BYU STORYLINES

- **BYU and Utah compete in the Deseret First Duel rivalry.** BYU is 4-2 overall, with Utah winning the latest overall contest on a tiebreaker. The contest, in which schools earn points based on victories in various sports, began in the 2007-08 season. Ten points toward the overall record are on the line for Saturday's football game. Saturday both teams will wear their home jerseys, with BYU sporting royal blue uniforms. The series is sponsored by Deseret First Credit Union. BYU leads the 2013-14 overall duel 6-0 after wins in soccer and women's volleyball.
- **Quarterback Taysom Hill rushed for a career-high 259 yards**, good for second-most yards in a game all-time at BYU. He also tied the record for longest BYU quarterback rushing touchdown with a 68-yard scoring run vs. Texas. He tied his own record set in 2012 vs. Hawaii.
- **Two-year break.** Following Saturday's game, the series will take a two-year break for the first time since the 1940s, when BYU did not field a team from 1943-1945 due to World War II. The series will resume in 2016
- **Hoffman needs three touchdowns, 475 yds and 17 receptions** to become the BYU all-time record holder in each of those categories. He needs four more 100-yard receiving games to become the BYU leader in that category and 882 yards to become the BYU all-time all-purpose yards leader. Hoffman missed the UVa game due to a hamstring injury, but returned for the victory vs. Texas.
- **Jamaal Williams recorded a career-high 182 yards rushing** vs. Texas on 30 carries. The sophomore running back now has five 100-yard rushing games in his career and is No. 3 nationally in rushing yards per game.
- **BYU tallied a school-record 550 rushing yards** vs. Texas, a record that has stood since 1958. It was also a record for rushing yards allowed at Texas. BYU totaled 679 offensive yards.

BYU RUSHING TOPPLES NO. 15 TEXAS

PROVO, Utah – Taysom Hill rushed for 259 yards and three touchdowns to lead BYU to a 40-21 victory over No. 15 Texas at LaVell Edwards Stadium Saturday night. The Cougars rushed for a school-record 550 yards in the win.

The win is the first over a ranked opponent since BYU (1-1) defeated Oregon State 44-20 in the Las Vegas Bowl in 2009 and the first over a team ranked in the top 15 since the Cougars opened up the 2009 season with a win over No. 3 Oklahoma. BYU's last home win over a ranked team was also in 2009 when the Cougars downed No. 21 Utah.

Hill and the Cougars responded to a Longhorn touchdown that put Texas up 7-3 with a big play of their own to jump back ahead 10-7 with just over 2 minutes left in the first quarter. On the read-option, Hill kept the ball, ran off the left tackle and out-sprinted the Texas defense for a 68-yard touchdown. The 68-yard run ties the school record for the longest run by a quarterback that he set last year against Hawai'i.

On the ensuing Longhorn possession, Texas drove

76 yards on nine plays before Joe Bergeron ran it in from two yards out to take a 14-10 lead.

BYU responded with three consecutive scoring drives to take a 27-14 lead into halftime.

Hill scored his third rushing touchdown in the game on the Cougars' first drive of the second half from 26 yards out to put BYU up 34-14 with 10 minutes left in the third quarter. The drive took 1:51 off the clock and covered 79 yards in eight plays.

Texas quarterback Ash hit Davis for a 23-yard touchdown to bring the score to 34-21 with a little more than eight minutes left in the third quarter.

Sorensen added two late field goals after the touchdown in the third quarter to end the scoring at 40-21. He nailed a 36 yarder with just under six minutes left in the quarter and a 24 yarder with a minute and a half left in the quarter.

BYU finished the game with 679 yards of total offense and Texas had 445 yards of total offense.

NOTES FROM BYU'S LAST GAME

- **Taysom Hill rushed for 259 yards** – the most yards by a quarterback in the nation in a single game so far this season. His mark is the second most by an FBS quarterback in the past 10 years, just behind Vince Young's 267 yards in 2005. The mark also set his career high and ranks No. 2 all-time at BYU behind Eldon Fortie, who rushed for 272 in 1962.
- **Jamaal Williams** rushed for a career-high 182 yards.
- **Hill's 68-yard touchdown run** in the second quarter ties the school record (which he set last year against Hawai'i) for the longest run by a quarterback.
- **With 550 yards on the ground**, the Cougars broke the all-time school rushing record, which was previously set in 1958 against Montana (465 yards).
- **BYU's 550 rushing yards** are the most allowed by Texas in its program history.
- **Cody Hoffman moved to No. 3 in BYU history** for career receptions with his two receptions vs. Texas. The senior receiver now has 205 catches in his career.
- **Justin Sorensen's four field goals** are the most in one game for BYU since 2000.
- **Senior defensive back Skye PoVey** had a career-high eight tackles, including six solo.

OPPONENT OUTLOOK

UTAH'S LAST GAME

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) - The Utah offense produced 539 total yards, but Oregon State quarterback Sean Mannion's 6-yard touchdown pass to Brandin Cooks in overtime pushed the Beavers past the Utes, 51-48, on Saturday night.

Mannion completed 27 of 44 passes for 443 yards and five touchdowns in a back-and-forth thriller. Cooks had nine receptions for 210 yards and three scores as the Beavers overcame the loss of Storm Woods to a frightening neck injury and opened Pac-12 play with a road win.

The weary OSU defense was able to force a 41-yard field goal by Andy Phillips on Utah's possession in overtime.

Travis Wilson passed for 279 yards and ran for 142 and three touchdowns while rallying the Utes (2-1, 0-1 Pac-12) from 13 points down to tie the score at 45-45 on a 9-yard run with 21 seconds to play.

James Poole had a career-high 117 yards rushing and Dres Anderson had 101 yards receiving but the Utes couldn't overcome Wilson's three interceptions.

NOTES

- Utah falls to 0-3 in Pac-12 openers.
- Utah has dropped its last two overtime games (27-20 loss to Utah State in 2012).
- Utah had 153 yards of total offense in the first half and 385 yards of total offense in the second half.



BYU and Utah Announce Series Extension
Monday BYU and Utah announced an agreement for games in 2017 and 2018. The 2017 game will take place Sept. 9 in Provo, and the 2018 game will be held Nov. 24 in Salt Lake City. BYU now has four games scheduled with Utah for 2013, 2016, 2017 and 2018.

- Oregon State was held to only 48 yards rushing by the Ute defense.
- James Poole made his first career start and had a career-high 117 yards rushing (25 carries). He scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard run in the third quarter. Poole had also had 70 yards receiving (team-high seven catches) for 187 all-purpose yards.
- Travis Wilson reached the 2,000 career yards passing mark with 279 yards passing (19-for-33, two touchdowns). He has 2,156 career passing yards. It was his fifth career 200-yard passing game.
- Dres Anderson scored his third touchdown of the season in the second quarter on a 49-yard reception. Anderson led Utah with 101 receiving yards on four catches.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR THREE

BYU's 2013 schedule may be the toughest in program history. The 12-game schedule with six road games and six home games includes fellow independent Notre Dame and teams from eight different conferences, including the Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, American Athletic, Conference USA, Mountain West and Big Sky.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Selected by their peers, wide receiver Skyler Ridley, slot receiver JD Falslev, linebacker Uani 'Unga and safety Daniel Sorensen have been named team captains for the 2013 season. Three of the four captains started their BYU careers as walk-ons. In 2012, Ridley caught the first touchdown pass of the season and finished with 20 receptions for 206 yards and one touchdown. Falslev was second on the team with 37 receptions last season, while also returning punts and kickoffs. Sorensen is a three-year starter and led the team with three interceptions and was second on the team with 68 tackles. 'Unga recorded 28 tackles, three tackles for loss, one interception and one fumble recovery in his first year at BYU after transferring from Oregon State.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accommodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's 2012 average attendance of 61,161 ranked No. 3 in the West behind only USC (87,945) and UCLA (68,481).

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates 405 missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 75,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 330 missions around the world. Seventy-five percent of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years or 18 months for women and couples—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

There are 73 returned missionaries on the 2013 team. There are 57 missionaries from the football team currently serving in 18 different countries. Members of the team cover five of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before eight games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with Bronco Mendenhall.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **Sophomore Jamaal Williams rushed for a career-high** 182 rushing yards against Texas in Week 2. Coming into the Texas game, he ranked No. 34 all-time at BYU for career rushing yards. After the game, he jumped seven spots to share the No. 27 ranking with former running back Bryan Kariya with 1,101 yards, just ahead of Steve Young, who has 1,084 total rushing yards.
- **A loaded backfield** will take the pressure off sophomore QB Taysom Hill. With Doak Walker Award candidates Michael Alisa and Jamaal Williams leading the way and four other backs in Adam Hine, Paul Lasike, Algernon Brown and Iona Pritchard who could see significant playing time, the Cougars should see an increase in the running department.
- **Keep an eye out for The Hoff Show.** Wideout Cody Hoffman has an opportunity to end his Cougar career as possibly the best receiver in BYU history. He enters this week needing just 17 receptions, 474 yards and three touchdowns to take the top spot among the all-time leaders. As of now, Hoffman has amassed 205 receptions, 2,781 yards and 28 receiving touchdowns in his career, good for third, fifth and third, respectively, at BYU. Hoffman holds the record for receiving touchdowns in a game (5) and needs four 100-yard receiving games to have the most in program history.
- **Offensive staff rehaul.** BYU revamped the offensive coaching staff for the 2013 season. The new staff includes Robert Anae returning as the offensive coordinator for a second go-around with the Cougars after a two-year stint at Arizona. Joining Anae are offensive line coach Garrett Tujague, running backs coach Mark Atuaia, receivers coach Guy Holliday and quarterbacks coach Jason Beck. The new staff brings a variety of backgrounds and experience.
- **Go fast, go hard** has been the mantra of coach Anae. With coach Anae leading the offense again, he's brought the credo of "Go fast, go hard" to the team. Players conditioning has been ramped up with the expectation of nothing less than 100 percent on every drill, every rep and every workout.
- **BYU has not been shutout for 115 consecutive games.** The last time the Cougars failed to score was in 2003 in a 3-0 loss to Utah. That loss was the only other time BYU has not produced points since 1975. BYU has scored in the last 477 of 478 games since 1975.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **BYU finished the 2012 season ranked No. 3 in total defense.** The unit returns five starters to a defense that arguably was the best in team history. BYU finished the season No. 3 in the nation in total defense, ranking behind only Alabama and Florida State. The Cougars held opponents to an average of 266.1 yards per game, the lowest since 1974 when the Cougars held offenses to an average of 261 yards. The powerhouse held seven top-10 defensive rankings, including six top-5 rankings highlighted by the No. 1-ranked 3rd down defense and the No. 2 red zone defense.
- **One of everything, again.** After being the only Division I player to record a statistic in each of the major defensive categories in 2011, senior linebacker Kyle Van Noy repeated the same feat in 2012. The 6-foot-3, 245 pounder needed only a fumble recovery to duplicate his 2011 feat, which he did in the Poinsettia Bowl, stripping the San Diego State quarterback in the end zone and recovering that same fumble for a touchdown. The 2013 All-America candidate, who is also on the Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award, Lombardi Award, Lott Impact Trophy, Maxwell Award and Walter Camp Award watch lists, was No. 3 in the nation in sacks (13) and No. 4 in tackles for loss (22). Van Noy led the No. 3 defensive unit in four categories, including tackles for loss (22), sacks (13), quarterback hurries (8) and forced fumbles (6) - a school record.
- **Making a name for himself.** A strong fall camp earned Alani Fua a starting role at outside linebacker for the Cougars. In the game against Texas, Fua recorded seven tackles, two sacks and two tackles for loss in the upset win. For his performance, the 6-foot-5, 215-pound junior was named FBS Independent Player of the Week and College Performance Awards Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week. To make room for him, senior Spencer Hadley returned to inside lineback this season.
- **A large defensive line will help anchor the defense.** Eathyn Manumaleuna returns to the field after suffering a season-ending knee injury last year and receiving a medical redshirt. The fifth-year senior and Outland Trophy candidate has started 38 games over his four-year career at both defensive end and defensive tackle. True sophomore and Ted Hendricks candidate Bronson Kaufusi and redshirt sophomore Remington Peck join Manumaleuna on the line, as defensive ends. In the mix for extensive playing time is junior Marques Johnson who redshirted last season. Combined, the four average a commanding 6-foot-4 and 283 pounds, and will look to wreck havoc in opposing backfield's all year long.
- **Behind enemy lines.** The Cougars tallied at least 5.0 TFL in 12 of 13 games in 2012 with a season-best 11.0 TFL against Utah. BYU finished the season T-No. 23 nationally in TFL, averaging 6.92 per game with 90 total. In two games this season, the defense has recorded 15 TFL, ranked T-No. 75 nationally. Eathyn Manumaleuna, Uani 'Unga, Alani Fua, Daniel Sorensen and Kyle Van Noy each have recorded 2.0 TFL or more with Van Noy tallying 3.5 to rank T-No. 69 nationally.
- **Injuries are part of the game.** The defensive unit has been stung by the injury bug during the offseason and fall camp. JC transfer Trent Trammell, who was expected to fight for the starting job at boundary corner, tore his ACL during spring camp. Jordan Johnson, who started at all 13 games last season at field corner, tore his ACL during the first week of fall camp. Backup corner Adam Hogan tore three muscles in his quad during fall camp and will be out 3-4 weeks. The injuries have forced new players into the ever-important corner position, including true freshmen Michael Davis who began fall camp as a wideout and Dallin Leavitt.

YEARS OVERALL

In his first eight seasons as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored tradition to the Cougars as one of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to eight straight bowl invitations, two outright conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings. The Cougars finished the 2012 regular season 8-5, with a program-record fourth consecutive bowl victory, won four of their last five games and had the No. 3-ranked total defense in the nation.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 75-30 (.714) record to date to rank No. 12 in total wins among all teams in the nation since 2005. The Cougars have received eight straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history that took his first eight teams to a bowl game and has the highest winning percentage of any coach in school history. He also has more wins in his first 100 contests at BYU than Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in six of the last seven seasons to become the first Cougar teams to ever win six bowls in a seven-year span and win four in a row. Nationally, no one has won more bowl games over the past eight years and BYU is one of only seven programs to win six bowl games in the last eight seasons. The Cougars have won 10 or more games in five of Mendenhall's eight seasons overall.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident in the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 127 times in his eight seasons (47 offense, 58 defense, 20 special teams, 2 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 78 top-15 statistical rankings, 58 top-10 rankings and 27 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during seven of the past eight seasons and finished ranked in five seasons, including No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only three teams have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. BYU has led all FBS programs three of the last four years for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career.)

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State and went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.

Hailing from Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. They have three sons, Cutter, Breaker and Raeder.

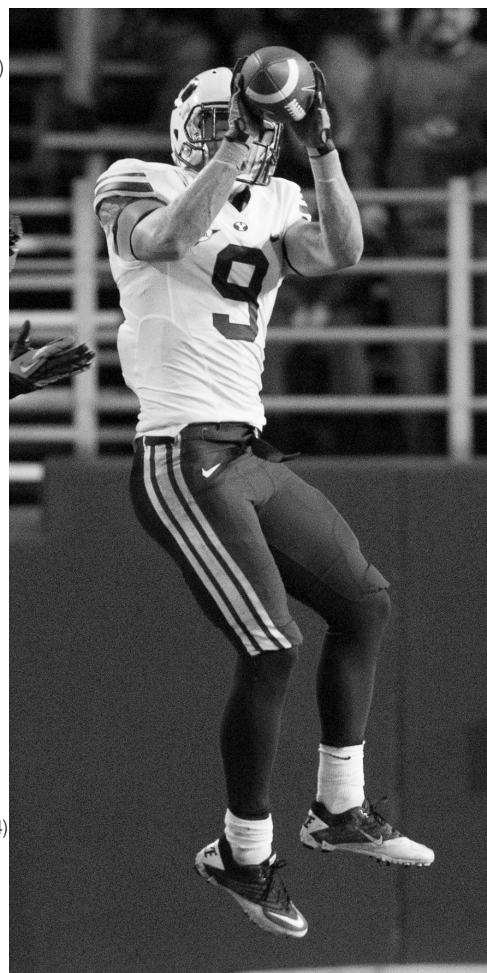
