BYU'S LAST OUTING - TAVERNARI LEADS COUGARS TO SECOND WIN ON THE SEASON

MALIBU, Calif. (Nov. 18, 2008) – With four Cougars in double figures and solid play from the bench, BYU improved its record to 2-0 on the season by defeating the Waves of Pepperdine (0-1) 82-53. The four double-figure leaders on the night included junior Jonathan Tavernari with 17 points, sophomore Jimmer Fredette with 16 points, senior reigning Mountain West Conference Player of the Year Lee Cummond with 13 points and junior Chris Miles with 10 points. Eleven of Pepperdine's 12 players scored against the Cougars, but none had double digits on the night. The 29-point margin of victory was the largest in the series versus Pepperdine, surpassing the 19-point victory set last season. This win ties the Cougars and Waves with four wins apiece. The Cougars went 24-for-28 in free throw shooting on the night (85.1-percent), a season-high. Tavernari led the Cougars in points with 17, starting his second game of the season and making his 31st career start. After going two years without a dunk, Tavernari now has two dunks in two games. He threw one down with 11:25 to go in the first half. Sophomore Jackson Emery, who is back from an LDS mission to Mexico, posted a career-high nine assists on the night, also racking up nine points for the Cougars. He played the role of facilitator in the first half, dishing out a career-high six assists before the break. "Jackson had a lot of energy defensively," said Rose. "He had the first steal of the game and gave us a boost that way. He just needs more time on the floor to feel more relaxed for longer periods of time. Nine and nine is a great way to play. Jackson is a team guy." Starting out the Cougar scoring was Miles and the Cougars maintained the lead the entire game. An 8-0 run early in the first half held off the Waves and BYU led at the half by 11 points (32-21). Coming out of the locker room, the Cougars pulled away in the second half shooting 60.5-percent and making 90.8-percent of its free throws. After BYU had an 18-point lead early in the second half, Pepperdine chalked up nine points on three-pointers in a 1:03 span while Cummond was on the bench. Cummond entered the game and gave the Cougars a four-point push to pace the Cougars in a 16-2 run, widening the margin of victory and leaving the Waves scoreless for five and a half minutes.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...**BYU Coach Dave Rose:**

– "I think Chris did a terrific job defensively. I thought we played very well defensively and we held Pepperdine to under 40-percent shooting on their home court."
– "When we went into the timeout after they had a 9-0 run we looked around and expressed the urgency of the defensive situation. It was a good time for us to regroup and we showed that sense of urgency to get into a better flow."
– "Jackson had a lot of energy defensively. He really gave us a boost with his defense. He will get even better as he gets more time on the floor. Nine (points) and nine (assists) is a great way to play. Jackson is a team guy."

Junior guard/forward Jonathan Tavernari:

– "I didn't even realize it was a 30-point game until I got off the court. We played really strong defense. Our shots were really good tonight, we did rush a few shots, but this is the second game of the season and we will continue to improve."
– "Our defensive game plan was to come out and guard the 3-point line and I feel we stayed on them. We didn't have them wide open, they just shot some good shots."

BYU NOTES FROM LAST OUTING

-BYU is now 4-4 all-time against Pepperdine and has won the last three meetings. The 82-53 win was the first in Malibu for the Cougars.
-Coach Rose made one change in the starting five from the Long Beach State game, starting Jimmer Fredette in place of Lamont Morgan, Jr. Jackson Emery, Lee Cummond, Jonathan Tavernari and Chris Miles were all common starters from the Long Beach State game.
-Four players scored in double figures, led by Tavernari's 17 points while Fredette added 16, Cummond had 13 and Miles had 10. Not one Pepperdine player scored in double figures.
-With three three-pointers Jonathan Tavernari has 122 career threes to move into fifth all-time in BYU history ahead of Lee Cummond (120). He is fifth behind Terrell Lyday, who had 127 threes in two seasons.
-After going two years without a dunk, junior Jonathan Tavernari has two dunks in two games. He threw one down with 11:25 to go in the first half.
-Lee Cummond scored 13 points for the 50th double figure game of his career.
-Lee Cummond went 3-for-3 at the free throw line, making him a perfect 10-for-10 on free throws for the season.
-With Lee Cummond on the bench and Pepperdine trailing 46-28 the Waves hit three-straight threes in 1:03 to cut the lead to nine at 46-37. Rose put Cummond back in the game and he ignited the Cougars with back-to-back shots. Chris Miles followed with a shot inside and two free throws. Jonathan Tavernari finished the run with a steal and a fast break layup to put the Cougars up 56-37.
-Jackson Emery played the role of facilitator in the first half, dishing out six assists before the break. He finished the game with a career-high nine assists to go with nine points and two steals.
-Junior Chris Miles had his best offensive game since his freshman year in 2004-05, scoring 10 points on 3-of-5 shooting from the field and 4-of-5 shooting from the free throw line.
-BYU caught fire in the second half against Pepperdine, hitting 60.9 percent (14-23) from the field and 90.5 percent from the free throw line (90.5 percent). The Cougars were 24-of-28 (85.7 percent) from the line for the game, hitting nine straight on two occasions. BYU hit 52.0 percent (26-50) from the field for the game.
-Noah Hartsock set a career high in points in the first half, scoring six in the first half on 2-for-2 shooting from the field and 2-for-2 shooting from the line. He finished the game with six points and tied his career high with two rebounds.
-James Anderson saw the first action of his career, entering the game with 3:27 remaining in the first half. He grabbed two offensive rebounds before the half. Matthew Pinegar also played for the first time, entering the game with under four minutes remaining in the ball game.
-Charles Abouo contributed to BYU's hot free throw shooting, hitting a perfect 6-of-6 from the line. He finished with a career-best nine points.

EXHIBITION #1 - CONVINCING EXHIBITION WIN AGAINST CONCORDIA

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 6, 2008) – In its first exhibition game of the 2008-09 season, the BYU men's basketball team handily defeated Concordia 96-54 at home in the Marriott Center. The 42-point victory matched the offensive productivity seen last season when the Cougars notched 20 double-digit wins. Sophomore Jimmer Fredette led all scorers with 26 points, going 6-of-8 from behind the new three-point line. Team captains Lee Cummard and Jonathan Tavernari both contributed 15 points apiece with Cummard leading the team with nine rebounds. Returning starters Tavernari and Cummard were joined in the starting lineup by Fredette, and juniors Lamont Morgan, Jr. and Chris Miles. Combined, the starting five contributed 65 of the team's 96 total points. Reigning Mountain West Conference Player of the Year Cummard picked up where he left off last season, scoring seven of BYU's first nine points. After jumping out to quick 5-0 start, the Stingers went on a 7-2 run to overtake the lead before a running layup by Cummard put the Cougars up 9-7 heading into the game's first media timeout. Fredette extended the BYU lead to four points after a made three-pointer with 13:46 remaining in the first half. After Tavernari scored his first points of the game on a beneath-the-basket make with 9:08 to play in the half, his steal on Concordia's following possession helped set up a dunk for newcomer Charles Abouo. In what seemed like *deja vu*, Tavernari recovered a Stinger turnover on the ensuing play resulting in a second dunk by Abouo. Back-to-back makes by Tavernari capped a 21-4 run by the Cougars, giving them a 39-19 lead with 4:20 remaining until the halftime break. With under one minute to play in the half, Tavernari made his first three-pointer of the night to help put BYU up 23 points at the half. After making two three-pointers in the first half, Fredette came out strong to start the second, connecting on 3-of-3 attempts from beyond the arc in the first five minutes. Tough defense and turnovers on both sides of the ball kept either team from scoring for the next two minutes until Morgan drew a foul on a fast-break layup, giving the Cougars a 78-39 lead.

WHITE BEATS BLUE AT COUGAR TIPOFF

PROVO, Utah (October 29, 2008) – Fans got their first official taste of the 2008-09 BYU Men's Basketball team Wednesday as the White team beat the Blue team 59-51 during the Cougar Tipoff at the Marriott Center. "I was really pleased with our progress from the first half to the second half," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "I thought we settled in and played a lot more like we are going to play." The night featured the annual Blue/White game between players and showcased the team to fans. The White team held the Blue team scoreless through the first 13 minutes and jumped out to an 11-0 lead before the first timeout of the game at 15:12. Jonathan Tavernari led all scorers with 23 points on 9-15 shooting. Senior forward Lee Cummard, the 2007-08 MWC Co-Player of the Year had 11 points. Freshmen Charles Abouo and Matt Pinegar also contributed with 11 points each. Tavernari and freshman guard Jackson Emery led all rebounders with eight apiece. Both teams shot above 70 percent from the free-throw line, with the Blue team shooting 75 percent and the White team shooting 73.3 percent. The game featured some exciting moments. The end of the first half was punctuated with a shot by guard Jackson Emery, who then stole the inbounds pass and dished the ball behind his back to Jimmer Fredette, who laid the ball in the hoop, but the shot was called off because the halftime buzzer had already sounded. Just three minutes into the second half, Emery passed the ball forward to senior center Gavin MacGregor who drove down the lane for a one-handed dunk. "I think the talent level of this group is good," said Rose. Our athleticism is improved and we have good strength. Hopefully that will help us defensively and allow us to be more diverse offensively." BYU fans can next catch the Cougars at the Marriott Center when they face Concordia University in an exhibition game Thursday, Nov. 6 at 7 p.m. MT. BYU will then face Georgetown College on Tuesday, Nov. 11 at 7:30 p.m.

CUMMARD, TAVERNARI NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 4, 2008) – BYU men's basketball head coach Dave Rose announced Tuesday that senior Lee Cummard and junior Jonathan Tavernari have been selected to serve as captains on this year's team. "Both our captains are great examples of what we want all our players to strive for," Rose said. "Lee and Jonathan are both great competitors, do well in the classroom and are good ambassadors of our program in the community. Lee did an outstanding job as a captain last year and has proven leadership ability both on and off the court. Jonathan has been a key member of our team the past two years and has earned the respect of a team leader." Cummard is a three-year starter and the reigning Mountain West Conference Player of the Year. He earned Associated Press All-America honorable mention last year after helping the Cougars win their second straight outright MWC title and a 27-8 overall record. A 6-foot-7 swingman from Mesa, Ariz., Cummard is a do-everything player who led the Cougars in scoring (15.8), field-goal percentage (.569), three-point percentage (.472) and blocked shots (1.0) last year while ranking second in rebounds (6.3), assists (3.5), steals (0.9) and free-throw percentage (.857). Tavernari followed his MWC Freshman of the Year season in 2006-07 with a record-setting sophomore campaign last year. The 6-foot-6 forward from Sao Bernardo, Brazil, earned All-MWC Third Team honors and set the BYU single-season and sophomore MWC three-point record with 88 treys last season. He was third on the team in scoring (13.1 ppg) and rebounding (5.3 rpg) while averaging 1.5 assists and a team-best 1.4 steals per game. This summer he was the lone nonprofessional player to make the Brazilian Senior National Team that competed at the Olympic Qualifying Tournament in Athens, Greece.

LEE CUMNARD TABBED AS WOODEN AWARD CANDIDATE

The 2008-09 preseason candidates for the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy were announced Nov. 7 by Richard "Duke" Llewellyn, Wooden Award Chairman and founder. The list is composed of 50 student athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. BYU senior guard Lee Cumnard has been named as one of the 50 preseason candidates for the 2008-09 award. The reigning Mountain West Conference Player of the Year, Cumnard is a three-year starter who earned Associated Press All-America honorable mention last year after leading the Cougars to a 27-8 overall record and their second straight outright MWC title. A 6-foot-7 swingman from Mesa, Ariz., Cumnard is a do-everything player who led the Cougars in scoring (15.8), field-goal percentage (.569), three-point percentage (.472) and blocked shots (1.0) last year while ranking second in rebounds (6.3), assists (3.5), steals (0.9) and free-throw percentage (.857). Tyler Hansbrough of North Carolina, last year's Wooden Award winner, returns to Chapel Hill for his final collegiate season and has a chance to become only the second repeat men's Wooden Award winner. Ralph Sampson of Virginia won the Award twice, in 1982 and 1983. Other returning Wooden All-Americans include Notre Dame forward Luke Harangody and Davidson guard Stephen Curry. Returning players from last year's Wooden Award ballot, in addition to the three All-Americans above, include UCLA's Darren Collison, Connecticut's A.J. Price, Tennessee's Tyler Smith and Robbie Hummel of Purdue. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are not eligible for the preseason list. These players and others who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for January's Midseason list and the official voting ballot released in March. North Carolina (Hansbrough, Wayne Ellington, Ty Lawson) had three players on the list. Six schools placed two players on the list: Louisville (Earl Clark, Terrence Williams), Duke (Kyle Singler, Gerald Henderson), Marquette (Jerel McNeal, Dominic James), Pittsburgh (DeJuan Blair, Sam Young), Connecticut (Price, Hasheem Thabeet), and Texas (Damion James, A.J. Abrams). In all, 42 schools and 13 conferences are represented on the Wooden Award Pre-Season list. Leading the way is the Big East (12), followed by the ACC (8), Pac-10 (5), SEC (5), Big 12 (5), Atlantic-10 (2), Big Ten (3), Conference USA (3), Mountain West (2), West Coast (2), Colonial Athletic Association (1), Ohio Valley (1), and the Southern Conference (1).

REDSHIRTS

BYU plans to redshirt two players during the 2008-09 season. They are sophomore guard Michael Loyd, Jr. and freshman forward Michael Boswell.

BEST START THROUGH 100

BYU coach Dave Rose coached his 100th game as the head coach of the Cougars on Tuesday against Pepperdine. His career record is 74-26 (.740) and is the best record for a BYU men's basketball coach through his first 100 games. The Cougars set the school record with their 67-59 win over Utah in the Marriott Center on Feb. 20, their 45th straight home win. The Cougars were 16-0 at home last year and won 17 home games the prior season after going 14-1 at home in 2005-06. BYU's last home loss was in the 2005-06 season opener against Loyola Marymount. BYU has since won 24 straight over nonconference opponents and 24 consecutive over MWC foes. BYU's last league loss at home was its season finale in 2005 to UNLV. BYU is 420-116 (.783) all-time in the Marriott Center, and Cougar head coach Dave Rose is 48-1. Prior to the current streak, BYU's longest homecourt victory streak was 44 games from Feb 19, 2000 to Jan 16, 2003.

Forward Jonathan Tavernari returns for his junior season after spending the offseason playing with the Brazil Senior National Team. An All-MWC Third Team pick last year, Tavernari set the BYU single-season and sophomore MWC three-point records with 88. He averaged 13.1 points and 5.3 rebounds per contest.

MAGIC NUMBER: 70

After an 82-53 victory over Pepperdine BYU is now 2-0 when scoring at least 70 points 2008-09. In 2007-08 the Cougars were nearly perfect when scoring at least 70 points, posting a record of 22-1. The Cougars scored 90 or more points in five games last season, reaching 100 against Jackson State, and were 10-0 when scoring more than 80 points.

PLAYING CATCHUP

BYU trailed Long Beach State 38-31 at the half before coming back to win 75-65 in the season opener. Last season the Cougars trailed at the half five times and finished 2-3 in those games. BYU was also 0-2 in games tied at the half. Against Long Beach BYU fell behind 9-7 at the 15:07 mark in the first half (the score was tied briefly at 9-9 at the 14:50 mark) and did not lead against until 41-40 with 15:02 to go in the second half. After Jimmer Fredette's free throw with 9:23 remaining gave the Cougars the lead at 51-50 BYU led the rest of the way.

REBOUNDING ADVANTAGE

BYU is continuing the trend of winning when outrebounding its opponents. The Cougars posted a 43-36 advantage over Long Beach State and a 36-24 advantage over Pepperdine. In 2007-08 BYU was 21-2 when winning the battle of the boards.

With the 75-65 season and home-opening victory over Long Beach State, BYU is 83-24 (.776) all-time in home openers, including a 27-11 (.711) mark in the Marriott Center. The Cougars won their home opener last season with a 90-69 victory over Idaho State. BYU is 3-1 in home openers under Dave Rose.

LATE GAME FREE THROWS

BYU struggled from the free throw line early on in the season opener against Long Beach State, hitting just 3-of-9 from the charity stripe in the first half, including a 1-of-7 start. The Cougars improved slightly in the first 15 minutes of the second half, hitting 6-of-10 from the line. BYU was clutch from the line in the final five minutes of the game as Lee Cummond and Jimmer Fredette were both 4-of-4 for a combined total of 8-for-8. The Cougars were 8-for-8 from the line in the final five minutes against Pepperdine with Charles Abouo hitting 6-of-6 and Gavin MacGregor going 2-for-2.

HIGH-PERCENTAGE SHOOTING

Senior Lee Cummond scorched the nets in BYU's season opener by hitting 81.3 percent (13-of-16) from the field, 75.0 percent from downtown (3-of-4) and 100.0 percent (7-of-7) on free throws. His career percentages are now 55.1 percent from the field (currently seventh all-time at BYU), 45.1 percent on threes (currently third all-time) and 82.3 percent on free throws (currently seventh all-time).

1,000-POINT MAN

With 36 points in the season opener against Long Beach State and 13 at Pepperdine, Lee Cummond now has 1,062 career points. He surpassed Scott Runia (1,051 points) in the first half at Pepperdine and now trailed former teammate Keena Young (1,068 points) by six points.

TRUE BLUE FANS

In the 2008-09 home opener 15,753 fans were in attendance, at total that is 3,600 more than the 2007-08 home opener. Last season BYU averaged 13,518 fans per home game to finish ranked No. 21 in the nation in home attendance. The Cougars were third behind Memphis (No. 10) and Creighton (No. 15) in teams not from a BCS football conference in home attendance. BYU was second in the MWC in home attendance behind New Mexico (No. 18, 14,361 per game).

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

- Including incoming freshman Charles Abouo, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 37 of the past 57 years.
- In the last five years, BYU has rostered eight international players, including three on this season's team - Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire), Archie Rose (Bahamas) and Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil).
- Foreign players at BYU have received nine all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

SECOND HALF SHOOTING

Through two games BYU has played its best basketball in the second half. Against Long Beach State the Cougars from 37.5 percent shooting in the first half to 50.0 percent shooting in the second half. BYU also increased in scoring output by 13 points, from 31 to 44. The trend continued against Pepperdine as the Cougars improved from 44.4 percent to 60.9 percent shooting and increased their scoring total by 18 points from 32 to 50. For the season BYU is shooting 54.9 percent in the second half of games compared to 40.7 percent in the first half and is averaging 47 points per second half compared to 31.5 points per first half. The defensive intensity has also improved in the second half of games as opponents are shooting a miserable 33.3 percent from the field and scoring 29.5 points in the second half. Opponents are shooting 44.4 percent in the first half and averaging 29.5 points.

PRESEASON MWC POLL

The Mountain West Conference media selected two-time defending MWC Tournament champion UNLV as the preseason favorite to win the Mountain West Conference men's basketball regular-season title in 2008-09. Three teams earned first-place votes, with UNLV capturing 16 of 24 first-place votes and 206 points for the top spot in the poll. Two-time defending MWC regular-season champion BYU (181 points) collected five first-place votes, while San Diego State (170 points) earned three first-place votes to finish second and third, respectively. Utah tallied 148 points for fourth and New Mexico earned 132 points for fifth. Wyoming received 75 points to finish sixth, followed by Air Force (66 points) in seventh, Colorado State (53 points) in eighth and TCU (49 points) in ninth to round out the poll. Five seniors representing five institutions were chosen for the 2008-09 preseason all-MWC team. BYU's Lee Cummond and UNLV's Wink Adams shared Preseason MWC Player of the Year honors, while UNLV's Tre'Von Willis garnered Preseason Newcomer of the Year accolades and New Mexico's Phillip McDonald received Preseason Freshman of the Year kudos.

IN THE NINE YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had seven 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had five, UNLV five, San Diego State four and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on three occasions. The Cougars were second last year (25) behind UNLV (24).
- BYU regularly plays one of the toughest schedules in the MWC. Last year, BYU's schedule was rated third behind UNLV and Utah.
- BYU has the most overall wins (189).
- BYU is also has the most conference wins (87).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (four) with Utah.
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

LEE CUMMOND NAMED TO MWC 10TH ANNIVERSARY TEAM

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 13, 2008) - BYU senior guard Lee Cummond was one of 10 players named to the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball 10th Anniversary Team. Cummond joins UNLV senior guard Wink Adams as the only two current players named to the team.

The team, announced by the MWC Monday, was selected by a combined panel of media, institutional and conference personnel and an on-line fan poll. In order to be eligible for consideration, candidates must have been an All-MWC First Team selection at least once in their careers.

The reigning MWC Player of the Year, Cummond leads a BYU team that has won back-to-back outright regular-season championships and holds the nation's top home victory streak at 47 games. The All-America candidate was the lone Cougar named to the team.

Anniversary teams will be chosen for each of the 19 conference-sponsored sports during the 2008-09 seasons in celebration of the Mountain West's 10th anniversary.



Since becoming head coach of the BYU Men's Basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a three-year resume that is nearly unmatched. In fact, only eight other coaches have ever won more games in their first three seasons at the Division I level. Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with back-to-back appearances in the top-25 polls

and back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships. Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past two seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as Associate Head Coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in eight of the past nine seasons, including five NCAA bids, while claiming four MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 11 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 25 years of coaching experience, including 13 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels, Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave

and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.
