For the first time since 2000, the BYU women's volleyball team has advanced to the NCAA Tournament Regional Semifinals, one of only 16 teams in the nation remaining in the NCAA Championship. The Cougars will be playing Middle Tennessee State in the Round of 16 on Friday at 5 p.m. ET at Penn State University. Should BYU win, the Cougars will advance to a Regional Finals matchup on Saturday at 6:30 p.m. ET against either Michigan or No. 1 and third-seeded Penn State.

The Blue Raiders are 35-2 this season after recording a second-round upset of 11th-seeded Hawaii in the NCAA Tournament to advance to the program's first-ever Regional Semifinals. Junior rightside hitter Ashley Adams leads the team with 4.29 kills per game after posting 22 against the Rainbows. She is also second on the team with 2.44 digs per game and third at 1.13 blocks per game. Junior middle Ashley Asberry paces the Wolverines and ranks eighth in the nation hitting .412 and ranks 12 nationally with 1.50 blocks per contest, helping MTSU rank sixth and seventh, respectively, in those categories.

The Cougars advanced to the Regional Semifinals for the first time since 2000 with a first-round sweep of Ole Miss (30-27, 30-21, 30-24) and a five-game upset of sixth-seeded Washington (30-28, 28-30, 25-30, 30-22, 15-13) on the Huskies' home floor. Senior Chelsea Goodman recorded double-doubles in both matches while junior Rachel Dyer led a balanced Cougar attack with a career-high 22 kills against Washington. BYU hit .331 in the weekend, bolstered by a .708 mark from sophomore Ashton Hansen.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE STATE IN 2007

The Blue Raiders are 35-2 this season after recording a second-round upset of 11th-seeded Hawaii in the NCAA Tournament to advance to the program's first-ever Regional Semifinals. Junior rightside hitter Ashley Adams leads the team with 4.29 kills per game after posting 22 against the Rainbows. She is also second on the team with 2.44 digs per game and third at 1.13 blocks per game. Junior middle Ashley Asberry paces the Wolverines and ranks eighth in the nation hitting .412 and ranks 12 nationally with 1.50 blocks per contest, helping MTSU rank sixth and seventh, respectively, in those categories. Senior libero Alicia Lemau'u leads the team with 3.50 digs per game while sophomore setter Leslie Clark is sixth in the nation with 13.79 assists per game. As a team, the Blue Raiders outperform their opponents in every category, including kills (16.34-13.10), hitting percentage (.295-.138), assists (15.38-11.97), aces (1.65-1.34), digs (14.35-11.13) and blocks (3.34-2.49).

LAST OUTING

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (Dec. 1, 2007) - The Blue Raiders set school history on Saturday night advancing to the Sweet 16 for the first time in Middle Tennessee volleyball history in just its third appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Middle Tennessee defeated Hawai'i 3-1 (30-22, 30-18, 15-30, 33-32) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament hosted by Louisville to advance to the Penn State Regional of the NCAA Tournament.

Junior Ashley Adams led Middle Tennessee with 22 kills for a .306 hitting percentage. Adams also had eight block assists in the match. Junior Ashley Asberry added assistance with 18 kills for a .556 hitting percentage. Sophomore Ashley Mead also had double-digit kills for the Blue Raiders with 13.

Defensively, senior Alicia Lemau'u and freshman Izabela Kozon led Middle Tennessee with 18 and 15 digs respectively. Sophomore Sasha McGlothlin posted five block assists to help at the net while sophomore Leslie Clark notched 58 assists in the match to further assist the Blue Raiders.

As a team, Middle Tennessee knocked down 69 kills for a .241 hitting percentage with 13.5 blocks while the Rainbow Wahine posted a hitting percentage of .161 with 60 kills and 12 blocks.

PENN STATE IN 2007

The Nittany Lions are 30-2 this season with sweeps of Siena and Albany in the first and second rounds, respectively, of the NCAA Tournament. Penn State entered the Tournament ranked No. 1 in the nation and received the third seed. The Nittany Lions' outside hitting duo of sophomore Megan Hodge and junior Nicole Fawcett lead the team with 4.63 and 4.50 kills per game, respectively, helping PSU rank ninth in the nation in that category (17.15 kpg). Hodge is also second on the team with 2.65 digs per contest while junior libero Roberta Holehouse paces the Nittany Lions with 3.85 dpg. PSU is second in the nation in hitting percentage as four Nittany Lions are hitting over .400 on the year led by junior middle Christa Harmotto at .489, second in the country, with 3.10 kpg. Harmotto's 1.64 blocks per game ranks fifth nationally and helps Penn State rank second in the nation at 3.82 bpg.

LAST OUTING

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (Dec. 1, 2007) - Behind a school-record .602 hitting percentage, the top-ranked Penn State women's volleyball team pounded Albany in three games (30-15, 30-9, 30-19) Saturday night in NCAA Second Round action to advance to the NCAA Regional Semifinal match on Friday, Dec. 7 at Rec Hall.

"Tonight's match was similar to last night's in that the physical nature of some teams causes other teams some problems," said head coach Russ Rose. "We look forward to playing at home next weekend. This tournament is one-and-done and you have to be focused and concentrate, even if you have seen the team before, because it's an entirely different situation."

Junior outside hitter Nicole Fawcett (Zanesfield, Ohio) led all players with 17 kills on .538 hitting as junior middle hitter Christa Harmotto (Aliquippa, Pa.) collected 13 kills on .750 hitting and sophomore outside hitter Megan Hodge (Durham, N.C.) provided 11 kills without an error to hit .550. Redshirt freshman opposite Blair Brown (Purcellville, Va.) notched six kills on an errorless nine swings to hit .667 as sophomore setter Alisha Glass (Leland, Mich.), freshman middle hitter Arielle Wilson (Broadview, Ill.) and senior middle hitter Melissa Walbridge (Yardley, Pa.) recorded four, three and two kills, respectively. For the match, Penn State set a new rally-scoring-era hitting percentage record, attacking at a .602 clip, including hitting a combined .660 through the first two games.

MICHIGAN IN 2007

The Wolverines are 24-10 this year after recording an upset of 14-seed Colorado State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on Saturday, advancing to the Round of 16 for the first time in program history. Senior outside hitter Katie Bruzdzinski leads the team with 4.68 kills per game after going for 14 in the sweep of the Rams and a match-high 19 kills in a first-round sweep of Miami (Ohio). Bruzdzinski also adds 2.65 digs per game, third on the team, and posts 0.47 aces per contest to pace the Wolverines. Junior middle blocker Beth Karpiak is second for Michigan with 3.03 kpg on a team-best .338 hitting percentage. Karpiak is also the only Wolverine averaging more than one block per game at 1.08. Senior libero Stesha Selsky is 11th in the nation with 6.03 dpg. As a team, the Wolverines outperform their opponents in kills (16.42-13.94), hitting percentage (.237-.192), assists (15.18-12.83), aces (1.40-0.94) and digs (18.14-16.12).

(Dec. 1, 2007) -- The University of Michigan volleyball team upset the No. 21-ranked Colorado State Rams in three straight games (30-24, 30-27, 30-23) on Saturday, advancing to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in program history. In front of 1,364 fans at Crisler Arena, the Maize and Blue limited the Rams' offense throughout the contest, tallying 14 team blocks and registering six aces with just one service error.

Senior Katie Bruzdzinski (Naperville, Ill./Naperville North) led the attack for the Maize and Blue, notching a team-high 14 kills. Junior Beth Karpiak (La Grange, Ill./Lyons Township) came up big in the match, contributing nine terminations and eight blocks, while sophomore Megan Bower (Indianapolis, Ind./Cathedral) added a career-high seven blocks and tacked on eight kills in the winning effort.

Colorado State put pressure on Michigan early in the third game, trailing by no more than four points. However, with the game tied 12-12, Bruzdzinski gave the Wolverines a lead they would not relinquish. U-M quickly pulled ahead by six points aided by a pair of kills by Bower and freshman Maggie Busch's (Toledo, Ohio/Toledo Christian) first postseason ace and ended the final game with the 30-23 victory. Bower's four terminations led the Wolverine charge, with Zimmerman tacking on 10 assists. Both Bower and Miller had a pair of blocks to move U-M to the next round of NCAA play.

BYU is tied for eighth in all-time appearances with its 24th selection this season and is 11th all-time in NCAA Tournament victories with a 30-23 record, including two wins this season. Prior to this year, BYU's last appearance in the NCAA Tournament was last season when the Cougars defeated UC Santa Barbara in the first round before losing to fifth-seeded USC in the second round in Los Angeles.

Upset Sends BYU Into Round of 16

SEATTLE (Dec. 1, 2007) – For the first time since 2000, the BYU women's volleyball team is headed to the NCAA Tournament Regional Semifinals after a stunning five-game upset of No. 6 Washington. The 30-28, 28-30, 25-30, 30-22, 15-13 Cougar win was just the second loss of the year for the Huskies on their home floor as Washington became the highest-seeded team to lose in this year's tournament.

"Beating Washington at home is a tremendous accomplishment," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "We're as proud of our team as we've ever been. We were patient and composed when we could've let Washington get away from us."

Junior middle blocker Rachel Dyer led the way for BYU with a career-high 22 kills on .625 hitting to go along with six blocks. Senior Chelsea Goodman recorded yet another double-double, her 23rd of the season and 57th of her career, with 16 kills and 20 digs, the third time this year she has posted at least 20 digs. Three other Cougars tallied double-digit kills as Erica Lott (17), Ashton Hansen (13) and Bryn Porter (10) reached double figures. Hansen led the Cougars with a .706 attack percentage and six blocks.

The Cougars began slow in game one as they fought to find their place against the nation's sixth-ranked team. Down 18-13, BYU began to make a run, scoring four straight including back-to-back aces from Dyer to get to within one point. BYU continued to pressure Washington, eventually earning a 25-22 lead late in the game. The Huskies battled back to tie the game at 26-26, but three straight Cougar points gave BYU three game-point opportunities at 29-26. After losing the first two, the Cougars got the one that counted the most as Annie Pinegar sent a dig over that net that fell for a kill.

After an early battle in game two, the Cougars took a 7-5 lead on three straight points. Despite continued pressure by the Huskies, BYU soon had the lead up to five points at 21-16. But the Huskies responded to the BYU advance, scoring eight of the next 10 points to take their first lead since 5-4 at 24-23. From there, the two teams battled down the stretch with neither able to gain more than a one-point lead until three straight Husky scores gave them game point at 29-27. Hansen saved the first for BYU, but Washington got a kill on the next ball to take game two 30-28.

Washington came out fast and furious in game three, running up an early 5-1 lead before the Cougars called timeout. BYU scored three of the next four points out of the break but were thwarted in their comeback bid by a 5-0 Washington run leading to a 12-5 Husky lead. The advantage continued to grow for the home team until it became a 22-11 lead. The Cougars began to find life at that point, getting two kills and an ace from Goodman during a 10-3 run that cut the deficit to just four points at 25-21. But the early Husky lead proved insurmountable for BYU despite the late push as Washington got the 30-25 win.

With their backs against the wall, the Cougars came out fighting in game four, jumping out to an 8-5 lead. Three straight Husky scores knotted the score, but Lott responded with three consecutive winners of her own followed by a solo block to put BYU up 12-8. A Husky attack error kept the BYU run alive, and the Cougars soon found themselves with a 16-9 lead. A 4-0 Washington run allowed the Huskies to climb back in the game momentarily, but a .484 BYU attack percentage was too much for the Huskies as the Cougars powered to the 30-22 win.

For the third time in the last four matches, BYU found itself playing a fifth game for all the marbles. Washington scored three of the first four points, but the Cougars battled back with a 4-1 run to go up 5-4. The two teams fought tooth and nail as the lead see-sawed back and forth until BYU scored four straight points to go up 12-9. A raucous crowd tried to swing the momentum back in Washington's favor in the final stages, and the Huskies responded accordingly with back-to-back scores to cut the lead to just one point at 12-11. But Dyer came up big for the Cougars with back-to-back kills on the slide to give BYU match point at 14-12. A Cougar net call on the first point left BYU with just one more chance, but Goodman came flying in with a kill to give the Cougars a 15-13 win.

Cougars Cruise Into Second Round

SEATTLE (Nov. 30, 2007) – The BYU women's volleyball team opened up the 2007 NCAA Tournament with a 30-27, 30-21, 30-24 sweep of Ole Miss in the first round, its 12th three-game win of the season.

"I thought we definitely got better as the match progressed," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "We were able to identify some things during the match that needed to be upgraded and responded accordingly."

In recording their first NCAA sweep since 2003, the Cougars (22-7) advanced to the second round for the second straight year and play Saturday at 6 p.m. PT against the winner of the evening match between sixth-seeded Washington and Missouri.

"We felt a lot more comfortable having been here the last three years," said Watson. "We know better what to expect and how to prepare. The challenge tomorrow is to build on what we did tonight."

Senior Chelsea Goodman recorded her 22nd double-double of the year and 56th of her career with 17 kills and 13 digs, leading the way for BYU in both categories. Senior Erica Lott also posted double-digit kills with 13 while Ashton Hansen tallied nine blocks to lead the Cougar defense. BYU setter Amy Schlauder helped the Cougars record a .321 hitting percentage and improve to 12-0 on the year when attacking over .300.

Hansen got BYU off to a fast start with a kill on the first serve as the Cougars scored the first eight points of game one. Goodman's serving run included two aces and three kills from Lott until Ole Miss finally got on the board at 8-1. The Cougars continued to apply pressure to earn a 13-6 lead, however, an Ole Miss run got the Rebels to within two points at 13-11, prompting a BYU timeout. Back-to-back Cougar scores out of the break swung the momentum in BYU's favor, and the advantage quickly grew to 27-20. But the Rebels scored six of the next seven points to once again cut the lead to two points at 28-26 and prompt another Cougar timeout. Goodman came out of the break with her seventh kill of the game to give BYU game point at 29-26, and Lott put it away at 30-27.

The Cougar defense was responsible for three of the first five points of game two as BYU put up three blocks while jumping out to a 4-1 lead. However, Ole Miss was ready for the Cougar attack this time and fought back to within one at 6-5. Lott put down a winner to maintain the BYU lead, but the Rebels stayed close until finally taking their first lead of the match at 17-16 in game two. Three straight Cougar points put BYU back in front at 19-17, and the Cougars cruised after a 20-20 tie, scoring 10 of the last 11 points in the game to take a 30-21 win.

Game three was a battle from the start as the Cougars pushed for the sweep and Ole Miss fought to keep its season alive. BYU was the first to earn more than a two-point lead with a 4-0 run to go up 16-11 thanks in part to two service aces by Annie Pinegar. Ole Miss got back to within two points at 17-15, but Bryn Porter stopped the Rebel advance with a cross-court kill on the next ball. The Rebels stayed close, but the Cougars kept their composure and weathered the Ole Miss attack, posting the 30-24 win.

NCAA First and Second Rounds In Review:

The Cougars advanced to the Regional Semifinals for the first time since 2000 with a first-round sweep of Ole Miss (30-27, 30-21, 30-24) and a five-game upset of sixth-seeded Washington (30-28, 28-30, 25-30, 30-22, 15-13) on the Huskies' home floor. Senior Chelsea Goodman recorded double-doubles in both matches while junior Rachel Dyer led a balanced Cougar attack with a career-high 22 kills against Washington. BYU hit .331 in the weekend, bolstered by a .708 mark from sophomore Ashton Hansen.

MWC Player of the Week - Erica Lott

After twisting her ankle at UNLV in the semifinals of the MWC Tournament, senior rightside hitter Erica Lott came up big for the Cougars in the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament. She posted 13 kills on .385 hitting in a first-round sweep of Ole Miss while coming one dig away from a double-double with nine digs. Against No. 6 Washington, she tallied 17 kills on .303 hitting with 12 digs. She came up big for BYU in a must-win game four as she posted three straight kills and a solo block to give BYU an early lead it would ride to a 30-22 win. On the week, Lott averaged 3.75 kills on .339 hitting to go along with 2.62 digs per game.

Winning With Watson

BYU head coach Jason Watson has compiled an impressive 73-17 (.811) record in his three seasons at the BYU helm, including a 39-9 mark in the Mountain West Conference. Watson coached his team to the league title in 2005 while earning Coach of the Year honors and has led BYU to three straight NCAA Tournament berths. After a three-year absence prior to his hiring, Watson's teams have been ranked in 33 of 45 weekly AVCA Top 25 Coaches Polls, including a No. 9 ranking this season, the program's highest since 1999.

The Nation's Best ...

The Cougars' 1,016-281-5 all-time record entering the week makes them one of the best teams in the nation, ranking fourth in all-time wins through Saturday's matches. UCLA tops the list with 1,059 victories while Missouri State and Nebraska are tied for second with 1,028 wins each. The top 10 is rounded out by Long Beach St. (1,000), Penn State (972), Hawai'i (962), Texas (936), Minnesota (917) and Texas-Arlington (914).

BYU Reaches 1,000-Victory Mark

The BYU women's volleyball team celebrated a significant milestone on Sept. 15 as the Cougars became just the fourth program in NCAA volleyball history to record 1,000 wins. BYU's landmark 1,000th victory, which came at San Diego State, puts the Cougars in elite company with UCLA, Nebraska and Missouri State as the only programs to reach the 1,000-win mark. In the world of collegiate volleyball, few schools have a volleyball tradition as successful as the history of the sport at BYU, whose all-time record is now 1,014-281-5 (.782). In the 38 seasons of its recorded history prior to this year, the Cougars have only suffered one losing season and have won 20 or more matches in 31 of the past 33 seasons.

Measure of Success

The Cougars will be looking to keep several streaks alive this week as BYU is 12-0 when winning the first two games and 13-0 when attacking over .300. BYU is 21-1 when outperforming its opponents in kills, 21-2 when besting foes in hitting percentage and 14-1 when posting more aces.

Comeback Kids

BYU has played nine five-game matches this season, going 7-2 in those matches after defeating No. 6 Washington in five games in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Three of BYU's last four matches have gone the distance. Before losing to Colorado State in five games on Sept. 22, the Cougars had won four straight matches when forcing a fifth game after being down including at Weber State (down 1-2), at San Diego State (down 0-2) and at Iowa (down 0-2) this season and against UC Santa Barbara (down 0-2) in the 2006 NCAA Tournament first round. BYU is now 17-4 in five-game matches under head coach Jason Watson.

Double the Fun

With 57 career double-doubles to date, Chelsea Goodman has set the Mountain West Conference record in that category, surpassing Wyoming's Michele Rauter, who had 47 from 2000-03. Goodman has recorded 23 double-doubles this season, including one in 15 of the last 16 matches, after posting an MWC-leading 18 double-doubles last year out of 29 matches in which she played. BYU's Erica Lott also appears on the active list with 29 double-doubles in her Cougar career, including 12 so far in 2007.

BYU In the Polls

The Cougars jumped back into the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll this week at at No. 17 after their upset of No. 6 Washington in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. BYU began this season ranked No. 17 and has been ranked as high as No. 9 this year. BYU has a rich history of rankings in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. Among NCAA Division I programs entering the 2007 season, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (279) and 11th in weeks ranked in the top 10 (122) and weeks ranked No. 1 (4). The Cougars have also traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in both weeks ranked in the final poll (20) and weeks ranked in the top five to end the year (3) and tied for sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1).

Rivals in the Rankings

Four Cougar opponents appear in the most recent rankings. Wisconsin, whom the Cougars defeated in the Molten Classic, is ranked No. 12 while Stanford comes in at No. 4 and Cal Poly is No. 11 this week (both teams beat BYU in the Stanford Invitational). MWC rivals Colorado State and UNLV are receiving votes after falling out of the polls. Washington was ranked No. 10 after the loss to the Cougars. BYU is 3-3 this season against ranked opponents and 2-2 against teams currently ranked.

Home Sweet Home

The Cougars finished the regular season 10-2 in the Smith Fieldhouse with an attendance average of 1,739 fans, 17th in the nation. A BYU women's volleyball record crowd of 4,509 fans saw BYU sweep Utah on Nov. 9. The fourth-largest crowd in program history (3,880) attended the Cougars' home opener against No. 10 Wisconsin on Aug. 31. The Cougars are now 470-84 (.848) all-time at home and 32-3 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the last three years.

Oh Goody

As she nears the completion of her Cougar career, senior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman is looking to leave her mark on the BYU and MWC record books. The Mesa, Ariz., native is already seventh all-time at BYU in career kills (1461) and sixth in career digs (1090) with at least one match left to play. Her current 3.53 digs per game average this season ranks fourth all-time. Goodman already set the MWC career double-double record earlier this season and continues to add to her total, which is currently 57. Her career-kill mark is fifth all-time in league history while her 3.90 kills per game over her four-year career comes in fourth in MWC history and fifth in the BYU record book.

Team Records

In addition to several individual marks this season, the Cougars have left their mark on the team record book with their performance in two categories this season. BYU's 26.0 blocks per game at Utah ranks fourth all-time in Cougar history while the 52 block assists that contributed to that mark is third. This year's team is also on pace to break the BYU season assist average record at 15.42.

Good For Goodman

Senior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman has had another outstanding campaign for the Cougars after earning All-America honorable mention last year. This season, she leads the team with 4.40 kills per game while adding 3.53 digs per game, which ranks fourth all-time at BYU. She has posted 23 double-doubles to bring her MWC-record career total to 57. She posted the first triple-double by a BYU player since 2004 at Utah with 21 kills, 11 digs and 12 blocks, doubling her previous career-best blocking mark. She has topped the 20-kill mark seven times and the 20-digs mark three times while leading BYU in kills in 21 matches and digs on nine occasions. She has double-digit kills in every match she has played in this season.

Heralding Hansen

Sophomore middle blocker Ashton Hansen has had a breakout year for BYU as she is hitting .394 on the year and averaging 1.45 blocks per game. Her hitting efficiency ranks 25th nationally while her blocking tally is 35th. In BYU's two NCAA Tournament matches, she is hitting .708 with 2.38 kills per game and posting 1.88 rejections per contest. She has notched one double-double on the year while topping the 10-block mark twice and has recorded double-digit kills in three of the last four matches.

Flyer Dyer

Junior middle blocker Rachel Dyer has built on the All-Region campaign she had a year ago as she leads the team and ranks seventh in the nation with a .414 hitting percentage. Dyer also posts 1.30 blocks per game, which ranks 56th nationally. She has led BYU in attack efficiency 12 times, blocks 16 times and kills five times while recording double-digit kills in 23 matches, including two with over 20 kills. In BYU's five-game upset of No. 6 Washington, Dyer tallied a career-best 22 kills on .625 hitting while tying for team-high honors with six blocks. She has posted four double-doubles on the year.

Getting a Lot From Lott

Senior rightside hitter Erica Lott has come on strong for BYU as the year has progressed, averaging 3.41 kills and 2.46 digs per game on the season. She has tallied 12 double-doubles, including one in six of the last seven matches, while posting double-digit kills 24 times and double-digit kills 12 times. In BYU's two NCAA Tournament matches, she is hitting .339 with 3.75 kills and 2.62 digs per game.

Schlauder Setting Up a Cougar Run

Despite battling injury for much of the season, junior setter Amy Schlauder has been a quiet but driving force behind the Cougars' success. She has posted four double-doubles on the year, including one in three of the last five matches, while helping BYU rank 22nd nationally with a .271 hitting percentage. In the Cougars' upset of No. 6 Washington on Saturday, she put up a career-best 71 assists while pacing BYU to a .337 hitting mark over the host Huskies, helping to knock Washington off on its home floor for just the second time all year and preventing the Huskies from advancing to a possible fourth-straight Final Four. BYU is hitting .331 so far in this year's NCAA Tournament.

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars began 2007 with an 88-28 regular-season record in eight years of MWC play after finishing second in 2006 with a 13-3 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and won again in 2005 with a 14-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. Utah won the 2005 title, and Colorado State took home the crown in 2006, both in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2006, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Colorado State (automatic) and Utah (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 23 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 18, SDSU with 13, Utah with nine, New Mexico with seven and Wyoming with four.

Three MWC teams have been ranked in 2007 as BYU, Colorado State and UNLV have represented the league in the AVCA Coaches' Top 25 Poll.

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .809.

MWC Sends Three Teams to NCAA Tournament

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Committee announced the field for the 2007 Women's Volleyball Championship, Sunday, November 25 and Mountain West Conference members BYU, Colorado State and UNLV were among the 64 teams. The Rebels earned the automatic bid after winning the 2007 MWC Volleyball Championship, while the 20th-ranked Rams and Cougars were at-large selections.

UNLV (24-5 overall) will be making its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. The Rebels open play vs. Long Beach State (25-6) on Friday, November 30, at 5 p.m. PT at the Galen Center in Los Angeles, Calif. No. 5 seed USC (25-4) vs. Pepperdine (18-10) is the other match of the evening with the first serve scheduled for 7 p.m. PT. The first-round winners will meet in the second-round Saturday, December 1, at 7 p.m. PT.

No. 20 Colorado State makes its 19th overall and 13th straight NCAA Tournament appearance. CSU enters the tournament with a 22-7 record and garners its first national seed since the 2004 season. The Rams travel to Ann Arbor, Mich., and open with Illinois State (21-11) in the first round at Crisler Arena on Friday, November 30, at 5 p.m. CT. The winner of the Rams vs. Redbirds match will face Michigan (22-10) or Miami (Ohio) (20-10) in the second round on Saturday, December 1, at 7 p.m. CT.

BYU (21-7) makes its 16th tournament appearance in 17 years and 24th appearance all-time this season. The Cougars be in Seattle, Wash., for the first and second rounds where they will start tournament play with a match vs. Mississippi (25-7) on Friday, November 30 at 4:30 p.m. PT at Bank of America Arena on the campus of the University of Washington. The tournament's No. 6 seed Washington (26-3) hosting Missouri (17-12) will start at 7 p.m. PT on Friday. The winners of the first two matches will meet in the second round on Saturday, December 1, at 6 p.m. PT.

JASON WATSON

HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the team.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has compiled a 50-10 (.833) overall record while leading the Cougars to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and a return to the national rankings. He was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He returned to BYU in 2002 as an assistant head coach for the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001 and as an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight seasons. In addition to his 50-10 (.833) head-coaching record, Watson's team's compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson is only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnn Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

COACHING CAREER

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU women's volleyball head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1999. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best in school history. The winning trend continued in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second-round NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars finished the year ranked No. 20 in the nation, their first final national ranking since 2001.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the 2005 season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game.

In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartssock was second in the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both received AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition.



In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the MWC and were 13th and fifth in the nation in blocks per game in 2003 and 2004, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the Cougars had put up since 1997. Hartssock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by Collegiate Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable-mention All-America recognition as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No. 3 in school history) and a .245 team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts. Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.

PLAYING CAREER

As a player, Watson was a four-year starter and two-time captain from 1990-94 as the BYU men's program grew from its infancy to a national power. After a 2-25 season in the program's second year as an NCAA sport, the Cougars achieved a 21-6 record and No. 2 national ranking in Watson's senior season in 1994. Watson is still BYU's all-time assist leader with 4,649 and single-game assist record holder with 128 against Hawai'i on March 27, 1993. He was named a second-team American Volleyball Coaches Association All-American, Volleyball Magazine honorable-mention All-American and a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Third Team in 1994. He was a member of the Australian Men's National Team from 1990-91 and a member of the Junior National Team from 1987-90.

PERSONAL

A physical education and sports business management graduate of BYU in 1995, Watson is a native of Homebush, Australia. He and his wife, Larissa, have two sons and one daughter.
