BYU Team Gets Top 25 Ranking

For the first time since the 2002-03 season, BYU's women's basketball team and its 13-1 record breaks into this week's 01/16/06 AP Poll at the no. 23 spot, and also rank 23rd in the USA Today/ESPN/WBCA Coaches Poll. The team's last top 25 ranking came during the 2002-03 year when the Cougars had tallied a 5-1 record before losing at George Washington who was ranked 22nd, on 12/11/02. BYU also finished ranked 17th after its first-ever Sweet Sixteen finish in 2001-02.

For the week beginning Jan. 23, BYU jumped to the no.20 spot in both polls.

The week of Jan.30, the team is ranked 19th by both polls.

The week of Feb. 6, the Cougars are ranked 18th in both polls.

Feb. 13, BYU was ranked 19th by AP Poll, and stayed 18th in the USA Today/ESPN/WBCA Coaches Poll.

Cougars dropped from no. 19 to no. 21 in the AP Poll on Feb. 20, 2006.

Anderson Joins 1,000-Point Club

After the 14 points scored by Ambrosia Anderson in the game at Wyoming on Jan. 18., she becomes one of only 18 players in BYU women's basketball history to eclipse the 1,000 point mark. As of Feb. 20, she has tallied, 1,139 total points in her four-year career.

Last Game Recap

vs. Wyoming - Sat. Feb. 18, 2006, in Provo

In a game that needed the full 40 minutes to decide a winner, the Wyoming Cowgirls (18-6, 8-5) stunned No. 18 BYU (20-3, 10-2) Saturday, upsetting the Cougars 57-56.

According to Coach Judkins, BYU must get more players who are offensive minded. Only Dani Kubik and Ambrosia Anderson scored in double figures for the Cougars with 21 and 19 points, respectively. Next in line was Shawnee Slade with four points.

The Cougars came out sluggish in the first half, and Wyoming capitalized by never allowing BYU to gain more than a four-point advantage at any point during the half.

Both teams got off to a slow start with neither team connecting for the first three minutes. Wyoming's Hanna Zavecz put the Cowgirls on the board first with a three pointer, but Jennie Keele immediately responded with a layup for BYU.

The Cougars went on a 6-0 run six minutes into the game off a long two-pointer from Anderson, a three pointer from Nancy Seljaas and two free throws from Kubik, giving BYU its first lead of the game, 11-8.

Michelle Taylor of Wyoming hit a jump shot over BYU's Lauren Riley with just over seven minutes left in the half to tie the game at 16 points apiece. Riley quickly responded by converting two free throws.

Megan McGuffey then nailed a three pointer and bucketed another shot to give Wyoming a 21-19 lead.

With just over a minute remaining in the half, Kubik netted a layup to give BYU a one-point lead, 26-25. On Wyoming's last possession of the half, Erin Hicks was fouled on the dribble and converted the front end of a one-and-one to tie the score at 26 points going into the break.

BYU looked as if it was going to open up a lead in the opening minutes of the second half, receiving quick buckets from Anderson and Melinda Johnsen, but then Taylor scored back-to-back-to-back buckets to give Wyoming a 32-30 lead, a lead it would not loose.

Wyoming's largest lead of the game came with just over 11 minutes remaining when Taylor scored a layup to give the Cowgirl's a seven-point lead, 45-38.

The Cougars then went on a 5-0 run off two buckets by Shawnee Slade and a free throw from Kubik with 10:59 left in the game, closing the lead to two points, 45-43.

Wyoming responded with back-to-back three pointers from Annie Gorenstein and Zavacz to extend their lead to 51-43. The Cougars stepped into another gear with 3:52 remaining in the game. BYU's full-court pressure proved to be dominating as the Cowgirls couldn't inbound the ball. On their first attempt, Anderson tipped the inbound pass. Johnsen almost came up with a steal on their next try to inbound the ball, and Wyoming was forced to call a timeout or face a five-second violation on the third attempt. After the timeout Anderson stole the inbound pass and was fouled on her drive to the basket. She converted both free throws to bring the Cougars within two, 51-49.

A defensive breakdown by BYU on Wyoming's next possession gave Hicks a wide-open layup, but Kubik instantly responded with a layup of her own. Anderson was then fouled on a drive to the basket, hitting one-of-two free throws to bring the score within one, 53-52.

With 1:50 left, the Cougars again had a defensive breakdown on the inbound, leaving Zavecz open for a layup and extending Wyoming's lead to three, 55-52.

Anderson then attempted a turn-around jumper with 1:03 left, converting both free throws to again close the gap to one, 55-

On Wyoming's next possession, Dominique Sisk was fouled on the dribble and hit the front end of a one-and-one. Kubik came right back for the Cougars and hit two free throws, tying the game at 56 points apiece with 36 seconds left in the game. Zavacz quickly brought the ball up the court was fouled on her way to the basket, hitting one-of-two free throws to give Wyoming a one-point lead with 13.4 seconds left in the game.

Johnsen brought the ball up the floor and found Anderson, who was unable to get a good look at the basket as time expired. Kubik led all scores with 21 points and posted eight rebounds. Zaveca scored 20 points for the Cowgirls, while Gorenstein added 10.

The longtime University of Utah coach and player came to

Provo with a proven record of success dating back to his high school days at Highland High School in Salt Lake City. An all-state selection in basketball, football and baseball, Judkins went on to play for the University of Utah from 1974-78.

While playing at Utah, Judkins helped lead the Utes to one conference championship and two berths in the NCAA tournament. He was a second-team academic All-American and three-time District VII academic selection. He also earned three first team All-WAC honors and was a member of the 1977 United States World Games team that captured the gold medal.

Judkins also played five years in the National Basketball Association for the Boston Celtics, Portland Trailblazers, Detroit

Pistons and Utah Jazz. He was a second-round pick of the Celtics in 1978, the same year the Celtics selected Larry Bird with the sixth pick overall. He made second-team all-rookie in 1979 with the Boston Celtics.

After his NBA career, he returned to Utah in 1989 and was an instrumental part of the program's success during his 10 years with the program, recruiting such players as Keith Van Horn, Andre Miller, Mike Doleac, Hanno Mottola, Alex Jensen, Trent Whiting, Garner Meads, Jeff Johnsen and Britton Johnsen.

Judkins, graduated from the University of Utah in 1978 with a degree in health and physical education. He and his wife Mary Kaye are the parents of five children: Jessica (25), Jordan (23), Jenna (21), Jaime (18), and Jaxson (15).

Veronica Shaw, a senior guard, follows with 9.1 points and 3.5 rebounds per game. The team is shooting 35 percent from the field, 62 percent at the line, and 25 percent from behind the three-point arc. SDSU is averaging 53.7 points per game while opponents are scoring an average of 68.6 points a game.


