Perfect BYU faces No. 14 Wisconsin in Tourney

After a huge win against No. 22 Texas Monday evening, the BYU women's soccer team (6-0-0) looks to keep the momentum as they head to Wisconsin for the Big Toe Soccer Invitational this weekend. The Cougars challenge No. 14 Wisconsin (4-1-1) on Friday at 6 p.m. (MDT), and on Saturday they face Colgate (3-2-0) at 3:30 p.m. (MDT). The games will be played in Madison, Wisc. Wisconsin

Wisconsin defeated Washington 2-1, Sunday at the Nike Invitational in Portland, Ore. Juniors Kara Kabellis and Allison Preiss each recorded their first goals of the season for the Badgers in the winning effort.

Wisconsin got on the board four minutes into the game when Preiss headed the ball into the net following a cross from Kabellis and Marisa Brown. The Badgers made it 2-0 at 26: 21 when Kabellis scored on a header of her own after a cross from Preiss. Wisconsin outshot Washington 2-0 in the first half and had a two-goal advantage at the half.

The Huskies pulled within one at 50:26 when Melissa Beal beat Wisconsin goalkeeper Lynn Murray. Murray came out of the net to attempt the save but Beal's shot to the lower left found its way in.

Despite being out shot 9-2 in the second half and 13-10 for the game, the Badgers managed to hang on to for the win.

Statistical Leaders: The Badgers offense is lead by Amy Vermeulen, who has scored four goals for eight points. Allison Preiss has assisted for three goals and scored one for her five points. Lynn Murray has recorded 25 saves in over 550 minutes of action.

Week in Review:

Beck Leads Offensive Attack Against Denver

In an extremely physical game, which included two Denver yellow cards in the first half and a head-to-head collision 45 seconds into the second, BYU defeated Denver, 2-0 on Friday, at South Stadium.

The first 30 minutes of action saw both teams struggling to find the back of the net, but Jaime Rendich Beck, who led the Cougar offense, had her opportunities.

Seven minutes into the game Beck received a touch pass from Katie Larkin at point-blank range. The goalkeeper dove to make the snatch. Moments later Beck again had the ball in the middle of the field, leaving a Pioneer defender flat-footed. The ball soared just over the crossbar.

BYU finally connected in the 35th minute. Brooke Thulin made her characteristic flip-throw that deflected off a Denver player, finding Beck right beside the goalpost. The header marked her third goal of the season.

The Cougars earned 11 shots on goal during the game, yet did not find their second goal until Katie Larkin received the ball on the left side of the goal, weaving in and out of three defenders on her way to a 35-yard sprint that resulted in her first goal of the season.

Cougars Knock Off No. 22 Texas

In front of 3,322 fans, the Cougars earned the sole goal of the game on their way to a 1-0 victory over No. 22 Texas Monday at South Stadium.

After coming off a 0-0 overtime tie against Michigan State last weekend, Texas looked to regain momentum against the Cougars, but BYU had its own ideas, out shooting the Longhorns 8-3 in the first half, including a 4-1 advantage in shots on goal.

In a game where both teams played with an extra sense of urgency, the Cougars had opportunities early. Carolyn Swenson outran two defenders minutes into the game to get a good look on goal, but the shot barely missed the crossbar. Moments later Katie Larkin also had a look as she showed fancy footwork during her run to the goal. Her shot missed wide.

Then Jaime Rendich Beck connected in the 25th minute for the only goal of the game. Bobbi Tillotson took a corner kick and lobbed the ball over to the far post. Beck headed the ball in for her fourth goal of the season.

The victory marked the Cougars first victory against a ranked opponent since 2003 when BYU beat Colorado 2-0, in the NCAA tournament on their way to the school's first elite eight appearance.

Record Breaking Attendance

The Cougar fans have shown undaunted support for the women's soccer team, as over 2,000 fans have attended each home game this year. An enormous crowd of 3,322 fans, the largest crowd in Cougar history was on hand to help BYU on its way to victory over No. 22 Texas on Monday. Over the past four games BYU has averaged an attendance of almost 2,600 fans.

South Stadium

South Stadium is the place the Cougars love to call home, a home all opponents hate to visit.

For the past ten years, South Stadium (formerly South Field), has been the battlefield for the Cougars as the team has taken on, and defeated, the top teams in their conference and in the NCAA.

The Cougars have amassed an 86-19-4 (.807) record at home, which is among the best in the nation over the same time period. Of those 86 home wins, an outstanding 47 have ended in a shutout.

BYU consistently manages to hold its opponents scoreless when playing at South Stadium with 43 percent of all the Cougars' wins ending in shutout victories, while BYU has been shutout only nine times in the stadium's history.

Aside from the Cougars' history of defeating tough teams at home, another factor making South Stadium a formidable place for opponents is the large and loud crowd of fans that pack the stadium at every game.

Consistently among the top 15 in the NCAA, South Stadium packs in some of the largest crowds in the country. With an average attendance of 1,191 fans during the 2004 campaign, the Cougars rank among the highest every year for largest attendance average in the country. BYU also packed in a total of 13,106 fans over 11 games, recording the second highest mark in the MWC and making South Stadium one of the toughest places for opponents to play in women's college soccer today.

Located just south of the Smith Fieldhouse, South Stadium boasts one of the best-maintained grass playing surfaces in the NCAA. The Wasatch Mountains serve as a scenic backdrop for the capacity crowd of 3,000 fans. South Stadium is also equipped with state-of-the-art field lights, making night games a favorite among fans.

The Rockwood File

After completing her tenth season, head coach Jennifer Rockwood has taken the BYU women's soccer team to national prominence and established herself as one of the premier coaches in Division I soccer today.

Rockwood currently ranks tenth in winning percentage among active NCAA coaches with an impressive 165-56-10 overall record for her career. Over the last ten seasons, Rockwood accumulated a .736 winning percentage.

In the past ten years, Rockwood has guided the Cougars to five conference championships. On the national scene, her teams have made seven appearances in the NCAA Tournament in the last eight years and reached the "Sweet Sixteen" in 1998, 2000 and 2003. The Cougars regularly maintain a consistent top-25 ranking. During Rockwood's tenure, the team finished in the top-10 three times, including a recent run in the 2003 NCAA College Cup. The tournament ended with BYU finishing No. 5 in the country after making their first "Elite Eight" appearance in the program's history.

Among the many achievements and awards she has received over her career, Rockwood has been honored with two Coach of the Year citations, one by the Western Athletic Conference in 1996, and again by the MWC in 2000. She also became the first MWC coach to eclipse the 100-win total mark when the Cougars shutout Milwaukee-Wisconsin 2-0 on Sept. 23, 2000.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Aleisha Rose, Jeni Viernes and Michelle Jensen. Among the players who have been coached by Rockwood are four additional All-American athletes that were drafted by the women's United Soccer Association: Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Rick's College on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management.

Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs, and the high school level.

Rockwood Among Coaching Elite

Rockwood currently ranks 10th in winning percentage among active NCAA Division I coaches with an impressive 165-56-10 (.735) overall record for her career. Anson Dorrance, Becky Burleigh, Jerry Smith, Chris Petrucelli, Len Tsantiris, John Walker, Randy Waldrum, G. Guerrieri and Patrick Farmer are the only coaches ahead of her.
