Johnny Dawkins' contributions since arriving on The Farm have come in the form of both team and individual success, most notably guiding the Cardinal to the 2014 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 and the 2012 Postseason NIT championship.

Meanwhile, Dawkins has also been responsible for overseeing the development of Landry Fields, Josh Huestis and Dwight Powell, all of whom parlayed outstanding senior seasons into NBA Draft selections. Huestis (first round) and Powell (second round) were taken in the first round of the 2014 NBA Draft while Fields (second round) was chosen in 2010.

Dawkins has also made significant strides off the court, with the 2014 recruiting class representing the latest top-20 crop of freshmen to arrive on The Farm. Even more impressively, that same young talent is being developed quickly. In 2012, Chasson Randle became the fourth player to earn All-Freshman Team status among conference players during Dawkins' tenure following a six-year period in which only two Cardinal rookies were honored.

A very high standard in the classroom has also been established during Dawkins' tenure. In 2013-14, Stanford totaled the most Pac-12 All-Academic selections (6) of any conference school for the fifth consecutive season while Powell was tabbed the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

The 2013-14 campaign was especially memorable, as Stanford (23-13, 10-8 Pac-12) advanced to the Sweet 16 for only the fifth time in school history after upsets of No. 7 seed New Mexico and No. 2 seed Kansas. Despite losing two starters and two key reserves to season-ending injuries, the Cardinal finished tied for third in the highly-competitive Pac-12.

Stanford finished 19-15 overall two seasons ago, advancing to the NIT second round. The Cardinal finished 9-9 in the Pac-12, swept the season series against California for the first time since 2008 and notched a 76-52 home upset of No. 10/12 Oregon.

Stanford produced a 26-11 record in 2011-12 en route to capturing the Postseason NIT title, the third championship in school history. The Cardinal chalked up its best win total since a 28-8 campaign in 2007-08. Stanford was the Pac-12's winningest program and tallied a league-best four top-50 RPI victories.

The Cardinal concluded the 2010-11 season at 15-16, fielding a team without a senior for the first time in school history. Stanford finished 14-18 during the 2009-10 campaign, Dawkins' second year at the helm.

In 2008-09, Dawkins directed Stanford to a 20-14 record and reached the CBI semifinals. In addition to surpassing Robert Burnett as the winningest first-year head coach in school history, Dawkins ranked third in victories among 21 first-year head coaches in Division I with no prior college head coaching experience.

Dawkins, 51, became Stanford's 17th head coach on April 28, 2008, after 11 years as an assistant at Duke.

Scouting BYU

- BYU (8-3, 0-0 WCC) has won four of five overall, most recently 76-60 over Weber State.
- The Cougars are averaging 89.8 points, 40.4 rebounds and 18.9 assists while shooting 48.2 percent overall and 75.4 percent from the foul line.
- The Cougars are led by: Tyler Haws (23.8 ppg, 49.7% FG, 43.4% 3FG, 90.1% FT), Chase Fischer (13.9 ppg, 44.2% 3FG), Kyle Collinsworth (12.4 ppg, 6.6 rpg, 53 assists).
- BYU compiled a 23-12 record last season and was 13-5 in WCC play. The Cougars have made 28 NCAA Tournaments and seven of the last eight overall.
- Stanford is 2-5 all-time against BYU. The Cougars prevailed 112-103 at Maples Pavilion last November. The Cardinal's most recent victory was a 62-53 decision on Nov. 23, 2004, at the EA Sports Maui Invitational.

Scouting No. 9/9 Texas

- No. 9/9 Texas (9-1, 0-0 Big 12) is welcoming Stanford to Austin for the first time. It's also the opener of a home-and-home series that brings Texas to Maples Pavilion in 2015.
- The Longhorns are averaging 72.4 points, 45.6 rebounds and 14.1 assists. Opponents are being limited to 30.6 percent shooting overall and 26.5 percent from long distance.
- You'll want to check out: Myles Turner (12.5 ppg, 7.0 rpg, 88.4% FT), Jonathan Holmes (12.3 ppg, 7.4 rpg, 43.7% 3FG), Demarcus Holland (8.5 ppg, 56.5 FG%, 78.1% FT).
- Texas finished 24-11 overall and 11-7 in the Big 12 last season, advancing to the NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns return their top four scorers from a year ago.
- Texas has won two of the three meetings. Stanford and Texas have not faced off since March 28, 2008, when the Longhorns defeated the Cardinal 82-62 in the NCAA Sweet 16. Stanford's only victory was a 72-46 home decision back on Dec. 22, 1962.

Recent Success Against Top-25 Opponents

Stanford is 9-16 all-time against top-25 teams under head coach Johnny Dawkins, including a 70-59 loss to No. 4/3 Duke on Nov. 22. During the 2013-14 campaign, Stanford finished 5-2 against top-25 opponents, defeating No. 23/25 UCLA at home while winning road games at No. 10/10 Connecticut and No. 17/13 Oregon. In the NCAA Tournament, Stanford knocked off No. 17/17 New Mexico and No. 10/10 Kansas. The five top-25 victories were the most since the 2007-08 campaign, when Stanford beat six top-25 clubs.

Scouting Arkansas-Pine Bluff

- Arkansas-Pine Bluff (2-8, 0-0 SWAC) had dropped six in a row prior to a 61-56 upset of Houston on Wednesday. The Golden Lions will not play a home game until hosting Mississippi Valley State on Jan. 3.
- The Golden Lions are averaging 54.0 points and 26.0 rebounds. However, they are shooting only 36.9 percent overall while committing 15.0 turnovers per game.
- Be sure to watch: Marcel Mosley (17.5 ppg, 43.4% FG, 83.8% FT), Jovaughn Love (12.5 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 37.2% FG), Ghiavonni Robinson (7.2 ppg, 2.6 rpg).
- Arkansas-Pine Bluff has made one prior NCAA Tournament appearance, overcoming an 0-11 start in 2010 to finish 18-16 and capture its conference tournament title.
- The only previous meeting resulted in a 92-49 Stanford rout four years ago at Maples.

Takeaways From The Loyola Marymount Game

- Chasson Randle scored a season-high 31 points (9-19 FG, 3-8 3FG, 10-12 FT), two off his career high, as Stanford downed Loyola Marymount 67-58 on Wednesday night. It was Randle's fifth career 30-point game.
- Stefan Nastic added 15 points on 7-10 shooting and grabbed five rebounds.
- Stanford trailed 31-19 with 3:25 left in the first half and 31-27 at intermission. But the Cardinal outscored the Lions 40-27 over the final 20 minutes.
- Stanford's 11 steals were its most since also totaling 11 at USC last January. The Cardinal also forced 17 turnovers, which led to 20 points.
- For the first time this season, Anthony Brown failed to reach double-digit scoring. He grabbed five rebounds and matched a career high with five assists.
- Stanford and Loyola Marymount were meeting for the first time since Dec. 21, 1984, when the Cardinal recorded a 67-59 home victory.
- Loyola Marymount's Evan Payne, who scored 32 points in his last game against Northern Arizona, was limited to 14 points.

100th SEASON OF STANFORD BASKETBALL

Stanford's 100th season features a celebration of the program's storied history and tradition. For all home games, an All-American will be featured on the commemorative game ticket. There are plans to honor select All-Americans during an in-game ceremony at specific games, as schedules permit.



Looking Back: BYU 112, Stanford 103 (Nov. 11, 2013 at Stanford, Calif.)

- The 215 combined points were the most in a regulation game since Dec. 6, 1985, when Stanford defeated Yale 129-108 (237 points).
- Stanford's 103 points were its most in a regulation game since a 105-60 win against Washington on Jan. 19, 2002.
- The 112 points were the most allowed by Stanford in a regulation game since a 114-83 loss at UCLA on Feb. 24, 1977.
- Stanford connected on 45.9 percent shooting and placed four players in double figures. Chasson Randle's career-high 33 points (12-23 FG, 7-9 FT) were the most for a Cardinal player since Landry Fields scored 35 against UCLA back on Feb. 4, 2010.
- Tyler Haws scored 31 points (10-18 FG, 9-13 FT) to lead six BYU players in double digits.
- BYU shot 53.5 percent from the field overall, with Matt Carlino adding 26 points on 8-16 shooting. The Cougars made 8-15 from beyond the arc and 28-43 from the foul line.
- The Cougars led 54-46 at halftime, used a 19-8 second-half scoring run to take their largest lead at 91-72 and eventually held off a late Cardinal charge.

Back-To-Back Slow Starts

The 12-point hole Stanford encountered against Loyola Marymount was its largest deficit overcome since last season's December road upset of No. 10/10 Connecticut, when the Cardinal trailed 43-30 with 16:48 remaining in the second half.

Sixth-Fewest Turnovers In Nation

Stanford has excelled at taking care of the basketball, with its 85 total turnovers ranking sixth-fewest in the country. Only five schools (Cal Poly- 64, Ohio- 73, Delaware- 77, Bryant- 79, Utah State- 80) have committed fewer miscues.

Cashing In At The Charity Stripe

- Stanford has placed an added emphasis this season on getting to the foul line, with a goal of 25 free throw attempts per game. The Cardinal has converted 137-184 (74.5 percent) from the charity stripe. It's a mark that leads the Pac-12 and ranks 30th in the country.
- Chasson Randle's 42-44 clip (95.5 percent) from the line ranks fourth-best in the nation. Randle converted his first 35 freebies of the season before misfiring on the second of two attempts at the 13:14 mark of the second half against Loyola Marymount.
- Stanford's 38 made free throws and 46 free throw attempts against South Dakota on Nov. 16 were the most since a 40-47 outing against Cal State Northridge on Nov. 18, 2008.
- Seniors Anthony Brown, Stefan Nastic and Chasson Randle are a combined 95-111 (85.5 percent) from the foul line this season.

Randle: First All-American Since 2008?

Fresh off a junior season in which his NCAA Tournament performances garnered national headlines, Chasson Randle must be considered a candidate for Pac-12 Player of the Year and Stanford's first All-America recipient since Brook Lopez in 2008.

- 540 points away from passing Todd Lichti (2,336) as Stanford's all-time scoring leader. Randle's 1,797 career points are good for third, also trailing Adam Keefe (2,319).
- Wooden Award Presented by Wendy's Preseason Top 50 candidate (first representative from Stanford since Dan Grunfeld and Chris Hernandez in 2006).
- Naismith Trophy Top 50 Watch list, awarded annually to the men's player of the year.
- Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award candidate (one of 36 players overall and three from the Pac-12, honoring the nation's top point guard).
- Allstate NABC/WBCA Good Works Team, recognizing student-athletes who demonstrate a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to their communities.
- Two-time Pac-12 All-Academic second team honoree and 2014 NABC Honors Court pick.
- 2014 All-Pac-12 first team honoree who sparked Stanford's NCAA Tournament upset of Kansas while averaging 18.8 points and shooting 47.7 percent from the field.

Travis On Historic Freshman Pace

Rookie Reid Travis has added to Stanford's depth in the frontcourt, establishing himself as a consistent rebounder and effective scorer. Travis is averaging 7.0 points and 6.6 rebounds per game while shooting 44.2 percent overall. Against No. 4/3 Duke on Nov. 22, Travis hauled down 12 rebounds, the most by a Cardinal freshman since Brook Lopez also grabbed 12 boards against Gonzaga on Jan. 31, 2007. Travis has an opportunity to be included among some elite company, if he can maintain his current scoring and rebounding pace.

Team Effort On The Boards

One of the unknowns entering this season was how Stanford would perform on the glass following the departures of eventual NBA Draft picks Josh Huestis and Dwight Powell. So far, so good, as the Cardinal is averaging 38.4 rebounds. It's been a complete team effort on the boards, led by Anthony Brown's 7.5 per game. Four of Stanford's five starters are pulling down at least 4.0 rebounds per game.

Scoring Balance Keys Offense

Five players scored in double figures during the loss to DePaul on Nov. 30, signaling the fifth time in eight games that at least four Cardinal players scored at 10+ points. The combination of Chasson Randle, Anthony Brown, Rosco Allen, Reid Travis and Stefan Nastic has started seven games and is accounting for 84.2 percent of Stanford's overall scoring.

Three (!) Seniors With Master's

Last year's memorable NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 run will likely prove to be a valuable experience for senior tri-captains Anthony Brown, Stefan Nastic and Chasson Randle. The veteran trio is equally determined to succeed in the classroom, with each starter currently completing coursework toward their master's degrees.

- Brown (Communication major, 3.26 GPA), a fifth-year senior, is working toward a Coterminal M.A. in the Media Studies program.
- Fellow fifth-year senior Nastic (Psychology major, 3.17 GPA) is progressing toward a Coterminal M.A. in the Communication program.
- Randle (African and African-American Studies major, 3.30 GPA) is set to complete both his undergraduate degree and master's degree in four years. Randle has been accepted into the Department of Psychology's master's program.

Roster Updates

- After missing the first seven games, Grant Verhoeven (hip) has been cleared for action and is practicing with the team. Verhoeven played nine minutes against Loyola Marymount, contributing four points on 2-4 shooting while grabbing two boards.
- Malcolm Allen will redshirt the season. Allen competed in 16 games off the bench last season, shooting 5-9 from the field and 3-5 from the foul line.
- Schuyler Rimmer appeared in two games before leaving the team on Nov. 24. Rimmer appeared in 14 contests as a freshman, making 3-9 from the field.

Nonconference Schedule Is Stacked

- The 2014-15 schedule features 11 NCAA Tournament opponents from last season, including a Jan. 17 home matchup against defending NCAA champion Connecticut. It's the back end of a home-and-home series as Stanford visited Hartford last year.
- Road games against BYU and Texas, along with a tournament matchup against Duke, should provide the Cardinal with an opportunity to quickly establish a high RPI. The Cardinal is visiting Provo for the first time since 1970 and Austin for the first time ever.
- Boasting an alumni network that extends coast to coast, Stanford places an emphasis on annually maintaining a strong national presence. The 2014-15 campaign is no different, with Stanford scheduled to play games in the New York, Chicago and Los Angeles markets, along with a trip to Texas and its usual home slate in the Bay Area.

Coaches vs. Cancer Classic Runner-Up Finish

Stanford fell 70-59 to No. 4/3 Duke in the championship game of the Northwestern Mutual Coaches vs. Cancer Classic. The Cardinal was competing in its sixth preseason tournament under head coach Johnny Dawkins and has notched a 13-9 record in such games. In the semifinals, the Cardinal routed UNLV 89-60 thanks to a decisive edge on the boards and 14 three-pointers. However, Stanford was limited to 36.1 percent shooting the following night against Duke. The game against Duke represented the first coaching matchup between Johnny Dawkins and Blue Devil head coach Mike Krzyzewski. Meanwhile, Chasson Randle was named to the All-Tournament team, averaging 20.0 points while shooting 14-27 overall in Brooklyn.

Quick Look Back At 2013-14

Despite losing two starters and two key reserves to season-ending injuries, Stanford (23-13, 10-8 Pac-12) advanced to the Sweet 16 for only the fifth time in school history following upsets of New Mexico and Kansas. Making its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2008, Stanford was 5-2 against top-25 foes and tied for third in the highly-competitive Pac-12. Of Stanford's 36 games, 19 came against NCAA Tournament competition, including a 53-51 road win at No. 10/10 Connecticut on Dec. 18 that represented the only non-conference loss for the NCAA champion Huskies.

Who The Cardinal Must Replace

Mainstays Dwight Powell and Josh Huestis, who capped their four-year careers having played more games (Powell – 136, Huestis – 135) than anyone else in the program's 100-year history before parlaying outstanding senior seasons into NBA Draft selections. Huestis was selected No. 29 overall by the Oklahoma City Thunder in the first round of the NBA Draft. A three-time Pac-12 Defensive Team selection, Huestis established a school record with 190 career blocks. Powell was selected No. 45 overall by the Charlotte Hornets in the second round of the NBA Draft, before being traded twice (first to Cleveland, then to Boston). A two-time All-Pac-12 First Team honoree and Pac-12 Most Improved Player of the Year as a junior, Powell averaged 10.8 points and 6.3 rebounds while shooting 46.4 percent overall.

Fifth In Pac-12 Preseason Media Poll

Stanford has been picked to finish fifth in the 2014-15 Pac-12 preseason media poll. The Cardinal tied for third in the highly-competitive Pac-12 last season at 10-8 after being projected to finish sixth. Stanford has not won more than 10 conference games in a season since compiling a 13-5 ledger in 2007-08.

Reid Travis Muscles Into The Picture by Tom FitzGerald, San Francisco Chronicle Dec. 13, 2014

One look at Reid Travis, and you can tell he has spent a lot of time in weight rooms.

That's right, says his high school coach, Dave Thorson. When Travis played in an all-star basketball game in Brooklyn in April, Thorson says, Travis made a point of finding a nearby gym where he could lift.

Thorson, a high school and AAU coach for 20 years, says, "I'm not sure I've ever been around anybody who embraced the grind like he does. That's why he's going to be an outstanding college player."

Most freshmen enter college with a lean and hungry look. The 6-foot-8, 240-pound Travis has the hungry look with an NBA body. An instant starter for Stanford (4-2), he's averaging 8.5 points and 7.5 rebounds going into Saturday's 3 p.m. home game against Denver (4-4).

"He's a skilled big man," coach Johnny Dawkins said. "He has a lot of room to grow, but he comes in with a good skill set already."

Travis had just three college games under his belt when he took the court against No. 4 Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium. Stanford lost by 11, but he had 12 rebounds, the most by a Cardinal freshman since Brook Lopez had 12 against Gonzaga in 2007.

Was he perhaps a little intimidated going into the game? "No, that's why I came here — to play in games like that," Travis said. "I believe our program is right up there with them."

Up there with Duke? You've got to love his enthusiasm. Dawkins sure did. He's been on Travis' trail since his sophomore year in high school. Duke coach Mike Krzyzewski loved it, too. So did Gonzaga's Mark Few. Their schools were among his finalists, along with Minnesota.

Other schools — most avidly Iowa, Boston College and Rutgers — offered him football scholarships. At De La Salle High in Minneapolis, he quarterbacked a spread offense and could chuck a ball 70 yards.

He was torn between college basketball and football until he suffered a stress fracture in his foot just before the start of football practice in his senior year. He would be out eight weeks.

"That kind of made the decision for me," he said, "but I can't say my heart was totally set on playing football."

His father used to drive him to the high school to practice with the freshman and varsity football teams — when he was in seventh grade. That's when he started lifting weights. He played on the basketball varsity when he was a freshman, but while backing up his brother, Jonah, he didn't play a lot. Jonah is a senior forward at Harvard, where he is coached by Dawkins' former Duke teammate Tommy Amaker.

Reid Travis helped De La Salle win three straight state titles. Thorson ran 6 a.m. practices twice a week. "Travis would be here by 5:20, lifting weights," he said.

College life has presented him with other challenges. Earlier this week, he was preparing for a final in his poetry class. "I like to analyze poems, not so much write them," he said. "Trying to figure out, 'What's the poet thinking? Why did he write that?' I kind of like that process."

On the court, his biggest struggle is at the foul line. He has made just 7 of 19 free throws (36.8 percent). Last season he was around 80 percent from the line at De La Salle, Thorson said. "Knowing Reid, he's going to be spending a lot of time practicing by himself at Maples."

Stanford Recovers To Beat LMU, 67-58 by Jeff Faraudo, Bay Area News Group Dec. 17, 2014

Just in time, Stanford found its defensive intensity Wednesday night.

The Cardinal used 11 steals to generate 20 points off turnovers and rallied for a 67-58 win over Loyola Marymount.

Stanford hopes to carry over that defensive level into Saturday at BYU, which last season pasted a 112-103 defeat on the Cardinal at Maples.

"I love the way we finished this game defensively," said Chasson Randle, who added five steals to his season-high 31 points. "If we can take the way we played defense in the second half to Utah, I think we'll be all right."

Against BYU a year ago, Randle said the Cardinal was "embarrassed" by its play at the defensive end.

"It was a wakeup call," he said. "We knew we couldn't just play offense and not play defense. That's a recipe for losing."

The Cardinal advanced all the way to the Sweet 16 round of the NCAA tournament last season, and coach Johnny Dawkins credits a lesson learned in the loss to BYU.

"To give up that many points ... I believe it was 112. I kind of remember those things," head coach Johnny Dawkins said. "It was a good turning point for us from the standpoint that we realized how we had to play to be successful. We got lulled into a style of play that wasn't our strength."

Randle Leading The Charge by Matthew Snyder, SLAM Magazine Online Nov. 4, 2014

At Rock Island High School, Chasson Randle never received less than an A. He was the class valedictorian. When people talk about him, it usually takes about 10 minutes before they breach the subject of basketball. Kid is special in that rare kind of all-around way.

But still. Finishing his degree in African and American Studies, at Stanford, in three years, while maintaining a 3.3 GPA? That takes some doing. As head coach Johnny Dawkins says, "He's had to take extra courses in the school year and in summer. To balance that with basketball says a lot about him."

This summer, Randle began work on his thesis for Stanford's master's program in Psychology. That meant numerous trips to Scott County Correctional Facility, in Davenport, IA, just a short drive across the Mississippi River from Rock Island. Randle has volunteered at the facility since the summer before his junior year in high school.

He interacts with the kids housed there, tells them what he's done with his life, what's helped him get to where he is today. "I try to give them motivation and some hope for when they're ready to leave and re-enter schools," Randle says.

Those experiences served as the springboard for his master's thesis. "We're looking at perceptions of juvenile youth who are re-entering schools and how they're received by their peers and teachers," Randle said. "What we're really trying to do is help their transition in getting back into society and schools. Randle recounts all this in vintage matter-of-fact manner. You begin to see why Dawkins calls him a special kid, and why the first descriptor often attached to him is "extremely driven and incredibly humble."

So, who better than to lead Stanford as they try to enter a season intent upon solidifying their foothold on the national scene? Randle has always felt more comfortable leading by example, but this fall, he's been trying to improve vocally. "I think I'm growing in that area," he says, "and getting that respect from my teammates."
