SCU Hosts BYU In WCC Home Opener New Year's Day

Santa Clara returns home to open 2015 and West Coast Conference play on the same day! The Broncos will host a 2 pm game with BYU on Thurs., Jan. 1. The game will be telecast on BYU-TV with Dave McCann and Blaine Fowler making the call. It will also be broadcast live on SantaClaraBroncos.com as part of the Bronco Radio Network. Anthony Passarelli is in his eighth season as the Broncos' play-by-play announcer.

Santa Clara is 6-7 and 1-1 in the WCC. BYU is 11-4 and 1-1 in the WCC. Santa Clara is 3-2 at home this season and the Cougars are 2-0 on the road. BYU is led by four players who average double figures including 2014 WCC Player of the Year Tyler Haws, who scores 22.1 ppg. Anson Winder (14.9), this week's WCC Player of the Week Kyle Collinsworth (13.6) and Chase Fischer (13.4) all average double digits as well. Collinsworth leads the team with 7.8 rpg.

Leading from wire to wire, with Denzel Johnson opening the game on with a 5-0 run, Santa Clara won 57-40 at Pacific on Dec. 27. Matt Hubbard scored a career-high 15 points and was three of three from beyond the arc. Jared Brownridge scored 14, including 4 of 6 from the three. He added a career high eight rebounds. Denzel Johnson had 10. In his first start this year, Nate Kratch had a career-high 11 rebounds. Brandon Clark scored nine, tying a career high with seven boards and six assists.

With BYU leading up-start Portland by 22 points in the middle of the second half, the Cougars held off the Pilots and won 97-88 on Dec. 27 in Provo. Not much of a defensive battle, both teams scored 50+ in the second half, with BYU tallying 54 and Portland 51. Five Cougars scored in double figures, including three with 21+ (Haws, 24; Winder, 22; and Collinsworth, 21).

Our Opponent

Santa Clara is 5-21 vs. BYU all-time and has lost 10 straight games to the Cougars. The Broncos' last series win came on Dec. 2, 1972 when they defeated No. 12 BYU, 66-64, in Provo. The Broncos' last win vs. BYU in Santa Clara came almost 54 years ago and it was actually two wins on back-to-back days. The Broncos defeated BYU 64-53 on Dec. 8, 1961 and then 71-55 on Dec. 9, 1961.

Brownridge and Clark Lead The Broncos

The Broncos return the West Coast Conference's top-scoring back-court in Brandon Clark and Jared Brownridge. Clark is averaging 16.2 ppg after scoring 16.9 ppg in 2013-14. Brownridge is averaging 15.2 ppg this season after leading the team with 17.2 ppg last year. Clark has scored double figures in 11 of 13 games and Brownridge has done it 10 times this year. Brownridge has led the team in scoring seven times, Clark the other five games and Matt Hubbard once.

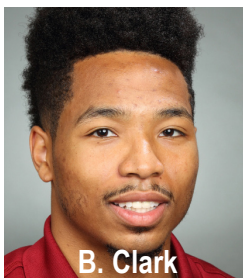

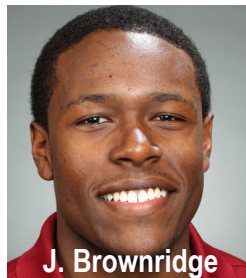

SANTA CLARA'S PROBABLE STARTING FIVE



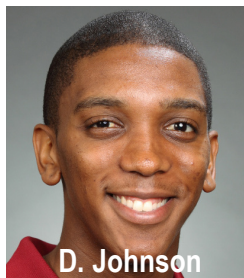

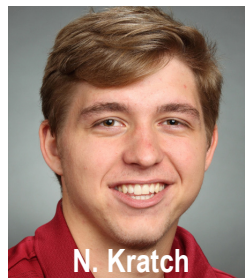

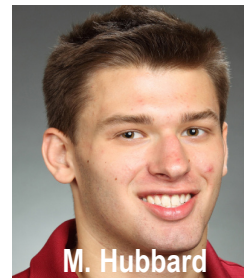

Johnson

Starting every game this season, Denzel Johnson is averaging 8.2 ppg. He has scored double figures six times this season, including a season-high 15 points vs. Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 14. His 22 steals on the year puts him at No. 4 in the WCC. He is No. 2 on the team with 427 minutes played, behind Jared Brownridge's 429 minutes played, and Johnson is No. 6 in the league. He has played in 98 games with 24 starts during his four-year career. A versatile guard, he started 10 games his freshman year and then just one his junior year.

136 Career Threes

Jared Brownridge has started each of the 46 career games he has played in dating back to last season and hit double figures in 36 of those games. He led the team with 95 three pointers a season ago and has already hit 41 this season. His 567 points last year scored shattered the SCU freshman record and placed him at No. 2 all-time in points scored for a Bay Area freshman (list includes SCU, Stanford, Cal, Saint Mary's, San Francisco and Pacific). He finished his freshman year with 24 points vs. Gonzaga in the WCC quarters, as the Broncos fell 77-75 on a last second layup by the Zags' David Stockton.

Brownridge has scored 30+ points three times, all last year. He has scored 20+ points 17 times in his career, including three straight games this season (vs. Rider, at San Jose State and vs. Washington State). He has scored five or more threes seven times in his career, including seven twice last year (7 vs. La Sierra, 12/14/13 and 7 at Pepperdine, 3-1-14).

20+ 5 Times This Year; 18 Times In Career

Brandon Clark has started 50 of the 114 games he has played in during his four-year career. Clark has scored 20+ points in five games this season, including 24 at Saint Mary's on Dec. 27 and a career-high 31 vs. Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 14. Clark has scored double figures 57 times in his career, including 18 games with 20 or more points the past two years. His first two seasons he never scored more than 19. He also scored 30 or more three times during his career, including a season-high 31 points vs. Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 14.

Clark had his streak of 25 straight games in double figures snapped at Utah State when he scored nine. The streak dated back to Dec. 13, 2013. It was the longest streak for a Bronco since Travis Niesen scored double figures in 22 straight games (Feb. 5, 2005-Jan. 21, 2006).

Back In, Not Again

Freshman-redshirt Emmanuel Ndumanya played seven minutes with a rebound at Saint Mary's on Dec. 27 after sitting out the last nine games with a left foot injury. In his next game, at Pacific, he scored a career-high four points with a rebound in nine minutes. The Anambra, Nigeria native grabbed 14 rebounds in his first two games, averaging 15.0 mpg.

The Broncos will be without the services of forward Yannick Atanga (6-8, 230) for the remainder of the year. He injured his knee in the opening half of the season vs. Cal State Fullerton and did not play vs. San Diego Christian, but did play 20 minutes at Utah State. After the game his knee swelled and an MRI determined he tore his ACL. Atanga had surgery to repair it on Dec. 16. It is expected he will apply for a sixth year.

With a block at Utah State on Nov. 19, Atanga sits at No. 5 all-time in SCU history with 94 career blocks. He

passed former All-American Kurt Rambis (93, 1976-80). After leading the WCC in rebounds in 2012-13, Atanga was second on the team in rebounds last year with 5.0 rpg and led the team with 30 blocks. He has collected 10+ boards in 11 career games. A native of Yaounde, Cameroon, Atanga spent time playing with the Cameroon National Team in China as part of a four-nation tournament in 2013. Sporting a 7-4 wing span, Atanga dreams of one day working for the United Nations as a peacekeeper in Africa.

Brandon

Brandon Clark is No. 23 on the all-time points scored list with 1,253. He needs 28 points to move to No. 20 and will pass Ralph Ogden (1,280, 1967-70). Clark is tied for No. 3 all-time in free throw percentage. He has made 328 of his 395 free throws attempted, good for 83.0 percent. The school record is held by Steve Nash (86.1 percent, 1991-96).

Clark was named the WCC Player of the Week on Nov. 17, 2014. He set a school record for points scored in a season opener with 31, including 15 of 16 from the line, in the Broncos' win vs. CSU Fullerton on Nov. 14. He had four career bests on the weekend as well. He was 15 of 16 from the free throw line vs. the Titans - marking a career best in makes and attempts. He is the only the seventh Bronco in school history to make 15+ free throws in a game. He scored 21 points vs. SDC on Nov. 15, collecting a career-high nine assists.

Career

Sophomore Nate Kratch had career highs in both rebounds (11) and blocks (4) at Pacific on Dec. 27. He scored a career-high 15 points off the bench on Dec. 20 vs. Northeastern. His previous career high 11 points at Cal Poly on Dec. 7, 2013. He was seven of 10 from the free throw line, also career bests.

Kratch had come off the bench in all 12 games this season when he started at Pacific. Freshman Matt Hubbard added a few career bests in the Pacific game as well. He scored a career-high 15 points, tying career highs with five field goals made and three threes made. Starting 11 of the 13 games this season, he leads the team with 5.1 rpg.

Freshman Evan Wardlow scored a career-high eight points off the bench at Saint Mary's. Jared Brownridge had a career-high eight rebounds at Pacific and Brandon Clark tied a career-high with seven rebounds himself.

Our 20s

Jared Brownridge (27) and Brandon Clark (23) scored 20+ points each in SCU's 68-60 win vs. Rider on Nov. 30. Brownridge had a season-high six threes. They narrowly missed the feat again vs. Washington State with Brownridge scoring 25 and Clark adding 19. Scoring 20+ together is nothing new for the duo of Brownridge and Clark, as they did it five times last season. The first time was Nov. 16, 2013 when Brownridge scored 21 and Clark added 23. The last time was Jan. 28, 2014 when Brownridge dropped 30 and Clark added 20.

Youngsters

The Broncos welcome four true freshmen to their team: forward Matt Hubbard from Colville, Wash., guard Stephen Edwards from Muskogee, Okla., forward Evan Wardlow from Lake View Terrace, Calif., and guard Kai Healy from Sydney, Australia. In addition, the Broncos have two redshirt freshmen, forward Jarvis Pugh from Murphy, Texas and center Emmanuel Ndumanya from Anambra, Nigeria. In the offseason, the team also added forward Dominic Romeo, a graduate student who played a year of football at Notre Dame University.

Denzel

Denzel Johnson and Academy Award winner Denzel Washington share a similar story on their first names. While pregnant with Johnson, the doctor told his parents he was going to be a girl and were thrown two pink baby showers for a girl. When Johnson was born, they were surprised to find out he was a boy and had no name! After a lot of conversation, they chose the name Denzel, after Denzel Washington.

Fast forward to years later, when Johnson's father, C.J., met Denzel Washington. When Johnson told him why they named his son after Washington, the actor laughed. Washington's parents were also told he was going to be a girl and when he was born, they had no name for him. After debating, his parents named him after the doctor who delivered him.

Like his namesake, Johnson enjoys his time in front of the camera. Johnson is in his third year of working as an EyeBronco reporter for SCU Media Relations. He is in his second year of hosting Bronco Weekly Sports Wrap, a weekly YouTube show on Bronco Athletics (youtube.com/EyeBronco).

Andrew

Senior Andrew Papenfus is recovering from brain surgery in early Oct. Papenfus suffered a seizure in mid-June at Santa Clara during a Bronco Basketball camp drill. Tests revealed he had a golf ball sized tumor in the left side of his brain. He was given the choice to wait to have the surgery and play this season or have the surgery immediately. Because they couldn't guarantee it wouldn't grow, up-regulate, Papenfus decided to have brain surgery as soon as the surgeon could get it on the schedule. "Why take the risk," said Papenfus.

The five hour surgery was done at UCSF in San Francisco by Dr. Mitch Berger and his team. He has shocked doctors with how fast he has been able to recover. He was only in the hospital for four days. Papenfus has already graduated from basic physical therapy (he couldn't move his right foot after surgery) and is working on sports rehabilitation. His hope is that he will be able to play this season and is shooting for a West Coast Conference debut. He travels with the team to help him continue to rehab.

Kai

SCU was expecting to redshirt Kai Healy this year, but announced prior to the Michigan State game on Nov. 24 that he would play this year. He responded with four points and three boards in 19 minutes at Michigan State. He started and scored a key three pointer in Santa Clara's win vs. Rider on Nov. 30.

Healy is a 2013 graduate of The Scots College in Sydney, Australia. The Scots College lost 82-76 to Lake Ginninderra College in the national championship high school game in 2013. Healy had 25 points in that game on 10 of 11 shooting from the field, including making four of five beyond the arc. Dante Exum scored 19 points with 15 assists for Lake Ginninderra. Lake Ginninderra had a 17-point three quarter time lead reduced to four points inside the final two minutes, before they steadied to hold on for the win. Healy's team defeated Exum's team three of the five times they played during their prep career. Exum went on to be the fifth overall pick by the Utah Jazz in the 2014 NBA Draft.

Healy was born in Indianapolis, Ind. and moved to Australia prior to his fourth birthday and has lived there with his family since then. His father is a Notre Dame graduate and his mother a University of Indiana graduate.

Redheads

Nate Kratch made his first three on his first attempt in his first game for the Broncos last year. Kratch comes from a very athletic family. His maternal grandmother, Dorsey Anderson Dinkla, played professional basketball for the Redheads and was inducted into the Professional Basketball Hall of Fame in New York City at Madison Square Garden last year. She once scored 70 points in a high school game.

His dad, Bob, played football at Iowa and went on to win a Super Bowl ring with the New York Giants in 1991. His mother, Kristi, was a high jumper at Iowa and cleared a personal best of 5'11. His older brother, Colby, played tight end at Toledo University and is now a graduate assistant for the Rockets. His younger sister, MacKenzie, strives to be a Division I hockey player next year.

Finally, his paternal grandfather played baseball at Long Island University and two Kratch Uncles played football at Cornell and Central College.

Long Walks?

Jared Brownridge works as an EyeBronco reporter for the SCU Media Relations office and hosts his own series called "Long Walks With Jared". With a couple camera people filming their conversation, Brownridge walks around the picturesque Mission campus interviewing his subject. He has interviewed teammates Dominic Romeo and Brandon Clark; and Dec. 19 he interviewed the SCU President, Father Michael Engh. Through an invitation on @SCUBroncos Twitter, WCC Commissioner Lynn Holzman has agreed to come to campus for a "Long Walk With Jared".

Brownridge, who was named to the Kyle Macy All-American team last year as a finalist for National Freshman of the Year, was named as one of the preseason candidates for the Lou Henson Award earlier this month. He was also named to the 2014 10-man preseason All-WCC list. Last season Brownridge set seven SCU freshman season records and three game records.

The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the Division I "Mid-Major" Player of the Year. The award is named in honor of Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. When he left the game in 2005 he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779. He is the winningest coach at both Illinois and New Mexico State. He is one of only 12 coaches in the history of the game to take two schools to the Final Four.

Romeo, Romeo Wherefore Art Though Romeo?

In his first season as a walk-on forward with the Broncos after graduating from the University of Notre Dame in 2014, Dominic Romeo is working on his Master's degree in Theology. Romeo has played in two games this season.

He graduated magna cum laude from UND in 2014 with a double major in Chinese and Political Science. He was a walk-on defensive end for the Fighting Irish football team (2012 season). As an undergrad he spent time volunteering in Honduras, Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda and the United State's Appalachian region. He also travelled to China three times and wrote his senior thesis on grassroots Democratic movements in rural China. Proficient in Mandarin Chinese, he was president of Notre Dame's Political Science Honors Society and founded Notre Dame's first-ever Chinese Language Club. His career goal is to be a medical doctor in a developing country.

Just how did he end up at Santa Clara this season? After playing a couple years in Notre Dame's famed Book Store Basketball Tournament, in which he was named the MVP of, Romeo decided to try his hand at college basketball. He passed up the opportunity to play four years prior. He sent emails to more than 150 schools and many responded. A Turlock, Calif. native, he narrowed it down to Cal, Pacific and Santa Clara. After he spent time talking with the Bronco coaches and meeting the players on the team, he said his decision to come to Santa Clara was quite easy. "As I interacted with everyone involved in the program, I was struck by how close the team was, and how much everyone seemed to genuinely care for one another. Being raised in a large family, I greatly appreciate the cohesion of a family, and it didn't take long at all for me to notice that was a real thing here on this basketball team. Once I recognized this, my decision to come here was easy, and I haven't looked back for even a second since."

Going to a WCC school should have seemed like a no-brainer for Romeo. His sister Samantha goes to Gonzaga, his brother attends grad school at Saint Mary's and his father graduated from University of San Diego.

Youth-filled again, this season the Broncos feature nine underclassmen, no juniors and three seniors. Entering his eighth season at SCU, Kerry Keating led the Broncos to 14 wins last year. Freshman Jared Brownridge was named the WCC Newcomer of the Year. Brownridge made 95 threes, breaking Kevin Foster's record from 2009 (85). His career record is 114-121. Brandon Clark became the 32nd career Bronco to score 1,000 career points.

Keating led the Broncos to 24+ victories for the second time in three years in 2012-13. Collecting a 26-12 record, the Broncos won the CBI post-season tournament after winning the CIT in 2011. The Broncos final RPI was No. 68 and record-wise, they claimed the biggest turnaround in Division I basketball this year. The 26 wins were just one shy

of the school record set by the 1968-69 team who collected 27 wins.

SCU won 26 games in 2012-13 after winning 21 regular season games for the first time in almost 20 years on the Mission campus. Keating coached two first-team All-WCC members in Marc Trasolini and Kevin Foster. Foster finished as the second-all-time leading scorer in WCC history. In addition to their success on the court, all five seniors graduated in June as well. Keating has seen all 19 of his seniors graduate from Santa Clara during his tenure.

The Broncos combined to break 22 school and WCC records in 2012-13. Foster broke the all-time WCC record for threes made, finishing tied for fourth in Division I history with 431. The Broncos broke eight individual career records and five individual season records. As a team the Broncos broke eight season records as well. They also led the West Coast Conference in two team categories and two individual categories overall and two team categories and three individual categories in league games.

Keating led the Broncos to 24 wins in 2010-11 – the second most in school history – and the Collegen Insider.com Post-Season Tournament Championship. Foster was named to the All-WCC First Team and an NABC All-District honoree; Evan Roquemore was named to the Freshman All-WCC Team and Troy Payne was named the WCC Defensive Player of the Year.

The Broncos also set eight team records, seven individual season records, two individual career records and four freshman individual records in 2010-11. Foster's 140 threes were No. 1 nationally and No. 9 all-time in the NCAA. Both Foster and Trasolini scored their 1000th point in 2011 as well. All four seniors – Ben Dowdell, Troy Payne, Nate Mensah and Michael Santos – graduated in June 2011.

Keating led the Broncos to 11 wins in 2009-10 and a fifth-place finish in the league. Trasolini was named all-league and Robert Smith was named to the Freshman All-WCC team.

In 2008-09, Keating led the Broncos to 16 wins and a trip to the West Coast Conference Tournament semi-finals. In addition to Bryant being named the WCC Player of the Year, Kevin Foster was named the WCC Newcomer of the Year. Three Broncos were named to the WCC All-Freshman team with the trio breaking 10 Bronco freshmen records.

It was a record-setting year for the Broncos in 2009. They won the 2008 Cable Car Classic with an 89-88 overtime win vs. UTEP. Bryant became the first Bronco in school history to score 1,600+ points, grab 1,100+ rebounds and block 200+ shots. Bryant finished his career at Santa Clara No. 1 in rebounds (1,152), No. 1 in blocks (246) and No. 6 in scoring (1,667). He was No. 1 in the country in double-doubles, rebounds per game and total rebounds during regular season play.

Foster's 85 three-pointers in 2009-10 broke two-time NBA MVP Steve Nash's Bronco record. Nash set the SCU record in 1995 when he made 84. Foster also broke the single season record for three pointers attempted with 232, breaking the Bronco record set by Kyle Bailey in 2005 when he attempted 198. In addition, Marc Trasolini broke the Bronco record for single season shooting percentage, hitting 68.1% - shattering a 37-year old record set by Mike Stewart in 1972 when Stewart shot 64.7%. Santos and Dowdell were both named to the WCC Academic Honor Roll with the men's team posting a 3.1 GPA in the Spring 2009 quarter.

Keating's first Bronco team won 15 games in 2007-08, finishing fourth in the WCC as the eight-team league sent a record three teams to the 2008 NCAA Tournament. Both Angley and Bryant were named to the WCC First Team. Angley broke the school record for minutes played in a season; and Bryant led the WCC in blocks and rebounds and was second in scoring. Bryant broke the SCU career blocks record, entering his senior year with 162, and single season record for blocks with 76 his junior year. Mitch Henke was named the WCC Postgraduate Male Athlete of the Year.

Keating was named the 14th men's basketball coach in Santa Clara history on April 6, 2007 and was introduced to the media at a press conference on April 9, 2007. Keating came to Santa Clara after serving four seasons as an assistant coach at UCLA, helping the Bruins to Final Four appearances in 2006 and '07. Keating is only the fifth SCU head coach since Bob Feerick took the reigns of the program in 1950 and the first Bronco men's basketball head coach to be hired without having attended or coached as an assistant at SCU since 1926 when Harlan Dykes was hired as head coach.
