2006 Run In Preseason WNIT

The Cougar team ended their run in this year's Preseason WNIT with a disappointing 58-84 loss to No. 16 Baylor on Thurs. Nov. 16. BYU had advanced to the Final Four after a 73-50 home victory over Idaho State on Nov. 10 and then a come from behind 55-52 upset victory over No. 4 Stanford. Dani Kubik Wright was named to the All-Tournament Team.

Cougars Team Summary

After compiling the best season record in school history (26-6), making their seventh postseason NCAA Championships appearance and clinching the 2006 MWC Regular Season Champion crown, the BYU team looks to take that success and winning attitude into the 2006-07 year.



BYU returns a nucleus of four starters and five letterwinners that will make this year's squad tough to beat during its non-conference and league schedules.

Once again the Cougars should finish at the top of the MWC standings, leading the way to an eighth appearance in the NCAA Championships and advancing further in that national tournament.

◆ 2006-07 Highlights ◆

- → The Cougars non-conference road record finished at 4-4.
- → With the 54-49 win @ SDSU on 01/25/07, the team improved to 12-0 when leading at the half.
- → BYU is 11-2 when outrebounding opponents. (Outrebounded Utah 38-35 on 01/27/07, and on 12/30/06 at Oregon, 37-29 but loss both games.
- → The 11 turnovers BYU had vs. UNLV on 01/20/07 were the lowest of the year. They had 13 vs. CSU on 01/18/07.
- → The nine blocks at SDSU on 01/25/07 are a new team high.
- → The Cougars have had three players scoring in double figures in six games, most recently (vs. CSU, vs. WY, @ AF, @ Oregon, vs. UCR, @ Baylor). BYU has won all but two (Baylor, Oregon) of those games.
- ◆ Seven times this season, the Cougars have had two players scoring in double figures, the most recent, at SDSU on 01/25/07).
- → The 79 points scored against Weber State are the most scored by BYU this year and the (13) three-point goals, are a new team high.
- → The Cougars picked up season bests in 3-point field goal percentage .542 (13-24) in the Weber State game on 12/14/06.
- → To date, BYU has shot over 50 percent from the field in two games (vs. Weber State .542 on 12/14/06 and vs. UCR .521 on 12/20/06)
- → The Cougars have had four players score in double figures three times this year: (vs. SCU, @ Harvard, and @ UVSC).
- → In the game at home vs. Santa Clara University on 11/22/06, the .839 (26-31) free throw percentage was the best for the team so far this season.
- → The 55 total rebounds grabbed in the game vs. CSUN on 12/09/06 are a new season high for the team.

PREVIOUS GAME RECAP

BYU @ UTAH- BY-54; UT-64

Playing its second game in three days, the BYU women's basketball team was unable to overcome a well-rested Utah team falling 64-54 to Utah Saturday at the Huntsman Center.

Dani Wright got the Cougars going in the early going by scoring nine of BYU's first 12 points. However, neither squad was able to establish any consistent momentum in the early going, as both teams struggled shooting from the field. The game was tied at 12 points apiece after the first eight minutes of play. The Utes finally broke free and took a 17-14 lead with 7:53 left in the half behind 13 points from Morgan Warburton. A quick five-0 Cougar run gave BYU a two-point lead with 6:25 remaining in the half. The two conference leaders exchanged buckets over the next few minutes until Utah took a four-point advantage after a pair of Kalee Whipple free throws. The Utes shot 57 percent from behind the three-point line over the first 20 minutes to take a 28-24 lead going into the locker room.

Wright led BYU with 14 points in the first half, while the conference's leading scorer, Warburton, scored 15 in the half.

Utah came out hot to start the second half and took a 32-24 advantage with 17:41 left. A pair of back-to-back three-point shots put the Utes up 42-30 with 12:26 left to play. A tough Ute defense held the Cougars to just six points over the first 8:36 of the second half, and Utah capitalized on costly BYU turnovers.

A pair of Mallary Gillespie free throws cut the lead to 42-36 with 7:16 left. The Utes came back to build its lead to 51-40 with just over five minutes left in the game. The Cougars mounted a five-0 run to cut the deficit to six points after a Gillespie three-pointer.

BYU was never able to get any closer than six the rest of way and fell by 10 points at the end, as Utah shot 50 percent from behind the arc on the day and took advantage of 20 Cougar turnovers.

Wright recorded her third double-double of the season and the fourth of her career with a team-best 21 points, marking the 13th time this year she has led

BYU in scoring. She also chipped in a game-high 10 rebounds to help the Cougars win the battle on the battle on the boards 38-35. BYU is now 11-2 on the season when outrebounding its opponents.

2006 MWC Coach of the Year Jeff Judkins begins his sixth year as head coach of the women's basketball program. Prior to heading up the women's

program, he served one year (1999-2000) as Director of Basketball Operations for the BYU men's team. In 2000 he became an assistant coach on the women's team. Last season under Judkins, the Cougars compiled their

best finish in school history with a 26-6 record, clinched their first MWC regular season title since 1992 and received a no. 7 seed in the NCAA tournament, the highest seed for any BYU program.

For the first time since the 2002-03 season, the team and its 13-1 record to start the year broke into the women's basketball collegiate polls, ranked No. 23 by the AP Poll and the USA Today/Espn/WBCA Coaches Poll. They would rank as high as 18 and 16 in the two respective polls, finishing the year at No. 20. Last season Judkins picked up his 100th win, a 69-67 victory over CSU on Mar. 2, the same time the team clinched the league's regular season title.

Under Judkins tutelage, the women's basketball program has had consistent success with four postseason appearances including three NCAA Championships, guiding the team to its first ever Sweet Sixteen finish in 2002. In 2005, the 19-11 team played in the first round of the WNIT.

Judkins has also coached two All-Americans in Erin Thom and Ambrosia Anderson. Both have gone on to play in the WNBA for the New York Liberty. Thom has been with the team for the past four years while Anderson just completed her first year playing professionally.

The longtime University of Utah coach and player came to Provo with a proven record of success dating back to his high school days at Highland HS in Salt Lake City. An all-state selection in basketball, football and baseball, Judkins went on to play for the University of Utah from 1974-78.

While playing at Utah, Judkins helped lead the Utes to one conference championship and two berths in the NCAA tournament. He was a second-team academic All-American and three-time District VII academic selection. He also earned three first team All-WAC honors and was a member of the 1977 United States World Games team that captured the gold medal.

Judkins also played five years in the National Basketball Association for the Boston Celtics, Portland Trailblazers, Detroit Pistons and Utah Jazz. He was a second-round pick of the Celtics in 1978, the same year the Celtics selected Larry Bird with the sixth pick overall.

After his NBA career, he returned to Utah in 1989 and was an instrumental part of that program's success during his 10 years, recruiting such players as Keith Van Horn, Andre Miller, Mike Doleac, Hanno Mottola, Alex Jensen, Trent Whiting, Garner Meads, Jeff Johnsen and Britton Johnsen.

Judkins, graduated from the University of Utah in 1978 with a degree in health and physical education. He and his wife Mary Kaye are the parents of five children: Jessica (26), (married to Paul), Jordan (24), Jenna (22), Jaime, who plays on the basket-ball team, (19), and Jaxson (16). Jenna plays on the volleyball team at BYU.

TCU - Provo, UT (02/01/07)

Heading into this week's MWC action, TCU is tied in third place with New Mexico with 5-2 league records. Their two losses were at Utah 61-72, and at Wyoming 51-66. The Lady Frogs have an 14-5 overall record and are receiving votes in both polls. In conference games the team has three players scoring in double figures led by junior guard Adrianne Ross. She's averaging 16.1 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. Next is Hanna Biernacka who contributes 12.3 points and grabs 4.3 boards. Senior guard/forward combo Ashley Davis rounds out the double digit scoring with 11.9 points and 5.1 rebounds per contest. Toping the rebound category is Lorie Butler-Rayford who averages 8.3 boards a game. Head Coach Jeff Mittie is in his eighth season with TCU.
