## Cougars Host Colorado and Southwest Missouri State in Annual BYUMizuno Classic, Thursday - Saturday

Coming off a sweep of Rhode Island Monday, the Cougars stay in Provo this week to host the annual BYUMizuno Classic Thursday - Saturday at the Smith Fieldhouse. This year's tournament includes No. 23 Colorado of the Big 12 Conference and Southwest Missouri State of the Missouri Valley Conference.

The Cougars, 3-1 and ranked No. 16 in the latest USA Today/AVCA Top 25 Poll, face the 23-ranked Buffaloes Thursday at 7 p.m. and the Bears Saturday at 7 p.m. Colorado and Southwest Missouri State play the Friday night match, also a 7 p.m. start.

The Buffs and the Bears enter the Classic with perfect 3-0 records. Colorado opened its season by winning its own tournament with wins over Clemson (3-1), No. 24 Loyola Marymount (3-0) and Oral Roberts (3-1). Southwest Missouri State won the Four Points Titan Classic by defeating Iowa (3-1), Manhattan College (3-2) and tournament host Cal State Fullerton (3-1). The Bears' Therese McNatt earned MVP honors.

BYU has a 5-1 series record vs. Colorado, but the Buffaloes won the last meeting, 3-1, in the 1995 Mizuno Classic. BYU's last match with Southwest Missouri State was in the 1989 Mizuno Classic, a 3-1 Cougar victory.

"Colorado and Southwest Missouri State are both good teams that went 3-0 last week," BYUcoach Elaine Michaelis said. "I thought we played well Monday in our home-opener and hope we can continue to improve during the Mizuno Classic in front of our home crowd. Our fans should see some good volleyball this week."

**COLORADO NOTES**

The Colorado Volleyball team (3-0) earned it's first ranking since the final poll of the 1999 season as the AVCA/USA Today Coaches Poll put the Buffs in the No. 23 spot Sept. 3.

The Buffs opened up the 2001 season on a good note as they swept the competition at their own season-opening tournament. The Buffs opened the season Aug. 31 with a 3-1 win over Clemson, then turned around on Sept. 1 with a good 3-0 win over No. 24 Loyola Marymount before closing out the tourney with a 3-1 victory over Oral Roberts Sept. 2. The Buffs Elizabeth Gower was named the tourney MVP and Sonja Russell and Monique Gerlach were also tabbed all-tournament.

**SOUTHWEST MISSOURI STATE NOTES**

The SMS Bears return 10 letterwinners and five starters from a team that finished 27-7 in 2000 and finished third (14-4) in the Missouri Valley Conference. Southwest Missouri State started the season on the road last week by winning the Four Points Titan Classic. The Bears defeated Iowa (3-1), Manhattan College (3-2) and tournament host Cal State Fullerton (3-1).

The Bears' Therese McNatt earned MVP honors. SMS comes into this tournament with a 19-match winning streak in regular season tournaments. Since 1999, the Bears have played in six tournaments (not including postseason tournaments) without losing a match. The Bears last loss in an invitational was in five games to Hofstra at the 1999 Hofstra Classic.

Just a sophomore, setter Chenille Bayless already ranks ninth in SMS history in career assists. She has 1,587 and has a chance to break the school record of 2,770 in just two years as a collegiate setter.

**SERIES NOTES**

BYU has a 5-1 series record vs. Colorado, but the Buffaloes won the last meeting, 3-1, in the 1995 Mizuno Classic. BYU has won three of four matches in Provo during the series, which began in 1973. BYU's last match with Southwest Missouri State was in the 1989 Mizuno Classic, a 3-1 Cougar victory. This year's match will be only the second played in Provo during the series, which began in 1975.

## BYU BRIEF OUTLOOK

The 2001 Cougars are led by first-team AVCA All-American middle blocker Nina Puikkonen and NCAA All-West Region rightside hitter Sunny Tonga Mahe. Mahe will be a junior in 2001 while Puikkonen is one of three seniors returning with significant court experience. She is joined by fellow seniors Jackie Bundy, an All-MWC middle blocker who finished 12th nationally in blocking last year, and Natalie Whittaker, BYU's top reserve last season. The Cougars also return setter Karina Puikkonen, who earned all-conference honors last year as a freshman. While Michaelis returns four all-conference starters, she will need to replace the services of starting outside hitters Melissa Layton and Kalani Tonga. Reserve middle blocker Alyssa Barrus and backup setter Martha Brinton also won't return in 2001. Both players decided to leave on an 18-month mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, with Barrus to serve in Washington, D.C. and Brinton in Switzerland. Whittaker, junior transfer Allison Holsten Larson and the redshirt freshman tandem of Lindsey Steele and Becky Warnick all are talented players with the potential to fill the void left on the outside. A solid freshmen recruiting class join sophomore Carrie Bowers (middle blocker/rightside hitter), sophomore Uila Crabbe (defensive specialist) and junior Michelle Mahaffey (defensive specialist) to provide Michaelis with a strong supporting cast. Last year, the Cougars were ranked second nationally in blocking and eighth in hitting and should continue to excel in those categories in 2001. With Karina Puikkonen having a year of experience on her resume and setting many of the same hitters, BYU's offense should again be one of the nation's most potent. The Cougar block could be the nation's best with Puikkonen and Bundy in the middle.

## BYU SWEEPS RHODE ISLAND IN HOME OPENER MONDAY

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 3, 2001) - All-American Nina Puikkonen put down 15 kills and Sunny Tonga added 10 as BYU defeated Rhode Island, 30-21, 30-19, 30-25, Monday in front of 1,390 volleyball fans at the Smith Fieldhouse. The Cougars, ranked 16th in the USA Today/AVCA Top 25 Poll released Monday, improved to 3-1 on the season with the win while the Rams dropped to 0-4. The Cougars hit a season-high .303 as a team while holding the Rams to a .050 attack percentage. Mahe hit .421 with only two hitting errors in 19 attacks while Nina Puikkonen hit .355, making only four errors in 31 attempts. In all, five Cougars hit .300 or better. Puikkonen finished the night just three kills from overtaking fifth place on BYU's all-time kills list. She should pass former Cougar All-American Gale Johnson (1993-96) during Thursday's match with No. 23 Colorado. The Cougars also excelled on the

defensive side of the net. BYU totaled 14 team blocks while the shorter Ram front line mustered just three. Puikkonen tallied a match-high six blocks. Natalie Whittaker led BYU's back row effort with a match-high 15 digs, helping the Cougars tally 48 digs compared to 36 by the Rams. One of Karina Puikkonen's eight digs was a pancake save that seemed certain to reach the floor before she slid under it at the last minute. The Cougars took the momentum and quickly transitioned into an offensive attack that produced a Whittaker kill to give BYU a 26-17 lead in game two.

## BYU'S MAHE NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

BYU junior outside hitter Sunny Mahe was named the Mountain West Conference Volleyball Player of the Week, marking the second time overall she has earned the award. A native of Allen, Texas (Allen HS), Mahe led BYU with 45 kills (3.75 per game) and a .330 hitting percentage (45k-11e-103a) as the Cougars posted a 2-1 record at the Washington Tournament in Seattle last weekend. Mahe, who earned all-tournament honors, posted her best numbers of the week in a four-game win against Purdue with a career-high 22 kills, 12 digs, five total blocks and a .724 hitting percentage. She also had nine kills in a sweep of Washington and 14 kills in a five-game loss to Texas. For the week, Mahe racked up 23 digs, (1.92 per game), 13 total blocks (1.08 per game), four aces (.33 per game) and 56.5 points, which ranks second in the MWC.

## CURRENT COUGAR NOTABLES

- BYU's Sunny Mahe and Nina Puikkonen were two of six players named to the Point Huskies Invitational All-Tournament Team.
- All-American Nina Puikkonen moved into sixth place on BYU's all-time kills list with her second kill in BYU's win over Purdue on Saturday. With her 15 kills Monday, she now has 1,338 career kills and needs just 3 kills to move into fifth place past Gale Johnson. Puikkonen averaged 3.67 kills, 2.92 digs and 1.33 blocks last week despite not being 100 percent. She is coming back from a stress fracture in her left leg.
- BYU improved its record against Pac-10 opponents to 93-58-1 (.615) with its win over Washington and is now 24-6 (.800) against the Big-10 with its win over Purdue. The loss to Texas dropped the Cougars record vs. the Big XII to 35-15 (.700). BYU is now 11-0 vs. Washington, 9-6 vs. Texas and 3-1 vs. Purdue all-time. BYU improved to 6-0 vs. the Atlantic 10 and 3-0 vs. Rhode Island with its win.
- Sophomore setter Karina Puikkonen is attacking effectively while hitting a team-leading .452 attack percentage with 23 kills (1.53

kpg). She is also averaged 12.07 assists, 2.00 digs, and 1.07 blocks.

- Several Cougars set or came close to career marks in loss to Texas, as five players recorded double-doubles. Sophomore setter Karina Puikkonen set a new personal attack percentage high at .583 while finishing just one kill and one dig short of career bests with 8 and 11, respectively. Senior outside hitter Natalie Whittaker set new personal bests with 14 kills and a match-high 19 digs, and Jackie Bundy equaled her kills high with 16 and added 12 digs, just two shy of her best-ever digs effort. Nina Puikkonen had a double-double with 19 kills with 14 digs and Uila Crabbe had career highs of 17 digs and 4 service aces.
- Sophomore defensive specialist Uila Crabbe had 11 service aces in 12 games (0.92 sapg). She had 3 aces vs. Washington and then back-to-back career -best efforts with 4 aces against both Texas and Purdue.
- With four all-conference starters returning, BYU coach Elaine Michaelis is looking to replace her two starting outside hitters from last season. Three players have played the outside spots this year. Senior Natalie Whittaker has played in all 15 games and averaged 2.07 kills, and a team-best 3.87 digs while hitting .189. Redshirt freshman Becky Warnick has played in 8 games with 18 kills (2.25 kpg) while hitting .233 and junior college All-American transfer Allison Larson has played in 10 games with 14 kills while hitting .043.
- BYU has a 12-match home winning streak dating back to last year.

**NINA PUIKKONEN • 6-3 • SR • MB**

A three-time All-American, Nina was named to the AVCA and *Volleyball Magazine* All-America First Teams and was the only player selected AVCA National Player of the Week twice last season ... she was a *Volleyball* magazine freshman All-American and earned second-team AVCA and *Volleyball Magazine* All-America honors as a sophomore ... last year she was named to the all-west region team ... was the MWCPlayer of the Week four times last year and was an all-conference selection for the third straight year ... finished second nationally in blocks per game (1.88) ... was named the MVP of the MWC tournament after leading the Cougars to the tournament championship ... recorded double-digit kills in 28 of 33 matches ... had 20 or more kills in four matches, including a season-high 25 kills against LBSU ... had a team-high nine double-doubles and two triple-doubles (both vs. Utah) ... led BYU in kills (467), block solos (24), block assists (189), total blocks (213) and was second with 38 service aces and 226 digs ... had team-best averages of 4.13 kpg, 1.88 bpg and a .357 hitting percentage ... in MWC conference matches she was first in the MWC in kills (4.30) and service aces (0.43), second in the in blocks (1.68), and third in hitting (.369) ... was selected to the Verizon Academic District VIII Third Team.

**KARINA PUIKKONEN • 6-0 • SO • S**

Sister of Nina Puikkonen, Karina was named all-conference in her first season as the Cougars' setter ... led the BYU offense to an overall team hitting percentage of .278, which ranked eighth nationally ... recorded five double-doubles ... matched career-best 12 digs vs. Hofstra in NCAA tournament ... had a career-high nine kills vs. Pepperdine, narrowly missing a triple-double ... was third on the team in hitting (.290) and averaged 12.68 assists, 1.59 digs and 0.98 blocks per game ... she was second in the MWC in assists (12.65) and 10th in service aces (0.33) in conference matches.

**JACKIE BUNDY • 6-1 • SR • MB**

Jackie was an all-MWC selection last year in her second season starting in the middle ... ranked 12th nationally in blocking (1.58) ... had a BYU season-best 14 blocks at Notre Dame ... had 17 double-digit kills matches, including 11 of the last 16 ... had double-digit digs in six matches ... had five double-doubles last season ... she had career highs of 16 kills three times last year against No. 1 Stanford, No. 20 Kansas State and in the NCAA Tournament vs. Hofstra - all BYU wins.

**QUOTING MICHAELIS**

ON MIZUNO CLASSIC – "Colorado and Southwest Missouri State are both good teams that went 3-0 last week," BYU coach Elaine Michaelis said. "I thought we played well Monday in our home-opener and hope we can continue to improve during the Mizuno Classic in front of our home crowd. Our fans should see some good volleyball this week."

ON WIN OVER RHODE ISLAND MONDAY – "Our offense was better (than last week), much faster, and the hitters were going hard. (Setter) Karina (Puikkonen) created some nice hitting options where Rhode Island did not have a blocker up or only one blocker. We blocked well and we made some nice defensive plays. Natalie (Whittaker), Uila (Crabbe) and Karina all made some very nice plays to keep the ball off the floor."

**PUIKKONEN POISED TO MOVE UP CAREER KILLS LIST**

All-American Nina Puikkonen moved into sixth place on BYU's all-time kills list with her second kill in BYU's win over Purdue on Saturday. With her 15 kills Monday, she now has 1,338 career kills and needs just 3 kills to move into fifth place past Gale Johnson. Puikkonen averaged 3.67 kills, 2.92 digs and 1.33 blocks last week despite not being 100 percent. She is coming back from a stress fracture in her left leg.

**SCHEDULE**

BYU boasts a typically strong schedule that includes many of the nation's top teams. The Cougars will face 10 teams that qualified for last year's NCAA tournament in a minimum of 12 matches during their 2001 regular season schedule. Eight of those 10 teams won an NCAA tournament match last year with Hawaii advancing to the NCAA Final Four. UC Santa Barbara had its run end with a regional final loss to Hawaii while Long Beach State and Colorado State each earned regional semifinal appearances. Utah, Cal Poly, Colorado, and Utah State made it to the second round while Loyola Marymount and Sacramento State earned a spot in the big dance. Other 2001 non-conference opponents include Texas, who has appeared in 17 of 20 NCAA tournaments and is sixth all-time with 38 NCAA tournament wins, Washington, Purdue, Rhode Island and Southwest Missouri State. BYU will play 12 regular season matches at home, including UC Santa Barbara, and also hosts the 2001 MWC tournament at the Smith Fieldhouse. In addition to the MWC tournament, BYU will host Colorado and Southwest Missouri State in the annual BYU Mizuno Classic. The Cougars also play in the University of Washington's invitational, which also features Texas and Purdue, and travels to Hawaii to face the host Wahine and Loyola Marymount in September. In November, BYU plays in the Long Beach Thanksgiving Tournament, which also includes Cal Poly SLO. The Cougars will play a total of 12 away matches and four neutral site matches to complete its 28-match regular season schedule.

**RULE CHANGES**

Women's volleyball will take on a different look in 2001 with several new rule changes. The National Association for Girls and Women in Sports, the official rules-making body for women's collegiate volleyball, released the changes in its "2001-2002 NAGWS Official Rules, Interpretations & Officiating Rulebook." The most noticeable difference this season will be the move from sideout volleyball to a rally scoring format where each play will result in a point. The first four games will be scored to 30 points, with the winner holding a two-point lead. The fifth and deciding game will be played to 15 with the winner leading by two points. Other significant changes involve the serve. Players must serve the ball within eight seconds after the referee authorizes service and will not be allowed a second toss for service. Further, the collegiate game will mimic the international game with the let serve. A served ball will remain in play if it hits the net and continues its path to the opposition's court. A service ace can be earned if the ball falls to the opposition's side of the court on the serve, despite contact with the net on service. The international pursuit rule was also added as an experimental rule for the upcoming season, and can be implemented in a match by agreement of both coaches. The rule allows for a player to retrieve a ball (on second contact) that has crossed the plane of the net to the opponent's free space, provided that player does not touch the opponent's court and sends the ball back to their court, over or outside the antennas, for an opportunity for the third contact.

**MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE**

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. Six of the eight MWC programs have competed in postseason action over the years while the other two programs have only been in competition since 1996. Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA tournament both seasons. Last year all three teams were ranked in the top 20. Overall, BYU has made 19 NCAA appearances and Colorado State has made 12. The reigning Mountain West Conference Tournament Champions, BYU will again be among the top contenders for the MWC title. The Cougars are a slight favorite to edge Colorado State, according to the MWC preseason coaches poll. The Cougars have a 25-3 regular season record in two years of MWC play after finishing second in 2000 with a 12-2 mark. The Cougars won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record before finishing second to Colorado State at the MWC tournament. The Rams won the regular season title last year with a 13-1 record, with the lone loss coming at BYU. The Cougars went on to win last year's MWC Tournament title in Fort Collins, Colo., avenging both regular season conference losses with wins over Utah and Colorado State, ending the Rams' nation-best 44-match home winning streak. The Cougars, Rams and Utes were all top-20 teams in 2000 and should again compete for the conference title. San Diego State was on the bubble of the NCAA tournament last year and could factor into the title hunt. BYU will host the 2001 MWC Tournament, Nov. 15-17, at the Smith Fieldhouse in Provo.



**MWC PRESEASON VOLLEYBALL COACHES POLL**

In a vote of the eight head coaches in the Mountain West Conference, BYU is the favorite to win the 2001 MWC title after earning five first-place votes and 46 points. Colorado State, which finished with three first-place votes and 45 points in the poll, is second, followed by Utah, San Diego State, UNLV, New Mexico, Wyoming and Air Force. Last year's preseason poll foreshadowed the tight race between BYU and Colorado State, which tied for first in the 2000 poll. Colorado State captured the regular season MWC title with a 13-1 record, but the Cougars won a thrilling five-game match over the Rams in the championship match of the McLeod USA MWC Championship to earn the league's first-ever NCAA automatic bid.

**ELAINE MICHAELIS/coaching profile**



Now in her 40th year at the helm of the BYU program, Elaine Michaelis also enters her seventh year as Director of Women's Athletics. A proven winner, Michaelis is second all-time in

Division I victories with an 870-217-5 record (since records were kept in 1969) and has the most wins ever by a female coach. With BYU's 26-7 record last season, Michaelis posted her 27th consecutive 20-win season and her 29th in 32 years since records have been kept at BYU beginning in 1969. She has never had a losing season. Her team won last year's Mountain West Tournament title after winning the previous season's inaugural MWC regular season title. She has the distinction of winning the inaugural championship in each of the five leagues in which BYU has been a volleyball member. Michaelis is 25-3 in MWC play in two years and now has an overall conference mark of 346-33. She has guided her team to the NCAA tournament 19 times in the 20-year history of NCAA control of the sport, including 11 straight appearances. Her teams have participated in 29 of 32 national tournaments. BYU's two wins last year in the NCAA tournament improved Michaelis' national tournament record to 73-43 (.629). Michaelis is 26-19 (.578) in the NCAA tournament.

**2000 SEASON SUMMARY**

The Cougars won the Mountain West Conference Tournament and were ranked as high as No. 10 in 2000 while advancing to the NCAA Regional Semifinals for the fifth straight season, finishing 26-7. The tournament appearance was BYU's 11th straight and its 19th in the 20 years of the NCAA tournament. With its ninth-place tie in the tournament, BYU recorded its 20th overall top-10 national finish in the 32 years the Cougars have competed at the national level. All seven Cougar losses in 2000 were to teams ranked in the top 20 during the season, including a season-ending loss to No. 5 Arizona in the NCAA Central Regional Semifinals in Lincoln, Neb.

**NINAPUIKKONEN EARNS NATIONAL HONORS**

Junior middle blocker Nina Puikkonen was named to the AVCA All-America First Team and earned AVCA Sports Imports National Player of the Week honors twice (Sept. 11 and Nov. 20) during the season. She was the only player to earn the award more than once last season.

**FOUR COUGARS EARN CONFERENCE AWARDS**

Four BYU players earned All-MWC honors, including juniors Jackie Bundy (MB) and Nina Puikkonen (MB), sophomore Sunny Tonga (MB) and freshman Karina Puikkonen (S). Nina Puikkonen is a two-time All-MWC selection and three-time all-conference player (All-WAC as a freshman). Nina also earned four Mountain West Conference Player of the Week awards (Sept. 11, Oct. 16, Nov. 6, Nov. 20) while sophomore rightside hitter Sunny Tonga earned one MWC Player of the Week award (Oct. 30).

**MICHAELIS SURPASSED 850-WIN MILESTONE THIS SEASON**

Second all-time in division I wins, BYU coach Elaine Michaelis achieved her 850th career win with a 3-0 win over San Diego State on Sept. 23. Michaelis finished the season with an 867-216-5 overall record in 32 seasons since records were kept. She has won an amazing 80 percent of her matches and is the all-time leader in women's volleyball victories among female coaches.

**MELISSA LAYTON COMPLETES SENIOR SEASON**

Melissa had 15 double-digit kill matches last season, including six of the last eight. She recorded a team-high nine kills in the NCAA Central Regional Semifinals against Arizona. She had 15 or more kills four times, including a career-high 19 kills at Pepperdine. She recorded five double-digit dig matches and had two double-doubles. She led BYU in aces (42) and was fourth in digs (202). She averaged 2.72 kills and 1.89 digs per game and had a .243 hitting percentage. She was second in the MWC in aces (0.39).

**COUGARS DEFEAT NOS. 1, 2, 3 AND 4**

The Cougars defeated teams ranked No. 1, No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4 last season with wins over No. 1 Stanford, No. 2 Long Beach State and two wins over Colorado State when the Rams were ranked third and fourth. BYU's last win over the Rams was for the Mountain West Conference Tournament title and ended CSU's nation-best 44-match home court winning streak. The Cougars had a chance to beat a No. 5 team but dropped their bid losing to fifth-ranked Arizona in the NCAA Central Region semifinals.

**BYU PLAYS NATION'S BEST**

BYU played 14 matches last season against a ranked team. BYU had a 9-5 record in those matches with wins over Stanford, LBSU, Colorado State (2), Utah (2) and Kansas State, UCSB and Utah State. BYU has also played two matches, both losses, against teams who were not ranked at the time but later moved into the top 25 (Notre Dame and Utah State).

**WINNING STREAKS**

BYU won 13 straight matches entering the NCAA Central Regional in Lincoln. The Cougars enter the 2001 season with an active streak of 11 straight home victories.
