie Kemp Pinegar's record-setting 42 digs, breaking the 22-year-old BYU mark. However, BYU could overcome host USC the following night, falling to the No. 6 Trojans to end the season with a 25-6 record.

In addition to being ranked No. 20 in the nation as a team to end the year, the Cougars finished 16th nationally in hitting percentage (.269), 24th in win/loss percentage (.806) and 33rd in blocks per game (2.96). Several individuals also excelled as Cougars led the MWC in four of the seven statistical categories tracked by the league including hitting percentage (Lindsay Hartsock), kills (Chelsea Goodman), assists (Schlauder) and points (Goodman). Hartsock ranked 17th nationally in hitting with a .389 mark while Schlauder ranked 24th in assists per game at 13.15 and Goodman was 43rd in the nation with 4.49 kills per game.
