Cougars and Aggies in the First Round of NAAs

Cougars and Aggies in the First Round of NAAs

HONOLULU (Dec. 3, 2003) – In the first round of the NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship, the BYU Cougars will face New Mexico State Thursday at 5 p.m. (HST), 8 p.m. (MST) in the Stan Sheriff Center.

Hosted by No. 2 University of Hawai'i, the winner of the BYU vs. NMSU match-up will play the winner of Hawai'i vs. Idaho Friday at 7 p.m. (HST), 10 p.m. (MST).

BYU (23-8) is ninth in all-time wins in the NCAA Tournament with a 26-10 record, including an 11-4 record in first round matches (excluding byes). The Cougars' top finish in the NCAA Tournament was in 1993 when they advanced to the Final Four.

"I feel confident with where our team is at this point," BYU coach Karen Lamb said. "This late in the season there's no time to reinvent the wheel. We do what we do and we'll do a little bit of strategy adjustment, but we will play with our strengths."

It is a homecoming for senior libero Uila Crabbe, who prepped at nearby Kamehameha High School, and is a native of Millilani. She led the Mountain West Conference this season with 409 digs and 3.65 digs per game. Crabbe also became the sixth BYU player to surpass 1,000 career digs and in her last home match, set the single-season digs record at BYU.

The BYU defense also features one of the nation's top-blocking units. Averaging 3.12 blocks per game, the Cougars ranked No. 11 in the country entering play last week.

Offensively the Cougars have a diversified attack, as eight players have 100 or more kills on the season. Sophomore outside hitter Kim Wilson leads the way with 353 kills (3.68 kpg) and 851 attempts on the year.

The Aggies (30-4) will be participating in their first-ever NCAA Tournament and are the champions of the Sun Belt Conference. They have won 24 matches in a row entering the tournament.

"New Mexico State is a well-coached team," Lamb said. "But I don't think that they run a type of offense that we haven't seen this year. It will be on the players and the team that sustains pressure through the entire match will win."

Lamb enters her first NCAA Tournament as a head coach and will seek to lead BYU to its first tournament win since defeating Utah State in the second round in 2000.

The Cougars have qualified for 21 of 23 NCAA Tournaments, and with 924 wins, are the third-winningest women's volleyball program in NCAA Division I history.

Weekly Notes:**WEEK #14 IN REVIEW ...**

The Cougars came out a luckless team in the first and second games against Utah State on Tuesday. After quickly falling into a 0-2 hole, BYU staged a thrilling comeback against the Aggies. Defense led the way, as BYU put up a season-high 99 digs to go with 17 blocks. It marked the third time this season that BYU has come from 0-2 down to win a match. Previously this season, BYU defeated Air Force and San Diego State after making up similar deficits. On "Senior Night" Friday, the Cougars recognized outgoing players Carrie Bowers, Uila Crabbe, Laura Nielsen and Sahara Castillo. BYU then proceeded to take three straight from Eastern Michigan.

SELECTION SUNDAY

For the 21st time in the 23-year existence of the NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship, the BYU women's volleyball team has qualified for the 64-team tournament. BYU was chosen as one of 33 at-large teams for the single-elimination event. The Cougars (23-8 overall) will play New Mexico State (30-4) Thursday at 5 p.m. (HST), 8 p.m. (MST) in a first-round match-up hosted by the University of Hawai'i. The winner of the BYU and NMSU match will play the winner between No. 2-seeded Hawai'i and Idaho Friday at 7 p.m. (HST), 10 p.m. (MST). BYU is the ninth-winningest team in NCAA Tournament history with a 26-20 record, and will be going up against a NMSU team that is making its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

UILA'S MILESTONE

This has been a banner season for All-MWC senior libero Uila Crabbe. In 2003, she has picked up her 1,000th career dig and she moved past Caroline Bower (1,052) to move into fifth in all-time digs at BYU and against Eastern Michigan, Crabbe broke the BYU single-season record for digs, passing Cherie Sam Fong (401). Crabbe currently has 409 digs, with play in the NCAA Tournament remaining in her career.

LOOKING AT THE NUMBERS ...

Will the Cougars win today? A close look at the numbers reveals that BYU is 14-0 this season when winning the first game. All BYU's wins this season have come when the Cougars hold a hitting percentage advantage over their opponents, a perfect 23-0 record.

THE COUGAR STUFF

BYU was averaging 3.12 blocks per game entering the week, which placed them as the No. 11 blocking team in the nation.

WELCOME HOME UILA

The last time the Cougars were set to leave for Hawai'i was for an early season tournament on Sept. 11, 2001.

"We try to get our kids over to play Hawai'i on a regular basis, so those from the area can have their family and friends come and watch," BYU coach Karen Lamb said. "With 9/11, though, there were obviously more important things to worry about at the time, and our trip was cancelled.

"Now it's kind of fitting for us to be able to go down there. I'm happy for Uila (Crabbe), and I'm happy that she will have the opportunity to play in front of her family and friends."

NOT A MIDDLING BUNCH

All three middle blockers on the BYU active roster are hitting over .300 on the year (Lexi Brown .368; Lindsay Hartsock .350 and Laura Nielsen .320). They are hitting a collective .350 (462-116-988).

COUGAR PLAYER OF THE WEEK: THE BROWN BOMBER CONTINUES TO STRIKE

Sophomore middle blocker Lexi Brown has become an integral part of the BYU offense as the season has progressed. She has consistently provided timely kills, but she has also become one of the top Cougar blockers as well. Last week she provided an all-around game in leading BYU over Utah State and Eastern Michigan.

Brown led BYU in kills for the fifth time this season against Utah State. Her 18 kills set a career-high, besting her previous high of 16 kills. Against the Aggies, Brown hit a match-high .459, while the Cougars, as a team hit .176. Seven players in all had double-digit kills in the match, but the Aggies' Erin Davis recorded the next highest attack percentage, hitting at a .222 rate. Brown capped the 0-2 comeback win over the Aggies with a kill to seal the match in the fifth game, 15-12.

Against Eastern Michigan, Brown played two games recording seven kills with a .500 attack percentage. In the two matches Brown only committed two total attack errors, one in each match. For the week Brown hit .469, besting her season average entering the week of .364.

Brown recorded her first career double-double against Utah State with 18 kills and 10 blocks. She also recorded seven digs, missing a triple-double by three digs.

She has now led the Cougars in kills in six matches this season, in which BYU is 6-0. All six of Brown's team-leading efforts have come in the Cougars' last nine matches. Included in Brown's run is leading BYU to a pair of five-game wins after being down 0-2 to San Diego State and Utah State.

Brown put up a season-high 10 blocks against Utah State. The next highest blocking output by a Cougar in the match was six by Lindsey Metcalf. Against the Aggies, Brown also put up a career-high seven digs.

DEFENSE WINS MATCHES

The need for stellar defensive play was never more apparent than on Nov. 25 against Utah State. Down 0-2, it was the Cougars' defense that kept play alive and scored points. When the dust settled in the BYU win, the Cougars had recorded a season-high 99 digs to go with 17 blocks.

ARE YOU DIGGING ME?

Senior rightside hitter Carrie Bowers had a career-high 22 digs against Utah State, Nov. 25, almost doubling her previous career-high 12. With 15 kills to go with it, Bowers posted the second double-double of her career.

CONSISTENT COUGARS

The Cougars have lost consecutive matches only once this season. It came in the first two weeks of the season, when BYU lost to then-No. 4 Florida and then lost a five-game decision to Arkansas.

ACING AIR FORCE

Sophomore setter Lauren Richards set a career-high in aces against Air Force in the first round of the MWC Tournament on Nov. 20, when she put down eight. Her previous high was five against Ohio State earlier this season. As a team BYU put down 13 aces, one short of its season high, also against Ohio State.

ALL-CONFERENCE COUGARS

Three Cougars were named to the MWC All-Conference team as selected by league head coaches. The BYU selections were senior rightside hitter Carrie Bowers, senior libero Uila Crabbe and sophomore setter Lauren Richards.

FANTASTIC FRESHMAN

The Cougar honors didn't stop there as freshman middle blocker Lindsay Hartsock garnered the MWC Freshman of the Year award. On the year, she's averaging 1.59 kills, 1.21 blocks and 0.37 aces per game, while hitting .350.

CRABBE PASSES 1,000

Senior libero Uila Crabbe put up 16 digs against Utah, Nov. 7. In the second game of that match, she passed the 1,000 dig mark, to become only the sixth Cougar to reach that mark.

BYU ATTENDANCE

BYU is ranked 26th nationally in average attendance. The Cougars average 1,279 fans per match at the Smith Fieldhouse, second in the Mountain West Conference to Colorado State. BYU has played at home 14 times this season, and 11 matches have seen crowds of over 1,000.

INJURY UPDATE

It is relatively quiet on the injury front for the Cougars. Other than various minor bumps and bruises there is nothing serious. It is in stark contrast to 2002, when the Cougars had numerous players miss extensive playing time because of injury.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Cougars have warmed to the confines of the Smith Fieldhouse this season, tune to a 12-2 record. BYU is 7-0 at home against non-conference foes. That is in stark contrast to last season when BYU went 4-12 at home.

BYU BALANCE

Demonstrating depth and distribution, the Cougars are the only team in the MWC to have eight players with over 100 kills.

TURNAROUND COUGARS

In 2002, BYU had 14 wins total. With the team's 23rd win against Eastern Michigan Friday, the Cougars have won 23 matches this season. The nine-win improvement is tied for the sixth best in the country and best in the MWC.

POLL POSITION

After spending four consecutive weeks receiving votes in the USA Today/AVCACoaches Top 25 Poll, BYU fell out of the polls as a listed team Oct. 13. The Cougars peaked as they were listed No. 26 on Sept. 26. Since the beginning of the AVCACoaches Top 20 Poll in 1982, BYU has been ranked a total of 252 weeks, which ranks the Cougars eighth in NCAA history.

Karen Lamb Head Women's Volleyball Coach



In her second year as head coach of the BYU women's volleyball program, Karen Lamb replaced the legendary Elaine Michaelis on July 9, 2002. An assistant to Michaelis for eight seasons preceding her promotion, Lamb has 19 years of collegiate coaching experience,

including 11 years as a head coach, and two years coaching with the U.S. National Team.

Lamb is only the third person to head BYU's program, joining Michaelis (1962-2002) and JoAnne Calderwood (1956-61). Michaelis retired in May 2002 after 40 years at the Cougar helm ranked No. 2 all-time in NCAA Division I women's volleyball wins with an 887-225-5 (.796) record.

In 11 years as a head coach, four in junior college and five at the Division I level, Lamb has totaled a 227-149 (.676) overall record while bringing success to each program. Her accomplishments include an NJCAA national championship and national coach of the year honors. As an assistant coach at BYU for eight seasons, she helped coach seven All-Americans while the Cougars won five conference titles, achieved a 207-51 (.802) overall record, and played in eight NCAA tournaments, including three regional final appearances among five trips to the regional semifinals.

Lamb's opportunity at BYU is her second with a well-established program. In her five prior seasons as a Division I head coach, Lamb took over new or struggling programs and turned them into winners. She owns a 122-120 (.502) record in her seven seasons as a Division I head coach at UNLV, Washington State and BYU.

Lamb received a bachelor's degree in physical education with a coaching emphasis from BYU in 1978. She earned a master's degree in educational administration with an athletics emphasis from Arizona State in 1984. She has finished her doctorate course work at BYU and is currently working on her dissertation.

REDSHIRTS FOR 2003

Of BYU's eight incoming true freshman, seven are slated to redshirt the 2003 season. They are: Erica Lott, Catherine Parker, Lindsey Evans, Stacie Powell, Amy Hulse, Annie Kemp and Kimberly Dabo.

ROSTER OF CHAMPIONS

After an unprecedented year in which nine of the 16 players on the roster sustained injury, BYU made it a mandate to recruit additional talent. While at times last year the Cougars didn't have enough players to scrimmage, with the current 21 players on the roster, BYU is not only ensured of having enough players to practice, but the team's competitive level of play in practice has risen.

MILESTONE MANNER

Sophomore setter Lauren Richards collected 34 assists against Air Force on Nov. 1 to put her over the 1,000-assist mark at 1,007, to mark the first milestone she has hurdled in her young career.

COUGARS SELECTED AS MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

DEC. 1 - LEXIBROWN - First career award. A 6-1 sophomore from Sandy, Utah (Jordan HS), Brown led the Cougars to a pair of key victories. In a five-game win over Utah State, Brown tallied a team- and career-high 18 kills and 10 blocks as she helped rally BYU from an 0-2 deficit in the match. She hit .459 (18-1-37) and added seven digs vs. the Aggies. The Cougars are now 5-0 when Brown leads the team in kills this season. In a sweep of Eastern Michigan, Brown totaled seven kills and three blocks in just two games played. For the week, Brown averaged 3.57 kills, 1.14 digs and 1.86 blocks per game, while hitting .469 (25-3-49).

SEPT. 15 - LAUREN RICHARDS - First career award. A 6-0 sophomore from Orem, Utah (Timpanogos HS), Richards entered last week's Mizuno Classic with just six starting assignments as setter for BYU, but was able to lead the Cougars to the tournament title with stellar all-around play. Under Richards' direction last week, BYU hit .234 (compared to opponents .177) despite facing two top-25 blocking teams (Penn State-11, Ohio State-25). Five Cougars hit .250 or better and three averaged at least 3.0 kills per game, including 4.31 kills per game by Classic MVP Kim Wilson. Although BYU struggled with a team hitting percentage of .167 (54-28-156) in a win over Big Ten power Ohio State, Richards stepped up with a .417 hitting percentage (7-2-12), totaling seven kills, 41 assists, nine digs, five aces and a career-high five blocks. In a victory over Rice, Richards collected 52 assists, 10 digs and four blocks to mark her fifth double-double of the season. In the win over No. 8 Penn State, Richards recorded another double-double with 55 assists and 11 digs, while topping her previous career-high with six blocks vs. the Nittany Lions, who entered the Classic as the No. 3 hitting team in the nation (.352). For the week, Richards averaged 11.38 assists, 2.31 digs, 1.62 kills, 1.15 blocks and .54 aces per game.

SEPT. 2 - CARRIE BOWERS - First career award. A 6-2 senior from Salt Lake City, Utah (Highland HS), Bowers earned all-tournament team honors at the Campus USA Credit Union Invitational, which was hosted by Florida, while leading the Cougars to a 2-1 record. She posted a .556 hitting percentage (22-2-36) in a victory over American and topped that with a career-high .583 percentage (15-1-24) in a win vs. Rutgers. In BYU's only loss of the week at No. 3 Florida, Bowers posted a .243 hitting percentage (13-4-37) despite a team percentage of .052 vs. the Gators. In the three matches, Bowers averaged 5.0 kills, 1.7 digs and .70 blocks per game, while hitting .443. Her 50 kills for the week were nearly 1/3 of the BYU total (151) in that span.

MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars have a 42-14 regular season record in four years of MWC play after finishing fourth in 2002 with a 7-7 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and finished second in 2000 with a 12-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively. In 2003, Colorado State became the first MWC team to finish 14-0 in conference play and became the first No. 1 seed to win the MWC Tournament. In 2002, two MWC teams, Utah and CSU, earned NCAA bids.

Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA tournament each season. After three teams were ranked in the top-25 at the end of 2001 (CSU 10, Utah 15 and BYU 22), no MWC teams finished in the top 25 in 2002. Overall, BYU has made 20 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 14, SDSU with 13, New Mexico with seven, and Utah with five and Wyoming with four.

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .829. The 2003 MWC Tournament was held in San Diego, Calif., Nov. 20-22, with CSU defeating Utah in the final.

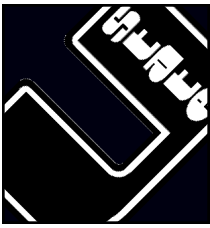

HISTORY OF BYU IN THE POLLS

BYU has received votes to be listed in the AVCA/USA Today Top-25 Poll this season, but the Cougars have not been ranked. Since women's volleyball became an NCAA sport in 1982, BYU has been ranked in at least one week per season in each year of the poll - a streak spanning 21 seasons. If the Cougars enter the polls at some point this year, they will stretch that streak to a perfect 22 consecutive seasons.

The last time BYU was ranked was in the 2002 preseason poll, where it was the No. 23 team in the country. The Cougars tumbled out of the rankings the following week on Sept. 2 for the first time since 1996. In 1996 BYU was unranked for nine weeks (Sept. 17 - Nov. 12). The only other times the Cougars have been unranked are in 1984 for one week (Sept. 25) and 1989 for eight weeks (Oct. 3 - Final). The Cougars have been ranked for a total of 252 weeks, eighth most in NCAA history.

Comeback Cougars Block Aggies in Five

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 25, 2003) – For the third time this season, the BYU women's volleyball team staged an improbable comeback. Tuesday night in the Smith Fieldhouse, the Utah State Aggies fell victim to a resilient Cougars team that came from 0-2 down to win it 3-2 (26-30, 29-31, 30-24, 30-28, 15-12).

Previously this season, BYU had come from an 0-2 deficit to win against Air Force and San Diego State. The Cougars were led by several exceptional team and individual efforts.

Sophomore middle blocker Lexi Brown tallied her first career double-double with a career-high 18 kills and a season-high 10 blocks. Brown also hit a match-high .459, while falling just shy of her first triple-double with seven digs.

As a team BYU was buoyed by season-highs of 221 attack attempts and 99 digs. The No. 11 blocking team in the nation, the Cougars also out-blocked the Aggies 17-9.

"They gave it everything they had tonight," BYU coach Karen Lamb said. "It was one of the most heart-wrenching matches I've had to watch, and it feels great to win. We needed the win to help us improve our standing for a potential NCAA Tournament bid.

BYU was also led by a career performance from senior rightside hitter Carrie Bowers, who put up a career-best 22 digs to go with 15 kills, for her second-career double-double. Metcalf also tallied a double-double with 16 kills and a career-high tying 20 digs, to go with six blocks. Sophomore setter Lauren Richards also picked up a double-double, her team-leading 11th, by dishing out 62 assists to go with 15 digs.

Crabbe Breaks Digs Record in BYU Sweep

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 28, 2003) – On Senior Night, graduating libero Uila Crabbe put up a match-high 16 digs as she passed Cherie Sam Fong and set a new BYU single-season digs record. The BYU women's volleyball team swept Eastern Michigan in its season finale 3-0 (30-25, 30-18, 30-26).

The Cougars improve to 23-8 on the year, while the Eagles drop to 21-11. Before the match rightside hitter Carrie Bowers, Laura Nielsen and Sahara Castillo were also recognized in a short ceremony.

BYU out-hit EMU .312 to .134 and was led by sophomore outside hitter Kim Wilson who was the lone player in the match to put down double-digit kills with 12.

The biggest moment of the match came during the second game. With BYU leading 12-7, Crabbe collected her ninth dig of the match and 402nd of the season to set the new digs mark at BYU.

"To have Uila break the digs record at home, on senior night, was special," Lamb said. "She's been awesome all year, and I'm really happy for her, but I know she's got a lot more left in her."

Bowers, suffering from illness, put down eight kills and hit .615 in the match before being relieved by Kiholm in the final game.

BYU also had six aces, three from Richards, and out-blocked the Eagles 8-4.

2003 Week-by-Week

WEEK 1
BYU started its season with a trip to Florida to participate in the Campus USA Credit Union Invitational. The Cougars opened their season with consecutive wins over American and Rutgers. Senior rightside hitter Carrie Bowers started the season on fire as she recorded a career-high 22 kills against the Eagles and posted a career-high .583 hitting percentage in a win over the Scarlet Knights. BYU finished the tournament with a loss to then-No. 3 Florida. For her efforts, Bowers was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week, after averaging 5.0 kills, 1.7 digs and 0.7 digs per game while hitting .443.

WEEK 2
The Cougars continued their road tournament play the following week in Springfield, Mo., where they participated in the Dr. Mary Jo Wynn SMS Invitational. In its first match of the tournament, BYU lost a closely contested five-game clash to Arkansas. The loss marked the only time BYU has lost consecutive matches this season. BYU then won a pair of four-game matches against North Texas and Saint Louis. In the match against the Billikens, sophomore outside hitter Kim Wilson put down a career-high 29 kills. In the tournament concluding match, the Cougars were downed by host Southwest Missouri State.

WEEK 3
Finally home and ready to play its first home matches of the season, the Cougars were set for the BYU Mizuno Classic. On the first night of the tournament (Sept. 12), BYU played preseason top-25 Ohio State and won in four games. The next afternoon, the Cougars downed Rice before its showdown with then-No. 8 Penn State that night. Against the Nittany Lions, BYU dropped the first game before fighting through for a close five-game win. Wilson led the Cougars with 22 kills, 11 digs and six blocks in the win. She was also named tournament MVP for her play throughout. For leading the team offensively, sophomore setter Lauren Richards received MWC Player of the Week honors.

WEEK 4
With the continuation of its home schedule, the Cougars welcomed Utah Valley State and Nevada. BYU swept both teams to mark the first time it had swept teams in consecutive matches. In its wins over the Wolverines and Wolfpack, BYU hit .422 and .333, respectively. The wins put the Cougars on a five-match win streak, their longest in two years.

WEEK 5
Sept. 26 marked BYU's entrance into Mountain West Conference play. The Cougars hosted Colorado State and Wyoming. BYU earned a split of the two matches with a loss to the Rams and sweep over the Cowgirls.

WEEK 6
It was then time to hit the road for BYU as it traveled to play New Mexico and Air Force. The Cougars won in a tidy sweep over the Lobos the first night, but met resistance the next night at Air Force. The Falcons were unstoppable at the beginning, putting BYU into a quick 0-2 hole. The Cougars would storm back, however, and take the next three to win their first match of the year after being down 0-2. Four Cougars hit double-digit kills, led by Wilson and junior outside hitter April Varner with 18 each.

WEEK 7
It was rivalry week for BYU as it played at Weber State in a mid-week match and hosted Utah later in the week. The Cougars rolled over the Wildcats in four games. After dropping the first two games to the Utes, the Cougars dominated the third, but ultimately fell in four. In the match sophomore middle blocker Lexi Brown set a career-high 16 kills.

WEEK 8
Things didn't get easier for the Cougars as it hosted San Diego State in its next match. The Aztecs got up 2-0, forcing BYU into a corner. The Cougars pulled off their second win of the year when down 0-2 with a dramatic win over SDSU. The next night, BYU swept UNLV with its most offensive effort of the season with a .439 attack percentage.

WEEK 9
The Cougars then left for their annual Front Range trip and defeated an inspired Wyoming team that fell in four games, before losing to Colorado State the following night.

WEEK 10
BYU swept both of its matches against New Mexico and Air Force, and was the only team in the MWC to hit over .300 in all of its games, and also the only conference team to hit over .300 in each match.

WEEK 11
In its lone week 11 match, the Cougars played in-state rival Utah. It was a hard fought match on both sides, and BYU, down 2-1, was up 27-21 in the fourth game, but was unable to hold on and eventually fell for the seventh consecutive time to the Utes.

WEEK 12
The MWC regular season finished in style for BYU, as it played some of its best all-around volleyball with the conference tournament looming. The Cougars swept through the Rebels at UNLV, before dominating San Diego State. BYU, the No. 11 blocking team in the nation entering the week, posted double-digit blocks against the Rebels (11) and Aztecs (14). Sophomore setter Lauren Richards quarterbacked the attack to a .292 hitting percentage.

WEEK 13
BYU came out as two distinctly different teams in the Mountain West Conference Championship. The Cougars started strong with a convincing sweep of Air Force on Thursday, as the team hit a collective .366. The next day in its semifinal match-up against Utah, BYU struggled out of the gate in dropping a three-game decision to the Utes.

WEEK 14
In the final week of their regular season, the Cougars kicked off this week's play with their third come-from-behind win of the season, after being down 0-2. In a Tuesday match-up, BYU victimized Utah State for its 22nd win of the season. There were many team and individual highlights, but Lexi Brown stood out, recording her first career double-double with 18 kills and 10 blocks. The Cougars ended their season on "Senior Night" with a sweep of Eastern Michigan. Crabbe broke the single-season digs record at BYU finishing the match with 409.

2003 Season Outlook

Coming off the most injury-plagued season in team history, the BYU women's volleyball team is poised to become the nation's most improved team in 2003.

After seeing its lineup decimated by injuries – a total of 12 Cougars drew starting assignments in 2002 – BYU returns nine letterwinners and eight players with significant starting experience.

The positive side of BYU's injury struggles last year is manifested in its suddenly experienced lineup. Despite the Cougars' 14-19 record in 2002, they were an impressive 7-2 in five-game matches with a perfect 6-0 record versus Mountain West Conference opponents. BYU's improvement as the season wore on was manifested in its run to the MWC Tournament finals.

"Last year will never happen again," BYU head coach Karen Lamb said. "Only one of the injuries happened in practice and the rest were freak injuries. Last season made us really tough, though. The result is we have a lot of tough individuals on our team. We need to be in that mindset to compete at the highest levels."

BYU lost three players from its 2002 roster. All-MWC rightside hitter Allison Larson and defensive specialist Michelle Mahaffey were the two departing seniors while two-time All-MWC setter Karina Puikkonen graduated with a degree in Zoology and will not return for her final year of eligibility. As well, All-America candidate Sunny Mahe, who redshirted last year, will not return to the team.

OUTSIDE HITTERS

Senior Carrie Bowers leads the parade of outside hitters, as she shifts from the middle to the rightside. Bowers, one of the top blockers in the nation last season, before injuries slowed her, has worked hard to train in the off-season. As a result of rigorous weight training, she is stronger and is expected to once again be among the best blockers in the country. She is an intelligent player and has the savvy to be a strong offensive contributor.

BYU's leftside hitting triumvirate of Kimberly Wilson,

April Varner and Lindsey Metcalf each saw extensive playing time last season, with Wilson establishing herself as a premier attacker as the season progressed.

Wilson, one of the Cougars' most gifted leapers, improved with each successive match in 2002, and she is expected to be a focal point of the BYU attack this season. She posted 14 double-digit kill efforts in BYU's last 19 matches.

Metcalf is perhaps the Cougars' most complete player and best overall athlete. In 2002 she posted career highs of 17 kills, 20 digs, 17 blocks and 15 assists. Her 17-block effort at UNLV on Sept. 28 established a new MWC record and is fourth all-time at BYU. She is also an All-American high jumper on the BYU women's track and field team.

A highly regarded transfer from Long Beach State before the 2002 season, Varner started the season as BYU's main offensive threat. She improved over the course of the season, which peaked with a career-high 23 kills at Wyoming on Oct. 19. The following week during a practice, April severely sprained an ankle, which virtually kept her out of the lineup for the rest of the season. She should again be a key member of the Cougar attack in 2003.

MIDDLE BLOCKERS

Laura Nielsen is the lone returning All-MWC player on the Cougars. After starting last year as a reserve, Nielsen gained playing time as a result of an injury to Lexi Brown. She took advantage of her opportunity and was second on the team with a .298 attack percentage. Besides being the Cougars' most efficient attacking player, Nielsen also set career highs with 11 blocks and eight digs. She will be looked on to provide leadership while playing an all-around game.

Lindsay Hartsock will be looked on to provide an immediate impact as a redshirt freshman. A former Idaho Gatorade Player of the Year, Lewis-Hartsock participated with the U.S. National Women's A2 Team this past summer and has vastly improved in her year as a redshirt. At 6-foot-4, she has the ability to dominate on both sides of the ball and is a freshman All-America candidate.

Sophomore Lexi Brown made a splash in her collegiate debut last season against Gonzaga with 14 kills, eight blocks, two service aces and a .619 hitting percentage. In the season's eighth game against Weber State, however, she tore her ACL shelving her for the remainder of the season. At the time of her injury she was the Cougars' second leading blocker. A starter last season, Brown will be looked upon to compete for playing time this season.

SETTERS

Lauren Richards, one of the most athletic setters in the country, quarterbacks the attack. After coming out of redshirt in 2001 as an outside hitter, she will make her collegiate debut as a setter this season. A sophomore, Richards has participated with the U.S. National Women's A2 Team for two consecutive summers. One of the most athletic setters in BYU history, Richards will be expected to lead BYU's offense back to one of the nation's best.

DEFENSIVE SPECIALIST/LIBERO

Senior Uila Crabbe returns and is expected to be the main libero for the Cougars. Last season she led the team with 376 digs, the fourth-highest season total in team history. Crabbe also set a career high with 25 digs against UNLV in the MWC Tournament. She will not only be looked upon to provide solid defense, but to be a leader as well.

Melanie Togo joins BYU as a sophomore and she was impressive in spring play. Togo displayed a great degree of athleticism and court sense. With her knack for getting to the ball, Togo will be in the mix as a defensive dynamo.



TRADITIONALLY TOUGH SCHEDULE FOR COUGARS IN 2003

Never a team to shy away from a challenge, BYU again features a tough schedule for the 2003 season. Of the Cougars' 22 opponents 17 teams had a winning record and 15 of those teams were 20-win teams in 2002. Overall, eight of BYU's opponents for the upcoming season qualified for the NCAA Tournament last year.

The Cougars will face three teams that finished 2002 ranked in the top 25: No. 4 Florida, No. 13 Ohio State and No. 16 Penn State. Additionally Utah and Arkansas received votes finishing No. 32 and No. 33, respectively.

Of the Cougars' 2003 opponents, BYU has a losing record against only three teams: Arkansas (0-1), Florida (3-4) and Penn State (3-4). BYU's all-time record versus this season's opponents is a dominating 371-75-1 (.830).

Cougars Confirm Top Volleyball Recruiting Class

Four Highly Sought-After High School Prospects Sign with the Cougars

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 17, 2003) – BYU Head Coach Karen Lamb announced Monday the signing of four highly sought after high school recruits to NCAA Letters of Intent to play volleyball at BYU next season.

Amy Schlauder, a 6-foot-1 setter (Las Vegas, Nev.); Chelsea Goodman, a 5-foot-11 outside hitter (Mesa, Ariz.); Rachel Dyer, a 6-foot-1 middle blocker (Carlsbad, Calif.) and Bryn Porter, a 5-foot-10 outside hitter (Encinitas, Calif.) have committed to the third-winningest women's volleyball program in NCAA Division I history.

"This is an exciting recruiting class we have – and perhaps one of the best BYU has ever had," BYU coach Karen Lamb said. "All four of the players are extremely talented, but each also brings with them a high level of intensity and competitiveness.

"These players will come in and strengthen every position on the court for our team."

Schlauder, from Durango High School, just led the Trailblazers to their second consecutive state 4A championship Saturday. She is a four-year starter and holds the Durango HS record for assists in a match (68) and also holds the Nevada single-season record for assists with 1,151, set in 2002. As a sophomore and junior, she was a member of the U.S. Youth National Team and in 2002 was named to the Junior Olympics All-Tournament Team. She is also a Prepvolleyball.com Senior Ace, ranking as the No. 26 recruit in the nation. Graduating in the top 3% of her class, Schlauder was also recruited by Stanford, USC, Pepperdine, Florida, Arizona, Arizona State and Washington State.

"Amy is a great setter with tremendous potential," Lamb said. "She has uncommon intangibles and is a true student of the game. Over the past several years, Amy's had extensive experience with the Nevada Juniors Volleyball Club, and she is a proven winner."

Goodman, from Mountain View High School, has been a first-team all-state selection as a sophomore and junior. She has trained with the U.S. Youth National Team (2000-2003) and was named as an honorable mention All-American as a junior. Goodman was also named as East Valley Region Player of the Year the past three seasons. She is also a Prepvolleyball.com Senior Ace, ranking as the No. 41 recruit in the nation. She chose BYU over Utah and Texas.

"Chelsea is an outstanding athlete," Lamb said. "She is a go to player on offense, but what sets her apart is her tenacity on defense. She's a very intense leader on the court."

Dyer, from La Costa Canyon High School, is a three-year letterwinner, who led her team to the California "Sweet Sixteen" as a junior. She was the Fall Classic Tournament MVP in 2002 and 2003 and was named to the California Challenge All-Tournament team in 2003. Dyer led the Epic Volleyball Club to a 13th-place finish in the 18's (open division) at the 2003 National Junior Olympics. She is also a Prepvolleyball.com Senior Ace, ranking as the No. 47 recruit in the nation. She was also recruited by Georgia Tech, Arizona, Arizona State, UC Santa Barbara, Iowa, Utah State and Northwestern.

"Rachel is a very versatile player that can play in all three of the front row positions," Lamb said. "She possesses a great personality and is a consummate team player. Her best attribute is hitting right now, and she hits the slide very well, but she has the potential to develop into a top blocker, as well."

Porter, from Thousand Oaks High School, is a four-year letterwinner. As a junior, she was named First-Team All-Marmonte, as well as being named best team offensive player and MVP. She also led the Southern California Volleyball Club to a first place finish at the Junior Olympic Invitational this year, where she was named MVP. Porter is a Prepvolleyball.com top 250 Senior Ace, and chose BYU over Utah and Arizona State.

"Bryn is a powerful outside hitter, who has tremendous talent, and is only beginning to tap into her potential," Lamb said. "She has overcome injuries and is constantly improving. I expect that she'll have a strong club season before coming to BYU."

With 921 all-time wins, BYU is the third winningest NCAA Division I women's volleyball program. Currently 20-7, the Cougars have now won 20 or more matches in 29 of the past 30 seasons. BYU has also qualified for 20 of 22 NCAA Championship Tournaments.

"I'm thrilled that the girls committed to BYU, and we are just as happy to be making a commitment to them," Lamb said. "This is a program that is filled with tradition and we expect them to help us continue the excellence that has been established.

"Not only are these girls top talents, but they are each wonderful people as well, and they will fit in well with our team."

2002 SEASON REVIEW

Although it ended the season a better team than it started, the Cougar season mirrored the ups and downs of its lineup. With 12 different players drawing starting assignments over the course of the season, the Cougars were never able to establish an identity of consistency and cohesiveness.

"We expect to win on a consistent basis," Lamb said. "Obviously there were extenuating circumstances this past season. I'm not making any excuses, though, this season was tough. But it was not indicative of what BYU volleyball is about. We are going to win and carry on the tradition of BYU volleyball."

A tradition-rich women's volleyball program, leading into 2002, the Cougars had recorded 28 consecutive 20-win seasons and had never experienced a losing year. Many factors combined to send the Cougars to their first non-winning season (sub .500 record) in school history (14-19). Nineteen losses represent the most of any season in school history, but BYU also endured the most injuries it has ever had in a single season.

The emergence of true freshman outside hitter Kim Wilson was instrumental to a team that needed a steady offensive force. Wilson, a hometown product hailing from Provo High School, slowly worked her way into the lineup as the season progressed, and by the end of it she was BYU's most looked to offensive force. Starting the season as a reserve didn't have the opportunity to register her first double-digit kill effort until midway through the season, but she caught fire down the stretch as she recorded double-digit kill efforts in 14 of BYU's final 19 matches, proving she was one of the Mountain West Conference's top first-year players.

Despite a lineup that was besieged by injury, the Cougars never gave up and broke through in pressure situations time and time again. Although BYU endured two four-match losing streaks in the first half of the season, each time the team would avoid the dubious distinction of being the first squad in BYU history of losing five in a row by narrowly escaping with five-game wins over Wake Forest and UNLV.

At 7-12 the Cougars headed on the annual Front Range road trip on Oct. 18 with the prospects of becoming the only Cougar team to ever drop to as many as seven matches below .500. Indicative of its season and with its backs against the wall, BYU came through with five-game wins over MWC leader CSU and a Wyoming team that was in the midst of a 20-win campaign. In the MWC Tournament the Cougars would not disappoint as they earned a pair of five-game wins over UNLV and CSU before falling to Utah in the final.

2002 SEASON NOTABLES**BYU ROSTER HIT HARD**

Entering this season BYU had 16 players on its roster. Nine of those players were affected in some way that has prevented them from playing or hindered their ability. All-America candidate Sunny Mahe redshirted because of a pregnancy, and Lauren Richards and Lindsay Lewis are sat out the season as redshirts. Carrie Bowers played with two stress fractures in her feet and was unable to practice as the season progressed. Lexi Brown tore her ACL in the eighth match of the season was lost for the year. As well, Lindsey Metcalf, Becky Warnick, Laura Nielsen and April Varner were all bitten by the injury bug in 2002. In all, 12 different Cougars drew starting assignments.

THE PROCESS OF REBUILDING A WINNER

Of the 13 active players on the BYU roster in 2002, Karina Puikkonen and Uila Crabbe were the only returning starters with a combined 350 games of experience entering the season. The remaining 11 players on the active roster came into the season with a combined 117 games of experience (the rough equivalent of a normal season). Thus far this season the 11 returning non-starters have played in a combined 624 games. Due to a myriad of injuries on the team, more of the Cougars are seeing extended playing time. Ten of the 11 players have seen action in at least 24% or more of BYU's games. Nine of the 11 have seen action in 35% or more of the Cougars games. Eight of the 11 have seen action in 57% or more of BYU's games.

A TEAM OF ENDURANCE

The Cougars had losing records in three-game (5-12) and four-game (2-5) matches, but their record in five-game matches was an impressive 7-2 on the season. That includes a perfect 6-0 record against MWC teams.
