BYU IN 2013

The Cougars finished the 2013 season with an 8-5 record after plaving one of the toughest schedules in school history, advancing to a ninth-straight bowl game at the Fight Hunger Bowl in San Francisco. BYU earned six of its eight wins over bowl teams, including a 40-21 victory against then-No. 15 Texas, and faced nine bowl teams overall. Other key victories in 2013 included a 31-14 win against Utah State, 47-46 win against Houston at the Texans' stadium and a 37-20 payback victory against Boise

BYU had seven various All-America awards, 13 FBS All-Independent citations and 13 Phil Steele All-Independent citations.



UCONN IN 2013

UConn ended the 2013 season 3-9 overall and 3-5 in American Athletic Conference play, winning its last three games against Temple, Rutgers and Memphis, respectively.

After the 2013 season, the Huskies welcomed new head coach Bob Diaco, who served on the Notre Dame coaching staff as the defensive coordinator for the past four years and the assistant head coach for the past two. Diaco was the 2012 winner of the Frank Broyles Award, given to the top assistant college football coach in the country.

- Sophomore QB Casey Cochran played eight games for the Huskies last season and started four, including all three victories. He finished the year 111 for 175 with 1,293 pass yards for 11 touchdowns.
- WR Geremy Davis recorded 71 receptions, 1,085 yards (sixth best in school history) and three touchdowns in 2013. He is UConn's first 1,000-yard receiver in the FBS era and first since 1998.
- · RB Max DeLorenzo rushed for 349 yards and five touchdowns to lead returning runningbacks. He also had eight catches for 69 yards, seeing action in all 12 games for the Huskies.
- DB Obi Melifonwu led returners with 70 tackles in 2013, including three tackles for loss. He had two interceptions, five pass breakups, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.

BYU 2013 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- QB Taysom Hill rushed for 1.344 vards and passed for 2,938 in 2013, totalling 29 touchdowns. Hill finished the season No. 4 in BYU history for total offensive yards in a season. He helped the Cougars break the BYU record for rush yards in a game with 550 vs. Texas and is one of only seven NCAA players to ever throw for 400 and run for 100 in a game (vs. Houston).
- · RB Jamaal Williams had 1,233 rushing yards in 2013 and 2,008 for his career, placing him No. 10 all-time at BYU. He had five 100-yard games last season and scored seven touchdowns.
- Mitch Mathews leads returning WRs with 23 receptions for 397 yards. Mathews played in nine games in 2013 before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury against Wisconsin.
- DB Craig Bills recorded 79 tackles last season, the most out of returning players. He had 2.5 tackles for loss and two interceptions. He also recovered two fumbles and forced one.

2014 BYU FOOTBALL **TEAM NOTES-4**

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR FOUR

The 12-game independent slate features teams from 10 states and seven conferences, including the American Athletic, Atlantic Coast, Big 12, Pac-12, Conference USA, Mountain West and Mid-Eastern Athletic.

The Cougars will play six home games and six road contests in 2014. BYU will face teams that hail from Connecticut, Virginia, Florida, Georgia, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Idaho, Nevada and California, including seven programs - Texas, Houston, Utah State, Central Florida, Boise State, Middle Tennessee and UNLV - that qualified for a bowl game last season.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Selected by their peers, quarterback Taysom Hill, running back Paul Lasike, safety Craig Bills and defensive lineman Remington Peck have been named team captains for the 2014 season.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accomodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's 2012 average attendance of 61,161 ranked No. 3 in the West behind only USC (87,945) and UCLA (68,481).

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 83,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 406 missions around the world. Seventy-five percent of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years or 18 months for women and couples—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

Eighty-eight members of the 2014 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in 28 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before eight games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

The Connecticut fireside will be held Thursday, Aug. 28 at 7 p.m. EDT at Hartford Stake Center, 1000 Mountain Rd, Bloomfield, Conn.

Quarterback Taysom Hill ranks No. 5 at BYU for most offensive yards in a season with 4,282 in 2013 as a sophomore-the only QBs to have more total offense are Steve Young, Jim McMahon and Ty Detmer (two times) and only Detmer had more as a sophomore.

After installing a new QB, offensive staff and system last year, the Cougars' offense finished 14th nationally with 493.7 yards per game.

BYU averaged 15 points per game in its five losses last season, with a high of 17 against Wisconsin. In their wins, the Cougars scored 41.3 a game, with a low output of 31 vs

Taysom Hill ended last season ranked No. 2 in the nation with 60 plays of 10+ rushing vards.

Sophomore running back Jamaal Williams has carried the ball 383 times in his BYU career and never lost a fumble. He's fumbled just two times and did not lose either one.

- At the end of the 2013 season, quarterback Taysom Hill ranked No. 10 in the country with an average of 329.4 yards per game of total offense. Hill earned the No. 1 all-time spot among BYU quarterbacks with 1,680 career rushing yards. Then a sophomore, he also ranked No. 19 in the FBS in rushing yards with 1,344 on the year. Hill is one of eight quarterbacks in NCAA history to throw for 400+ yards and run for 100+ yards in the same game. In the win at Houston, he tallied 417 yards through the air and 128 on the ground.
- Balanced offensive attack. The Cougars scored 43 touchdowns on offense last season. Nineteen of those TDs came through the air and 24 on the ground. Of the receivers returning to the team, Mitch Mathews recorded four TDs and Ross Apo three. Taysom Hill rushed for a team-high 10 scores, followed by Jamaal Williams (seven), Michael Alisa (three--but moves to LB this year) and Algernon Brown (two). Paul Lasike and Adam Hine each contributed one touchdown in 2013.
- · Go fast, go hard has been the mantra of offensive coordinator Robert Anae. Last year with a new offense, the Cougars averaged 89.9 plays per game, the second most of any team in the country only behind Texas Tech. Comparatively, BYU ran 79.2 plays per game in 2012.
- Hill made history with his performance against Notre Dame. He became the first BYU player to ever throw and run for 1,000 yards in the same season. He's also the 23rd quarterback in FBS history to achieve 2,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a year.
- BYU has not been shut out for 124 consecutive games. The last time the Cougars failed to score was in 2003 in a 3-0 loss to Utah. That loss was the only time BYU has not produced points since 1975. BYU has scored in the last 482 of 483 games since 1975.

BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

BYU returns 10 defensive players who have starting experience.

The defense allowed only 11 rushing touchdowns last season. It gave up two rushing TDs in just three games (Wisconsin, Nevada and Washington). Over the past two seasons, BYU has allowed only 16 rushing TDs.

Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally.

Under coach Mendenhall, BYU opponents average just 14.2 points per game in season openers. During that time the Cougars are 73-11 when allowing 24 points or less.

#42 Michael Alisa, LB, Sr.

#2 Dallin Leavitt, DB, So.

As a true freshman, Leavitt saw time in all 13 games last season and even started one. He earned the starting nod to replace three-year starter Daniel Sorensen (now with the Kansas City Chiefs) at the KAT position.

#15 Michael Davis, DB, So.

Originally recruited to BYU as a wide receiver, Davis made the switch to defense last year and started the last two games of the season and tallied 15 tackles in the last four games. He played WR in spring but was switched back to DB in fall camp. Davis is the fastest player on the team, running a 4.4 40-yard dash.

#47 Zac Stout, LB, Sr.

Alani Fua and Zac Stout both prepped at Oaks Christian High in California and reunited as teammates for their senior seasons at BYU. Stout was on the BYU roster from 2010-2012 and looks to make an impact at inside backer for his last year. #91 Travis Tuiloma, DL, So.

Tuiloma, a sophomore nose tackle, recently returned from an LDS mission in Samoa but has earned playing time. He played in all 13 games in 2011 and registered 12 tackles, including 1.5 TFL.

#92 Graham Rowley, DL, Jr.

THE BYU DEFENSE

• The BYU defense likes to get off the field, a lot. The defensive unit forced 5.42 three-and-outs per game to tie for 11th nationally with Wisconsin in that category last year. Of the 182 opponent drives last season, the defense got off the field in three plays or less 65 times, meaning that the defense has either forced a punt after three plays or has caused a turnover before the opposing team recorded a first down of any kind (36.9 percent). At the same time, BYU has forced 7.4 punts per game to rank tied for second in that category and 89 punts to tie for fourth overall in that category.

- Four BYU players from 2013 participated in the NFL combine this past February-only three college programs had more defensive players invited. Although the Cougars need to replace those high-caliber players, head coach Bronco Mendenhall has a proven record of maintaining a nationally ranked defense with the players who suit up on Saturdays. His teams especially excel at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 scoring-defense ranking over the past eight seasons.
- Lengthening the field. For the 2013 season, BYU allowed opponents 154 plays of 10 yards or more to rank No. 19 in the country. That means that opponents were tallying 11.84 such plays per game. The defense allowed just 4.8 yards per play, good for 20th in the FBS.
- Points per game and per play. The BYU defense allowed an average of 22.8 points per game to rank No. 24 nationally. It also allowed .289 points per play on the season to rank No. 14 in that category.



Entering his tenth season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to nine straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned an 82-34 record to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005. Mendenhall also ranks 12th in winning percentage at .707 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience.

The Cougars finished the 2013 season with an 8-5 record after playing one of the toughest schedules in school history. BYU earned six of its eight wins over bowl teams, including then-No. 15 Texas, and faced nine bowl teams overall. Under Mendenhall BYU is one of only 12 programs to earn a bowl invitation each of the past nine years. Only Florida State (7) has achieved more than BYU's six bowl victories over that timeframe.

The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first nine teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 116 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 82-34—almost identical to Edwards' 116-game mark of 83-32-1.

In 2006, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year following an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

He has also served as the defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. BYU has consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense over the past eight seasons, including three top-10 ratings. In 2012, the Cougars featured one of the greatest defenses in school history, allowing just 266.1 yards, including 86.9 rushing yards, and 14.0 points per game. Ranked No. 3 in total defense, No. 3 in scoring defense and No. 2 in rushing defense, the Mendenhall-coached unit held its first six opponents under 300 total yards (part of a streak of 12 consecutive such games dating back to 2011) and kept opposing offenses without a touchdown six times during the year. Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since the program began in 2007.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.


