Second Time Around With Broncos

PROVO, Utah (March 1, 2005) – After a successful weekend for the Cougars, BYU and BSU will meet again this Friday at the Taco Bell Arena in Boise at 7 p.m.

“It’s really fun going to Boise,” said Head Coach Brad Cattermole. “It’s a short trip and we enjoy it.”

This last weekend’s meet was a win for the Cougars but they still moved down one spot in the rankings to 14th. BSU moved up to No. 33. The Cougars ended a short 194 scoring run and beat BSU 195.525-194.075.

Currently in the rankings BYU is sixth on vault, a top ten ranking they have held all season. BYU’s next strongest event is beam (13th) followed by floor (16th). On vault, senior Marie-Helene Claveau is ranked 14th followed by Jamie Mabray at 24 and Kirsten Pauga at 27.

The last time the Broncos won was on Valentine’s Day in 2003.

Last Week...

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 26, 2005) – The Cougars are back on track after beating Boise State tonight in the Marriott Center 195.525-194.075.

Though none of the team scores tonight were season highs, they were enough to pull the third highest total team score of the season.

On vault, the Cougars performed their very best as they are known for doing. Keeping with a common tradition, BYU took the top spots. Marie-Helene Claveau finished first with a 9.900 followed by fellow senior Jamie Mabray (9.875). Alethea Boon continues to be a stronghold in the vault lineup and took fourth with 9.850. On the Bronco's side, Kea Cuaresma tied for second and earned a season high. BYU finished overall with 49.275.

Moving on to bars, the Cougars landed all of their routines and did not suffer the falls of last week. Mabray came in first with 9.825 with BSU's Carla Chambers tying and Lindsay Ward finishing third (9.800). Mabray's first place finish was also a season high. In fourth was BYU's Cassandra Myers with 9.750 in only her third collegiate appearance. Final score: BYU 48.600, BSU 48.500.

Beam, usually a strong event for the Cougars, proved to be tough for BYU tonight. BSU's Ward took the top spot with 9.875. However, BYU took the next five spots with Dayna Smart leading (9.775). Jamie Mabray (9.750), Kandis Kelly (9.725), Marie-Helene Claveau (9.725), and Kacie Capra (9.675) rounded up the top six. BYU finished with 48.650 with BSU coming in at 47.900.

Though the score does not reflect it, BYU had some of the strongest performances on floor. Once again Jamie Mabray had a beautiful performance that landed her first place (9.875). Kirsten Pauga finished second and earned a 9.850 which tied her career high. Kandis Kelly performed for the first time on floor and proved she deserved to, coming in third (9.825). BSU's Ward once again led the team, coming in fourth (9.825) and earning a career high. The Cougars closed the meet with a 49.000 to BSU's 48.700.

On the Injury List

Senior Genevieve Claveau is favoring a sore knee. She tore her ACL and had surgery on it last year. She may be pulled from some of her usual events.

Senior Marie-Helene Claveau has a sore shoulder. She will not be competing bars and therefore not in the all-around competition.

Junior Lisa Willis has been out most of the season because of chronic fatigue or overtraining syndrome. She competed in Cancun and against SUU but is out for the rest of the season.





Head Coach Brad Cattermole

Brad Cattermole begins his 17th season as the head coach of BYU gymnastics. Cattermole has quietly built the Cougar program into a respected national power.

He has since guided the Cougars to school records in nine of the last 12 years, missing record marks only with 1994, 1995 and 1998, when injuries and more stringent scoring kept numbers down.

After taking over the program midway through the 1988 season, he promptly led the Cougars to the first 185 in school history. In 1998, the Cougars broke the 196 barrier for the first time, hitting a 196.325 against Utah in the final meet of the season in Provo. In 2000, once again in Provo, Cattermole's squad broke 196 for the second time, pulling off an upset victory over the University of Utah by a score of 196.05 to 195.975 in the last meet of the season. In 2001, the Cougars shattered all school records, surpassing the 196 mark five different times, a mark they had only reached three times in history. On March 16, 2001 against Utah State at home, BYU reached the 197 mark for the first time in history with a 197.325. Then one week later they broke that record again with a 197.375 at Utah, a full 1.450 points higher than any score they had received on the road. In the record-setting season, BYU set new team highs in each event and in the all-around. In 2004, the Cougars again set a new standard, scoring a record 198.025 at Utah State. During that same year, the team also set record high scores of 49.625 on vault, 49.675 on beam and 49.675 on floor.

Before conference meets were eliminated in 1994, Cattermole's teams were league runner-ups five times and seven athletes earned 10 all-conference honors. Seven gymnasts have earned 17 NCAA All-America awards under his tutelage.

His recruiting efforts have netted five U.S. National Team members, five Canadian National Team members and numerous Junior Olympic National and Elite champions.

As vault coach, he led Christy McAdams to the Cougars' first perfect 10.0 score. In 2003, Kari Dye-Lords scored a perfect 10.0 on balance beam and Brogan Jacobsen scored a perfect 10.0 on her scintillating floor routing against Southern Utah, Utah State and Central Michigan. In 2004, Jaime Mabray shared in the tradition, scoring a perfect 10.0 on vault against Texas Woman's University and Air Force.

Along with his duties at BYU, Cattermole owns and operates All-American Gymnastics in Orem. Highly successful since its establishment in 1976, All-American has earned more State Class I and Class II championships than any other club in Utah. Several athletes - former stars Marianne Williams Squires, Kelli Rose-Rhyssman, Korie Jackman, Cristen Cosgrave-Barlow, Angela Gunnell Anderson and Jessica Nelson-Taylor earned national club honors while competing for All-American gymnasts.

Born in Stormlake, Iowa, Cattermole grew up in Los Angeles. He competed on the 1971 BYU men's gymnastics team. Following his freshmen year, he left school to serve an LDS mission to Peru. His competitive career ended when he broke his hand in practice shortly after returning from his mission. He was a part-time assistant women's gymnastics coach at BYU and part-time coach at Provo Gymnastics during the 1975-76 season while he continued his schooling at BYU.

He is married to Dawn Niedert and they have three boys - Brad 27, Brett 24, and Mark 20. Brett is married and has two dogs, and Brad recently married Christy Garner. Mark is currently serving an LDS mission in Iceland.
