
- » No. 2/2 Auburn is set to open the 2017 season outside the country in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico for the Triple Crown Tournament. The Tigers will face No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 13 Washington, Nebraska and BYU in the three-day event.
- » Auburn's national ranking is the highest it has ever had to open up a season. Last year, the Tigers began 2016 at No. 4, which was a program-best.
- » The Tigers are coming off the deepest postseason run in school history. Auburn won a record 58 games en route to the Women's College World Series Championship Series, where it faced Oklahoma and battled the Sooners to a three-game series.
- » Auburn is led at the plate by three-time All-American Kasey Cooper, who returns for her final season. Cooper shattered a plethora of program records last season including 83 RBI, 21 home runs, 71 walks and 163 total bases. She also set Auburn single-season marks with a .581 on-base percentage and an .880 slugging percentage.
- » Key returners from the 2016 squad include Victoria Draper, Haley Fagan and Carlee Wallace at the plate, as well as Kaylee Carlson and Makayla Martin in the circle.

CLINT MYERS » HEAD COACH

With the reputation of taking a program and turning it into a perennial power, head coach Clint Myers has taken Auburn softball to unprecedented heights in just three years.

Myers has guided the Tigers to back-to-back Women's College World Series appearances in the past two campaigns, when the previously best finish came with a showing at a regional final in 2006.

Since his appointment following the 2013 season, Auburn has broken 21 records, including 16 on offense, and led the nation in a plethora of categories.

Myers has coached nine All-Americans, with three coming in each of his seasons on The Plains. Before his arrival, the Tigers had five players who were tabbed All-Americans in the previous 17 campaigns.

In comparison with rivals in the conference, Myers has coached nine All-SEC performers, even setting a program record with four in 2015. Between 1997-2013, Auburn had never placed multiple players on the all-conference team lists. Since then, the Tigers have had three, four and two representatives in successive years under Myers.

As impressive as Myers' teams have been on the field, the program has taken a giant leap forward off of it.

Under Myers, Auburn has placed three on Academic All-America and Academic All-District lists, something that had never been done previously. In 2016, the Tigers had 24 honorees on the Academic All-SEC list. Kasey Cooper also became the first player in softball history to be named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and the NCAA Elite 90 winner.

A 1976 graduate of Arizona State, Myers was a member of the Sun Devil baseball team from 1970-73 and played on the College World Series runner-up squads in 1972 and 1973. He was later selected by the St. Louis Cardinals in the third round of the 1973 Major League Draft.

Myers and his wife, Katie, have two sons, Casey and Corey. They also have three grandchildren; grandsons, Cole and Christian, and granddaughter, Carlee.

Thursday's duel will mark the second time the two teams have faced each other oustide the state of Oklahoma. In 2002, the Sooners took a 6-2 result over Auburn in Miami, Fla.

INSIDE THE SERIES: NEBRASKA

» Auburn and Nebraska have shared the field four times since 1998. The Huskers hold a 3-1 lead in the series, with all three wins coming in neutral site tilts. In 2010, the latest series matchup, the Tigers won 2-1 behind the pitching duo of Angel Bunner and Anna Thompson.

INSIDE THE SERIES: BYU

» In two games in the series history, BYU has taken both decisions in one-run ball-games. The Tigers and the Cougars played each other in back-to-back days in 2011. Both contests took place at Jane B. Moore Field and were marked as NCAA Regional battles.

ON THIS DATE

» On Feb. 9, 2001, Auburn took down Purdue, 7-2, and Syracuse, 7-0, to highlight a 6-0 start to the 2001 campaign. The two wins marked the first of their kind in the respective series against the Boilermakers and the Orange.

NATIONAL SCALE

» Senior Kasey Cooper and freshman Alyssa Rivera have already made an impact in 2017 on the Auburn softball program. The duo was selected to be on the USA Women's National Team for contests beginning in June. Cooper, who became the first Tiger ever to don the stars and stripes, returns to the senior squad for her second stint, while Rivera was tabbed to the junior team.

TIGERS OPEN SEASON AT NO. 2

» The Auburn softball program achieved another first when it was picked No. 2 in the nation in both the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll and USA Softball/ESPN.com Poll. The Tigers closed the 2016 campaign as the second-ranked team in the country after reaching the Women's College World Series Championship Series for the first time ever.

THREE NAMED TO POTY WATCH LIST

- » Kaylee Carlson, Kasey Cooper and Makayla Martin were tabbed to the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Watch List.
- » Auburn tied for the most representatives on the list, joining Arizona, Florida, Florida State and Oklahoma who each had three players chosen.

COOPER PICKED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

- » Auburn softball's Kasey Cooper was picked to the Preseason All-SEC Team, the league office announced Wednesday with the unveiling of its 10th annual list for the upcoming 2017 season.
- » Cooper, the lone representative from the reigning conference tournament champions, earned the nod as a preseason all-conference choice for the third consecutive time in her career.
- » The 2016 SEC Player of the Year was one of six seniors to be selected to the team that also included six juniors and three sophomores.

TIGERS TO APPEAR ON NATIONAL TV

- » Fresh off the deepest postseason run in program history, the Auburn softball team is slated to appear on national television 13 times during the 2017 schedule.
- » The Tigers are set to have six games featured on ESPN2, five on the SEC Network and one on ESPNU through the upcoming campaign.
- » Included in the major television package will be 22 Auburn home games streamed online via SEC Network+, the online-only branch of the SEC Network.

LOADED SCHEDULE

- » Auburn is set to face a challenging schedule as 35 of its games will be against teams that made the NCAA Tournament a season ago, including 10 contests versus teams that made the Women's College World Series.
- » The Tigers are set to face 15 opponents who were ranked or receiving votes in the annual preseason polls, including five inside the top 10. Auburn has six SEC opponents who are inside the top 25 on the docket with four of them being road fixtures.
