Cougar Softball Back at Gail Miller Field (April 8, April 10)

The BYU softball team (20-11, 2-2) will play host to Southern Utah (23-12, 6-2) and the University of Utah (10-21, 2-2) this week to mark its third and fourth home games of the season. The Cougars will face the Thunderbirds on Thursday, April 8 at 5 p.m. and battle the rival Utes in a conference doubleheader on Saturday, April 10 starting at 2 p.m. at Gail Miller Field.

"These games will be two stern tests for us," BYU head coach Gordon Eakin said. "We'll have to play well to come out on top."

After Thursday night's game fans are invited to stay at Gail Miller Field for a free country concert. Ty Perry and his band "Ty Perry and the Broken Bow Band" will be setting up in the fifth inning and performing after the game. Fans are encouraged to come to the game early, before the fifth inning, if they want to get a good seat.

A live audio cast will be available on April 10 against Utah by clicking on the BYU softball schedule page. Jay Monsen will provide the play-by-play. The live audio cast is also available on Direct TV and the Dish Network through the BYU Radio Channel.

After playing six games last week, BYU comes into the games this week posting a 20-11, 2-2 record. The Cougars are coming off two wins over Utah Valley State College (15-2, 11-1) and a split with conference schools UNLV (L 6-3, W 5-3) and San Diego State University (W 6-2, L 5-2).

During the conference match ups, Ashlyn Russell led BYU batting .444 (4-9), with one double, two home runs and two RBI. Five Cougars also batted .300 or better for the MWC opening weekend.

As a team, BYU is batting .295 with 31 home runs in 31 games. Defensively, the Cougars have posted 14 double plays already this season, which ties the season record of 14 in 2002. Freshman Jodi Norton currently leads the Cougars with a .329 batting average, eight doubles and 22 RBI.

The pitching squad is posting a 3.05 overall ERA. Junior Niki Andersen who's coming off back-to-back MWC Pitcher of the Week honors (March 23, 30) stepped up for the Cougars last week to pitch 21.2 innings against UNLV and SDSU on a sprained ankle. Ariel Capra contributed 5.1 innings, and the return of pitcher Brooke Boyce is day-to-day.

The Thunderbirds are coming into this week's games with a 23-12, 6-2 record. SUU will have a big week ahead of them as they will play a doubleheader at Utah State on Wednesday at 1 p.m. followed by single games at BYU on Thursday at 5 p.m. and Utah on Friday at 3 p.m. This will be the Cougars first match up with the Thunderbirds this season.

Second baseman/pitcher Lacee LePrey leads SUU at the plate batting .355 with 13 doubles, four home runs and 19 RBI on the season. Kristen Carmichael is hitting .326 with a team-high 21 RBI, while Anna Leeman has 10 doubles thus far with team-highs of five home runs and 30 runs scored. LePrey also leads the pitchers with a 16-4 record and a 2.27 overall ERA. Sophomore Mandy Brown is 6-6 on the year with a 3.28 overall ERA.

"Southern Utah will be a good test for us," Eakin said. "They're a good team with a veteran pitcher."

The Utes come into this week with a 10-21, 2-2 record. Like the Cougars, the Utes are coming off a split with conference opponents UNLV and SDSU. Leading Utah offensively is shortstop Glennis Donnelly batting .444, with 44 hits, 12 doubles, 11 home runs and 28 RBI. Teammates Melissa Stahnke and Devina Quintero are posting .319 and .315 batting averages, respectively. As a team, the Utes are batting .234 and post a 3.84 ERA. Brianna Gourdin leads the pitching staff with a 2.72 ERA, an 8-3 record and 46 strikeouts in 82.1 innings.

"Any Utah-BYU game is very competitive regardless of the sport, and this weekend won't be any different," Eakin said. "The rivalry will help enhance the competition."

2004 Preview

The Cougars enter the 2004 season to battle for their second Mountain West Conference title in four seasons and a shot at the World Series after posting the best record (36-17) in the program's history last season.

Last season's success earned BYU four offensive top-10 national rankings in team batting average (7th), scoring (8th), slugging percentage (4th) and home runs pergame (6th).

"I think we'll compete at a high level this year," BYU head coach Gordon Eakin said. "We have great team chemistry and we have players stepping up from all areas."

The team chemistry and depth of this year's team will help mitigate the loss of those quality players lost, some of which were impact players. After a successful fall softball season, the team looks to be stepping up to the challenge of filling the shoes of those who have gone on before them.
