TOURNAMENT PLAY CONTINUES IN FRESNO

PROVO, Utah (March 11, 2009) – The BYU softball team, 14-11, heads to Tampa, Fla., for the USF Underarmour Showcase, where the Cougars are slated to play four games beginning on Friday.

“We are excited to continue to play at the level we have been performing at,” BYU head coach Gordon Eakin said. “I’m pleased with the way the team has been playing and we’re improving as we inch closer to conference play.”

The Cougars will first face Hofstra, 4-8, on Friday at 4 p.m. (ET). In BYU’s only meeting with Hofstra in 2001, when they closed the season with a 4-2 defeat.

In the nightcap of the day’s events BYU will play Indiana, 1-15, at 6 p.m. (ET). The Cougars lead the all-time series 2-1.

Saturday’s doubleheader begins with a 1 p.m. (ET) game against East Tennessee State, 8-6. The Cougars trail the all-time record 1-5. East Tennessee State will proved to be a tough competitor, winning eight of its last 10 games.

The Showcase will close with a 4 p.m. (ET) matchup against Florida Gulf Coast, 25-4. The meeting between the two will be the first. Florida Gulf Coast will also be a competitive opponent as it is on a 17-game winning streak.

The team heads into the event after a 4-1 showing at the Bayer Cropscience Classic. BYU earned the honor of Tournament Champions, while Jessica Purcell was deemed Tournament MVP and Paige Affleck was named to the All-Tournament team.

Purcell was also honored as MWC Player of the Week after batting .526 with 9 RBI over the tournament.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

- The Cougar finished last week 1-4 falling only to No. 9/10 Cal. BYU also defeated No. 21/24 Fresno State in a 10-inning, combined no hitter. The Cougars were deemed Tournament Champs after their performance.

- Jessica Purcell was named the Bayer Cropscience Classic MVP and MWC Player of the Week after hitting .526 with 9 RBI, 10 hits, 4 doubles, 1 triple and 2 home runs.

- Paige Affleck also earned a position on the All-Tournament Team after going 3-0 with a 0.76 ERA over the weekend.

REMEMBERING LARRY H. MILLER

As a long-time fast pitch softball supporter, Larry H. Miller made significant contributions to the BYU softball team. The Cougars are proud of the baseball/softball complex that bears the Miller name. The softball team is wearing LHM patches on their uniforms in honor and gratitude to Miller. Both head coach Gordon Eakin and assistant coach Vaughn Alvey played on the Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch Softball Team.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Cougars are 24 games into a 33-game road trip to begin the season. The team travels as far as Tampa, Fla., to compete during their tournament schedule. BYU opens its home season on March 24 against Boise State at 4 p.m.

VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

The Cougars are now 1-6 against opponents ranked in the top-25 at the time of the game. BYU faced No. 3/3 Washington (Then No. 15) in a 7-3 defeat before falling 0-4 in 10 innings against No. 6/7 Tennessee (Then No. 12) at the Red Desert Classic. BYU dropped a 4-2 game to No.10/10 Michigan, before taking on No. 2/2 Alabama in a 6-0 loss (then No. 1/1). BYU also dropped a game to No. 18/17 Louisville (then RV). The Cougars won their first game against a ranked opponent with an extra-inning no hitter against No. 21/24 Fresno State (21/24) before falling to No. 9/11 Cal (9/10).

THE BIG THREE

Jessica Purcell, Andrea Ramirez and Angeline Quiocho represent the three Cougar sluggers on the rosters. The three have combine for 18 home runs with 133 total bases. With all three hitters in the heart of the BYU lineup opposing pitchers can be wary as one of the three is sure to drive in some runs.

DID YOU KNOW...

- This year BYU carries two married players: Stephanie Hopkins and Whitney Nix-Thomas.
- The BYU softball program began in 2000, and the team has had eight-straight winning seasons.
- BYU has had four-consecutive berths to the NCAA Regional Tournament.
- During the program's existence it has carried six different All-Americans, including Jodi Norton and Jennifer Whitely from the 2007 MWC Champions.

CORNER**

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin is enjoying his seventh season at the helm of the Cougar softball team. Eakin holds a 67.9 winning percentage through the six-plus season and has directed the team to four-straight NCAA Tournament Appearances.

MILESTONE COACHING WIN

During the Lousivilee Slugger Classic BYU head coach Gordon Eakin earned his 250th win with a 8-0 victory over Virginia. As the second coach in BYU history, he is the winningest coach in Cougar history.

NATIONAL TEAM COACHES POOL

The Amateur Softball Association of America and USA Softball announced that Eakin is one of 14 coaches selected to the 2009 Women's National team coaching pool. The coaches have been selected for the 2009-2012 quadrennium and are responsible for the training and preparation of the national team. The final selection will be released at a later date.

COUGARS IN THE CONFERENCE

BYU and San Diego State are expected to contend for the MWC title according to a vote by the league coaches. The Cougars and Aztecs each received three first-place votes to finish in a tie for first in the pre-season poll.

BACK IN THE SADDLE

BYU junior Andrea Ramirez made her return to the diamond in St. George. Ramirez sat out the 2008 season following knee surgery. During her freshman campaign she was named to the MWC All-Conference team.

HOME SWEET HOME

The back-to-back Miller Park facility will host six dates when both baseball and softball compete at the same time. Larry H. Miller Field seats 2,204 fans in two-tiered permanent seating for baseball. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility.

THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN

The seven freshman on the roster have already begun to make significant contributions to the Cougars. Eakin expects all of the rookies to continue to make impacts both with their defense, their speed and their strength at the plate. Six of the seven have made starting appearances.
